PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is with mixed feelings that I present my report to members for the 2007 season. While the club experienced it successes there were disappointments as well. Perhaps the word that best describes our football season is "inconsistent".

After a slow start to the season there was significant improvement is all three grades. A lack of experienced tall players was certainly evident in a number of games. When we had several of our AFL players available we were very competitive but when we didn't we struggled against stronger sides. It is no coincidence that our best perforamances occurred during the five games when Jeff Farmer was available. What a great contribution he made during this short time.

A number of positives could be taken from the season. We saw the emergence of a number of young players who showed they were capable of playing at league level. Kris Miller and Tim Malseed proved to be very valuable recruits and the promotion of colts players to reserves and league will add depth to our player list next year.

The coaches and support staff are to be congratulated for turning around some disappointing early season performances which enabled all three sides to play finals football.

One of the highlights of the year was undoubtedly the combined function we held with East Fremantle to announce the Fremantle Team of the Century. The manner in which both clubs were able to work so effectively together was very heartening. Hopefully we can do so again in the future for our mutual benefit and for the good of football in Fremantle.

While in Victoria for the interstate game the South Fremantle representatives visited

Len Crabbe to present him with his Team of the Century jumper. Len was too ill to come to West Australia for the function so we had arranged for the presentation to be videoed. This was a very emotional moment as Len spoke very fondly of his time at South Fremantle and of the many lifelong friendships he had forged there. Len and his family were delightful hosts and obviously very touched by the occasion. Sadly Len passed away a few weeks later.

After a distinguished 211 league games career David Gault announced his retirement. David is one of the few players to achieve the two hundred game milestone with the one WAFL club. A premiership player in 1997 David also had the distinction of captaining the side in 2005. David's success is a tribute to his courage, perseverance and loyalty.

Once again it is pleasing to report that the club will post a healthy profit, details of which are included elsewhere. The Board has decided that the next area for refurbishment should be the players changerooms. As a centre of excellence it is important that we provide our players with the best possible environment in which to play and train.

The District Development Committee continues to work effectively to promote football and the South Fremantle Club within the zone. Introducing football for girls was this year's priority. For the first time we were able to field a ladies' team playing under the Bulldogs banner. The ladies finished a very creditable runners up in the reserves competition.

To adequately acknowledge everyone who made a contribution this year would not be possible in a report such as this. However, I would like to express the appreciation of the Board of Management to our managerial and office staff, to our bar staff, our coaching staff



and the very many volunteers who work so tirelessly and selflessly to ensure WAFL football remains a vital and vibrant part of the football system. To our many sponsors, members and supporters who continue to contribute so generously to ensure our club maintains its sound financial status a sincere thank you.

In conclusion may I wish all of the Bulldogs family best wishes for the coming festive season and may 2008 bring us all good health and good fortune.

Members of the South Fremantle Football Club, on behalf of the Board of Directors, I have much pleasure in presenting for your adoption the club's 108th Annual Report.

Congratulations to the coaches, players and officials of all three grades for making the final four this year which is a clear indication that our development programmes are now starting to bear fruit at senior level.

Our football department headed by Marty Atkins has been very busy this year talking to several key position players and midfielders to bolster our playing stocks and to give our emerging talent the support needed to be more successful at league level in 2008.

It was most pleasing once again to have above average crowds attend our home games, with the first semi final and first Friday night derby being our biggest games.

Next season should be a bumper year for crowds at Fremantle Oval with the return of the Foundation Day Derby.

We will endeavour to avoid clashing with AFL games held at Subiaco in 2008 and due to many requests we will commence any Friday night games during the winter, at 6.40pm.

Two major highlights of the year were the Fremantle Team of Legends function held at the Esplanade Hotel, Fremantle in conjunction with the East Fremantle Football Club and the Tribute Dinner to the WA representatives selected in the AFL Indigenous Team of the Century which was held in the Griff John Function Centre in conjunction with the Claremont Football Club.

Both dinners drew a very appreciative crowd of over 400 people to pay tribute to some of Western Australia's greatest players.

The Fremantle Legends team was selected by a panel of experts headed by chairman, John O'Connell and including historian Brian Atkinson and former players Tony Parentich, George Grljusich, Laurie Nugent and Trevor Sprigg. The Tribute Night to the AFL Indigenous Champions was held during NAIDOC Week and was made possible by the efforts of Brad Collard, Richard Walley, Todd Shimmon, Jim Maher, Trevor Walley, Gail Beck, Dave Chesson, Terry Dean and Fred Penny.

