PRESIDENT'S REPORT BEGIN A NEW JOURNEY

2012 was another challenging year for country football as funding distributions from the WACFL were reduced due to cuts in sponsorship income. The intentions of funding have always been to provide leagues with additional funding over and above what they are able to generate from their own communities. However, leagues should not fall into the trap of relying on WACFL funding to keep them afloat as their future is then out of their own hands.

This year the WACFL made the decision to invest in trialling a Leadership Program with the Moora Warriors. The feedback from this program has been outstanding and serves as a great example of investing in football clubs to achieve football and community outcomes.

The Warriors went on to a premiership in the reserves competition and the future is looking bright in Moora as the Rovers and Warriors are merging to form one strong club in the town.

Points systems were a topical subject this year with both the South West Football League and the Central Midlands Coastal League introducing them. The WACFL would like to congratulate these leagues for being proactive and strategic in trying to ensure even competitions. Points systems can also be successful in ensuring player payments are reduced which is surely a positive for country clubs. Points systems are definitely not for each league, but I would suggest that the stronger leagues continue to evaluate them.

The Landmark Country Football Championships experienced excellent weather for a change which contributed to a successful championship. A total of twenty teams competed in this year's championships and there are rumours that even more teams will nominate next year. Bringing a side to Perth every year is definitely a costly exercise and I would like to thank those leagues that supported the event. Our board is investigating ways of

making Landmark as affordable and positive an experience as possible for players and officials.

The 2012 New Holland State Program was a terrific experience for all involved despite the competition being fierce in Wagga Wagga. Many of the other states have numerous player concessions which make it even harder for WA to compete. Despite this, the team played some great football and was unlucky not to knock off Vic 1 who went on to win the title. Our Board will continue to discuss the State Program and look at ways of enhancing the status and program of State football.

It was great to follow the grand final results from around the traps with a number of great crowds and tight games witnessed. A number of clubs also broke their premiership drought so a big congratulations to Railways in Albany (1986), Corrigin in the Eastern Districts FL (1996), Boyup Brook in the Lower South West FL (1981), Lake Grace/Pingrup in the Ongerup FA (1999) and Panthers in the Fortescue NFL (1996).

There were many staff and role changes at the WAFC this year from the Chief Executive to our General Manager. The WA Football Commission continues to support country football and recognises the importance of our leagues. We are confident that the Commission and new Chief Executive Gary Walton will keep country football's best interests at heart when negotiating football's biggest issues.

The WACFL staff continued to work professionally despite losing Cameron during the year, so I'd like to acknowledge Joe, Milton, Robyn and Kellie for their work for country football. They and the Executive have an important role to play in strengthening and supporting country leagues.

Finally, to my Executive, thanks very much for your support and the work you have put in to date and I look forward to the challenges we face moving forward.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT A POSITIVE DIRECTION

2012 has been a whirlwind year for me personally, having taken over from Cameron Knapton as General Manager of the WA Country Football League mid-season. Cameron was transferred internally to a position with the WAFL which created the opportunity for me to step in as General Manager between May and October.

Since taking over, my objectives have been not only to steer the ship in the right direction, but also to look at improvements and opportunities within our current structures.

Obviously there is a lot to learn in the position and I'd like to thank Grant Dorrington and the WAFC for the support and guidance provided to me in this role. Cameron has remained a confidant and source of knowledge and is still passionate about country football.

The WAFC provides funding to the WACFL which helps us to not only pay staff to manage and promote country football, but also allows us to provide leagues with financial assistance throughout the course of the year.

The football industry as a whole is currently in a re-evaluation phase with financial pressures starting to influence key decisions. The WAFC's new Chief Executive Gary Walton has certainly had his work cut out since commencing with key items such as AFL Reserves and the new stadium critical to the future of football in this State. Gary certainly seems to be making positive headway with these key issues which will have a flow on to country football for years to come.

Although football has always been considered one of the most financial sports, it is still imperative that leagues are financially independent and can adequately source enough revenue from their own community to cover the cost involved with management of their league. Over the last few years the WACFL has provided vast amounts of funding to leagues. Whilst continuing to provide funding support to leagues is a focus, the majority of our energy should be spent on helping to run and strengthen leagues, as well as contributing to enhancing the pathway for country kids to achieve their dreams in football and have a positive experience in doing it. So the dilemma becomes — do we concentrate on generating money to distribute, or invest money into football programs we believe will have positive outcomes?

Country football relies strongly on league and club volunteers to run football in their region. The role of the WACFL is to equip these people with the knowledge and skills to do a great job. Providing ongoing professional and personal development for these key football participants will be one of the key focus areas of 2013 as they are very much the ones driving the health of country football.

