Reporting Structure

This role forms part of the South Fremantle Football Club Coaching Team and is found within the wider football operations team. This role reports directly to the Female Football Operations Coordinator.

Role Statement

Position Objective:

The role of the Youth Girls Head Coach is to oversee all coaching requirements for both the South Fremantle Football Club Youth Girls (16 to 18 year olds) and Development Program (14-15 year olds). The role of the Head Coach is to develop and teach the fundamental skills to members of the South Fremantle Girls Squads; Prepare and implement a weekly training plan for both Squads; and Manage assistant coaches of both programs effectively to ensure the highest possible coaching standards across the South Fremantle Girls Programs. The aim of the Development program is to develop the players' skills to a level so that they have the ability to progress to the standards required for selection in the Youth Girls Squad. The aim of the SFFC Youth Girls program is to develop the players' skills, fitness and professionalism to a level so that they have the ability to progress to the standards required for selection in the highest possible level of football after they graduate the program (AFL Women's Competition, WAFL Women's competition or Highest possible level of community football).

Time Requirements:

- Friday Nights.
- 6 Sessions prior Christmas: December.
- 6 Sessions post-Christmas: January/February.
- In-season weekly training.

- WAFL Youth Girls Match Duties.
- Player and team reviews.

Key Responsibilities

Coaching Activities – 90%

- Oversee the Youth Girls Academy Squad Coaches.
- Prepare and implement a weekly training plan for the Squad.
- Teach Australian Football Fundamentals to players at training using various drills.
- Match Day coaching during WAFL Youth Girls competition.
- Communicate with players regarding their progress, areas to improve & provide feedback on performance.
- Attend all coach's meetings, player and/or parent induction meetings and other club functions.

Other Association – 5%

- To be an integral part of the South Fremantle Football Club.
- To assist in the delivery of key events.
- Other duties as required by the Female Football Operations Coordinator.

Occupational Health & Safety - 5%