Many organisations gave their financial support to enable the event entitled "Adwert Djuripin Jinna Ball at the Port" to be held. The Clive Lewington Medal for our best player in the Foundation Day Derby was won by Kyle Hams. Josh Head won the Neil Lewington Medal for best player in the first semi final and Ryan Murphy put in an impressive performance of goal kicking on preliminary final day to win the Stan Poole Medal. Ruckman Adam Hay won the Simpson Medal for best afield in the state game against Victoria held at TEAC Oval in Melbourne.

Morgan Cooper capped off an outstanding year by winning the Prendergast Medal for best and fairest in the Reserves competition.



Miller's medal double

KRIS MILLER admits his first day as a South Fremantle player was strange. "I never thought I'd see the day when I'd roll up to Fremantle Oval for training as a player so that first training night did feel funny."

Originally from Kalgoorlie-Boulder, Miller made his league debut for East Fremantle in 1999 and played 153 games with the Sharks before moving to the Bulldogs.

"It didn't take long to settle in," Miller said, "and it was interesting to see a different club from the inside."

He and fellow former Shark Tim Malseed made their first appearances for South Fremantle in the round one derby and according to Miller it was just like any other derby – in more ways than one.

"East Fremantle had a lot of players I hadn't played with and didn't even know," he said, "and I didn't leave on a bad note with any of the playing group so I wasn't looking over my shoulder.

"And the derby was normal - I was on the losing side."

Miller believes he was recruited to help cover for the retired Matthew Clucas in the midfield and also to go forward as a goal kicking option. The absence for long periods of Andrew Siegert, Toby McGrath and Hayden North meant he was needed on the ball and he also proved valuable in attack with 26 goals from 22 games. He kicked three goals in a best-on-ground performance in the first semi final win over East Perth.

One bonus for South Fremantle in 2007 was the appearance of former colts player

and Dockers star Jeff Farmer for four games midseason. "I didn't know Jeff but had my pre-conceived ideas about him like any AFL fan," Miller said. "His whole attitude was great, he played WAFL games just like he does in the AFL and it was great to see what he does first hand.

"He got excited, he didn't isolate himself and he's incredibly team-orientated. Jeff would have had more goal-assists in those four games than anyone else had for the year."

Playing under John Dimmer was another 2007 highlight for Miller. "John has got the concept of coaching in the WAFL perfectly," Miler said. "He knows we're fair dinkum but he also realises we're only semi-professional so there are times we just can't be there because of work commitments.

"There has to be a good trust element and you don't abuse that – you don't want to let John down because you know he's looking after your best interests."

In winning this year's Hughes Medal Miller established a new record, he's the first player to win South Fremantle's fairest and best award and East Fremantle's Lynn Medal. He won the top award at the Sharks in 2005 and being runner-up in the previous four seasons.

Miller's grandfather Riley was a member of Perth's grand final team in 1950 and his father Craig also made it to league level at the Demons.

The 2007 Hughes Medal winner sees himself continuing on at his new club for the few more seasons. "I'm 27 and I don't have to worry about getting slower because I've never had to rely on my pace."


Cicco and George Grljusich once again were able to sell out both events which received the accolades of all those that attended.

Veteran sports broadcaster, George Grljusich was post humously inducted into the West Australian Football Hall of Fame on Wednesday 14 November at a testimonial dinner organised after he was diagnosed with terminal cancer in late September.

A 700 plus crowd gathered under a red and white marquee on Fremantle Oval to witness his pre- recorded acceptance speech taken at Murdoch Hospice, four days prior to his death.

George's long time colleagues, friends and admirers paid tribute to his outstanding contribution in the sporting and media professions.

In his extraordinary career, he had broadcast six Olympic and ten Commonwealth Games as well as a total of 39 different sports.

Former ABC Radio workmate, Glenn Mitchell described George as the best multi sports broadcaster in the world.

George became the fourth media person inducted into the Hall of Fame, following on from Dick Buchanan, Geoff Christian and Ross Elliott.

Some of the players from this team have the capability to become regular league players next year if they are prepared to work hard over the pre-season.

I sincerely hope that all those who gave of their time and expertise during the season will reappear again in 2008.

