

BRIEF HISTORY & OUTLINE

WAAFL 1922 – 2007

- Formed in 1922 with five teams as the Mercantile Football Association
- 1924 – name changed to the Perth Districts Football Association
- 1929 – name changed to the W.A Amateur Football Association
- 1971 – name changed to the W.A Amateur Football League (Inc.)

In 2007 the WAAFL is in its 86th year of operation. With 43 clubs, 158 teams and over 10,500 registered players, the WAAFL has grown from a four team competition to the largest single organised football league in WA, catering for players from the age of 16 years, as well as considerable volunteer personnel and social supporters.

The WAAFL is an important part of the metropolitan based community football with the stringent amateur standard and quality competition.

The WAAFL is a member of the Community Football Council with other members including the Sunday Football League, Peel Football League, West Australian Football Association, WA Masters Football, Women's Football League and the Mercantile Football Association.

VALUE OF AMATEUR FOOTBALL

The WAAFL provides organised football on Saturday where anyone whatever ability, can participate or contribute to the football industry.

The system in place allows players to play in senior football at any level they are capable of achieving. Colts (U19) learn the fundamentals of amateur football and its responsibilities after graduating from junior ranks. While the WAAFL also provides a quality high standard competition for those players not wishing to endue the commitment to WAFL (second tier state competition) training due to study or career commitments or simply a lifestyle that considers football a recreational pursuit, it is, however, in a position to bridge the gap between amateur football and the champions of tomorrow.

Many well known WAFL and AFL personnel began their careers in the WAAFL. Former West Coast Eagles and Hawthorn coach Ken Judge began his coaching career at an A Grade amateur club. Former Dockers coach Gerard Neesham played several seasons of amateur football and played at state amateur level.

Other high profile players starting in the Amateurs include Troy Wilson (West Coast Eagles), Gary Buckenara (Hawthorn), Shane Parker (Fremantle), Simon Beasley (Western Bulldogs), Sandover Medallists Ian Dargie, Alistair Pickett and Shane Beros.

Former Amateur players who have gone on to be senior administrators include former Chairman of the WA Football Commission Dr Peter Tannock, current WA Football Commission Chairman Dr Neale Fong (a triple A Grade Fairest & Best medallist with the WAAFL), current Chairman of Sydney Swans Richard Colless and former West Coast Chairman and AFL Commissioner Terry O'Connor are just a few who have gone on to contribute to football at a higher level.

The WAAFL is continuing to focus on the future and how the League uses its leadership and resources to set new standards of excellence and relevance for its member clubs and various committees. The League's Strategic Plan has been successful in stabilising the League's financial position and the establishment of a Club "culture" that will ensure a long and viable competition.

The future strategic plan will build on this strong foundation and ensure that the WAAFL continues as the main contributor to Community football.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



In last seasons President's Report, I indicated that it had been a challenging and at times a difficult year. However I am pleased to report that in 2007 we have laid the foundation for future development and continuous improvement for both the League and Clubs through strategic planning. Several of the initiatives put in place over the past seasons are now starting to have positive outcomes.

At the last Annual General Meeting, the Board was reduced to six members plus the President and Vice President. The elected positions of Treasurer and Secretary were abolished. These tasks are to be carried out in day to day operations by either the CEO or staff. The Clubs also voted to allow the Board to appoint up to two people to sit on the Board for a period of time until confirmed by the delegates. Those appointments were to allow people with specific expertise to assist us in areas that we needed additional experience.

Clubs should be proud to be a part of an organisation that continues to be given greater recognition within the Western Australian football fraternity. The achievements of clubs in respect to financial viability and greater efforts in looking after their administration responsibilities and their willingness to embrace the directions laid down by the WAAFL Board have assisted to make the League and Clubs viable.

The untiring work done by our many volunteer officials, committees and supporters whose efforts although primarily focused on their own clubs and teams, have contributed to make the WAAFL a better sporting body. I sincerely thank you all.

The Western Australian Football Commission Chairman, Commissioners, Executive Officer, Directors and Managers have all made the Leagues' immense administrative task all the more easier by their continuing support of our important role in community football. They have consistently made themselves available for advice, provision of facilities and attendance at our functions and presentations. Their ongoing financial contributions, that has increased annually, underpins the viability of the WAAFL and has not been taken for granted.

