# **2018 THE YEAR OF THE LION**

In 2018 the Subiaco Football Club arguably produced the most outstanding single season by a club in WAFL history, breaking a series of long standing WAFL and club records on route to their 14th league premiership.

It truly was the "Year of the Lion" as Subiaco won the league, reserves and colts Premierships, becoming the first club in over 130 year history of the WAFL to win those three premierships in the same season.

It came a month after Subiaco had become just the second club in history to win minor premierships in all three grades, and the first in 40 years to do so.

On top of these incredible premiership trifectas, the Subiaco league team went through the 2018 WAFL season undefeated becoming the first team in over 70 years to go through a WAFL league season unbeaten. Subiaco became just the third WAFL league side to go through a season unbeaten.

Subiaco's defence was miserly all season conceding just 51.90 points per game, the greatest defensive season recorded by a WAFL league team since 1944.

By virtue of a dynamic attack as well as dominant defence, Subiaco finished the season with a percentage of 217.92, the third highest percentage in the history of the WAFL.

# SUBIACO'S STANDING AS THE BENCHMARK OF 2018 WAS EVIDENT:

- Were the number one contested ball team, finishing with 167 contested possessions a game, 13 more than the next best WAFL side
- Were the number one team for handball receives finishing with 123 per game, some 14 more than the next best WAFL side
- Were number one for loose ball gets with 59 and number two for hard ball gets with 60 per game across the season
- Were the number one team in both hit-outs and clearances, having 51 hit-outs per game and 45 clearances per game
- Were the number one team for both inside 50 entries with 58 per game and scores per game with 30 scoring shots per contest
- Were the number one team for score assists on the season finishing with the top three assist players in the WAFL in 2018
- Were the number one team for knock-ons for the season averaging 5.8 per contest, with no other team registering more than 3.7 per game
- Won all 20 third quarters they played during the season, the first club to win the same quarter in every game for the season



### THE PERFECT DAY

The quest for a perfect season had a perfect finale, as Subiaco's league side produced one of its best performances on Grand Final day, defeating arch rivals West Perth in what would be a one side decider.

After a nervous start, Subiaco kicked the first goal of the Grand Final after 17 minutes and from there took control, producing a stunning mix of breath-taking offence and resolute defence. Subiaco would eventually run out 81 point winners.

# THE TALE OF THE GAME WAS HIGHLIGHTED IN ALL THE KEY STATS:

- The 81 point final margin was the second biggest winning margin that Subiaco had achieved in Grand Final history
- Subiaco had 130 more possessions than West Perth, the sixth time for the season they had out possessed their opponents by over 100
- Held West Perth to their lowest score of the season on their fewest number of scoring shots for the season, 46 points on 11 scoring shots
- The 46 points by West Perth was also the lowest Grand Final score conceded by Subiaco since the drought breaking premiership of 1973
- Had 21 more scoring shots for the game, a record breaking seventh time having more than 20 scoring shots than their opponents on the year
- Generated 40 points from score launches in their own forward 50, some 11 points more than their own average and 22 points more than the league average
- Had 98 tackles in the Grand Final, their highest tackle count of the season, including a record 41 tackles in the first quarter
- Finished with a disposal efficiency of 67% compared to 59%, with this 8% the second greatest differential for Subiaco for the year

# THE WIN, BUILT ON THE CONTRIBUTION OF ALL 22 PLAYERS, STILL FEATURED SOME INCREDIBLE INDIVIDUAL GRAND FINAL PERFORMANCES:

- Leigh Kitchin recording a Grand Final record 18 tackles, including 10 tackles in the first quarter alone, another WAFL record
- Josh Deluca, Chris Phelan and Kyal Horsley combining for 24 clearances, just under half of Subiaco's 49 match clearances
- Kyle Halligan and Ben Sokol each bagging five goals, with these five a piece each a season high
- Aaron Heal and Jordan Lockyer combining for 10 intercept marks, accounting for a third of the intercept marks taken in the entire match by both teams
- Jordan Lockyer having 12 spoils for the match

The perfect season, the perfect day, this was the "Year of the Lion".

# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

no peers when it comes to operating in the constrained environment of a State league. This is a club that rarely if ever makes an organizational mistake, that pays meticulous attention to the smallest detail while being conscious of the big picture and, above all, is driven to win games of football." What a year! The best in the history of the WAFL since it started in 1885 that's 134 seasons!!

Minor premiers in all grades, the fourth year in a row for the league team. And then to convert all three to winning the premiership is remarkable. Back to back for the Reserves team and the first since 1989 for Beau Wardman's Colts. Add to that only the second undefeated League Premiers in the league's history and we can see this year is very special indeed.

It's a bit more than just this year, I think we all know that, we've been building towards this year over a number of years. Every year we have planned to improve our club, bringing in coaches, developing players and then doing some targeted recruiting and making sure all our people love being here and that makes Subi better. And that is a great reflection on everyone here.

Starting with our Colts talent pathway, Beau Wardman, Michael Farmer and their coaching and support group have been fantastic giving our young players the best chance to develop.

Well done again to everyone involved in the Colts.

Matt Cavedon's first year at the club has been a great effort coaching the premiership winning reserves team. Congratulations to everyone involved for the back to back premiership performance by the reserves.

We have only won fourteen premierships in our one hundred and twenty two years of existence, think about that! And to win three in the last five years and play in five grand finals in a row must surely now rival our so called Glory Years! Jarrad Schofield is moving on to Port Adelaide and I wish him, Bec, Kiera and Taj every success over there. He's been a great coach and in six years has developed into someone we are all so very proud of and someone that will make an impact in the AFL.

Beau Wardman has been appointed as our league coach for the next two years and his development as a coach is very impressive. I have no doubt that Beau is the right man to continue to drive results at the Lions, well done Beau!

#### **SUSTAINABILITY**

As I have said every year of my Presidency, I'm determined we remain a WAFL powerhouse and financially sustainable for the next decade and beyond, nothing has changed that focus.

This year will be our second financial loss in succession as we transition from our old business model at Subiaco Oval. We have held a number of Subi Summits over the last few years to hopefully have all members understand the huge \$400,000 gap we need to fill, what we are doing to close that gap and our other plans for the future which are detailed elsewhere in this report.

What is really important to understand is that we need you all to help us please. Be ambassadors for the club, get to understand our situation and what your club is doing, when you have the chance to involve others please get the message to your business contacts, get people to join as members and grow the Subiaco family. Suggest or help generate ideas that will provide leads that we can then follow up to generate new income opportunities.

# **CONGRATULATIONS**

The winner of the President's Trophy this year was Scott Flood.

Scott has been involved with us for 14 years from when he was only 15 years old. His devotion and loyalty to this club stand out.

This is only one example, at a Lions Pride match held at Wesley College, a country player suffered a spinal injury and was taken to hospital where he was to be in bed all weekend. Scott not only visited him, but he stayed all weekend to make sure he had company and was in good spirits. Thanks for that Scott.

Scott is totally reliable and adds so much to our club. He is highly respected and performs a vital role for the Lions and a worthy recipient of this year's President's Trophy sponsored by the Strack Family.

Well done to Captain Kyal Horsley and his leadership group for driving our training and playing standards all year and then leading us into another grand final. Winning the Simpson Medal in an undefeated premiership year can't get much better but add another reserves premiership and a colt's premiership and you can start to understand the importance of leadership throughout the club. To cap off one of the most brilliant individual years in our history, Kyal won \$5,000 for The West Australian Footballer of the Year and his third Outridge Medal.

# **CEO REPORT**



The best ever season in WAFL history was of course amazing and the undefeated League premiership did go some way towards diminishing the huge disappointment of grand final losses in the last two seasons. Add back to back Reserves premierships and a Colts premiership and we are now in unchartered territory for any WAFL club at any time in the 134 years of the WAFL.

