

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Directors, I have great pleasure in presenting my 9th report as President to the members of this great club.

In last year's report I wrote "and how does the peak body of WA Football congratulate us for back to back league premierships?

"Something has to be done "Taylor said. "Recruiting restrictions at the top end and looking at ways to help teams like Peel have to be considered". Unbelievable, disrespectful and unforgivable on the night of our

great premiership success. This WAFC leadership drove the social media commentary that has been so damaging to this club and our people and of course deeply damaging to the reputation of the WAFL competition. Those restrictions have just been lifted for 2021 however we cannot forget or forgive the WAFC for their appalling lack of judgement – ever!!

Looking back on our season, how much did this impact our club? Certainly, our supporters felt cheated, disrespected and some of them made to feel winning was not applauded by many in WA Football positions of power. Some of that lingered into the 2020 season and must have rubbed off on players, coaches and staff.

What a year we had this season! When football and all other sports went into a halt, panic reigned. Initially, our survival was at stake, the projections were alarming and good news was impossible to find. I'm sure many in the room had similar experiences in their business or with friends or family!

What was really interesting to come out of the season length, football department costs and player payments 2020 restart negotiations between WAFL Clubs and the WAFC was the length of the season. It was very possible to play a 10-game season plus finals, however teams would have to play two other teams twice to allow that to happen. The interesting bit was that both the eventual grand final combatants refused that 10-game model simply because they were to play us twice! Can you believe that?

CEO Peter Capes was largely responsible for negotiating the COVID season and encouraging the WAFC and other WAFL clubs to keep a season alive when most just wanted to close up because it was too hard, too many unknowns and too much work. Well done to Peter and Scott Baker and others at the WAFC for taking a proactive stance and getting 2020 moving.

Chasing three in a row for the League was a great challenge given the longest preseason in history, over eight months! That length of preseason is not the new normal, players & coaches needed to pivot and be nimble, everyone's mental health was sorely tested in these COVID times.

And although we didn't get in the finals this year there were many exciting moments. We played 36 players in only eight games and seven of those made debuts.

The Development Team and Colts both finished second and played finals so well done to both groups. The Colts went one better and not only qualified for the Grand Final but played brilliantly to beat Claremont and claim only our fourth ever Premiership at Colts level. Well done to Chayce and Dicko and their staff and of course the playing group led by Connor Patterson.

Every year we simply have to improve our club, bringing in coaches, developing players and making sure all our people love being here. That makes Subi better and that is a great reflection on everyone here.

Beau WARDMAN has been reappointed as our league coach for the next two years and his team of coaches along with Beau provide us a great launching pad for 2021.

ONGOING SUSTAINABILITY OF THE CLUB

This year will be our best financial result for four years given that in early April a \$500k loss was the projected outcome the board was faced with at that time.

Thankfully the work done by our Finance team of Nathan O'Connor, Peter Capes and Debbie King guided the club from disaster to a position where we can continue to reform our purpose and business model.

CEO REPORT



After such a magnificent Premiership season that was 2019, did we really expect the upheaval that was to follow. Unprecedented may cover it.

Much has been written and said about the WAFC imposing penalties on our club after winning the premiership. It was a disgrace then and nothing has changed that view even now that those penalties have been removed for the 2021 season. It is impossible to gauge the impact it had on our players and coaches, however our past players, members & supporters have been incensed about this

issue and that is something we will not forgive the WAFC.

COVID-19 IMPACT

Then of course the world was turned upside down by the COVID-19 crisis. We were preparing to play a round of practice matches the same weekend as AFL round one when on the Friday afternoon a meeting of WAFL Clubs and the WAFC made the decision to halt all playing and training.

The players and coaches were all gathered the following Monday where announcements were made that the season was on hold, access to the club was no longer allowed and group training sessions were stopped immediately. It was a huge shock and had a very big impact on everyone involved.

Initially all clubs faced a financial disaster and a race for survival that was only saved by Job keeper payments and cash flow boosts via tax concessions. This was followed by support announcements by the WA State Government and the City of Vincent providing direct support to the club. Without these measures the WAFL competition could not have even been a consideration.

With clubs closed, staff stood down or working from home, the chances of any season at all appeared remote during April and May. Discussions then commenced with Clubs about what appetite they had for games and what capacity the industry had to fund game expenses, players, coaches and other staff. Especially since there was no prospect of generating revenue from crowds at games or through bars, functions and events. A range of different models were floated and the whole industry was working together to share information from government and what possibilities existed.