The ongoing relationships with our sponsors have once again greatly contributed to the success of the WAAFL with support provided by the Clubs.

Foster's Australia continues to be the major partner in helping our League with a generous amount of product allocated during the season to Clubs and for all League functions. Their financial support makes the game more affordable for all members. The **Foster's** partnership is vital to the well being of the WAAFL. We appreciate

their continued involvement and the recognition of the work our club Presidents do by the invitation to use the company's box at an AFL game.

West Coast Eagles Football Club support for the entire colts competition and the **West Coast Eagles Under 23 State Amateur Program** is the envy of all within local community football and the Victorian, South Australian and Northern Tasmanian Amateur Leagues. We also value their contribution in providing facilities to entertain our sponsors and key people at every **West Coast Eagles** home game.

Key support sponsors **Sherrin, Park Auto Centre, Beiersdorf (Elastoplast), Toyota Genuine, Cougar Sportswear, Rebel Sports, Keystart Home Loans and Office National Booragoon** have all provided significant contributions to the WAAFL. The overall financial support and provision of product and services from our sponsors has benefited all Clubs with only a minimal increase in fees this season after three years of no increases. The overall improvement in the Leagues financial welfare could not have been achieved without the continued contribution of our member Clubs and in particular our sponsors and supporters mentioned previously.

The WAAFL continues to be blessed with some very talented and dedicated Board who continue to give their time on a purely voluntary basis and are prepared to evaluate and ethically act in their decision making. Vice President Trevor Howard, Brett Fullarton, Peter Grosser, Bruce Wainwright, Mark Herron, Milton Sanders, Bill Armstrong and Graham Hill with their wide ranging business and management skills as well as their first hand knowledge of the game, have served the Clubs well.

The dedicated community football staff of CEO Brendan Cullinan, Operations Manager Geoff Palmer, Natalie Couch, Matt Henson, Tarryn Kailis and Melanie Thomas have all worked with the varied needs of our member Clubs and Board in their usual efficient way.

Many people continue to contribute to and make up important parts of the WAAFL such as Tribunals (P & D and Investigative), Community Football Council, Umpiring, District Development Council, media and state football. They are all important participants in the smooth running of our league.

Sincere thanks to the dedicated umpires coaching and support panel of Des Morgan, Gavin Levitzke, Warren Beckwith and Terry Tomlinson. They have worked hard to have available each week competent umpires whose performances have been commendable during the year.

Some of the significant events in 2007 include:

- The sad passing of long serving past Board Member and Life Member Doug Frame.
- The growth of our colts competition with

three new teams.

- The start of a Quality Club Program which aims to assist clubs to run themselves better and more efficiently.
- The implementation of a policy whereby alcohol cannot be served at amateur games before 1pm. This has proved a success with no alcohol related incidents since its introduction.
- More stability in our clubs with officials staying an average of 18 months longer in their elected roles.
- The ongoing success of the **West Coast Eagles Under 23 State Amateur Program** with AAFC All Australian assistant coach, Wayne Langborne and his dedicated assistants.
- The introduction of an Under 19's representative team under coach Andy Leinassars, playing two games against the WACFL and WA State 16's.
- The spinal injury to Mosman Park player Scott Joyce. The football fraternity rallied to provide financial support. Thanks to the **West Coast Eagles** members, the WAFL 200 Club and all our Clubs for their contributions.
- Eight players from our **West Coast Eagles Under 23 State Amateur Team** were selected in the All Australian Amateur Team that played the Northern Tasmanian Football League/ Northern Tasmanian Football Association combined team in Launceston in October.
- The awarding of Life Memberships to long serving League officials and contributors Geoff Metcalfe (tribunal and umpiring) and former Executive Officer, Neil Judge. They

are both worthy recipients.

- North Beach joining an elite group along with Wembley and Mt Lawley in winning four successive A Grade Premierships.
- The finalisation of the Rush Supreme Court decision that started in August 2000 and finished in the Appeals Court with judgment passed in favour of the WAAFL.
- The admittance of Northern Tasmania to the AAFC to play in our interstate football triennial series.