Jarrad Schofield, Matt Cavedon and Beau Wardman were all outstanding as were their team of

assistants and support staff that all drive our standards and club culture and that delivers results.

What makes Subiaco the best club in 2018 and on the podium for the very best in WAFL history?

The Club sets very high standards and expectations, employs the very best people we can find who then all commit to these high standards and cultural norms. Coaches demand high standards in preparation and training and drive each other to set a professional environment with only one aim – to get the very best from every player. Players in the club must be of great character and part of the team, no excuses for individuals, all together and no cliques, they buy into the programs, support the leadership and more than anything else simply work harder for longer than anyone else.

Many external people continually disrespect the achievements of this club, but doing so after all three premierships merely reflects an ignorance of the Subi way. Dismissing league success by pointing to a financial influence is one thing but to then also apply that logic to the unpaid reserves and colts players success is absurd.

The AFL Alignment Model again demonstrated that the WAFL gained no advantage from the presence of the high-profile brand of the AFL Clubs where key areas like attendance & sponsorship are not growing. I am therefore very excited about the introduction of the West Coast Eagles standalone team in 2019 and as I have said before this alternative model can now hopefully harness the power and prestige of the AFL Clubs to provide a positive environment for the WAFL and its fans and supporters.

# SFC OPERATIONS

People are what really defines a club's culture and we are very fortunate to have a great team that includes Debbie King, Kevan Sparks and his hospitality team. Cameron Palmer wants to make a difference and Teigan Freeman helps provide a wonderful public face to our members, visitors and supporters.

Well done to the Subiaco District team of Andrew Ridley, Callum Warner, Matt Debarro and Jesse Tippet who continue to have positive and engaging relationships with all the staff and continue to be the face of football participation in Subiaco football district.

# **SEASON HIGHLIGHTS**

Some of the game day and event highlights during the year included;

 The newly named Subiaco Women's team (Titans) playing in another grand final

- Good Friday game which again attracted our biggest crowd of the year and was the highlight of our home games.
- Landmark fixtures featuring the Goldfields as curtain raiser games before our match with Peel on Friday July 7
- Home game functions included the premiership reunion for the 1988 and 2008 teams, ANZAC round, Men's Health Round supporting Prostate Cancer, NAIDOC round, Ladies Day and the District Day.
- QBE game Thursday night in which we played in the special cyan QBE jumpers, followed the next night with the Subiaco women's team and reserves playing while our Life Member's night was held where Kyal Horsley and Chris Phelan were officially welcomed as life members of the club
- Leederville Oval hosted the Second Semi Finals for all thee grades at Leederville.
- The historic first ever Grand Finals at Optus Stadium featuring all three Subiaco men's teams.

### **KEY CLUB STRATEGY**

Our financial power has been driven by our operations at Subiaco Oval and we have known for some time that this was ending but replacing that income will take a lot of hard work by us all and support from our current and new members, sponsors and supporters. The club has identified a number of new strategies and has been moving to a new business model but until that can be achieved we will continue to have sustainable losses such as the one this year.

Our financial result does not reflect our on field dominance over such a great period for the club. The Club has failed to meet revenue targets especially in the hospitality bars and social clubs and there was little progress in our business development, sales and sponsorship in a difficult economy. The WAFL is facing a very tough time now and into the next few years, this Club is no different.

We must all now be aware of the significant challenge we face financially, the financial result this year again emphasizes the need to address all the following key issues during 2018 and beyond;

- Leederville Oval Master Plan along with East Perth and the City of Vincent
- Subiaco Football Club Strategic Plan for 2019 and beyond
- Women's Football strategy for WAFL competition in 2019
- Sustainable model for SFC, purpose of the Subi Summit events held in 2017
- Subi Forever projects to lead to a sustainable future.
- Talent pathway center of excellence to include women's football.
- WAFL opportunities from the Perth Stadium
- Club constitution needs changes to meet the new rules by 2019
- Welfare and mental health programs for players and support for coaches.