I would also like to thank our full time staff that put in long hours into making South Fremantle the successful club that it is both on and off the field. In particular the endeavours of Marty Atkins should be highlighted. As the majority of those associated with the club wind down in the lead up to Christmas, Marty will be hard at work bolstering our playing strength so that there is plenty of pressure on for spots in the league team.

I would also like to thank the committee of the club, headed by president Terry Dean, for their support during the year and in particular their desire to continually have South Fremantle at the top of the tree. This is an important attribute to have if you want to be a leader in your field of endeavour. I know the playing group and the coaching staff have the same desire and are not happy with bowing out in the Preliminary Final.

In closing I would like to congratulate all of the individual trophy winners who have been rewarded for their efforts throughout the season but hedge my comments with the understanding that the best trophy to win is the premiership, a trophy that everybody at the club shares in. This must become our primary target for 2008.



A facilities grant owed to the club by the WAFC was paid in this year and hence the major increase.

Next year brings new challenges in maintaining club profits and prospects of new capital expenditure on player's facilities. So once again I would like to thank the members and sponsors for their efforts in making 2007 financially successful.



2007 DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT REPORT

South Fremantle Development in 2007 has had a record breaking year! We have lead the state in Auskick growth (5-8 years), player number growth from 5-7 years, overall participation growth, as well as producing a number of quality programs in areas of indigenous, multicultural and female participation.

Our metropolitan District which encompasses an area from Fremantle to Roleystone, down to Mundijong and across to Kwinana, produced an extra 955 new players this past season alone. An outstanding achievement considering our total playing numbers including Auskick (5-8 year olds) in 2006 was 3,326 and this year we had 4,286, a 29% increase in participation.

These results were only achieved by the exceptional work of the South Fremantle District Development Council, the South Fremantle Football Club and the hard working Development staff in Bradd Gardiner (District Development Manager), Jason Burton (Development Officer) and Scott Pontague (Development Trainee).

We have 6 core areas which we focus on at development level which our report is broken up into. We have detailed what was achieved under these 6 headings.

1. Continuous Improvement in Environment and People in the District

• We have had a major focus this year on Coaches and coaching development. John Dimmer and Gary Fuller have run sessions here at Fremantle Oval with junior coaches attending.

• John Dimmer is also working with the District to develop a coaching DVD to hand out to all 150 coaches in our Metro and Country zones. This will be completed by December this year and handed out at the commencement of the 2008 season.

• Coaching accreditation is at 98% across the board in the metro area.

• We promoted the umpiring pathway to students at DHS and SHS in the South Fremantle District and worked with Peter Matier in continuing to recruit and entice back umpires.

• A number of resources were placed on our District website for coaches, trainers, administration personnel and Presidents to assist in the efficient running of their clubs and ensure club volunteers were well aware of best practice in the industry.

2. Promoting and Managing Growth

• Junior age players are continuing to return to footy each year, with an 18% increase in the number of players aged 9-17, adding an extra 12 teams to junior competitions.

• Auskick participation has now reached a massive 1805 participants, with a huge increase of 55% from last year.

• School based Auskick centres were delivered at Mater Christi PS, Leda PS, Beeliar PS, St Jeromes PS and Christ the King PS as a result of conducting over 220 clinicx in our schools reaching over 23,000 students.

• Gerard Wilkie, James Daniels, Toby Prunty and a number of colts players conducted WAFL super clinics and also umpired lightning carnival days for the schools.

• Our School Holiday Super Clinics are still being increasingly more popular each year with a record 400 kids taking part in our July clinic at Fremantle Oval.

• In April we conducted the first ever School Holiday Clinic under lights, a huge hit with the kids as over 260 joined in the fun, despite the atrocious

weather conditions that evening.

• The Bulldogs of the Future Auskick gala night was a major event for the Auskickers from our 14 junior clubs. Over 500 kids played games under the lights on Fremantle Oval in May, with most of them no doubt hoping to one day return and play as a bulldog in the future.

• We conducted direct marketing strategies with letters going directly out to all players in the District encouraging them to play in 2007 and inform them of their closest clubs, as well as registration dates.

3. Reaching new Populations Female Football

2007 saw South Fremantle expand development programs to attract more female participants to our game. The major female initiative was the establishment of the South Fremantle Women's Football Club, which played for the first time in the reserves competition of the WAWFL. Overall about 30 girls made up the squad who fell just 10 points short of a premiership in their first season. The club has its own committee and we wish to thank the President, Sally Allomes who put in a mountain of work to ensure the girls were given the best opportunities to play.