The WAAFL continues to play a key partnership role in the Community Football Council along with the Sunday Football League, Peel Football League, Masters Football, WA Womens Football League, Western Australian Football Association and the Mercantile Football Association. We all have worked closely together for the good of local football covering all the metropolitan area.

Congratulations to all League award winners, premiership teams, state and AAFC representatives and state umpires in achieving personal and team awards.

We must not underestimate the role that the WAAFL plays in the development of strong and healthy communities through the metropolitan area. The benefits to the community, families and individuals is all brought about by the untiring work of our many dedicated volunteers. Thank you for your participation.

CEO'S REPORT



The Western Australian Amateur Football League continues to embrace the philosophy of continual improvement as it remains the pre-eminent senior community football competition in Western Australia. Throughout 2007, strategic changes implemented by the Board continue to further enhance the quality environments at all Clubs leading to improvements in the standard

of competition in all grades.

The WAAFL launched the Quality Club Environment Program this season aimed at enhancing the environments at all Clubs on and off the field. The full implementation of this program will provide greater direction and assistance for our Club volunteers as they undertake their important roles each season. The appointment of Trevor Howard to coordinate this program has ensured that all Clubs will be supported by his wealth of experience and knowledge.

The WAAFL competition continued to grow this season with the number of clubs increasing to forty three with the inclusion of Ellenbrook, three new colts' teams, and four additional senior teams taking the total number of registered players to over 10,500. This growth has prompted a review of the lower grade structure with changes expected for the 2008 season.

The number of participants will increase dramatically in the coming years as more players are expected to progress to senior football from the massive growth that has occurred in junior competitions over the past twelve months. The WAAFL needs to continually evolve to ensure that all Clubs and competition structures are appropriately positioned to manage this growth as it occurs. The recently released Future Directions report by the Community Football Council provides a number of recommendations that are aimed at ensuring the governance and competition structures for all levels of senior community football are appropriate to cater for the future growth of senior football.

The professional standing and strong financial position of the League would not be possible without the enduring support of our key partners. The professional and financial support of the West Australian Football Commission ensures that the WAAFL continues to be recognized for the major role it plays in promoting positive community involvement. Special mention for the support provided by Executive Officer, Wayne Bradshaw, Director of Football, Grant Dorrington, Director of Finance and Administration, Michael Hnatjko, Director of Facilities, Geoff Glass, Umpiring General Manager, Steve Hargrave, and Manager of Community Development, Warren Nel.

Our financial partners also underpin the success of the

League particularly our major partners with Dean Turner at **Foster's Australia** and Trevor Nisbett at the **West Coast Eagles**. Partnerships with these high profile organizations complement the professional standing of the WAAFL.

The 2007 season also produced some outstanding team and individual performances. North Beach won a thrilling A Grade grand final over Wembley to win its fourth premiership in a row under coach, Bill Duckworth. The **West Coast Eagles State U23 team** were defeated by South Australia but still managed to finish second at the conclusion of the triennial series against the SAAFL and VAFA. Eight players from the WA squad were selected in the All Australian Amateur Team that played in Tasmania in October with WA State Coach, Wayne Langborne, as assistant coach. University's Wayne Loxley was WA's best player in the AAFC game receiving one of the awards for the match. Wembley player, Andrew Piccoli won the C.J. Jamieson Medal (A Grade Fairest and Best), A Grade Leading Goal Kicker, *L.A. Tetley Award* for the Fairest and Best player in the **West Coast Eagles U23 State Program**, and All Australian selection in a remarkable season for a talented young man.

In a season with so many highlights, there was one incident that left all involved with the WAAFL and football in general devastated and that was the spinal injury to young Mosman Park player, Scott Joyce. It was encouraging to witness the football fraternity at all levels rally to support Scott and his mother, Tina. The Mosman Park Football Club formed a special committee that is focused on providing long term support for Scott. Outgoing Club President, Harold Hardy and all involved with this committee should be acknowledged for their tireless work in

supporting Scott. The WAAFL will continue to push for greater insurance coverage for all players as part of the national scheme. The support of Paraplegic Benefits Fund Australia has also provided guidance and financial support. On behalf of the Scott Joyce Committee, I would like to thank the **West Coast Eagles Football Club**, Adrian Barich from radio station 6PR, the WAAFL Clubs and the many people and organisations throughout the community that have kindly donated to Scott's Trust.