### **FOOTBALL & TALENT**

Football is addressed more completely elsewhere in this report but I would like to acknowledge Daniel Vidovich and Jarrad Schofield as the team that drives our football programs. Unfortunately we lose both post season. With great pride we celebrate Jarrad's appointment as an AFL assistant at Port Adelaide and with great regret that Daniel moves into other roles that will see him get

more work – life balance. Both have been outstanding Subiaco people and will be missed at the Lions.

The core of our club is the football operations staff, coaches and players that continue to set high goals, to work together and never take things for granted. Our list management was again well balanced by promoting the development of Colts and emerging talent while at the same time identifying our playing weaknesses and gaps. The key platform to our list has been attracting players not getting regular league games and that continued again this season.

Last year I acknowledged Beau Wardman and Michael Farmer for finally being able to put in place a talent pathway program that challenges the best in the WAFL.

An excellent job by both these men to again drive that program to achieve a Colts premiership which is nearly unheard of at the Lions.. They have been well supported by many aspiring coaches and support staff that provide the teams in the pathway with a great learning experience during their time at the club in addition to development of their football.

## **SPONSORS, MARKETING & COMMUNICATIONS**

It has been the longest partnership in state league sport but all good things come to an end unfortunately. It is with the greatest appreciation and with my sincere thanks for thirty four year of support from our Principal Partner QBE. My thanks to Sara Hamer and all the other regular QBE staff that have supported us in 2018.

Our major support sponsors are vital to the club, thanks to Phoenix Holden, KC Sports, AE Hoskins Building Services, 3B Build and SKG for your support.

Cameron Palmer is responsible for driving new business opportunities and increasing sponsorship and marketing revenue as well as developing and maintaining positive relationships with our stakeholders. Strategies in the business development area target growth in the number of people we have contact with, to thereby increase the number of people we can convert to members and new and potential leads for sponsors, to get to attend games, events and functions and of course promote the benefits of our sponsors.

Cameron recruited a team of volunteers to deliver our communication with members and supporters, the website, Lions eNews, Facebook, Instagram and Twitter that provide up to date information and stories about the people within the club remains a high priority. # FINANCE REPORT

The 2018 year again presented a number of financial challenges for the club given the final exit of all clubs operations at Subiaco Oval, increasing costs associated with running the club's football operations and in providing services to members as well as key sponsorship changes. Notwithstanding the second successive financial loss, the club remains in a strong financial position at year end (net assets of approximately \$3.6m)

Whilst it is very disappointing to report an operating loss, the

Board is acutely aware of the need to continually plan for the club's long term financial security, in particular setting budgets for sustainable losses until the Club is able to successfully transition to a new business model post the club's commercial operations arrangements.

Subi Forever has been established by the Board with the ultimate objective being to generate a pool of funds sufficient to secure the club's financial future in perpetuity. It has two key roles, the first is to achieve a better financial return for the club's existing reserves and secondly, to generate significantly more funds to increase the club's capital base and meet annual revenue targets. The Subi Summit series of workshops were held to make sure members and other stakeholders clearly understood our position and participate and help us plan our way forward. Only if this is successful will the club's future be assured.

On a personal note, I would like to thank my fellow finance committee members, Peter Capes, Debbie King and Basil Fuller for their support during the year.

# **FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT**

WHAT A SEASON!!!!!

Records and droughts broken in all areas. 3 PREMIERSHIPS, an undefeated season in the league, back to back premierships for the reserves and colts the winning their first premiership

since 1989.

The league went one better after last year's one loss regular season and Grand Final appearance, becoming the first side since 1946 to complete an undefeated premiership season. We had 11 players make their League debut with the club with nine of them being their WAFL debuts, eight players represent the WAFL State squad, four players make the State 18's, three players in the State 16's and the club won the Rodriguez shield by a comfortable margin. But more importantly we continue to add depth, strength and development to our youth which saw the Reserves win back to back premierships and the league take out the Premiership with another memorable win.