During that process, the SFC and the majority of the other WAFL clubs strongly wanted to play a season although the commitment, the acceptable level of risk and capacity to do so varied significantly. In the end, to play any games at all, all clubs agreed to a set of rules and financials that met the demands of those most unwilling or unable to take any financial risk. Well done to WAFC's Scott Baker and Luke Sanders for their work in supporting clubs to get the season underway.

Just on a tangent, we never want to hear these words and phrases again – unprecedented times, flatten the curve, all in this together, lockdown, hard border, contact tracing, new normal, social distance, nimble, self-isolate just to name a few.

WA FOOTBALL SCANDAL

The off field has been dominated by the scandal of the famous WAFC leak of its entire staff payroll and the ensuring witch hunt which was played out in the media.

The leak caused major embarrassment for the WAFC through back page headlines and lines like "WAFC pays \$9 million to its 134 staff, with 23 pocketing at least \$100,000"

The scandal led to significant change at the WAFC as well as the Minister for Sport, Mick Murray announcing a WA Parliamentary Public Accounts Committee hearing into the WAFC. The West Australian comments at the time included "The administration, it must be said, deserved to be embarrassed, it also reflected a bureaucracy that has become bloated and overly centralized" We couldn't agree more and made similar comments in our submission to the Public Accounts Inquiry. See our full submission in this annual report.

The PAC will report around the same time this annual report is published. Our hope is that by then pressure is still on the WAFC to continue to decentralize programs such as the talent pathway and even some community engagement programs that are best delivered by clubs closer to the community.

SFC OPERATIONS

Our staff have been great considering concerns about job security, stand down, office closure, reduced pay and hours and then working from home. I would like to thank everyone for their contribution, they have done a great job.

Particular thanks to both Zac Acott and Deb King who both stepped up in a crisis to manage key aspects of our business.

Well done also to Mack Sheppard for his COVID Safe plans and being available when required and for his hospitality team including long time staff in Paul and Susie.

Our football highlight came in the form of the Colts Grand Final victory and well done to all those involved. Also worthy of a mention was the Reserves team's excellent year and another push into the finals.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

Some of the game day and event highlights during the year included;

- · Colts Premiership well done Dicko and Chayce
- The WAFLW and the Subiaco Football Club Women team finishing minor premier and playing in the Grand Final.

- The WAFL Grand Final at Fremantle Oval would have preferred Leederville but still?
- Launch of the Lions Foundation our community engagement vehicle.

KEY CLUB STRATEGY

Sport in general and WA Football in particular, is facing a very tough time now and into the next few years and no doubt this Club will be impacted.

We must all now be aware of the significant challenge we have faced over the last few years. The future for us means we must address all the following key issues during next year and beyond.

- Lions Foundation growth and funding sources and then an ongoing strong link and benefit stream for the SFC then incorporating a strong community engagement activation.
- A "One Club" model for the Subiaco men's and women's teams.
- Greater level of support for donations via the Australian Sports Grants platform
- Ongoing support for the AFL hospitality opportunities we have developed at AFL games.

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

The core of our club is the football operations staff, coaches and players that continue to set high goals, to work together and never take things for granted. Our list management is always critical given our club direction to develop our players promoted from Colts and Reserves emerging talent. The key platform to our list for a few years has been identifying players undervalued and not getting regular league games and that continued again this season.

In addition, let us hope we can minimize player retirements and recruit smartly so that Beau and his team can again drive us to success in 2021.

TALENT & DEVELOPMENT PATHWAY

What a team that Chayce Creedy and Kristian Dicton have become. These leaders showed they have a bright future after guiding the Colts and Futures through a highly successful 2020 that will provide our senior program with a flow of quality players in the coming years.

They have been well supported by many aspiring coaches and support staff that provide the teams in the pathway with a great learning experience during their time at the club in addition to development of their football.

SPONSORS

Thanks to Holman Industries as our major partner and to also see Managing Director Wally Edwards as a regular at home games.

In addition, we welcomed the North Perth Community Bank and Chair Nick Catania as our major community naming rights partner.

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT



Season 2020 was like no other season in WAFL History. When pre-season rolled around in November last year, the players, coaches and staff were ready to Unleash the Beast and launch an attack on the competition in a bid to win their third successive premiership. Restrictions were placed on the club in terms of our recruiting abilities and players were determined that whatever stood in their path could be overcome. A strong pre-season had been completed and the night before our

first competitive match against competition, COVID-19 struck. Players, coaches and staff were forced to stand down, leave the club and wait. It was an unprecedented time and one that would have major ramifications for the club and the competition.

