



(Exposed aggregate concrete paver with engraved stainless steel plaque)


LARGE PAVER (ENTRANCE TO BUILDING) - DONATIONS OF \$1,195 AND ABOVE

On behalf of the board I would like to thank our CEO Todd Shimmon and his staff who have worked tirelessly raising much needed revenue for the club and assisting with the move to the showgrounds.

The Board of Directors also has worked tirelessly in what can only be described as a difficult year. I would like to make special mention of Ian Haggerty - for organising the move to the showgrounds, Ken Casellas - for his reports throughout the season, Darrell Panizza - for his leadership of the football department and Jarrod Ryan - for his contribution to the redevelopment of the club premises.

The next two years, 2015 and 2016, will be spent at the Showgrounds. This will be financially challenging for the club due to the loss of revenue and the additional costs from playing away from home. To offset the loss of revenue, I strongly urge everyone to buy a paver and be part of the redevelopment "Claremont on the Park" and the history of our great football club by having your name on a paver in front of the entrance to the club.

The board has now linked the pavers with membership for life and has created a special package for players and ex-players to be part of the club's history and reignite their involvement with the club.

The details are:

Large paver \$1,195 which entitles you to buy two memberships for life. The first membership for life will cost \$500 and the second membership for life will cost \$300

A Small paver costs \$295 plus a membership for life for \$500.

In a special deal for former players a small paver will cost \$295 plus a membership for life for \$400

CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S REPORT

2014 can certainly be put down as a season of change, with the departure of key playing personnel, brand new coaching staff, a move from our sacred home ground to the Showgrounds, and the adjustment from members & sponsors to our new surroundings.

May I thank the Royal Agricultural Society of WA (RASWA) for firstly allowing us to set up home across the road from our Claremont Oval, and secondly for making the players, members and supporters feel welcome. A big thank you to Martin Molony & Peter Cooper for their communication throughout the transition, and their foresight to embrace community football at the Showgrounds.

We hope that we can make it more of a fortress in the 2015 season. Although we didn't reach the heights of our four years over the three grades of football, we did reach the grand final in the colts, and preliminary final in the reserves, only narrowly missed out on the finals in the league.

Michael Broadbridge has come on board as senior coach with a wealth of experience and knowledge in all areas of football management, and although we had a shaky start, the player group started to gel to Michael's coaching in the second half of the year with some excellent results. We hope to see further improvement in 2015.

Well done to Ross McQueen & the colts coaching staff for reaching another grand final and to Nigel Wilson and his development squad for making the finals. Both grades have some excellent talent who will progress to league football next year.

Finally to Dean Horsington, Darcy Coffey and Warren Parker who manage our entire football operations. This year certainly tested their management skills with the relocation to the Showgrounds, and I am delighted with the way we identified problems and provided solutions when the football department was under pressure early in the year. Well done to all involved.

Redevelopment at Claremont Oval

Last year I indicated that we would start construction in March or April 2014. Since then we have had a few setbacks that have frustrated our members and supporters in delaying the start. But I can assure you that the redevelopment committee has been very careful to make sure the football club gets the best possible outcome out of this redevelopment.

We are now finalising sub lease arrangements within our new building and will update members and supporters as these leases are signed.

I can now inform you that demolition has commenced on our famous clubhouse, and we should have a construction company appointed before Christmas. We expect construction to start in late January with completion set for March / April 2016. A big thank you to CFC working committee of Jarrod Ryan, plus our architects Ian Oldfield & Hugh Gill and our project director Denis Marshall for your ongoing support on the redevelopment. In this report is the final designs of our new building for members and supporters to view.

Financials

Unfortunately the Club has reported a loss of (\$109,910) for the 2014 season. \$78,757 of the loss is depreciation of the assets in the old building which has now been demolished to make way for our new facility.

The club received further funding from the WAFC with the alignment model, but that income was eroded by relocation costs to the Showgrounds and loss of income from other funding sources within our old building. (ie sub leases to Aspire Fitness, Katrina Sykes Catering, and use of the facility in general).