These players all had a big impact to the club whether at league or reserves level. 35 players would represent the Subiaco league side with distinction in 2018.

# **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT REPORT**



The Subiaco Football Club's Community Engagement Program was able to recommence its full operations in the metropolitan schools again in 2018 at Balga Senior High School and also at our Primary School North Balga Primary School. This year in the Community Engagement Program we have had a strong focus towards engaging with the multicultural and disengaged youth in the Subiaco District. To help assist we

have connected with the West Coast Eagles Adam Selwood and Kim Hannah with their Next Generation School Programs called the Naitanui Academy. We continued the in-school program at Balga Senior High School with the IEC students. We also had more schools engage with the program especially with John Septimus Roe in Mirrabooka. We had a lot of female students engage with the program from schools to grow their football knowledge and skills.

The Subiaco Football Club is working with Balga SHS with their the "Success Through Sport" program to help deliver in the program committing to at risk youth at the school. During 2018 we have delivered a program that covers a range of areas and topics and again the students have formally recognised accreditations in coaching and umpiring. We made sure that this year we could help develop their football skills and help assist them to their local junior clubs.

This year continued our "Learn Today... Lead Tomorrow" program in the primary schools. This year the program was delivered to students in Year 4, 5 and 6 at North Balga PS. After consultation and review with the schools, we have still made it a focus on the literacy and numeracy base and teaching students teamwork, leadership, resilience, socialemotional skills and how to work collaboratively with others. The feedback and responses we have received from the schools have been very positive.

# **ABORIGINAL FOOTBALL**

This year was a very exciting year for the Indigenous boys and girls in the Subiaco Metropolitan Area. We have seen an increase in numbers of indigenous boys and girls in football especially through engaging with the schools in the Subiaco District and transitioning them to local Junior Football Clubs. I want to acknowledge and say thank you to Len Yarran and the WADJAK Centre for their support to our programs with Welcome to the Country and dance performances throughout the year.

In 2018 both Nicky Winmar & Kirby Bentley teams saw an increase in interest with more participants in both teams. In the Nicky Winmar we had 26 players playing for Subiaco with John Yates picked for the WA Kickstart Team that played in Blacktown Sydney and ended up winning the championship. In the Kirby Bentley teams we saw the girl's numbers increase again for 2018 going to two teams and having 44 girls

participate. Five of our indigenous girls were nominated to try out for the WA Diversity Team. This year we had a different approach by not have a state carnival. The girls trained together with the All Nation girls and a squad of 26 was picked. The girls played against a development squad that were created this year from the female talent department.

The other major events that took place throughout this year included District Dreaming which was held at Barry Britton Oval connecting with Balga JFC, NAIDOC Week celebrations and NAIDOC Round at Leederville Oval with Subiaco wearing the indigenous jumpers. It was great to again see our Colts support NAIDOC Round by playing in our special indigenous jumper and exchanging gifts with Peel in a pre-match ceremony.

# **MULTICULTURAL FOOTBALL**

Multicultural football this year in the Subiaco District saw more players engage into football compared to previous years. The District staff went out to schools in the district a ran a 4-6 week football program with the aim to engage with the multicultural students and getting them into AFL and helping them find a Local Junior Football Club. Again, this year we continued our relationship with the Edmund Rice Centre who still run their Edmund Lions Program throughout the year down at Barry Britton Oval. A big thankyou goes to the Edmund Rice Centre with Joe and his crew continuing our relationship helping facilitate multicultural football in the Subiaco district.

This year we have also linked up with Adam Selwood and Kim Hannah from the West Coast Eagle Next Generation Academy. This has assisted to grow multicultural football with their inschool and out of school programs. The NGA program will give more opportunities for students to improve their football and one day in the future push to be drafted as the new category B selection for the West Coast Eagles. Towards the end of the year Subiaco and Edmund Rice Centre will be entering in a team for the Naitanui Cup to play against the other teams in the West Coast Eagles zone and from there players will be selected to tryout for next years WA All Nation team

The other major events that took place in 2018 were the International Round at HBF Arena, Bachar Houli Cup which we had two school represent the Subiaco District giving multicultural students the opportunity to play against other schools and Harmony Day with the Edmund Rice Centre.