The New Holland State program saw the WACFL State team fly to Wagga Wagga for the Landmark National Championships in July. Despite the team's below par results, I'd like to acknowledge the efforts of Paul Pannell and his coaches as well as the playing group. To be chosen as one of the best country players in the State is a fantastic achievement not many people can say they have experienced. State football is an important part of country football's annual program and gives our best players an opportunity to strive to compete at a higher level, so we'll be looking at ways we can improve and compete against the powerful eastern states.

2012 saw the continuation of some of the WACFL's key partnerships which all contributed to the health of country football and regional WA:

Belt Up – the WACFL continued its 14 year partnership with the Insurance Commission of WA. Highlights of this campaign were the cobranding which appears alongside the WACFL logo as well as the annual Belt Up round of fixtures.

One Life – In our second year with One Life we continued to spread mental health and suicide prevention messages to our football clubs and regional communities in general.

Pink Football Day – Leagues chose to participate in this event over the Mother's Day weekend with country football raising more than \$80,000 for the National Breast Cancer Network. This was a great example of country football getting behind a worthy cause.

Landmark – Continues to be a fantastic sponsor of the WACFL and the Landmark Country Football Championship which is the jewel in the crown of country football.

The WACFL Executive continues to strive to enhance the product of Country Football and supporting country kids who have the talent to excel. All but two of the WACFL Executive resides in country Western Australia which helps keep us in touch with regional stakeholders and issues. It also means that it takes up much of their time to attend meetings, so I'd like to thank them for the work they continue to do to develop country football.

This year saw the Executive separate into varying charters to continue to drive improved performance across country football. These charters were Commercial Operations, League and Club Development and Talent and Representative Football. The impacts of this move will hopefully be felt early in 2013 as we roll out many of the changes we believe will help strengthen our leagues and clubs as well as the talent pathway for country players.

2012 was a special year for our Executive member Alan Bishop who was awarded WACFL Life Membership for the work he has done with the WACFL, as well as a coach and administrator in the Kimberley. The northwest of the State certainly has the potential to be further developed and Alan's knowledge of the area will be critical to us ensuring that future developments are well executed.

Regional participation numbers for the annual AFL Census continued to improve (5.73%) which is a testament to the hard work of the regional staff and the Regional Football Development Councils. We still need to be proactive for clubs as there are many regions where fielding a side each week remains the number one challenge.

Our Executive member from Morawa, Milton Milloy, had an interesting year when he successfully applied to back fill my position as Operations Manager at the WACFL. Milton had to

relocate to take up this role (as well as step down from his role on the board) and has certainly brought his passion and knowledge of country football to the table and should be congratulated for the work he has done this year.

As well as Milton, I'd like to thank Robyn and Kellie from our team who are both great assets to country football and are very professional in the work they undertake. Ben Ralph continues to put in over and above what is expected and is a great example of country people's dedication to volunteering.

2013 promises to be a year with many changes and we are sure this will contribute to the future success of our 26 affiliated leagues. Country football remains in a strong position in the community so we will continue to support our leagues to ensure their sustainability for years to come.

Many of our wheatbelt leagues found ways of surviving the highs and lows of the agricultural industry and with the same community engagement, football will survive.

One of the highlights of 2012 was the Landmark National Country Carnival held in Wagga Wagga in July. This was a great opportunity for the best country footballers in the State to travel and test themselves against the nation's best country footballers. I very much enjoyed working with State coach Paul Pannell and the great group of players at the carnival. To Gary Bovell and his medical crew, thank you for your outstanding efforts of not only strapping and getting the team ready for each game, but your commitment after games and 24 hours a day to get the best out of the players was amazing. I would also like to acknowledge Ben Ralph for all his hard work and commitment in Wagga.

This year's Landmark Country Football Championship was also an outstanding success and is the highlight of country football in this State. Congratulations to the South West, Mortlock and Central Wheatbelt Football Leagues for taking out the Grand Finals in Divisions 1, 2 and 3 respectively. There were six teams in the colts division with South West FL defeating Kimberly Spirit in the grand final.

This year the WACFL used Bendigo Bank Stadium for the first time and we look forward to utilising this great facility for future championships. Let's hope 2013's carnival can be just as good and continues to be a highlight for our country footballers.

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the numerous volunteers out in the bush who continually help administer and deliver our game to regional communities year after year. Witnessing volunteers dedicate themselves to their teams is an inspiring part of my role and the game of Australian Rules couldn't be run without our volunteers. Easing the pressure on them and trying to motivate the next generation to get in and help will be another focus of 2013.

