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

The game has changed and we need to position ourselves in the best possible way to move with these changes. Football clubs in 2009 were completely different to the footy clubs I was involved in and the players are completely different to the players that I played with.

critical and we extend our warm appreciation and thanks for the tireless hours that they put in each week and weekend.

Sometimes I ask myself why we need more and why we need to change, but it's clearly evident that we need to embrace this change and accept the challenge of more so that we can continue to grow. Not only in player numbers, but in professionalism, the standard of facilities, the standard of umpiring, standard of our coaches, and finally we need to grow the standard of the game to ensure we continue to capture the imagination of each and every community.



I would also like to make a special mention to the WA State Team Selection panel, Coaches, Staff and volunteers who are preparing a team for the 2010 National Country Carnival..



CAM'S CALL

2009 has been one of the strongest years for the West Australian Country Football League. We achieved benchmarks never hit before in country footy with our highest ever participation levels exceeding 27,000. Financially we exceeded 2008's milestone of a million dollars. Our human resource levels reached an all time high securing a 10th appointment with a full time Development Officer based in Kununurra in the Kimberley.

Our corporate support was the strongest it has ever been and our grants and funding distribution to leagues reached an all time high. One of the most pleasing things to see was a resurgence in the number of senior players in our competitions. Many of these achievements can be attributed to the work of our regional staff. Having ten full time football professionals working in the regions gives us an advantage over other sports. Together with our RFDCs, these guys are continually working hard to raise the profile of football and develop the game in regional areas. These are the people who continue to drive our game to be the leader in winter sports.





The State Government's financial support, through the Department of Sport and Recreation has been terrific, allowing for the highly successful Country Sport Enrichment Scheme games to be held in Corrigin, Albany and Margaret River in 2009. Our challenge is to make 2010 even better in every area of our game from schools to community and all other competitions. It is therefore essential that every senior club ensures that growing the game in their town is a key part of ensuring that club's future viability.

COUNTRY DEVELOPMENT



2009 was a positive year within regional football development. Growth was prevalent in most regions with Auskick numbers again increasing. The main focus area was once again game environment and there is an increasing awareness of the role that the coach and spectators play in this area. Umpiring also continues to develop within regional WA and 2009 saw the introduction of Tim Priest as the Country Umpire Development Manager. This role has added a specialist feel to umpiring and the fruits of Tim's hard work will be seen in more years to come.

Our regional development committees moved to a new level with the introduction of regular phone link-up with our chairs and the increased awareness within the regions of the role these committees play. This awareness needs to be continually monitored and the role the WACFL plays helps make this occur. WACFL junior vice president Cathy VanderWeide has taken an increased role in development and is committed to the role of the RFDC chair and ensuring that we move forward sharing best practice amongst the group.

The development staff welcomed Mark Skehan to the South West. He took over from Dylan Harper as the Talent and Coaching manager within the region and the work he has done with the South West Academy of Sport has been outstanding. Paul Pirrottina took on the role of development officer in the Midwest region and his enthusiasm and experience within the region lead to some great new initiatives being implemented. The WAFC was also granted funding through the AFL and FaSCHIA to employ a development officer within the Kimberley, based in Kununurra, which gained immediate results. Aaron Dunster was appointed to this role and we have been encouraged by the development of a youth football competition, increased awareness of the governance needed within the EKFL and his approach to development at all levels. Aaron's appointment allowed us to elevate Brett Claudius to Regional Manager of the Kimberley.

Our staffing levels are now at ten full-time with six Regional Managers and four development officers we also have three part-time employees and two AFL trainees. While it will prove hard to increase this level of service to regional WA in 2010 due to the economic climate we will continue to strive to do so. The WAFC was also instrumental in the progress of our regional councils moving ahead as they took on the leasing of all staff vehicles. This relieves our volunteers within the RFDC's of the burden of leases and dealing with the associated time consuming tasks of running a vehicle. Staff phones were also

taken over by the WAFC to bring us into line with our metropolitan counterparts.

School football returned to 2008 levels as the teachers once again committed to school football. Our competitions at both inter and intra levels were of high quality and well supported, while the country week school competition surged back to 2008 participation levels

Major achievements in 2009 included the youth football competition based out of Kununurra at both 14's and 16's levels. This was the first year that these competitions have been run. Increased football in the Northern Goldfields was evident and our partnership with SWAS has proved that AFL is well structured, run and administered at a development level. The Kimberley region released a highly professional Future Directions Report which will allow us to continually grow the game of AFL within the region and all the other regions are working on these documents which should be released in 2010.

Key focus areas in 2010 will continue to be growth in numbers and retention of players at all levels, stability of staff and continued strategic planning and thinking by all involved at a regional level and the ever increasingly popular area of female football. We have already seen signs of cohesion at the level of RFDC Chairs and this will be further enhanced by the involvement that will be undertaken in best practice sharing with the DDC chairs. Quality clubs and football environments will be supported and the work of the volunteers in their capacity within football clubs will be enhanced, recognized and rewarded.

Once again the support shown to myself, the regional staff and the regional volunteers from the WAFC has been outstanding at all levels. The WACFL continues to show the way, by means of support and also embracing the development concept, and for this I thank President, Terry House and his executive. The RFDC Chairs and committees work as hard as anyone in football and their contribution is highly valued and appreciated.

