If for any reason the Annual General Meeting cannot proceed on Monday 26th February, the meeting lapses and is adjourned to the same time on the same day at the same venue the following week.



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Last year saw another period of growth and consolidation for Perth Football League and our member clubs.

On-field, a record 321 teams competed in 32 grades for a total of 2,915 fixtured matches across the season. The ongoing growth of club-based participation throughout the League continues to be underpinned by Women's Football, which has now been embedded into fifty-four member clubs that collectively fielded 69 teams in 2023.

As we continue to grow the game on-field, to ensure the sustainability of our clubs and the League as a whole it is important that we also work to grow the game off-field and provide the necessary resources to support our member clubs – helping Perth Football League clubs and the thousands of volunteers who power them to take advantage of opportunities and manage the challenges that they face from week-to-week and season-to-season.

Two significant initiatives from last year that deserve to be highlighted in this regard were the appointment of a new Club Development Manager role, as well as the creation of a dedicated PFL Umpiring resource. Each of these appointments were made possible through our ongoing partnership with WA Football Commission and are testament to the strong relationships we have built through years of advocacy and the deep sense of alignment and purpose between the WA Football Commission and Perth Football League – in line with our four key pillars:

- 1. Growing The Game and Growing The Pie;
- 2. Adding Value and Building Capacity;
- 3. Selling the Benefits; and
- 4. Running a Tight Ship.

Financially, the League has returned to a responsible operating surplus, underpinned by significant growth in our commercial partnerships and sponsorship income which has enabled the League to recover from the financial challenges we faced together during the COVID-interrupted season. The League's strong financial foundations enable us to invest further in strategic programs and initiatives going forward – 'giving back' and adding value to Member Clubs through targeted initiatives such as the Small Grants Program and the re-introduction of State Football, and building capacity through further investment in club development, resources and support to make the lives of club volunteers more rewarding and enjoyable.

Further investments in resources and strategic priorities into 2024 will be guided by insights gathered from club leaders and other industry stakeholders in a review which was completed over the course of 2023. This review of PFL operations was supported through our new partnership with New Balance and Belgravia Apparel, and saw wide-ranging collaboration with clubs, officials and players, highlighted by a series of round-table workshops which were facilitated with clubs drawn from across the entire metropolitan area, from all grades and of all sizes.

Personally, I would have to say that the highlight for 2023 was to receive such positive feedback from those Club Presidents who took part in these workshops. An excerpt of one such piece of feedback is provided below:

Just wanted to flick and email to say, well done... It was so refreshing to not be talked to, but instead be asked what is important to my club, and be heard. It was also great to interact and work collaboratively with other clubs, and listen to what they have to say .

I would like this conclude by thanking our experienced operations team for all their hard work in delivering another outstanding season in 2023, and supporting the thousands of club volunteers who ultimately make it all possible for players of all ages, experience and abilities to enjoy the benefits of participation in senior community football club environments.

As a member-based League, we are stronger together. On behalf of the Board and Staff, we look forward to building on all that good work and the spirit of collaboration from 2023 in the 2024 season and beyond.