So, after a very satisfying and eventful year in 2018 the Subiaco Football Club is very excited to look forward to 2019 with the knowledge and feedback we have had from Community Engagement Programs and will be looking forward to keep continuing to deliver our programs. We are excited about the future growth of these programs and getting to work with a different group from within our zone, many whom have never been involved with football before. We are looking forward to introducinging more multicultural youth in our zone to the program and keep showing them the benefits of being involved with the Subiaco Football Club and football in general.



# SUBIACO SURVEY

With the Subiaco Football Club currently going through a transition phase off-field, the club continues to need support or members and supporters by both becoming members and donating to the club.





Could we bounce back from last year, would mental scars linger, could we overcome list turnover which saw over 20 players come in and go out, would our senior guys as a year older still be able to produce a strong brand of football. As the year went on, this team full of character, proved all those doubts unfounded as they embarked on one of the greatest ever WAFL seasons.

We embarked on a tough pre-season highlighted by a gruelling pre-season and pre-season camp by our year one to year four players. It was during this time that I felt that 2018 could be a great one, as our young players showed their growing mental strength and our senior players showed they had unfinished business to take care of. The club supported these efforts by recruiting Drew Rohde, Ben Newton, Josh Deluca and Zac Clarke; four high quality players and people who had significant impact on our premiership success.

We again showed we are a club that provides opportunities with 11 players debuting for the club, including eight first gamers. 35 players represented the league team in 2018, our lowest in a number of years. This is credit to our strength and conditioning and medical teams. Thanks to Craig King and Dan Hiscock and his team for their efforts this year helping keep our players fit and playing to a high standard week in, week out.

As the year started we showed a highly efficient forward line, with a number of players helping impact the scoreboard. We ended up kicking more goals in 2018 as opposed to 2017 as players like Lachlan Delahunty, Kyle Halligan, Zac Clarke, Rhys Waters, Brad Stevenson and Ben Sokol all had outstanding years. They were supported by a midfield group blessed with the incredible leadership of Kyal Horsley, Leigh Kitchin and Chris Phelan. We built on our midfield strength as Zac Clarke's influence in the ruck meant we ended up as the number one clearance and hitout to advantage team in 2018. As for our historic defensive group, they again proved to be a rock solid and consistent group. The great unity they showed was pivotal to our success as they epitomised that the small improvements would make us a better team.

The challenge as we kept winning games, was to keep winning. It defines the mental strength of this group that they were constantly able to get the best out of themselves and keep winning games of footy. This mental strength was most evident as we lost two people who were close to our player

and coaching group. To lose Wayne Orsi and Shane Yarran in the space of a few weeks was devastating. I was proud of the way we dealt with it internally and the support we showed each other in what were tough times. It did galvanise and help drive us closer to the premiership we coveted.

That premiership would eventually come in September as we played close to the perfect game. We always strive for the 'perfect game' and played it at the right time. Our pressure throughout the game was outstanding, our midfield was dominant, our defence held firm throughout and our forwards made the most of their chances. It was everything we try to do in a game coming together to help produce the club's 14th premiership.

It was a reward for the disappointment of the past two years, made even more memorable that our Colts and Reserves also won premierships on same Grand Final day. To Beau Wardman, Matt Cavedon and their respective teams, congratulations on your premiership achievements in 2018.

On a personal level, 2018 was an incredible way to sign off my coaching journey with the Subiaco Football Club. I couldn't have asked any more of the players. I am super proud of the commitment and dedication they have shown this year and in my time as coach. The relationships that I have built this year and in past years will last a lifetime and I look forward to seeing those players grow as players and men as their lives progress.

