

20 CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

The highlight of the football season was shared by the Colts team which recorded a magnificent grand final victory and the League side qualifying for the finals despite a horrid run of injuries.

Many outstanding footballers have emerged over the past twelve months which is a result of the excellent work our coaches and officials are putting in at our Warriors Development Squads.

BAR/FUNCTION MANAGER'S REPORT





It was gratifying to see that a majority of staff were involved within the district and have performed at a high level during their time in junior football and the Warriors development squads. Peter Robinson and Jason Ireland are products from within these development structures and have performed at an exceptional level to help achieve a terrific outcome. Ex Warrior, AFL and SFFC player Daniel Gilmore was able to bring a fresh young enthusiasm to a coaching group well credentialed in their field. These gents along with Brent Dawkins and Daniel Vidovich provided the program with much of its impetus towards a hugely successful venture that will produce many new opportunities for the players and our club.

The volunteer group had a renewed vitality as they recognised that the program had been given a new focus. They were dedicated to the task as were the players like never before, and none more than the reliable and capable Sue Jones. I wish to thank Sue for her unyielding dedication and recognise her service over the years that we have worked together. Others I wish to thank are Lew Turner, Harry Drygan, Lorne McGuinness and Terry Turnball for their efforts each week on game day. I hope they enjoyed watching the team develop over the year and assure them that their efforts were greatly valued. Our medical group, David Dawes, Linton Davies, Michelle Hellmrich and Dayne Albronda, were outstanding and worked professionally taking care of all the players needs and provided the utmost service to the program and the team.

A majority of the player group were products from our immediate district with some exposure to the Warriors development program over the years. Others were country zone products that took the courageous step to relocate to the city to give themselves an opportunity to play colts football. Although the program was successful in terms of a terrific grand final win, many other achievements were reached by this talented group. Eight players were selected to represent WA in the 18's carnival, Shane Kersten, Steve Verrier, Haiden Schloithe, Brendan Ah Chee, Myles Bolger, Sean Lynch, Adam Carter and Mason Shaw. Mason was the competition's leading goal kicker and also won the Mel Whinnen medal, adjudged best afield on grand final day with seven goals.

The South Fremantle Colts squad lost only two games for season 2011, unbeaten in eleven outings at Fremantle Oval, and winning fifteen straight games from round two through to round twenty. We also played a majority of the list, (47) as we lost players to state duties, injury, and promotion to senior football. Haiden Schloithe and Steve Verrier both made their league debut in 2011. We were proud of the fact that not one player that played during the 2011 season fell below the required level established by the system. On one occasion, with seven debutants, the squad was able to produce an inspiring seven goal win against the second best side, (Claremont) on their home turf. So dominant was the squad that there were eight players selected in the 2011 Colts Team of the Year. Captain Robbie Thompson, Sean Lynch, Jason Maskos, Shannon Burnett, Haiden Schloithe, Mason Shaw, Brendan Verrier and Marvin Warrell all had an impact on the Colts

competition with outstanding seasons. Marvin was adjudged runner-up for the Jack Clarke medal with Haiden Schloithe featuring well with a fourth placing. Haiden was chosen by the colts head coaches as the player with the greatest impact on this year's competition.

It is difficult to surmise the special qualities of such an enormously talented group of young men. Each player showed a variety of individual skill and true grit to make the Red and White jumper feared and respected on the field. 20 LEAGUE REPORT

This time last year I was writing about the number of injuries we had, which saw us tumble out of the four for the first time under my tutelage and that we were hoping for an improvement in fortune for the 2011 season.

