President's Report

They have all stayed and worked hard to maintain a positive forward-looking attitude, and that is a great testament to the characters we have in our club.

Throughout these past years of my presidency our sponsors and partners have also been critical to the turnaround. For those sponsors that have been with us for decades and continue to put money in with little economic return to their own businesses or families, I want to thank you for your support of the club.

You have enabled us to continue to be a leading light in terms of our off field and financial performance where we achieved all the necessary targets that are set and benchmarked by the WA Football Commission (WAFC).

Without our sponsors new and old, we just could not exist let alone be successful, so thank you for being part of this journey and hopefully it will continue into the future. We do not take you for granted.

However, on a positive note, we must not forget the great success of our Women's programmes in 2024, winning another Rogers Cup grand final, three out of the last four years, and having a WAFLW team get into a preliminary final where they were beaten by the eventual premiership team. This in itself was an amazing feat. I want to thank Clint Degrobot, Scott Kounis, Luke Richardson and all the volunteers, coaching and support staff who have worked so diligently to build a great women's programme. It is and will be a really important part of the club's future.

We have a great group of players men and women, experienced ones, and newcomers and with a revamped and strengthened team to support our on-field performance I look forward to you a good season in 2025.

Our relationship with VenuesWest has been one of the central reasons in our club's turnaround over the past seven years and we thank Dave Etherton (CEO) and his team for this amazing support to improve the club's home. The lights installed this year have been a highlight and we look forward to a digital video scoreboard and time clock, new seating in the front grandstand, a new media centre and coaching box improvements. All of this builds us into a venue to be desired for key sporting events and we were pleased to host the WAFLW grand final and the Perth Football League A and B Grade grand finals this season.

I want to thank our board who have tried their hardest to provide the right framework and good governance to ensure that our club never gets into the situation that it did in 2018. All of our board members are volunteers, and we've enjoyed great representation from our female members two of whom will retire this year. Thank you to Kate Vivian and Pia Drummond for your involvement and support. Also, to Graeme Yukich who steps aside. His financial support and board experience will be missed. I especially want to pay tribute to our finance director Adam Myers who puts in a mountain of unseen work to ensure that we are financially professionally managed, and to our financial controller/bookkeeper Lillian Kluge supported by the administration staff – thank you to a job well done.

I also thank all the other board directors who have served with me over these past seven years, and in particular Ross Kelly who joined me with a great deal of experience back in 2018 to help set the club on the right path. He and Leith are great West Perth people and continue as our patrons. To Claire O'Donnell who has been our Junior Club's representative as well as a huge volunteer, thank you.

Our balance sheet is relatively strong and this year we will repay to the WAFC the outstanding amount on our loan which was provided under the 2018 Deed of Company Arrangement (DOCA).

Our club administration size is probably the leanest in the WAFL and we have relied a lot on our CEO Joe McCarthy assisted by Paola Zito and Tracy Venner. The board in 2025 will look to see

that we are better covered in this area, but of course this all takes finance and so we need to ensure that we can pay as we go. But considering all this, great job by all.

We also thank the WAFC led by outgoing Chair Wayne Martin. They have been incredibly supportive of our club, in difficult circumstances and the collaborative approach to solving issues has been exemplary. We thank Wayne and his commission.

Finally, I repeat, it has been an immense honour to be the President of our great club. Having started at the club in 1976 as s colts' player and finishing as President 47 years later is something I will be enormously proud of.




Joondalup is our home, and we now have characters, legends, memories, and tales of the last 30 years to add to the previous illustrious and glorious 100 years.





Talent Report

Season 2024 for our WPFC Talent Pathway has been a successful, enjoyable & rewarding one for the 200 plus athletes involved. All our programs in 2024 had new coaches at the helm, along with various new staff members in support and administration roles, such uncertainty generates challenges, but it also created opportunities to advance our approach on & off the field.

Colts

An indifferent pre-season with a few bumps along the way, a few potholes at Mater Dei, a camp in Lancelin & some new faces resulted in this group learning to ride the wave from the outset. A slow, but promising start to the home & away fixture indicated this group was up for the fight, and fight they did. Sitting winless after three rounds, the boys went on a 7-game winning streak, none better than the clutch "Marcello" kick in the dying stages of our R13 clash against Perth, to give the boys a stirring 5-point win. Colts Coach Report

Here at the West Perth Football Club, our development pathway focusses heavily on player development and producing quality players for our club both on and off the field, not necessarily the wins and losses.

Every year there is a significant turnover of players within our colt's program, therefore it is understandably difficult to gauge where our talent sits against other clubs. We commenced preseason in early December with over 70 players on the track, which would eventually be narrowed down to 45 squad members. There was certainly a heightened level of expectation amongst the group which could be sensed by being around the boys. Preseason concluded in late February and culminated in a player driven camp in Lancelin to build connection further amongst the group. This camp proved pivotal in what would mould the group for what was to come.

We powered through the preseason games followed by two-night games to start the season against last year's Grand Finalists. Coming up against Claremont in Round One who were last year's premiers, did not daunt the group at all. In what was a tight game the boys fell just short, but the disappointment on their faces was good to see as they realised, they could match it with the best of past years. Round 2 against Perth was a tight game that went down to the wire with a drawn match the end outcome. Once again, the look of disappointment was there and although not the ideal start, the boys knew their best was good enough. Ultimately, our colts group played 16 games for the regular season finishing 2nd on the ladder with 12 wins, 3 losses and a draw qualifying for the colts sixth finals series in succession.