Our next 18 months will be very difficult financially while we try to survive without those income streams, but there is a rainbow at the end of the tunnel once we are set up in the new facility.

A big thank you to Marina Manuel & Ken Gray for their work in the financial area for the 2014 season.

Development & District Football

I would like to acknowledge the work of Darcy Coffey & Warren Parker with our country and district development squads throughout the year. The club prides itself on running a very good development program giving players, coaches and parents the opportunity to link into the Claremont culture that starts from 14's development squads through to league football.

Also the continued support we receive from our district staff in Matt McNally, Sam Cousens and Mia Paul-Hunter in promoting our brand in the schools and junior clubs throughout our district.

Marketing, Bar & Administration

Hannah's work in setting up documents and procedures within our sponsorship and marketing area will give us benefits over the next couple of years. Unfortunately Hannah is leaving the Club, but I wish her all the best in her future endeavours.

This year has been a very difficult year for the administration staff with the relocation move. I would like to thank Marina, Hannah & Jess for an outstanding job in setting up events and making the move as smooth as possible for members, supporters and sponsors. I would also like to thank Christian Sedley (bar manager) for

his countless hours of moving stock up to the members lounge. I am sure you are a lot fitter because of this role. Both Marina & Hannah took on workloads that were way beyond the call of duty, and I thank you sincerely for all your support throughout the year.

Volunteers

A special thank you to the following people who lead our volunteer groups:

Ladies Committee — Carol Millband took on running of the ladies committee while still running her own business. A big thank you to Carol for taking on one of the most difficult roles at the football club. Once again Shirley Medcalf, Doreen Powell, Bev Gascoigne were Carol's main helpers and we thank them for their continued support. Thanks to all the ladies who helped out this year.

Monday Maintenance Group — Yes, It changed from Tuesday to Monday with us moving to the Showgrounds. This year we could not have survived without this group of willing helpers lending a hand to relocate, then move back, and now return for the 2015 football season. We had several working bees, and I cannot thank this team enough. My biggest thank you is to our facilities director Ian Haggerty who does an outstanding job in co-ordinating these men every week. A big thank you to Kerry Sprigg for the use of his ute throughout the season.

Past Players & Officials – They look after our colts and running of functions on game day throughout the year. Thank you to John Peddie and his committee for their work.

Royal Show Parking – Thanks to our many volunteers who helped out with parking over the Royal Show. Special thanks to Ron Dingwall who ran the parking for eight days. This is a mammoth task that we have usually left to Arthur Smith, but Ron took over the reins and did an outstanding job. FOOTBALL DEPARTMENT REPORT

2014 was a year of transition. Saying farewell to a host of premiership players before the season had begun saw many new faces enter the group, and the redevelopment of our facility on Davies Road meant a pre-season away from home, most of which was held at City Beach Oval. The new players were not the only new additions to Tigerland with almost a complete turnover in coaching staff. Most notable was the appointment of Michael Broadbridge to the top job.

Despite a positive pre-season the year didn't begin as expected with the league side suffering several heavy losses. A grinding two-goal win in round two provided the only real glimmer of what the group was capable of during this time. The state game following round nine was telling with champion centreman Luke Blackwell the only Tiger to receive a call-up to take on the NEAFL in Sydney. A solid mid-season review saw a change of fortunes with the boys storming home to win eight of the last nine matches and narrowly missing the finals. The influence and impact of the coaching group to this turnaround cannot be underplayed with a big thanks to Michael and his deputies in Brad Trpchev, Des Headland, Chris Bolton, Mike Fountain and Damian McMahon.

The players and entire coaching staff can be commended on their attitude and enthusiasm throughout a turbulent year. Thanks must also go to Ian Haggerty and the Monday crew for their considerable contribution in transforming the Police Exhibition Centre into our home rooms for the season.