There is no doubt that up until February we were looking good. We had an extremely fit playing list that was ready to play quality football and with the inclusion of some key recruits the feeling around the club was optimistic. However, from the very first series of intra-club matches the injury curse reared its head again. And the injuries were serious. Jarred Parry damaged his ACL and Steven Verrier suffered the worst broken nose I have ever seen. Paul Haselby damaged his ankle which required an operation; Scot Thornton suffered a perforated bowel in a reserves scratch match (brilliantly diagnosed by Dr Peter McCarrey, something that quite possibly saved Scot's life) which forced him into retirement. Sam Hunt hurt his knee in the same game, which when combined with other injuries to the same knee also forced him into retirement. Adam McIntosh tore his ACL against Swans, Jaymie Graham's knee injury has been well documented and Adam Guglielmana also went down with an ACL which ruined his chances of playing state football as well as putting him out of the game for twelve months. At one stage we had seven players with long term knee injuries. Chris Bossong damaged his knee in the pre-season and when he returned broke a bone in his foot which ruled him out for the remainder of the year. The loss of premiership players Scot Delmenico and Gerard Wilkie to retirement due to work commitments also reduced our playing depth. Later in the year Paul Mugambwa broke his arm (who bravely came back to play the last two league games) and the promising Nick Borovac broke his thumb (which finished his season).

To offset these injuries we saw the re-emergence of one of our best players after open heart surgery. I talk here about Theo Adams, whose ability to play league football after such a serious operation was nothing short of miraculous. Theo was further tested when he broke his collarbone in a preseason game against Claremont. To Theo you are exactly the sort of player that is admired by everyone, you set a great example for others to follow, your "get on with it" attitude and your devotion to your young family is to be admired. I have also been told that in your labour intensive job you do the work of two men. Theo you are a great person.

Despite the injury setbacks, the players performed extremely well during the season with some spirited performances, culminating in a top four finish after an enthralling final qualifying match against East Fremantle. After the injury to captain Jaymie Graham, co-vice captains Ryan Murphy and Craig White led the team with great aplomb during this testing time. This is the sort of experience that will make them even better leaders into the future.

It was particularly pleasing to note the improved performances of some of our younger group and the emergence of first year players Nick Borovac, Tyler Hall, Adam McIntosh, Brendan Gulley and Damien Haywood, and the arrival of Colts players Hayden Schloithe and Steven Verrier (who bounced back extremely well from his broken nose).

As is always the case, the football season would not be able to take place without the tireless efforts of those working behind the scenes and in this regard I would like to thank everyone who has assisted with the league team over the 2011 season. This includes our many volunteers and the paid staff.

In this regard I would particularly like to thank the coaching group at the club for their efforts this year. The inclusion of Paul Haselby certainly brought some new ideas to the club and helped develop our younger group of players. To Tony Walters, well done on a great job looking after the reserves, they were probably affected the most by the injury toll this year. Special mention must also be made of the effort put in by Nigel Hamilton who sat on the bench each week with his computer and managed our rotations, which would have to be one of the most onerous tasks undertaken in football. It is also worth noting that Jaymie Graham and Scot Thornton, although injured, assisted in the coaching area to great effect. Thank you also to Rob Haddrill who assisted during the year even though his work took him all over the countryside.

A special well done to our runners Gary Fuller (Gary also helping the colts in their finals campaign) and Les Oliveri, who not only ran during each game, but also had an input with training, what champion fellows. Well done to the ever reliable Andy Stone who leaves no stone unturned with his desire

to help in any area required. To Carl Micale, well done on your continued support and to Tony Mollica, who despite ill health during the season, continued to be the best team manager ever. And our property men headed by Sandy Cuccovia and backed up by John Jones (the limes are great Jonesy) where would we be without their behind the scenes work.

To our medical staff, well done on another great year, a year when you were well and truly tested. To Merv Lockhart, Marty Bos, Craig Allen and Dr Peter McCarrey as well as all the other trainers, the playing side of the club would not be able to function without your professional approach.

To our dedicated statisticians headed by Alan Bishop, well done on your efforts. The information gathered is absolutely vital for the coaching of the team.

To our fitness men James Bridle and Cas Gabriels, congratulations on your efforts. The majority of your work goes unseen and a large amount of it is done during the pre-season. The success of your work can be seen by the reduction in soft tissue injuries this year, the result of a well-planned programme, which at times may bore players, but one that is vital in improving fitness and guarding against injuries to key muscle groups.