In closing, I acknowledge the people behind the scene who do a fantastic job in supporting the Clubs and ensuring that the League runs smoothly. The Community Office staff continues to provide a friendly service to our Clubs in sometimes trying conditions. Thank you to Geoff Palmer, Natalie Couch, Matt Henson, Tarryn Kailis, Melanie Thomas and Des Morgan for your outstanding work again this season.

Season 2008 will again provide many challenges and opportunities for the WAAFL to continue to grow. I am confident that these opportunities will be fully embraced by the WAAFL and further endorse its position as the premier community competition in Western Australia.

VALE DOUG FRAME

On behalf of the Board of the Western Australian Amateur Football League, I extend sincere sympathy to Kay, Rachael, Helen, Doug Jnr and their families on the passing of their Father, Doug.

Doug had a long and distinguished association with the Amateur League as a player, administrator and umpire.

Prior to playing Aussie rules he represented W.A. three times in junior rugby.

In 1960 he began with the Bayswater Amateur Football Club where he was a player and a coach. He played 268 games and at the same time serving on the Clubs' Committee and Executive for 21 seasons.

Doug was elected to the Western Australian Amateur Football League Management Committee in 1976 until stepping down in 1999.

He served on numerous subcommittees including club permits, state football, ground fixtures and umpires. He was a State Team Assistant Manager in 1981 and 1982 and State Selector for four seasons (1980-1983). For his services Doug was elected a Life Member of the League in 1986. In 2000 he was awarded the Australian Sports Medal by the Australian Government for his services to Australian Rules Football.

For numerous seasons Doug and his family had the daunting role of organizing all finals gate keepers which was carried out in a thoroughly professional and diligent way, earning great respect from the executive of the League and Club Officials.

During his period serving on the Management Committee he also officiated weekly as a goal umpire reaching A Grade and state level consistently. He spent countless hours waving flags amassing over 800 games, continuing until a few weeks before his passing.

With Doug you got what you saw, an honest straight down the middle bloke. Not tall in stature but looked you straight in the eye at all times. He was not the most eloquent speaker but spoke from the heart when he felt strongly about an issue. Coming from a working mans' background he could mix equally with people across all levels.

A top class tradesman by profession, he would do any amateur football task, always carry it out in his own thorough way without fuss or grandstanding but at the same time not seeking any pats on the back or rewards.

He had a great sense of humour but not at the expense of others. Many of us at interstate football games enjoyed his company, share a laugh, have a social drink and talk about the game.

Doug's contribution to amateur football was long and meritorious. People like him have made out great game what it is today.

He is now with his other great love... his wife Nancy who I know he missed greatly since her passing.

'Framey', you will be sorely missed around the various venues. Thanks for your contribution to our community and our sport. You have left your mark.

WEST COAST EAGLES UNDER 23 STATE AMATEUR TEAM



This years state program saw the continuation of the modified selection criteria where only players 23 years of age and under were eligible to represent our competition.

Being the third and final year of the Triennial Series between the three major Amateur football states in Victoria, South Australia and Western Australia, all states were in with a chance to win the series depending on the results.

This year games were held in Adelaide and with WA having never beaten the Croweaters in their home state, the task ahead of us was daunting.

Once again the foundation of this years squad was made up of players who were still eligible from the 2006 and in some cases the 2005 sides, yet over 80 invited players attended the seven week training program at Claremont Showgrounds.

As it does with any representative side a huge emphasis was placed on talent along with commitment to the program and match day club performances. Prospective players were being monitored by a team of dedicated selectors along with their respective club coaches who offered essentially required quality feedback.

Besides the numerous training sessions, there were the annual night games against the WA State Country open age squad and the Sunday League under 23 year squad, where a narrow loss to the country and a narrow win against the Sunday league were recorded. Both lead up games were very important in our preparation and selection strategies to take on the formidable South Australians.

With a fair amount of rain in Adelaide in the lead up to the match, the ground, which was 6 meters longer than Subiaco Oval, was in reasonable condition.