During this time, players and coaches went online for regular catch ups, education sessions and information sessions that kept everyone connected and in good spirits. Our coaching staff's ability to continue to keep players motivated, informed and on track was paramount to our return to training and playing. Players trained in pairs before moving into groups of 10 then 20 and finally as a full squad in June. The WAFL Competition would resume on July 18th in an eight game season with shortened quarters and a top four finals series.

Our season unfortunately would not go to plan in 2020 and Subiaco would not defend their premiership and despite a nail biting season finish, the Lion's finished in 6th position and missed out on a finals series, our first time since 2013. Major injuries to key players affected our shortened season but in review, Subiaco moved away from some key areas that have made us so successful in recent years. Our coaching staff, players and Football operations department are determined to ensure this is rectified and the Lion's return to their formidable best in 2021.

Despite the setback of missing finals, the future looks bright with Subiaco Football Club Reserves making a preliminary final under Paul Vines and a young emerging side focused on development and learning. We debuted seven players in 2020, six of which are local products through our talent system in previous years. Kyle Stainsby, a 20 year Colts and League premiership player would take out the Outridge Medal in his second season from Lachlan Delahunty and Captain, Leigh Kitchin. Oskar Matthews moved over to Subiaco from Swan Districts and in his first season would win the Blakemore Medal as an emerging ruckman. The club farewelled Rhys Waters and Ben Newton at the end of this season as they announced their retirement. Ben was a major

recruit for the club in 2018 winning two premierships and adding some class and experience over the past three seasons. Rhys leaves Subiaco with three premierships and has been involved in the club through our talent pathway since he was 14 and we wish them both the very best.

Congratulations to Colts Coach Chayce Creedy, Futures Coach Stuart Page and Talent Manager Kristian Dicton for their successful premiership season in 2020, our club's fourth in history. Their dedication and commitment throughout this season has been immense and the talent coming through in our futures and development squads is a testament to the program and everyone involved. Our transition program continues to build providing Colt's players experience and opportunities in our senior program. Special mention must go to Lachlan Vanirsen who won the Jack Clarke medal, the Taylor medal and the Mel Whinnen Medal in what was a wonderful season.

I would also like to extend my thanks to Sarah Michell, Ashlea Renshaw, Amy Lavell and the entire Subiaco Women's Club for their 2020 season. To make a Grand Final is an outstanding achievement and while the result did not go your way, I know you will continue to push for premierships in the future. Thanks to you all for the hard work you put into your program and the relationship between the Men's and Women's will only continue to grow.

COACHING

Subiaco's League coaching staff remained unchanged in 2020 with Beau Wardman at the helm in his second year. Ryan Redfern continued with the forwards, Nigel Hamilton in defence and Jason Bristow controlled the Midfield. The Club welcomed back premiership ruckman Andrew McDougall who took on the role as Ruck coach.

Paul Vines replaced Matt Cavedon who stepped down into a midfield assistant role as the Reserves coach this year and we welcomed Scott Stanton and Brent McPherson to the club as assistant coaches. Congratulations must go to Paul and the reserves team for taking a young and developing side into a preliminary final.

The dedication of our entire coaching group throughout season 2020, which included the COVID layoff and the return to train and play stage was huge. The online communication and the commitment to ensure our players were engaged, motivated and committed were done purely through the care they have for the club and the players. Thank you Beau and our coaching staff and no doubt they will be excited for the challenge of 2021.

STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

Thank you to Matthew Olds, our head of Strength and Conditioning for your commitment to our players in your second year in the role. To James Hughes, Nick Del Borello, Andre Howell and Josh Richards for your tireless work this year. You oversee 60 of our players and your commitment to ensure they all are fit and ready to go on game day is very much appreciated.

MEDICAL STAFF

Due to COVID restrictions and policies in place, our medical staff and trainers went above and beyond this year to ensure we not only complied with the regulations but also kept our players safe and healthy. Thank you to Kristelle Oehlman as our physiotherapist this year, taking over from Craig King. Kristelle



was involved in our Talent and Colts program for three years and has done a wonderful job in her first year in the seniors.

To Kent Morrison, our club doctor, thank you for your work this year on game day but also during the week as you continue to see our players outside of the club and ensure they are receiving the best advice and treatment possible.



FINANCE REPORT



COVID-19 presented a number of unique financial challenges for the Subiaco Football club in 2020. However, I am pleased to report that, notwithstanding these challenges, the club will report a profit for the year.

