200 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Season 2004 saw the introduction of significant changes to the way in which football development in Western Australia is structured. These changes will be of great benefit to South Fremantle as we have been considerably disadvantaged in comparison with most other WAFL clubs.

The long overdue rezoning took place which now ensures that we have greater access to the number of junior players available to us. Changes to our country area saw us lose Tambellup and Kojonup but regain Boddington. Kwinana, Mundaring and Kardinya were added to our metropolitan zone. With enormous potential for growth in the South West corridor we are very well placed for the future.

Secondly, and of even greater significance was the establishment of the District Development concept where all of the zoned junior clubs play in the same competition. The WAFL clubs will now play a much greater role in the junior development system within their zones. I would like to congratulate chairman Rob Taylor and his District Development Committee for the brilliant job they have done in organising a great competition at such short notice.

The appointment of John Dimmer as the club's senior coach brought us the experience, the game plan and above all the coaching style which was so compatible with the club's developing football strategy. Ably supported by Glen Davies, Ron Bayens, Brad Collard and a very dedicated support staff John guided us to a Rodriguez Shield win which is awarded to the champion club based on performances over all three grades. The policy of promoting young players certainly established a very strong player base for the future.

One of the year's highlights was surely the magnificent victory of our reserves team in the Grand Final. Congratulations to all the players and to Glen Davies who prepared the side so well. Family commitments will prevent Glen from coaching next year but he has indicated that he will maintain contact with the club.

Our colts team also had a terrific year and were clearly the most dominant side for much of the season. Unfortunately they were unable to win their third successive premiership, being beaten by a very dedicated and fired up Peel Thunder team on the day. We would expect a number of these players to play at senior level next year.

Our thanks go to colts coach Roger Kerr who has indicated he won't be available next year. Roger has introduced our young players to the level of professionalism required to play senior football. Over the past three years we have seen a number of his charges drafted to AFL clubs or make their debuts at league level with our club.

As part of our ongoing commitment to country football we played two games in the country this year, one in Katanning, the other at Denmark. Both games resulted in losses. Fixturing of future games needs to be carefully considered as it is unfair to expect players to take part in a Monday game and then, four days later, travel 400 kilometres by bus to play, as happened to us with the Denmark game.

Off field the club continues to prosper. The promotion of the renovated function centre has been very successful and has provided another source of revenue. Over the summer the front bar and entrance will be refurbished which will see the completion of the major aspects of this programme. Despite the large sums spent in recent years on the media box, legends bar and hall we have been able to maintain adequate cash reserves.

The Football Strategy Committee, chaired by John Lange, is working to develop plans for the future. This year they have concentrated on recruiting and the document entitled "Making the Right Choices" provides a blue print for the club's operations in this area.

Discussions have been held with East Fremantle regarding holding the Foundation Day Derby at Fremantle Oval as a regular annual event. Although we have not been able to reach an agreement as yet we are hopeful that ongoing negotiations can find a resolution to perceived problems.

The highlight of the year on the social calendar was undoubtedly the John Todd and John Gerovich Tribute night. The evening was very well attended and an outstanding success. George Grljusich played a pivotal role in the organisation of the evening and his ongoing support of the South Fremantle Football Club is very much appreciated.

One of the strengths of the club is the stability of the Board of Management. All retiring members have agreed to renominate and, if it is the wish of the members, we will continue to serve the club. I am extremely grateful to Vice President, Sal Capolingua, and the Board for their commitment and dedication.

I would like to thank Brian Ciccotosto, Amelia Dabrowski and Barbara McKinnon for the most efficient and dedicated manner in which they have administered club affairs. Marty Atkins, in his first year as Football Manager, has adopted to the role very quickly and is doing a terrific job.

Bradd Gardiner has proved to be a very enthusiastic, hard working Junior Development Officer, Unfortunately we have lost the services of Jarrod Chipperfield who has taken up a football position elsewhere. We wish well in his future endeavours and thank him for his



untiring efforts on behalf of the club. It is very pleasing to be able to announce that premiership player, David Hynes, has been appointed as Jarrod's replacement.

To Colin Punch, Peter Williams and the bar staff a sincere thank you for the efficient and friendly manner in which you have managed the club and looked after our members. Club caterer, Julie Dhu, always produced a sumptuous spread for our many functions and her Friday night meals have been a very popular initiative with members.

Steve McCarthy, our Ground Manager, has ensured that Fremantle Oval is by far the best presented oval in the competition. Well done, Steve.

In conclusion I would especially like to thank our very many volunteers who have worked so cheerfully and selflessly for the benefit of the club. South Fremantle is surely blessed with the quality and dedication of its volunteer workers.

To all our members we wish you the very best for the coming future season and we look forward to season 2005 with enthusiasm and confidence.

200 GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT



Members of the South Fremantle Football Club, on behalf of the Board of Directors, I have much pleasure in presenting for your adoption the Club's 105th Annual Report.

As mentioned in last year's report the club's next building project is to renovate the Members Bar which will see the completion of the total refurbishment of the club premises. Work began on this final project in October and will be completed by the end of the year.