Another part of the female focus was to introduce younger girls to the game. The district's first All Girls Auskick centre based in Atwell attracted a state record 257 girls aged 5 to 12 for the 6 week program. The popularity of this program has allowed us to provide WA's first all female junior competition in 2008. For the first time our junior clubs will enter girls only teams to play each other each weekend in the 10's, 12's and 15's age groups.

Indigenous Football

With a strong indigenous presence in our district an Indigenous Auskick Program was run over 6 weeks based in Kelmscott. Around 50 young indigenous boys and girls took part and were given the opportunity to showcase their fine skills at half time of the Fremantle Dockers v St Kilda match at Subiaco Oval during the AFL's "Indigenous Round." Jeff Farmer also joined the kids for a session which was a huge buzz for the aspiring youngsters.

Multicultural Programs

For the first time we were able to employ a Multicultural Officer for a 13 week period to help us attract more new Australians to football. Luke Silich was instrumental in running a 10 week multicultural program in Kardinya, with around 40 kids from all types of backgrounds coming together to take part in Auskick.

An in school Auskick program was run at Beaconsfield Primary School with special Intensive English Centre students. 75 students who have only just arrived in Australia got their first taste of footy, and also received a NAB AFL Auskick pack thanks to the support of the City of Fremantle.

4. Strengthening Links with Key District Stakeholders

• Memorandums of Understanding between junior and senior clubs has increased with Kwinana Seniors and Juniors combining to become one club and maximise the volunteer and player base they both have and Kelmscott working closely to together to reach common goals.

• School Ambassador Program is going very well with the District increasing from 41 to 51 school ambassadors. The continued strengthening of our relationships with the schools is an integral part of the future growth in our area.

• Senior clubs in District are becoming more familiar with the structure and are now starting to work with the District.

5. Facilities and Grounds

• The commencement of lighting and facility strategic plans with a number of senior and junior clubs were activated which include Kwinana, Fremantle Hawks, Centrals, Kelmscott and Cockburn.

• All of these clubs are either in need of a facility or lighting upgrade and the District is working with all these important stakeholders to achieve what is best for football in the long term.

6. Player Retention

• A number of night fixtures were organised for youth games to assist teenagers with the difficulties of work commitments and study. Youth players enjoy Friday and Saturday night games, especially at Fremantle Oval.

• Focus on youth coaches in regards to quality and accreditation proved to be successful, with strong numbers seen in a majority of youth teams.

Warriors Program

16's

• The 16's squad coached by Graham Cornell did well winning 3 of their 6 games throughout the carnival. We had 4 boys successfully make the transition from 16's to the South Fremantle Colts. The Melbourne tour was a fantastic success. Took a squad of 40 players and 21 adults across and the boys played two games and won both. Attended 4 AFL games at the MCG and Telstra and also visited 2 AFL clubs in the Kangaroos and Essendon. Extremely rich experience appreciated by all.

14/15's

• The program is just coming into the WAFL carnival part as we go to print. The 14's are being coached by Arthur Maskos and Mark Pashby and the 15's by Paul McGrath and Warren Mosconi.

• The 15's had 7 sessions throughout the season and this was to help develop a special skills set as well as life skills, which included a talk from Olympian Kyle Vanderkyp.

State Representatives

• Congratulations go to Jarrod Ciesla, Brandon Matera and Rowan Pickett for their inclusion in the State School boys.

• Congratulations to Damien Haywood, Anthony Collica, Mitch Carter and Mitch Marsh for their inclusion in the State 16's.

Country Servicing

• South Fremantle hosted a School Holiday Super Clinic in Katanning in April, where South Fremantle players and development staff conducted clinics for over 50 kids.

- Provided bi-monthly football budget articles for the UGS.
- Conducted clinics at Exmouth DHS, Carnarvon DHS and St Mary's PS.

• "Gascoyne Bulldogs", the new development side from Carnarvon and Exmouth played against the Shark Pack from Geraldton in the curtain raiser to Souths game in Carnarvon.

• Upper Great Southern Rams competed in the Country carnival in the July school holidays and were all richer for the experience.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST OCTOBER 2007

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views). The financial statements have also been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial statements.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost or at independent or directors' valuation, less where applicable any accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal.

Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those entitlements.

Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in at call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months, net of bank overdrafts.