The positive financial outcome for the year would not have been possible without proactive and decisive cost cutting measures implemented by club management and endorsed by the board. However, it is appropriate to also recognise the broader financial support SFC received in

connection with COVID-19, including:

- Federal government support via JobKeeper payments for employees;

While the financial result for the year represents a very pleasing return to profitable operations, it is recognised that it arose in unique circumstances unlikely to be replicated in the short to medium term. Therefore, the board and club management remain committed to tackling the broader financial challenges facing SFC in 2021 and beyond.

On a personal note I would like to thank my fellow finance committee members, Peter Capes, Debbie King and Basil Fuller for their efforts and support throughout the year.

INQUIRY INTO THE USE OF STATE FUNDING BY THE WAFC

SUBIACO FOOTBALL CLUB SUBMISSION [EXTRACT]

In providing this submission, the Subiaco Football Club emphasises to the PAC (Public Accounts Committee) the three (3) most important principles that must continue in WA Football aside from other changes raised or discussed;

- Football money generated through the stadium arrangements that funds the WAFC cannot be lost to football.
- 2. We support an independent body like the WAFC to govern football in WA.
- The WAFC role must change from a program delivery body to a governance, funding and compliance peak body that empowers industry bodies such as the WAFL Clubs to deliver football programs.

This club strongly believes that football stakeholders such as the WAFL Clubs have lost control of the WAFC and have now seen them become a bloated, top heavy and centralised bureaucratic organisation. As such, they are distanced from their community and wasteful of footballs resources.

In addition to that, the traditional community organisations with a strong community links such as the WAFL Clubs have been isolated by the WAFC; and links through their local junior clubs, schools and talent pathway have been removed.

The WAFC must partner with the WAFL and industry organisations to assist deliver programs that not only empowers them but in turn gets them to engage with other community groups. This multiplies the funding on community projects and engages local key influencers.

Our recent experience with the WAFC and their leadership is of an organisation that is very guarded in sharing information; controlling the detail released and never the full picture. Financial details are filtered and often vague. This raises questions about their openness, transparency, accountability and willingness to truly embrace the WAFL Clubs as close partners. Lack of trust is the outcome.

Accountability and transparency are ongoing themes in most interactions with WAFC leaders. The recent salary leak fiasco where they decided on a witch hunt, hiring expensive consultants that appeared mostly concerned with WAFC reputational damage was amazing. No real concern for the innocent staff and football people being accused of "leaking information" to the media, and in the end, no outcomes that we are made aware of – another avoidable but distressing decision impacting trust.

WAFL Clubs are clear that our future relevance, much like our history, is with our local tribe, our community and the local delivery of football. Not only football, but using football as a vehicle to deliver true community engagement and educational and leadership programs.

Some of the other key issues facing WA Football that have been brought to the attention of the WAFC and industry more widely are;

- Minimal resources & funds available for grassroots football through to the 2nd tier competition (WAFL).
- Volunteering for local football is reducing every year, so the cost rises for Clubs.
- AFL Funding is directed to keeping 18 AFL & 14 AFLW teams afloat instead of investing in grassroots.
- Structure in WA is not aligned, it's delivered in silos that do not deliver high performance outcomes.
- Coach development poor given WAFL clubs are not integral to delivery or support.
- Red tape stifling volunteer appears to be increasing year on year
- Costs increasing to deliver football Players payments WAFL, Amo's and Country, Coaching costs etc.
- Morale in WAFC reported approaching alarming levels.
- Community understanding of player pathway & WAFL club Relevance within this due to clubs being removed from community football development.
- Lack of leadership. It's a disastrous indictment of the leadership that the government is undertaking a public inquiry of the WAFC.
- Failed central model. The WAFC has inadvertently continued to supress WAFL clubs rather than empower them. Yes, this is clearly a significant challenge, but good leadership would break through these barriers.
- Poor culture in the WAFC. The WAFC's internal research, The Inside 50, confirmed a majority of WAFC staff have little faith in the current leadership and no confidence in the organisation. I would strongly suggest that this also mirrors the views of the WAFL clubs. Culture isn't formed overnight. It's organic and develops over time.
- WAFL clubs must re-purpose quickly to survive. Decreasing traditional football revenues including potential WAFC base funding will cause increasing pressure on clubs.
- WAFL clubs continue to rely on the 'last WAFL generation'.
 Clubs need to build new audiences.
- Ageing and inconsistent WAFL Club facilities not assisting in the re-birth of community engaging hubs and supporting a strong second tier competition.