During the 2014 league season:

- 38 players played league football
- 13 players made their League debut for CFC
- 10 players made their WAFL League debut

With so many new players in the senior squad eager to impress the development (reserves) side was able to hit the ground running with consecutive wins in the opening rounds. A sterner test against Subiaco in round three preceded a number of mixed results before, like the league side, they finished strongly winning seven of the last eight games. This combined with some early wins helped the boys finish the home and away season in 3rd place and despite a strong 1st semi win against East Fremantle, we fell at the second last hurdle, outclassed by eventual premiers West Perth in the preliminary final. Thank you and well done to Nigel 'Barrel' Wilson on taking the reins of the development side for the season.

This year:

- 60 players played development football.
- 24 of those players were playing senior WAFL football for the first time.
- 17 of those players were graduating colts from 2013.

Another strong colts group in 2014 was highlighted by the selection of eight players in the state 18s squad. Triple premiership reserves coach Ross McQueen took the helm for the season and was ably assisted by line coaches Mark Paris, Chris Payne and Sam Wallace as well as Bevan O'Farrell & Craig Nitschke in development roles. 52 players played colts football in 2014 as the boys made it through to the grand final.

Highlights of the year included the first night match at the Showgrounds in some time with a mid-week round 17 win against the eventual premiers. This game preceded the inaugural colts vs Kimberly game held over the following weekend where 25 players and the coaching staff flew to Broome to play in a match against the best players from our northern zone. Clinics and cultural activities in Bidyadanga and Broome in conjunction with Garnduwa were key components of the trip which was gratefully sponsored by KRSP

Development Squads

The 16s program ran from March through April and was another success for the Claremont Football Club. Coached by perennial development mastermind Mark Paris, the strength of the group was evident as an unprecedented ten players were selected as part of the state 16s squad for 2014. One of those players in Sam Petrevski-Seton was adjudged MVP for the national carnival and has recently been selected in the NAB AFL Academy for 2015.

The 14s and 15s programs culminated in their individual carnival exit interviews. With four games over the October school holidays the future looks very bright for the Claremont Football Club and a thanks must go to all the coaches, support staff, parents and players for their help and assistance.

Country

Our country zones continue to play a significant role with more than a third of our 2014 playing list originally from our regional zones. The Great Southern Football League, Ongerup Football Association, Ravensthorpe & Districts Football Association, as well as the three leagues under the Kimberley Football Association umbrella continue to provide quality services and programs to prepare their players for state level competition.

Both the GSFL and OFA again competed at the annual Landmark championships and 2015 will see all colts from our southern zones combine under the banner of the Great Southern Storm at next year's carnival. This is another impressive step for the Storm program which continues to be the benchmark for regional football development in the state. Led by a team of committed volunteers, acknowledgements must go to Darrell Panizza, Joe Burton, Jen Whittle and the rest of their team for their wonderful work.

In the north the recently departed Michael Farmer must be commended on his contribution to football in the region during his time with CFC, something Brett Angwin in his role as general manager of the KFA has, and will continue to provide at a very impressive level. Farmer has moved to Fitzroy Crossing. Thanks must also go to Garnduwa with Mick Albert and staff in the Kimberley as well as Alan Bishop and Layla Yu in the metropolitan area for their tireless efforts with the players relocating to Perth. This has been of significant value to the players and Claremont.





FAIRYTALE FAREWELL FOR FABULOUS FOUR

Trinity Handley, Matt Orzel, Luke Blackwell and Andrew Foster have decided to draw the curtain on outstanding careers.

Between them, they have notched a total of 497 league appearances for Claremont, combining to take 1708 marks, have 5890 kicks and fire out 3830 handpasses.

We salute these four young men, each an ornament to the game and a true champion in his own right. They will be missed and we thank them for their dedication, their skill and the great joy they have given us.