Major clashes between WAFL and AFL home game fixtures has become a real concern with seven of the first eight AFL games at Subiaco Oval in 2005 being played on a Saturday.

We plan to upgrade the lighting levels at Fremantle Oval prior to the 2005 season to play more Friday night games, particularly in the warmer weather and to avoid clashing with the Dockers and Eagles home games.

Our only Friday night fixture this year drew a crowd of 3000 which was second only to the Foundation Day Derby.

The social event of the year was the 50th Anniversary Dinner for the debuts of our two football legends John Gerovich and John Todd.

McGrath finishes with a medal

SOUTH Fremantle midfielder Toby McGrath dropped a bombshell in his acceptance speech after winning the WJ Hughes Medal as his team's fairest and best player for 2004.

After gaining his highest footballing honour the 24-year-old announced his retirement.

After years of trying make a career in the game he had decided to look further into the future and joined the army.

While he never made it onto an AFL list, no one could accuse McGrath of not giving it his best shot. He spent time on the rookie list at both West Coast and Essendon, trained with Fremantle and played with Essendon in the VFL.

"There were no what-ifs for me," McGrath said, describing his time in Melbourne as a highlight.

"I loved it over there," he said, "footy is bigger and with not everyone concentrating on one or two teams the players don't get put on a pedestal.

"When I first met James Hird he just said 'how ya goin' mate' and treated me the same as anyone else and made me feel comfortable. It makes you want to impress them with the way you play and train."

McGrath returned to WA this year and said he didn't even consider going anywhere but back to South Fremantle.

"I played nearly 100 games for South, played in a couple of losing grand finals and played with blokes like Peter Sumich and Scotty Watters," he said.

McGrath is part of one of WA's most remarkable football families. His brothers Cory (Carlton) and Ashley (Brisbane) are current AFL players as is his cousin Dion Woods (Fremantle). Another cousin Martin McGrath played for Richmond. The fourth McGrath brother Brad currently works at the South Fremantle Football Club.

If things go to plan South's losing first semi final last month will have been McGrath's last for the Bulldogs. He was clearly his team's best player despite a blow that flattened him moments before the half time siren and led to a push-and-shove involving most players on the field. "I got a few whacks that day but just tried to get up and keep going," he said, "I was trying to get the boys fired up but it just didn't work."

And as for winning the Hughes Medal in his last season. "That was perfect," he said.

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT REPORT

The South Fremantle Football Development program for 2004 has been successfully completed.

The main focus of our program was to maintain the level of participation across our district by again offering skill clinics to all 70 schools.

In 2004, 95% of schools in the South Fremantle District were exposed to a school clinic and were also involved in one of many carnival programs we offer through the Football Development Program.

The Lightning Carnivals for the primary school age, Belt Up Cup for the secondary students and the Smarter than Smoking Cup for Upper secondary, were all participated in heavily by our regions schools and we must commend them all on the level of enthusiasm shown for these events.

Auskick was again a focus for our program, with numbers in this age group rising by 15% and new centres being scoped for season 2005. The 14 Auskick centres from last season were again involved in the program and all 14 received parent in-services, WAFL grid games and regular visits throughout the year. It is vitally important for this age group to be exposed to the correct techniques early, so that they can carry these perfected skills through to their junior and senior football.

Outside the school structure, the South Fremantle football program visited every junior football club in the district at least twice to conduct training sessions. The young footballers benefited greatly from these training days, as did the coaches because it gave them the opportunity to step back and observe some fresh drills and approaches to coaching.

SCHOOLS

- 55 schools were exposed to an AFL Auskick (5-8 years) Clinic to help increase the Auskick community numbers, 4,950 children aged 5,6,7 and 8 experienced a clinic.
- Participants up by 15% this year compared to last year, 950 Auskickers.
- 20 Development programs completed (3 clinics in 3 weeks), 5,400 children aged 9,10,11 and 12 experienced our clinics.
- 40 schools were exposed to a WAFL one-day clinic; James Taylor, Jordan Smith and Chad Broughton conduct them, 2,400 children aged 10,11 and 12 years experienced a clinic.
- School based Auskick centre at Beeliar PS, 40 participants, 38 of them have never played football, all soccer players. Completed 5 sessions and at the last session we conducted a meeting with parents and look to forming committee for new club in the area, Jim Hurst assisting.

COMMUNITY

- School holiday clinic numbers up 50% from last year with over 500 children
 participating.
- 26 training sessions were completed in the South Fremantle District clubs, aimed at 9-12 years teams, over 500 footballers taken for training sessions.
- Auskickers Big Day at the Footy a big success. 400 children attended the day, with 4 Auskick games played before the reserves and 2 at half time of the league.
- Conducting parent in servicing of all parents at Auskick Centres to promote the effectiveness of parent help; conducted at all centres.
- Increase from 63 to 71 junior teams this year in the 9-12 age bracket, an increase of 10%, includes Kardinya team numbers.