VALE

Subiaco Football Club was deeply saddened by the news of three great Subi personnel passing during the 2019/2020 year.

Life Member and Die-Hard Ron Jarvis passed away in early December 2020.

Ron played 129 games for Subiaco (1952-1959) and captained the Club in 1955. He was described as a stubborn defender and a grand clubman. Jarvis was runner-up in the 1953 fairest-and-best award.

Matt Barber, Subiaco's fitness-guru passed away in October 2021.

Under Peter German, Matt was key in leading Subiaco through their glory years, in a decade that produced four flags, nine top-three finishes and a host of AFL recruits.

The club and the wider-community was saddened by the passing of Jake Ryan in October 2021, after being struck by a train while running in Italy.

Jake played 12 league games and 26 reserves games between 2004-2006 and was part of the WAFL Reserves Premiership winning team in 2005.

Peter German coached Jake while at Subiaco from 2004 to 2006.

"He was the life of the party, he was outspoken, he was passionate, he was caring, he was popular," he said.

"When you think of Jake, you can't help but have a smile on your face, how he lived his life (to the full)," said German.

Our deepest sympathies go out to all three families and friends.

RETIREES

FINAL SIREN SOUNDS FOR TWO PREMIERSHIP STARS

Subiaco Premiership star members Ben Newton and Rhys Waters are set to call time on their respective careers after a total of 142 League games for the club.

Ben Newton was drafted by the Port Adelaide Football Club with pick 35 in the 2010 National Draft, playing four games between 2011 and 2014. Newton was then recruited by the Melbourne Demons, where he played 13 games in the 2015 and 2016 seasons before calling time on his AFL career and joining the Subiaco Lions.

Newton quickly established himself as a star midfielder of the WAFL competition, averaging 18 disposals and nearly a goal a game across his 34-game League games with the club. Originally recruited by South Fremantle from the Mundijong Junior Football Club, Newton became a two-time Premiership player for Subiaco in 2018 and 2019.

Newton starred in the 2019 Grand Final win against his old club; amassing 25 disposals and kicking a goal as the Lions won their second consecutive premiership and asserted themselves as one of the most dominant teams of the recent era. Newton played every game for the club in the 2020 Season, averaging more than 16 disposals per game as he continued to perform his role strongly.

Rhys Waters was originally recruited from the Sorrento Duncraig Junior Football Club, coming through the Subiaco Football Club u14's development program and debuted for the league side in 2011.

Throughout his footballing career, Rhys also represented WA in the WA State Nationals 18s (2011) and WA State Nationals 16s (2009).

Waters played 108 league games for Subiaco across nine years; kicking 138 goals and averaging just under 13 disposals per game.

The 26-year-old finishes his time at the club as a triple-Premiership player in 2014, 2018 and 2019 while also playing in the 2016 Grand Final loss.

Both players have been a part of a very successful period for the Lions and the club thanks them immensely for their services, wishing them all the best in their future endeavours.





HORSLEY HANGS THEM UP

Multiple Premiership player and four time Outridge Medallist Kyal Horsley calls time on his career following the 2020 season after leaving a lasting legacy at the Lions.

The powerful midfielder calls time after 207 games for Subiaco across 12 years in the WAFL.

The 33-year-old was an outstanding sportsman in his youth in cricket, hockey and football, making his senior debut for the Kalgoorlie City Football Club when he was just 16.

Horsley debuted for the Subiaco Football Club in round 16 against East Fremantle in 2007, hitting the scoreboard with two goals and finishing with 21 disposals.

Kyal Horsley is undoubtably the greatest Subiaco and WAFL player in the 21st century, winning five of his nine grand finals, recording three second-place Sandover Medal finishes to record a total of 241 Sandover votes; whilst also winning four Outridge medals and a Simpson medal in the 2017 Grand Final v West Perth.

In 2012, Kyal was selected by the Gold Coast Suns with their pick #2 of the rookie draft, before being elevated from the Rookie List. Horsley played 13 games for the Suns in his debut year, being awarded the "Most Professional" and "Iron Man" Award at the club's best and fairest.

After averaging 16.6 disposals a game for the Suns, Kyal was delisted by the club after enduring a mid-season ACL injury in 2013.

Throughout his Subiaco league career (2007-2011 and 2014-2020), Horsley amassed a massive 4,772 disposals (ave 23 disposals per game), 608 marks, 656 tackles and kicked 116 goals.