Their absence will leave a gaping hole in the side in 2015. But retirements are inevitable and the Tigers have a fine record of rebuilding quickly and strongly. The club is looking forward with great anticipation the return of Beau Maister (after a stint with St Kilda) and Ian Richardson (after a year overseas).

The rigours of competing year after year at a high level takes its toll and this wear and tear and the inevitable injuries were the main reasons for the retirements of the Tigers quartet.

The 30-year-old Handley will bow out with a record of 184 league appearances, leaving him in 11th place in the all-time list of Claremont footballers. Extremely professional in all aspects of football, Handley has been an extraordinarily versatile player who has shone as a key defender and key forward. He booted four goals in his only interstate match for Western Australia, against South Australia in Glenelg in 2012.

Along with Blackwell and Foster, Handley is a dual league premiership player (2011 and 2012). Born in New South Wales, Handley came to WA with his family as a young boy and his first involvement with Claremont was as a member of the club's under-9 side.

He graduated to Claremont's under-13 development squad before going on to play in colts ranks for three seasons. And then in his first season in the reserves he was a member of Claremont's losing grand final side. He also had the disappointment of playing in losing league grand final sides in 2004, 2005 and 2007.

Handley, strong, tall and athletic, took a year off to work and play country football with Port Fairy in Victoria in 2010 before returning to Claremont. A born leader with a quiet disposition, he would have played many more matches had it not been for a series of debilitating injuries over the years, including two leg fractures, a broken hand, a broken toe, a fractured cheekbone, groin and thigh strains and various stress fractures.

These failed to dampen his spirit or enthusiasm and in recent years he has developed into a wonderful mentor for younger teammates.

Orzel (29), a powerfully-built, robust and absolutely fearless midfielder, was a member of North Albany's colts premiership team in 2001 before representing the Tigers in colts ranks in 2002 and 2003. He played in the losing grand final against South Fremantle in 2003 and finished second in the club's fairest-and-best award.

He and Handley appeared in their first league match in the round-one fixture against Peel Thunder at Rushton Park in 2004 and he was still a teenager when he played in the losing grand final side against Subiaco that year.

Orzel played in 13 league matches in 2004 and ten the following year before making only five senior appearances in 2006 when he polled 170 votes to be runner-up to Tim Greaney (171 votes) in the club's fairest-and-best award. He topped the poll with 31 votes but was ineligible to win the Prendergast Medal for the fairest-and-best player in the competition. The award went to Greaney with 28 votes. Orzel had been suspended for one week for rough play against an East Perth opponent during the season.

Then he became a permanent member of the league side for the next four seasons before managing seven games in 2010 when the club boasted an outstanding crop of talented midfielders. This prompted him to make a move and he played in 38 league matches for Peel in 2012 and 2013 before returning to Tigerland this year, during which he has been a consistent performer in league ranks.

Advancing years and the responsibility of a young family of three girls, plus the pressure of work as a plumber, were his reasons for stepping into a well-deserved retirement.

The left-footed Orzel has always taken a wholehearted approach to the game. He is a tough, uncompromising, no-nonsense old-fashioned footballer with a strong work rate. His sacrificial acts and pressure skills have made him a valuable and much-loved member of Claremont sides

He has worn the No. 6 jumper with great pride and distinction. His last game was his 117th league appearance for the Tigers and no other number at Claremont boasts so many 100-game players, the others being Edgar Sanders, Jim Reid, Kevin Clune, John Lewis, Jeremy Guard and Brad Wira.

The 27-year-old Blackwell has been one of the greatest recruits in the history of the Claremont Football Club. He is the elder son of 1981 Claremont premiership player Wayne Blackwell, who made 112 league appearances for the Tigers before playing in 110 matches for Carlton.

Luke Blackwell was recruited by Claremont at 22 at the start of the 2009 season after he had been delisted by Carlton where he represented the club in 23 AFL fixtures in 2006 and 2007 before a serious injury (torn quadriceps muscle in his right leg) kept him out of action for much of the 2008 season.