Congratulations must be given to the award winners at league level. Well done to Ryan Cook on a fantastic first year at the club (hopefully the first of many) and to Ashton Hams for the second year in a row finishing runner up in the fairest and best award. To Kris Miller, well done on your third placing, your ability to find the ball, lead the club in clearances and hard ball gets is a testament to football ability and football intelligence. It is also fitting that Theo Adams received his award, I could think of no more appropriate winner in my time at the club.

I would also like to thank Brent Dawkins for his efforts during the year. Coming into the club as a Football Manager is never an easy task with its myriad set of tasks, communicating with a diverse set of clients as well as the day to day and match to match paper work. It has to be one of the hardest jobs in football. I'm sure you have learnt a lot and will head into the New Year with a greater understanding of the complexities of the job and of the importance you carry in the whole scheme of things.

The economic climate is currently one of great volatility. One only has to look at the ups and downs of the stock market, the uncertainty of European countries ability to carry their debt and the economic woes of the United States to understand the difficult times we operate in. To this end I would like to state publically that the work undertaken by the board of the South Fremantle Football Club headed by President Hyden Raitt and guided by the CEO of the club Brian Ciccotosto is certainly appreciated by the football department.

As I write this report and contemplate the future, I see an emerging group of footballers, boosted by the arrival of some quality colt's players and a core group of mature players who are capable of building on the improvements seen this year and take the club towards another premiership. However, a note of caution must be made. The only way a group of players can improve, is through dedication to the task. This involves a great deal of repetitive training that can at times become tedious and boring, that tests the patience and perseverance of players, that above all else tests how serious they are at becoming the best they can be, and yet, understanding through all of this that the best they can be may still not be good enough to play league football in a quality, successful, premiership winning team.

Football and sport in general can be a harsh mistress. It has its incredible highs, but also its incredible lows. We all must understand this and continually work towards reaching those amazing highs. As the league coach I coach because I enjoy the challenge, the day to day challenge and the year to year challenge. I also enjoy seeing the great excitement on a players face when I tell them they are playing their first game of league football or the enjoyment of presenting a player with an after match award after a break out game. I gain enjoyment from seeing a player gradually cement a place in the league side after years of effort and struggle. Enjoyment is something that I place extremely high on my list of job satisfaction. I look forward to enjoying myself next year.



We undertook tours of AFL clubs North Melbourne and Essendon, the MCG, viewed 3 AFL matches and were entertained by guest speakers which included South Fremantle great Scott Watters, St Kilda and Carlton Rookie listed players Warrick Andreoli and Mitch Carter and current Collingwood player Sharrod Wellingham. This year we were also lucky enough to have a past Essendon Champion Jack Jones take us for a tour around Windy Hill.

The development squad had two victories against St Monica's and Xavier College while on tour. With those games all boys showed great physicality to match the Vic's at their own game winning both of the games. The coaches and I were given an indication which boys can take their football to the next level and which individuals require work in certain areas of their game.

Selected players for the 16's program were asked to train with the Colts side to further their development. With hard work and good performances with the 16's side and his junior club South Coogee, Dylan Main made his debut with the colts.

I would also like to thank, Paul Pirrottina the Midwest, Gascoyne and Murchison Regional Development Officer and Adam Falls the Wheatbelt Football Development Manager for the outstanding work they do for their regional areas. I look forward continuing working with them next year.

20 1 DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT REPORT

The District had a bit of a change in the second half of this season, with long time District Development Manager Bradd Gardiner taking some very well earned long service leave. This gave me the chance to step into some very big shoes and take on the challenges of the District Manager role for the last four months, continuing all the exceptional work that Bradd had completed prior to his leave. Along with Robyn Elms stepping into her role full time and the very capable trainee Tiah Haynes assisting, the 'all-girl' office was able to continue the District vision that Bradd had set up and grow the game.

Although we recorded a small slump in our school numbers for this year after years of growth, we were one of the few Districts to buck the trend and grow over all three sectors in our juniors, with our senior clubs also holding steady. The hard work put in by Chairman Rob Taylor and Competition Director Shane Harding along with the extended DFDC and JCC has proven the South Fremantle District and its competitions are in fantastic shape.