Horsley has had an influential impact on the Club across the past 12 years, bringing a new standard of professionalism and team culture; setting the benchmark for future years. During his time at Subi, Kyal was able to show both his strong leadership styles and passion for football which lead him being a part of winning five WAFL grand finals.

Horsley is the third Lion to retire in 2020 after Rhys Waters and Ben Newton.

The Club wishes Kyal all the best for his future endeavours.

DISTRICT FOOTBALL REPORT

Season 2020 was one unlike any other and will be one remembered for many years to come. It was always set to be a ground breaking season with the move to a simpler governance structure with enhanced competition management, however just as quickly as the season began it was suddenly placed on hold as COVID-19 began to impact our Community.

In March the idea of reaching Grand Final Day 2020 seemed an impossibility with the season placed on hold and WAFC staff stood down. For several months our dedicated Club Presidents and their Committees were challenged with the task of maintaining a connection with their players, families, coaches and volunteers through virtual means only. Without the possibility of physical contact or training groups our Clubs had to reimagine how football can connect with the Community and our Clubs did a sensational job of thinking outside the box.

As the pandemic continued to evolve restrictions were slowly lifted and we were given the green light to recommence group training - much to the delight of thousands of players who had also missed not only training with footy friends but also attending school. Thanks to the hard work, flexibility and dedication of the WAFC staff, Club Committees, officials and umpires we were able to hold a successful season – albeit a slightly shorter one than normal.

Season 2020 required significant resilience and patience from everyone involved and those efforts are certainly valued and acknowledged. As a result of the efforts, the Metro North region achieved a 98% player participation retention rate. When many other winter sports faced significant declining player numbers and volunteers, this is an incredible achievement in an unprecedented year.

- Stirling JFC volunteer Mimma Rombola named as WA Finalist for NAB AFL Auskick Volunteer of the Year (based on her nomination in 2019).
- Lions District umpire Ryan Harrison named as Subiaco Umpire of the Year and Metro North Region Umpire of the Year
- A completed Female Football pathway, with the introduction of a Year 11/12 Youth Girls competition.
- Subiaco District clubs once again took part in the Sock it to Sarcoma! round together with Claremont and West Perth Clubs collectively raising more than \$15,000.00 dollars for Sarcoma research.
- Quality Aboriginal football programs with record participation in the Kirby Bentley Cup and Nicky Winmar Cup led by Lisa Cockie and Matt Debarro.

We have been blessed in the Subiaco District to have the outstanding level of professionalism shown by all of our Clubs Presidents and their respective committees. Their tireless work and desire to embrace the Lions District culture and all it stands for is one of the reasons we can provide the outstanding competition we have for our players today and working to develop quality clubs within the community. Thank you to all of our Presidents and particularly to those that have reached the end of their presidential journey, we wish you all the best.

Without Umpires we would not have a game and they do a fantastic job in what can be a very challenging environment. In the Subiaco District we have been very fortunate to have the quality of Umpires we have, and this is a credit to the Umpire Management and Coaching group that is in place. This season the quality of our Umpires was on full display with Ryan Harrison awarded the Lions Umpiring Group Golden Whistle award, the peer elected Umpire of the Year award as well as the Metro North Umpire of the Year award. Ryan has been a member of the Lions Umpiring group for the last four years and quickly solidified himself as a leader within the squad. The example set by this young man is one that fully embodies the exemplary Lions District culture.

Whilst this season was the first to operate without the Subiaco Junior Football League's Competition Committee, volunteers still play an enormous part in the running of our game. Thank you to our passionate Match Day Volunteers Rosemary Goodin, Ray Buscall and Ian Brotherton who continue to provide support and guidance to teams, coaches, parents and players ensuring a wonderful game day experience for all. They continue to provide valuable knowledge and experience to improve our game and are highly valued volunteers within our Community.

Volunteers play an enormous part in the running of our game however behind the scenes, our WAFC team members put in an enormous amount of work. 2020 has been a difficult season for our staff with not only being stood down early in the season but then having to get a season back up and running in a very short time frame. Thank you to our passionate team of staff. Football is more than employment, it takes a real passion to do what you do both during and after business hours for local footballers, volunteers and stakeholders and the Subiaco District are incredibly fortunate to have such a selfless and hardworking crew.

In what has been a difficult and disjointed season filled with additional challenges and responsibilities, we congratulate all award winners and premiership teams for their wonderful dedication and commitment to their important role in community football. 2021 will hopefully see the return to a more traditional season but we hope all volunteers take the opportunity to enjoy a well-earned break from football! Before you know it, the 2021 season will creep up on us again so stay safe and enjoy your break.