He has been a spectacular success at Claremont and will bow out a champion after 114 league matches. He is modest, unassuming, self-deprecating and a harsh self-critic whose professionalism and exquisite skills have earned him the reputation as one of the finest players in the 89-year history of Claremont.

Blackwell is the epitome of a team player par excellence who shuns the limelight and just gets on with the job with the minimum of fuss or fanfare. Among his chief assets are his ability to think quickly under pressure, his decision making and his proficiency with hand and foot on both sides of the body. His deft pin-point passing has made him the standout performer at Claremont over the past six years.

A member of the side which lost the 2010 grand final by one point to Swan Districts, he was a star in Claremont premiership triumphs in 2011 and 2012. He was the premiership captain in 2011 when he had 28 disposals and played a major role in the 56-point victory over Subiaco. He had 37 disposals and was a clear winner of the Simpson Medal as WA's best player in the first of his four interstate matches --- when the State side lost by 55 points to the VFL at Leederville Oval in May 2010.

He polled 34 votes and finished third to Perth's Ross Young in the 2009 Sandover Medal and a year later he polled 36 votes and was second to Andrew Krakouer of Swan Districts before he went one better in 2011 when he received 42 votes and won the medal by nine votes from Subiaco's Kyal Horsley. Blackwell also won Claremont's fairest-and-best award, the E. B. Cook Medal, in each of those three years.

Blackwell has shown enormous character and resolve to make light of injuries for much of his magnificent career and his battered and bruised body has sent him a timely signal that the time is ripe to hang up the boots. He plans to settle in Melbourne where he will marry his wonderfully supportive girlfriend Kimberley Alexander late next year. He will maintain strong links with Claremont as a talent scout for the club.

He received a three-week suspension in July 2012, but still managed to poll 33 votes and finish eighth in the Sandover Medal. A serious ankle injury (against East Perth at Leederville Oval early in 2013) forced him on the sidelines for 11 weeks. An abdominal injury forced him to miss one match this year when he has shown remarkable courage to continue playing under physical duress.

Foster played 49 league matches for East Fremantle and was on the senior list of the Fremantle Dockers for three years before joining the Tigers at the start of the 2010 season. His final match for the Tigers was his 86th for his adopted club.

A hard-running, creative midfielder and a highlyskilled half-forward flanker, Foster managed just nine AFL appearances with the Dockers because of a damaged right shoulder which required surgery and a debilitating back injury, with a prolapsed disc.

He has thoroughly enjoyed his five years at Claremont and now he has plans to continue his involvement in football in a coaching capacity



REDEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Over the last year we have progressed the Redevelopment to a stage where we go out to tender for the construction of the building in November and we will contract the winning tenderer by December 2014 with construction to start in late January 2015.

The construction period is set for 15 months with completion due for June 2016.

The Claremont Football Club (CFC) and the State of Western Australia acting through the Minister of Lands (State) have agreed that 1789 square

metres of the at the northern end of the CFC site will be sold off by the State to be developed for the purpose of an office building with car park. Up to \$1.5 million from the sale of this land will be placed into a trust account in order to assist with the future maintenance and upgrade of the CFC facility.

We have also been negotiating with sub leases for the new facility, with leases to be signed with Revo Fitness for a new fitness centre with a wide variety of equipment for all ages focused on strength and performance, medical offices for Sports Doctor, Physiotherapist, Chiropractor and coffee shop lease. In addition to the CFC football club use, the facility will be utilised for additional functions and we negotiating a catering lease for the function rooms and training facilities on the 2nd floor.

All up these sub leases will supply the Club with significant income outside of football to help fund our football development programs in the metro and country areas for many years to come.

The Club has met with all stakeholders who will utilise this new facility and we believe with support from Oldfield Knott Architects have designed a building which will be the hub for all sporting facilities within the Western Suburbs. Below are the artist impressions of the final building, we hope that sponsors, members, supporters and players will be suitably impressed with the final design and outcome of our new facility.