To President Mark Lawrence and CEO Peter Capes thanks for your support in 2018 and throughout my time as senior coach. To my coaching group, Steve Wasley, Nigel Hamilton and Ryan Redfern thanks for your substantial time commitment and hard working efforts in 2018. To Daniel Vidovich thanks for your ongoing support to me and the players. To all the admin staff, volunteers and support staff, thanks for your efforts in supporting the team. Special thanks go to Mick, Alby and Tania who have supported me through the whole six years coaching this great club.

The journey as senior coach over the past six years has been one to remember. This club will always have a special place in my heart. I am excited to see what success might come and will be watching on with interest from afar forever supporting the mighty Lions.

# RESERVES COACH REPORT

I feel like every player on the list improved and the thing that I am most proud of is that we as a club were able to debut 9 Development players into the first WAFL League side to go undefeated in over 70 years! Excitingly, a number of others are knocking the door down and we expect many more debutants in 2019.

To me, it still feels like a dream that all three sides were able to finish Minor Premiers and taste the ultimate success.

From the outside it would be easy to assume that the Reserves Grand Final teams of 2017 and 2018 had a large number of the same players. However, only 7 players from the 2017 Grand Final played in the 2018 Grand Final. Those players were McKenzie Lawrence, Daniel Leach, Ryan Borchett, Nick Menegola, Ray Daniels, Ben Reid and Michael Braut. Importantly 3 players from the 2017 reserves Greg Clarke, Braden Fimmano and Jacob Miller went on to play key roles in the 2018 League Premiership.

# **THE SEASON**

We got to Rd 6 and sat at 2 wins, 3 losses after losing to Sth Fremantle by 2 points in Rd 2 and being soundly beaten by Swan Districts and West Perth in Rd 3 and 6. Fortunately we had a bye after the West Perth game which allowed us two weeks to refine our craft and focus on areas of our game that had let us down. We would go on to only lose another 2 games for the rest of the home and away season and come away as Minor Premiers.

# THE OUTSTANDING PERFORMERS

Daniel Leach had an outstanding year making his League Debut in Rd 17 against Claremont, was awarded the Prendegast Medal for the WAFL Reserves Best and Fairest and finished Runner-up In the Blakemore Medal.

Travis Cleggett came to Subiaco from Collie as the reigning Hayward medallist for the Best and Fairest player in the South West Football League. Travis continued to get better and better as the season went on and was rewarded for his consistency and outstanding form in the second half of the year with the 2018 Blakemore Medal. All Subiaco supporters should be excited as Travis has shown he has the ability to be a very good League player in the future.

Former Subiaco Colts Ben Reid, Jack Beverley and Max Dennis rounded out the top 5 in the Blakemore and have shown considerable improvement throughout the season.

#### **FINALS RECAP**

The boys sprinted out of the blocks in the 2nd Semi-Final against East Perth leading at quarter time 44 to 0. East Perth fought back but Subiaco held a 27 pt lead at ¾ time only to see East Perth storm home with a 6 goal to none last qtr.

The Preliminary Final saw us face a very strong Claremont side at Sth Fremantle, it was a true four quarter performance in a brutally physical encounter that saw both teams lay over 80 tackles. We were in control all day and finished off with a 42pt win and much needed confidence.

The Grand Final was an early start on the amazing Optus Stadium. As a group we knew it important we started the day well for the club. The game was an absolute arm wrestle all day and to the boys credit after being 5 points down at ¾ time and some wasted opportunities early in the last quarter we hit the lead after 20 minutes and never looked back and defeated a very experienced and talented East Perth outfit by 18pts.

Through injury interrupted circumstances we were fortunate to have the class, experience and leadership of Adam Cockie and Craig Hoskins. Adam had a dominant Grand Final and was deservedly named best afield. Craig Hoskins had a fantastic finals series and was named player of the finals. Shannon Nelson with 2 goals, Michael Braut and Ryan Borchett with 3 goals were the other outstanding performers on the big stage.