It has been great to work within our country team at the Commission and also to work closely with a President and Executive that is committed to the growth of football in regional Western Australia.

UMPIRE MANAGER'S REPORT A CHALLENGING JOURNEY

Umpiring continues to be a major challenge in country areas with recruitment, quality and environments being the key focus areas.

Ensuring umpires are well trained and can carry out their craft in a positive environment will go a long way to addressing shortages of umpires coming through.

The WAFC continued to address these challenges in 2012 with a range of development and support opportunities detailed below.

The full time WAFC staff that are based throughout regional WA are critical to the development of umpires, both in terms of quantity (recruitment) and quality (education). Strategies to meet the needs of the varying football landscapes include: recruitment of umpires, umpire training, umpire development, material distribution and general support to umpire coaches and leagues on umpire development matters.

Umpire Development Coaches (UDCs) continued to be funded by the WAFC in 2012. These UDC honorary positions were again appointed by the Regional Managers to assist their endeavours to develop, recruit and retain umpires in each of their respective regions. Given limited resources, the UDC concept is under review, as are all investment programs.

The 2012 Landmark Country Football Championship was another successful event with the umpires playing a positive part in ensuring this event remained a high class spectacle. In excess of 70 regional field, boundary and goal umpires from all parts of WA freely gave of their time and immersed themselves in the spirit of this prime umpire development opportunity. All umpires were afforded the opportunity of expert umpire coaching on match day, plus professional development sessions each evening. These sessions were led by the WAFC Umpiring team and were conducted at Ernest Johnson Oval, the home of WAFL and WA based AFL umpires.

The Landmark Championship remains a key talent identification opportunity and assisted in producing two field umpires who were selected to trial for the WAFL in 2012/2013.

The Landmark Umpire Coach team was led by Ray Zoch (Head Field Coach), Terry Eaton (Boundary Selector) and Peter Courtland (Head Goal Coach). Special thanks to WAFC High Performance Umpire Manager Darryl Sinclair and WAFC Umpire Talent Manager Paul Pitchers, plus all the umpire coaching staff for sharing their respective expertise throughout the championship.

With Harvey Norman as the sponsor on all orange shirt umpires, umpires through their respective leagues (senior umpires via their competition and junior competition umpires via WAFC regional staff) were offered one free orange issue replacement shirt courtesy of the WAFC. Additional benefits of the Harvey Norman sponsorship include funding WAFC staff and UDCs, as well as subsidised resources including green shirts for new umpires and like support.

There were also many country visits to regions requiring support to provide professional development for umpires. These sessions are critical as many country umpires are unable to travel to Perth for professional development.

Umpiring continues to remain an aspect of the game that requires constant nurturing and at times rigorous protection. As detailed in this report a variety of support strategies and material is available to leagues, umpire groups and umpires. The extent of commitment varies across regional WA for a host of reasons, however it is the responsibility of leagues and umpires to make the most of professional development opportunities when they are made available as they are an investment in improving country football.

I am looking forward to helping country football continue to improve the standards of umpiring in 2013. As the AFL generated Umpiring Everyone's Business campaign says, 'Umpiring is Everyone's Business'.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2012

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the West Australian Country Football League (WACFL) constitutional requirements to prepare financial statements.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of this financial report, are in the opinion of the members of the Executive, appropriate to meet the requirements of the WACFL.

The requirements of Australian Accounting Standards do not have mandatory applicability to the WACFL because it is not a reporting entity. The members of the Executive have determined that relating to recognition, classification and measurement of assets, liabilities, revenues and expenses have been complied with. This includes the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements and AASB 107 Cash Flow Statements.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on the historical costs.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Statement of Compliance

The financial report complies with the recognition, measurement and classification requirements of Australian Accounting Standards, which includes Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS) and the disclosure requirements of accounting standards AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements and AASB 107 Cash Flow Statements.

Going Concern

This financial report has been prepared on the going concern basis. The going concern basis has been implemented, as the Executive Members believe that the cash flow projections are sustainable and the WACFL has a large surplus of cash on hand.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the WACFL and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade payables and other payables are carried at cost and represent liabilities for goods and services provided during the financial year that are unpaid at year end and future payments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services is required.

Income Tax

As both a not-for-profit and statutory body, there is no obligations to pay income tax.

Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax,

Except:

- (i) Where the amount of GST incurred on a purchase of goods and services is not recoverable from the taxation authority, in which the case the amount of GST is recognised as part of the cost of the acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense items as applicable; and
- (ii) Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable, or payable to, the taxation authority is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash is defined as cash on hand and cash equivalents, including highly liquid assets, which have a maturity of less than three months from Balance Date.


Trade and Other Receivables