COACHING

- 90% of all coaches in the District accredited
- 4 coaching seminars conducted throughout the year with excellent participation
- Umpiring seminar conducted for coaches to get an insight into the workings of today's umpires.

The community has again shown excellent support in all our programs and are very willing to assist and support whenever possible. The football clubs are our main stakeholders and it is extremely important to keep an open and free form of communication at all times.

Enjoyment and learning are our main focus for the South Fremantle District and from what we have observed from the children this year, we have succeeded in achieving these important outcomes.

Honour for Hughes family

WITH the Griff John Function Centre now an established and successful part of the club's operations the next project is nearly completed

Following the South Fremantle Football Club policy of naming parts of the club after prominent contributors, the soon-to-be-launched bar area will be known as the Bill "Doozer" Hughes members bar.

The renovations at the bar will create a more spacious area with the foyer gone and most, if not all, of the pillars removed.

There is also lots of rooms for photographs and with help from West Australian Newspapers outstanding performers and award winners will be honoured on the walls.

When the bar is officially opened next season it will mark more than 80 years of connection between the Hughes family and SFFC.

Bill Hughes snr played 47 league games from 1925 to 1927 and was then a long serving committee member who had stints as president and vice-president. He was on the committee from 1929 to 1941; vice president from 1942 to 1950; president in 1951 and 1952 and vice president again from 1953 to 1958 before serving as president again in 1960-61 and 1970-71. He was made a life member in 1940. Bill Hughes jnr was president of the club during a vital time from 1990 to 1992 while his sister Eileen Bond is a long-standing patron. A donation from Bill jnr in 1984 led to the club's fairest and best award being called the WJ Hughes Medal.

"The Hughes family has made a big contribution to the South Fremantle Football Club," said general manager Brian Ciccotosto. "In fact we probably wouldn't be here today if it wasn't for the Hughes family."

To set a goal at the start of the year and achieve it is very rewarding. I would like to congratulate all the players on their contribution and the great bond we know share as a "Premiership Team".







2004 LEAGUE REPORT

The only obstacle that could get in the way is attitude. As all the motivational books I have ever read say "attitude decides your altitude" and "the only place success comes before work is in the dictionary".

So as we embark on the 2005 season everyone involved needs to bring with them a positive attitude and a willingness to work hard to achieve an improvement.

Before we focus too much on 2005 it is important that I mention some of the outstanding people I have worked with over the last season. I would first and foremost like to thank Marty Atkins for his efforts in his new role as the Football Manager. Marty's desire to see the club be successful on the ground as well as his focus on an approach that enables players to feel as one with the club certainly made my job easier and enabled the players to give due focus on their physical preparation and not be sidetracked by other influences. His ability to have a laugh was also appreciated.

The coaching staff at the club have been superb in my first year. Ron Bayens joined us in February and brought to the club many years of experience as a player and umpire. His words of advice enhanced our discussions, particularly at team selection meetings. I believe I was particularly fortunate that Glen Davies stayed at the club for the 2004 season. His knowledge of the player group and his thoughts and ideas during the week and on match day were vital. It was tremendous to see Glen rewarded with a Premiership at the end of the year. His dedication and passion for the game brought the best out of his players and I'm sure their performances gave him a lot of fulfilment. Andy Stone provided me with great support in a variety of roles throughout the year. On match day his ability to combine the magnetic name tag movements with an eye for statistical analysis enabled the other coaches to have a quick snap shot of what was happening on the ground. I would also like to thank Brad Collard, who was primarily the reserves assistant coach but gave much time and energy to the league team. Brad's influence can never be underestimated. To James Bridle a special thank you for the great work in monitoring the players fitness and rehabilitation. It was also fantastic that a former player in Tom Bottrell was able to help in the fitness program of injured players. His boxing and weights routines were loved by those who couldn't train with the main group.

In Tony Mollica the league team has one of the best team managers going around. His attention to detail, particularly on Thursday nights and match day certainly gave me confidence that everything was covered, including name tags for new opposition players. Carl Micale is another great assistant to have at the club. Carl is there every training night and match day, always willing to help in whatever capacity required. Where would we be without people like Carl?

In this great game of ours one group of people often go unnoticed but have an incredible influence on a team. I speak of the runners. To Craig Civich and Tony Walters who did the running for most of the year a special thank you. You were greatly appreciated, not only for your running on match day but also for your general assistance during the week. I would also like to acknowledge the efforts of Dean Ercegovich, Greg Wootton and Warren Mosconi for their efforts when Craig or Tony were unavailable.

Thank you to our great property men, Ron Porter and Sandy Cuccovia. They are often out of sight but probably are at the club more than anybody else and their love and devotion to the club is outstanding.

When players are injured they have to fall back on our medical men and I would like to thank our team in this area lead by Merv Lockhart. Without this dedicated team of strappers, masseurs and ultra sound administers the players would not be able to get back on the park as quickly as they have this year.





1 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views). The financial statements have also been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial statements.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost or at independent or directors' valuation, less where applicable any accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal.

Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those entitlements.

Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in at call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months, net of bank overdrafts.