The first quarter saw a fairly even tussle with WA playing solid direct football and if not for some poor kicking for goal should have lead by more than the 9 points they did at the first break. It was a very physical game yet the WA boys more than held their own and with full forward Blake Ingersole providing a tall target up forward along with lightning quick Andy Piccoli pouncing on anything that hit the ground, WA had started well.

The second quarter was a different story though with the stronger bodied South Australians holding their feet much better in the sloppy midfield where they began to take control of the match. SA dominated the second term kicking 5-8 to just 2-1 and went into the long break 16 points up.

After half time a number of the WA boys lifted, in particular Captain Kane Loxley who kicked 2 great goals, Guy Boudville, Brad Wedgewood and Kris Thompson who were in everything and Dan Hunt and Scott Ward who were resolute in defence.

It was a magnificent fight back with WA hitting the front with minutes to go in the quarter but to the South Australians credit they fought back kicking a goal on the siren.

The final quarter was true desperation with both sides throwing themselves into the contest without fear or favour and to South Australia's credit they finished the stronger and ran out worthy winners.

South Australia would go onto beat the Victorians convincingly a month later to take out the Tri Series with Western Australia finishing a very creditable second.

Once again the State game was a magnificent advertisement for Amateur football and all the players from both states were a credit to their respective competitions

From a coach's perspective I was most pleased for the eight WA players who were awarded All Australian honours, having been selected over the past two years games, to represent the All Australian Amateurs against an open age Tasmanian State side in October. This is a real reward for the best players in our competition and hopefully it will inspire more players from more clubs to try out for future State squads.

The Amateur League should also be commended for re-establishing the WAAFL State under 19 side who had games against the State Country side and the State 16's. There are a number of talented boys coming through the ranks who are certain to figure prominently in future State under 23 sides.



Finally I'd like to sincerely thank John Davies and his Board for once again showing faith in me this year and in particular League Chief Executive Officer Brendan Cullinan, State Team Coordinator Peter Grosser and Mr Fixit, Geoff Palmer whose tireless support has been fantastic.

I'd also like to thank my own team who have been with me throughout the past four years and are significant in the success achieved. Assistant coach/selectors Andrew Maiorana, Trent Cooper and Kym Robertson, Chairman of Selectors Glenn Stephens, Property Man Extraordinaire Guy Ziati, and runner Rob Durant.

In closing special mention must go to all the players, coaches and their WAAFL clubs as without their input and support, State Representative Amateur football wouldn't be as alive, vibrant and competitive as it is today.

