# INTRODUCTION

Since 2015, the Starkick All Abilities program has been supporting and providing opportunity for children with disability to play football at community clubs across Western Australia.

The annual Festival of Football invites Educational and supported learning Primary School students from across the wider Perth and Peel regions to a one-day carnival that focuses on participation, fun and friendship.

All games played at the Carnival are a modified, non-contact version of AFL, allowing students of all abilities the opportunity to participate and enjoy themselves in a fully supported environment.

The Carnival seeks to celebrate sportsmanship, teamwork, fair play and inclusion through sport. We are driven to deliver on WA All Abilities Football's Starkick motto - "If you want to play, we'll find a way".

A perpetual shield or trophy will be presented to the school that best demonstrates these values throughout the carnival.

## Costs

There are no nomination costs or fees for schools participating in this event.

We wish to acknowledge and thank the SEDA Group Sport, Business and Leadership Program who are partnering on this event. SEDA Group students have undertaken a range of fundraising initiatives to ensure all costs incurred in hosting this carnival are covered.

## Lunch

All participants and staff will be provided a sausage sizzle lunch.

Meat products utilised shall be Halal certified.

To assist with planning and to minimise waste, attendee numbers must be advised at time of nomination.

## First Aid

All medical issues are to be attended in the first instance by the individual's school staff.

Event organisers will provide a First Aid Officer for additional support. Any student receiving First Aid care from the First Aid Officer must in all circumstances be under the direct supervision of a school staff member that is familiar with the student's relevant medical history and any specific needs are communicated clearly.

## Clothing and Sun Protection

Sporting attire with sandals are recommended. (Football boots optional)

In the event of a school uniform colour clash between teams, “playing BIBS” will be available for use from the event Coordinator / Timekeepers Marquee.

Schools are responsible for providing their students with sunscreen throughout the day.

Shade is limited at the venue and schools are strongly encouraged to provide their own marquees / gazebos.

## Photo Permission

Due to numerous schools, media outlets and other guests taking photos, any student that does not have photo permission is required to wear a bright coloured wristband which is highly identifiable.

Alternatively, wristbands will be available to participating schools prior to the commencement of the carnival from the event organiser's marquee.

It is the responsibility of each school to ensure that they have the correct photo permission for their students, and any students requiring wristbands are wearing those at all times.

Schools taking photos or video for their own use, please observe this process to ensure any children wearing a wristband are not included in imagery shared publicly or otherwise.

## Weather

School representatives will be notified 24 hours in advance if in the unlikely event the Carnival is required to be cancelled due to extreme weather.

## Rubbish

Schools are responsible to keep their designated areas free of rubbish during the Carnival and when they leave at the end of the event.

## Risk Management

Schools are required to keep their own records of attending students and staff and follow their own risk management excursion plan.

## Staff Team

In the event of uneven teams, we ask schools to please nominate two-three staff willing to participate in a backup 'staff team'.

If required to be activated, this team will ensure games continue throughout the carnival. Please note, there is no guarantee that teachers will play a game.

## Perpetual Trophy

The Carnival seeks to celebrate teamwork, fair play and inclusion through sport. We are driven to deliver on WA Football's Starkick motto "If you want to play, we will find a way". # CARNIVAL KEY RULES & GUIDELINES

## Objective

The objective of the carnival is to create an environment focused on participation, fun and friendship through the sport of Australian football.

Teachers and staff are encouraged to help facilitate this objective by taking necessary accommodations to ensure every child is involved in games. This may include ensuring students who are more enthusiastic in participating being encouraged to share with their teammates OR it may be teachers helping to facilitate each child's participation.

Our measure of success is not the numbers on a scorecard, but the smiles on the children's faces.

## Team Structure

Teams shall be comprised of nine players on the field at any one time with a limitless rotating interchange. We would suggest team sizes of 10 to 12 players as ideal to maximise participation.

## Field Size

The playing field shall be a rectangular shape, approximately 60 metres (length) x 30 metres (width).

## Equipment

Matches will be played with a size #1 soft touch synthetic football. All footballs and game equipment will be provided by event organisers.

## Umpires and Additional Team Support

SEDA Students will be assigned to each team to umpire and assist participants throughout the day.

Teachers are asked to please welcome and support the SEDA students as they build trust and rapport with the players in your schools team(s).

# GAME PLAY

The general rules of AFL football apply, however the focus is participation and fun for every participant. Children will be encouraged to kick or handball the ball, however if that is not possible for some participants, they will NOT be unduly penalised for disposing of the ball with other methods.

Players should at all times be encouraged and praised to share with their teammates.

## General Rules

1. 15-minute games (no half time). Teachers shall agree direction of play for each team prior to game start.
2. The game shall be started by a ball-up between two centre players of similar size. This should be shared between players throughout the game. Players not involved in the ball-up must not be within one metre of the ball up.
3. After a goal is scored, play is restarted in the centre. If a point or behind is scored the ball is required to be kicked back into play from between the goals by a nominated defender.
4. To encourage sharing, where possible, goals should only be kicked by players in the forward zone (which will be laid out within the field).
5. Out of bounds - a free kick is generally awarded to the nearest opponent. This is also an opportunity for the umpire to give a possession to a player who may not have had as many opportunities as others.
6. Possession rule - the ball is possessed by the act of (marking) catching, grabbing or placing two hands on it when it is on the ground. Once the ball is possessed, all other players must back off to allow the player with the ball opportunity to kick or handball uncontested.
7. Non-contact - no deliberate bumping. No deliberate contact of any kind permitted. A free kick will be awarded.
8. Marking the ball - any reasonable attempt to catch the ball directly from a kick, irrespective of distance travelled will be deemed a mark.
9. Distance run - while a player in possession of the football is moving, the player should be encouraged to dispose of the ball within 10 metres (umpire discretion to encourage team play).
10. To stop congestion, umpires to instruct players to stay in their zone.
11. Other rules and laws – above all else we aim to have fun and include everyone.