Before I go into some of the fantastic outcomes and future directions of the district, I would personally like to thank Rob, Robyn, Shane, the DFDC, Warren Nel and especially Bradd for all the support they have shown and the faith they had in me in transitioning to this new role. I have learnt a lot and grown in my capacity and enthusiasm to deliver quality programs and innovative development in the District. I look forward to resuming my Development Officer role with a new outlook and drive to succeed.

We as a District pride ourselves on the development of new programs and strengthening of our current ones. We have had many achievements this season and have identified areas in which the District can make some significant improvement in the next few years. I'd like to give you a snapshot of some of the key areas in the District, what we have achieved, and where our future priorities will be.

STRENGTHS AND OPPORTUNITIES

Our strong District Football
 Development Council, ably lead by
 Bradd, Rob and Shane. All our key
 areas in the district have representation
 on the council which we feel give us
 real time snapshots of current needs
 and trends. The Council has
 consolidated these positions in recent

- years which has enabled us to expand our scope within the District.
- Robyn Elms has again evolved her role and is pivotal in the success of the district. She is a vital communication cog between the clubs and competition council and her overhaul of the administration system and district documents has meant we have become more streamlined and effective.
- Volunteer recognition and development again was a high priority in 2011. Bradd's development of the Club Development Night in the last few years has seen it become one of the premier volunteer education nights in football. This year Bradd included streams from which clubs could choose what education was best suited to their clubs. The leadership sessions for both coaches and volunteers, including presenters such as Jason McCartney and State Manager for Junior Football Troy Kirkham were well attended by all.
- Coaching again is a priority in 2011, and will be in future seasons. The Coaching Unit was once again out in the field ensuring coaches had access to assistance and support. Jason Ireland and his team again were exceptional in the service provided to our community coaches. We also had another 6 coach's take the step up and complete a Level 2 qualification throughout the year, most of whom will be imparting their knowledge around the district in 2012. Our junior and senior clubs were fantastic in ensuring coaches became accredited and we saw again 100% accreditation within our junior coaches.
- We are starting to see the funding received last year for facility

- development come to fruition, with a number of lights and new buildings being developed at our junior and senior grounds. Relationships with our local councils are vital in ensuring quality facilities for our clubs and we will continue to work hard with various agencies to ensure that facility development and maintenance is of the highest quality.
- Female football lost its junior pathway for the first time in three years in 2011, so we have gone back to try and redevelop this key growth area, with a new competition scheduled in 2012 for both junior and youth girls. We are also looking to expand on the success of the first ever stand alone All-Girl Auskick centre at a junior club by developing two more in 2012. Congratulations to the Armadale JFC for this achievement and in co-ordinator Amy Potter for being the recipient of the NAB Volunteer of the Year.
- The Quality Club Program also moved from strength to strength this year, with many new clubs embracing the concept and those who were already engaged began the transition to a higher status. The South Fremantle Women's Football Club became the first club in the District and the first Women's club in Australia to become Gold standard, which is an outstanding effort.
- Our school programs, many of them sponsored by local businesses, provided a platform for many to experience AFL. Tiah Haynes has done a remarkable job in providing clinics to over 50 schools in the District. She also has been a great asset in communication with our schools, with our Ambassadors being provided with quality support. For the third time in four years, a South Fremantle School Ambassador walked away with the title of Primary School Ambassador of the Year. Marion Burt from Samson Primary was a deserving winner for her efforts in AFL promotion

 The Districts priorities still lie in assisting our low-socio areas to engage in football, with the district looking at

many options to help deliver and provide programs in those areas.

- Looking to provide a leadership and community engagement program in those areas, to be run through schools and reach out to girls and boys using football as a vehicle in the classroom and out.
- A new website has meant we are able to overhaul our resource base and provide communication and up to date news. The website needs to be utilised more and will be in 2012. A positive in our communication has been the emergence of the use of social media in the District, with Di Smith being instrumental in running our Facebook page.
- Senior club engagement is a huge priority for the District, with the clubs responding more than ever. The relationship between the Junior Clubs, Senior Clubs and Districts is a crucial one, youth to senior transition is a key focal point and the District is implementing resources to assist players and clubs alike.
- Facility Development will always be an improvement area in the District – with constant growth means we are always looking for advancement in our facilities. Again making sure AFL is a priority area in our local government's future planning is key to supporting that growth.
- Lastly, one of the most important areas - our Volunteers. Ways of making the workload easier and more enjoyable is always a focus, as well as opportunities for personal development and education. We want to keep key volunteers working in our clubs and the District, so making sure we provide support and give them the tools to run their clubs efficiently.

