Session Descriptions

Club and Volunteer Development - Warren Nel the General Manager of Game Development will be joined by Joe Georgiades the WACFL General Manager as they discuss the role of leadership in sport, and how strong leadership can come from everyone within the club. This session will also look at ways to measure success and development, and all attendees will have the opportunity to complete their own coaching development plan.

To support the theory side of coaching Craig Walker the WA Country Football League State Coach will also be in Kalgoorlie to deliver a practical session on how to train more effectively, and develop skill in your squad. This practical session will provide coaches with a range of drills and practical advice that they can transfer to their teams training sessions straight away.
