

September Dinner Meeting

Guest Speaker John McGuire gave a brief summary of his life growing up in WA and stated he was a proud Balladong Noongar elder. He grew up in the country towns of Quairading and Kellerberrin and is one of 11 siblings. John was home schooled until he won a scholarship to Guildford Grammar and was very appreciative of his family for his great upbringing. Upon graduating, John started working for the State Government and for the last 15 years he has worked at Sandfire Resources. He endured many a racial slur in his early days in Quairading and won every fight by 250 metres. His dad once saw him push a player at half time and told him never to that again. His dad said to take it as a compliment if he was abused as it meant he was playing well. He noted the better he played the more he got. His mantra when vilified was to say to his opponent that a lot of people are here today watching, and a black fellow is kicking your arse. His dad was a legend who gave him confidence. John was a talented all-rounder excelling at both football



and cricket. He played football with East Perth from 1973-1979 and at Perth from 1980-1983. He totalled 112 League games. He played cricket at Mt. Lawley for 23 years playing in 249 games and at Willetton for 18 games. He won five flags, and six ODI's and his highest score was 199. He is the second highest run scorer in Pennant cricket – scoring over 12,000 runs. The other person ahead of him played in the 1920's. He was in the State Cricket Squad and captained an aboriginal team for Australia in the 1988 Centennial celebrations in England. He also won an Advance Australia Award in 1992.

- Denver Grainger-Barras gave an insight into his life thus far. Growing up in the hills he attended Gooseberry Hill Primary School and then transitioned to Helena College for years 8 and 9 before moving to Darling Range SHS in year 10 where he completed his ATAR. He played for Kalamunda JFC in his junior years and has been involved at Swans since the age of 12. He made his League debut in 2019 but injured a shoulder and missed most of the year. He is looking forward to the prospect of been drafted into the AFL and doesn't have a preference of where he goes to.