It has been a great year in our District, and I would like to thank some of the many people who have contributed so much to our District. Our fantastic District team in Bradd, Robyn and Tiah – Bradd for his fantastic leadership and vision which has helped the District grow and achieve some great outcomes, Robyn and Tiah for their vital support and hard work throughout the year.

To the District Council, all of our members

bring so much to the scope of our district. I thank you all for the hard work you have done this year.

Special mention to our executive DFDC members, Rob Taylor, Shane Harding, Dave Kenny, Fiona Galea, Sharon Greengrass, Mal Hooper and Jason Ireland. Your dedication and work ethic is second to none and you are one of the core reasons our district is at the forefront of AFL development.

To our club committees and volunteers, you are never thanked enough for the work that you do, we appreciate all your efforts over the season.

To our P & D panel, in their second year, grew into their roles and ensured a fair and equitable tribunal system was upheld. To Peter and his panel in Murray, Gary, Stephen and Diane, well done.

To all our sponsors, your contributions mean we can grow the game more than

ever before. Thank you so much for supporting the District and we hope to strengthen our partnerships in the future.

To the SFFC in Lee, Jess, Vido, Dawks, Bob, Cicco, Haydn and the board, thanks for your assistance and support this year – it is always appreciated and valued.

20 TREASURER'S REPORT

Despite an indifferent year on field and off field the club has had a significant turnaround from a net loss result of \$90,649 last year to a loss of \$12,767 reflected in the Audited Accounts at 31st October 2011.

In viewing our Statement of Cash Flow there has been a positive movement in the net cash provided by our operating activities to the extent of \$80,999 off setting net cash used in capital activities of \$39,741. This results in a Net Increase of our cash held by \$41,528 which is a good result.

Bar sales decreased by\$70,000 from last year which in turn decreased our Gross Profit by \$52,000, however with the effect of catering income, TAB commissions and a significant increase in hall hire revenue the overall effect on Bar Trading was a decrease of approximately \$4,000 down to \$64,000 profit

Our marketing income increased from the previous year and shows a net result of \$371,624 a movement of approximately \$21,000. Within this area our sponsorship and advertising increased by approximately \$20,000 and there were various functions that are held in alternate years that make up sundry movements between the years.

The football department along with all its ailments and injuries showed a decrease in its loss by \$60,000 and this was due to increased gate receipts of \$20,000, finals appearance money of \$10,000 and increases in transfer fees received of \$66,000. Our expenses did increase in total by \$47,000 and most notably in player's fees and football staff wages.

Football development revenue decreased from last year due to a decrease in grow the games grant of \$10,000 and a decrease in the clinics income. Development expenses were up by\$15,000 and the main contributor to this was staff cost. The development cost centre is critical to the future of the clubs ability to get players cultivated within our own zones.

Membership revenue which includes membership fees, season passes and reserve seating totaled \$97,000 which was the same as the previous year and expenses for this department decreased by \$2,000 mainly due to badges and tickets cost reduction. In total all expenses \$13,000.

The administration costs of the club have fallen by \$12,000 and is run by full time office staff and as such wages, superannuation and on cost are the major costs of this department. It is a cost centre with no contributing revenue other than interest received of \$33,000 and technology grants.

Even though we were endeavoring to achieve a book profit we just did not get there. However, it was a major turnaround and I feel confident that 2012 will see us back in profit. The financial stability of the club still remains strong.

Thank you to all those who contribute to the well being of our 'Family Club".

1 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views). The financial statements have also been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial statements.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost or at independent or directors' valuation, less where applicable any accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows, which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal.

Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those entitlements.

Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in at call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months, net of bank overdrafts.