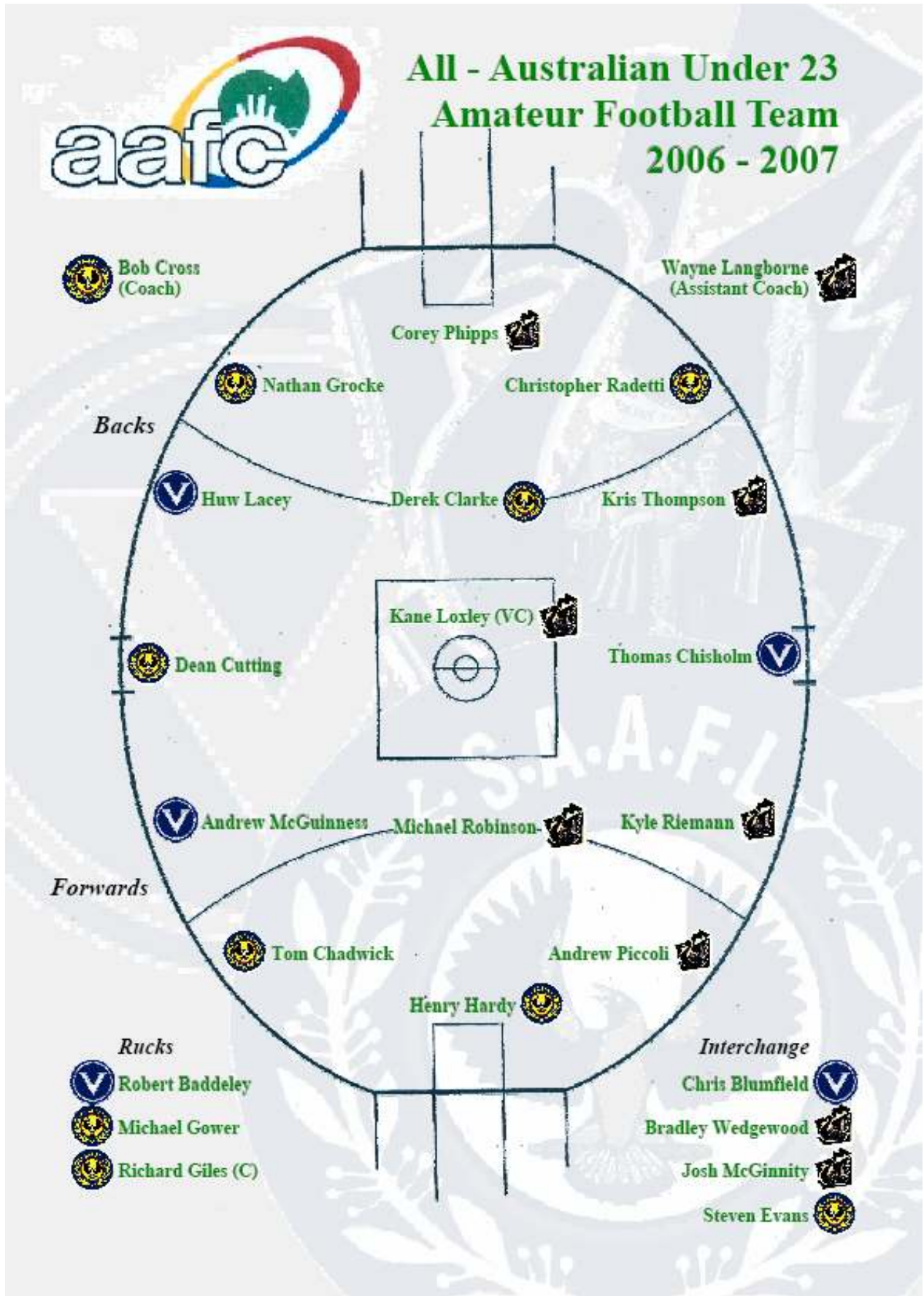

I am delighted to advise that there has been approximately 64 Field Umpires, 125 Boundary Umpires and 20 Goal Umpires being Panel appointed umpire recruits to Senior

Community in season 2007 that were not part of the 2006 panels. These recruited umpires together with existing umpires provided great service throughout the season.

The above recruitment numbers are outstanding. It demonstrates a continuum of successful outcomes in umpire development management in respect to the recruitment of umpires.

Disappointingly, despite two successive years of unprecedented strong recruitment of umpires the challenge of having enough umpires remains. As the game grows this challenge will continue.

Retention of umpires through recognition, respect and sound coaching is the only way forward.

The West Australian Football Commission is to be applauded for its decision to create a new position of a full time State Umpire Coach. This will go part way to assist the retention of umpires.

Darryl Sinclair commenced as full time State Umpire Coach for season 2007 and though this new position is in its infancy, already his support and guidance of honorary senior community umpire coaches has been well received. This support will advance as he establishes himself in this demanding role of leading the whole State in umpire coaching, whilst continuing a key role of providing leadership of the WAFL umpires and WAFL coaching staff.



The tireless efforts of the Senior Community Umpire Coach's including Gavin Levitzke (Field Coach), John Lawniczak (Assistant Field), Terry Tomlinson (Goal Coach), Fred Miller (Assistant Goal), Warren Beckwith (Boundary) and all other match day coaches is to be applauded.

Lead by Terry Battle and Sav Borg (Development

Squad Coaches) the WAFC Umpire Development Squad benefited from their exposure to Senior Community Football and will continue to do so in future seasons.

Des Morgan as seasonally contracted full time Community Umpiring Coordinator shouldered the burden of tasks that are often behind the scenes but not to be underestimated. To logistically coordinate the some 450 umpires he came into contact with over the season was at times demanding but Des's efforts remained outstanding.