Unfortunately, once finals were upon us, we looked to have spent most of our tickets and were not at our best. Two relatively close finals losses will no doubt hold the players in good stead and give them plenty of learnings to carry forward. Upon reflection, the results and year of development for our young boys was a great outcome with the squad playing 42 players, with 16 debuting. We also had one of the youngest teams in the competition highlighted with our ability to debut Koby LeCras and Luca Boczar as 16-year-olds as well as playing many 17-year-old boys each week.

During the year, we had three State 18s representatives, represent Western Australia at the National carnival. Jayden Rigoll, Kayle Gerreyn and Trent Hiscock all performed at an extremely high level. Every year the WAFL selects a "Colts Team of the Year". Well done to Jack Wooden, Kayle Gerreyn, Judd Marcello and Sam Swadling for featuring in this side.

We were fortunate throughout the year to have the support of our senior program and all affiliated coaches. Jason Salecic and Paul Sanzone were great to work with and offered great support to the colt's program. Some of our top end talent spent some time in the senior program with Kayle Gerreyn earning himself a senior debut in the back end of the season. Regarding our senior program, the pleasing part for our club but difficult part as a colts coach is to say goodbye for now to players that have now progressed to our senior program. appreciate all of you.

We have managed to have 16 players from this year's colts squad looking at completing a preseason with Jason, Sanza and the senior program, so credit to everyone involved in the development of these boys so far.

Support staff are key pillars in every program, and at West Perth we have some of the best going around. Clint Rudd came into the club as our Talent Manager this season and led the program well right from the start. Jess Fordham headed up our medical team and has built such a solid rapport with all players and staff over many years. Matt Lowndes works in our player welfare space and is an asset to our program. This year we introduced a mindset coach in Tony Silvio who was a great addition. Our assistant coaches in Michael Luca, Ryan Fong, Josh Wooden and Brendan Long all put significant time and assistance into each of our players to get the best out of them. Chris Keunen continues to offer support for our talls and give back where he can. Ray "Stinger" Garcia is still around providing all he can to our colts group. There are so many we could thank who have contributed so to everyone involved, we really appreciate all of you.

Any WAFL program requires a huge level of commitment from the players and support staff who put considerable time in every week. A big thank you to the parents, partners, siblings, family members or anyone else involved that allow us to all put the work in to be the best we can be. Without your support, we wouldn't be able to do what we do to prepare these boys for what is hopefully a long senior career at the West Perth Football Club.

Lastly, to such a special playing group, for our 100+ sessions together, we achieved so much with the development and growth that we saw in each individual as a person and people throughout the year, we have built a connection that will last a lifetime.

2025 promises to another exciting year of development at our football club and with some key learnings from all involved in 2024, we can't wait to get started.



The clinics that they ran in term 1 and 2 this year was either as a Free One-Day clinic at the school during the Play AFL campaign in an attempt to boost participation numbers throughout not only in the West Perth District, but across the whole of WA or they delivered a clinic via the Sporting Schools program, where schools engage in high-quality clinics run over a course of 4 weeks to deliver a football program of their choice taught by our WAFL/WAFLW players.

Our players didn't just visit schools, they also visited multiple events within the district. In Term 1 we had a great turnout from our West Perth Rogers Cup & Academy girls that came out and ran a Girls Come and Try day for the Ocean Ridge JFC. It was a great day for all involved and club was very appreciative of how engaged the West Perth girls were with interacting with these newcomers who had a positive experience playing football for the first time. In the term 2 holidays the Metro North district ran a Year 7 Academy that was held at MacDonald reserve. There were 60 Yr 7 boys that represented the West Perth district during this two-day academy, and we were lucky enough to have some of the West Perth colts down to give the boys a hand. The players were great at running some of the training drills as well as having a chat with the boys about their experiences so far



in football and what playing in the WAFL is different to community football.

2024 was a fantastic year on the Auskick front as WA set a record for the most participants ever recorded in a season with more than 16,600 Auskickers across WA. West Perth district clubs had just shy of 1,500 for season 2024 which was a great number from our eight district clubs. The West Perth district also enjoyed another successful Auskick Gala Day held at Heathridge Park on Saturday 3rd August. 8 junior clubs, 74 teams and over 800 kids braved the chilly conditions early to have an absolute blast having their first taste of competitive football against Auskickers from different centres in a carnival like event.

Little League was again another hit amongst junior clubs and those involved with all 8 district clubs experiencing a WAFL/W home game this season with all Little Leaguers experiencing the thrill of playing at half-time of the Reserves and League. We also had the return of WA Day junior parade with our mascots showing off their clubs in a lap of honour around Pentanet Stadium. We also kicked off the season on Easter Thursday with WAFL Wonderland, with the Year 5/6 from Quinns JFC lucky enough to be the club of the round as they enjoyed the experience of seeing the league boys warm-up before their big clash against Claremont and were even lucky enough to have some of the reserves players down to give the team a warm up as well as a quick tour of the facilities which the Little Leaguers absolutely loved the experience!

The season was again a great success in my second year, and it was great to build on all the good work done last year to make this season even better. Looking forward to 2025!
