#### On Field

The final home and away round saw the Swannies nearly bring home the bacon in all three grades.

The Colts started the day by defeating Claremont and consolidate third position and a Qualifying Final.

They will now front up to Claremont in the First Semi final.

She rated Chelsea Randall as the best female footballer she has played with and watched.

She kicked around in Kalamunda as a young girl, but it wasn't until Year 10 at St. Brigid's SHS she had an opportunity to play in a new generation women's competition. Emily also became a Swannie in 2007 and has also received Life membership. Some of her highlights include playing her 150th game on the same day as Fiona Boucher and winning the 2013 flag. She loves playing with a positive group of girls and noted red and yellow cards are used in the women's competition.
- Our guest speaker Michaela Carr gave an entertaining talk on her life in journalism. Michaela started as a journalist in Canberra and was the first female sub editor alongside the likes of Stan Grant. Her first door stop was with Bob Hawke in an audio grab. She covered many elections and was negatively affected by the back-packer murders. She spoke fondly of George Grylusich and Wally Foreman and loved the friendship of John K Watts especially on the 6IX footy panel show. She spoke of her beloved husband Rob and their journey with MND and the many fundraising challenges she supports to find a cure. Their kids were only 8 and 10 when he died. She loves her job and helps out at University and also produces radio shows. Some of her best