Finally to Cam, Tim, Robyn, Kellie and Kym, I thank you all for your support and for making our work environment the most pleasant and enjoyable I have experienced.

WAFC UMPIRING

Season 2009 umpire development within regional WA was placed in good stead following a stakeholder market sector review at the end of 2008.

This included an agreement between the WACFL and WAFC Umpiring with strategic structural outcomes facilitating closer partnership arrangements.

Regional Development Managers/Development Officers under the leadership of the WACFL board and staff led by Cameron Knapton and Dale Ballantyne have embarked upon a renewed approach to assist Leagues and regions recruit, train and retain local umpires.

WAFC Umpiring funded Umpire Development Coaches (UDC's) continued to play a critical role in assisting full time Regional Managers/Officers. These honorary positions made available to each League, were recruited and appointment by the respective Regional Development Manager/Development Officer.

The fourteen UDC's appointed in season 2009 worked in partnership with their respective League appointed competition umpire coach/coordinator and ensured newly recruited umpires received support including mentoring, basic course instruction, match day coaching feedback and access to learning resources.

It is anticipated more UDC's will be appointed by Regional Development Managers prior to season 2010 as such implementation of strategy is critical for future regional umpire growth and retention.

The 2009 Landmark Carnival was another successful event with the umpires playing a positive part in ensuring this event remains a high class spectacle.

In excess of 70 regional field, boundary and goal umpires from all parts of WA freely gave of their time and immersed themselves in the spirit of this prime umpire development opportunity. All umpires were afforded the opportunity of expert umpire coaching on match day and Professional Development evening sessions through the services of the WAFC Umpiring team, selected Regional Umpire Coaches, WAFL and AFL umpires, WAFL Umpire Coaches, WACFL Executive representation and guest speakers.

Those participating regional umpires were grateful for the WACFL support at Landmark including the awarding of medals for those selected for Grand Finals. Equally, the way in which both the umpires and umpire coaches conducted their Landmark duties is to be commended. Special acknowledgement is given to Field Umpire Tony Raudino from the South West Region who was deservedly awarded the JJ Lussick medal as Umpire of the Carnival. Further mention is given to 15 year old Thomas Currie from Albany who in being awarded the Peter Troode Encouragement Award displayed boundary umpiring skill well beyond his years.

The WAFL regional matches and the support of the Country Sport



Enrichment Scheme provided a terrific opportunity for WAFL Umpire personnel to share their expertise with regional umpires within Margaret River, Albany, Corrigin and surrounding areas.

The two WA AFL Road Shows in 2009 being Broome and Albany, each funded through the AFL and complimented with resources from the WAFC Umpiring team and Regional Development Managers, again proved that such events continue to be arguably the most effective strategy in promoting the importance of umpire development to the sustainable growth of quality Australian Rules Football.

Particular acknowledgement and thanks is given to Perth based AFL Umpires Dean Margetts, Brett Rogers, (Broome and surrounding areas) Todd Keating and Richard Hepinstall (Albany). They devoted consecutive days in regional WA promoting umpiring and passing on their expertise and experiences to regional umpires, umpire coaches, players and other regional stakeholders. These gentlemen all conducted themselves with such professionalism and enthusiasm in all their school visits, presentation workshops and regional print media and local radio interviews.

My personal visits and development sessions in 2009 included:
Albany, Bunbury, Broome, Busselton, Cunderdin, Esperance, Geraldton,
Karratha, Kulin, Kununurra and Kalgoorlie.

The discussion received and delivered in respect to strengths and improvements required in umpiring development were generally similar. It was particularly encouraging to see in my travels the passion and dedication of many including umpires, league officials, presidents, player coaches and umpire coaches, and countless volunteers including RFDC members.

As Future Direction Reports are regionally developed and acted upon there is real opportunity for local football stakeholders in partnership with their Regional Development Manager to continue to deliver an improved umpiring standard. This will be to the benefit of all regional players.

Matters including locally generated recruitment and retention of umpires, umpire talent pathway development, building capacity through the establishment of local umpire learning centre opportunities, wider use of a three field umpire system and a quality game environment are recognised as key issues.

In closing the WACFL and WAFC Umpiring acknowledge the long standing sponsorship support of RICK HART. With their resigning for 2010 it ensures regional umpire development has continued capacity to develop in respect to this important funding source.

Thank you to all Leagues for their support and compliance in ensuring RICK HART is widely promoted across all regional WA competitions through the umpires' RICK HART branded uniforms.







NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2009

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the West

Australian Country Football League (WACFL) constitutional requirements to prepare financial statements.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of this financial report, are in the opinion of the members of the Executive, appropriate to meet the requirements of the WACFL.

The requirements of Australian Accounting Standards do not have mandatory applicability to the WACFL because it is not a reporting entity. The members of the Executive have determined that relating to recognition, classification and measurement of assets, liabilities, revenues and expenses have been complied with. This includes the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements and AASB 107 Cash Flow Statements

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on the historical costs.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Statement of Compliance

The financial report complies with the recognition, measurement and classification requirements of Australian Accounting Standards, which included Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS) and the disclosure requirements of accounting standards AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements and AASB 107 Cash Flow Statements.

Going Concern

This financial report has been prepared on the going concern basis. The going concern basis has been implemented, as the Executive Members believe that the cash flow projections are sustainable and the WACFL has a large surplus of cash on hand.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the WACFL and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade payables and other payables are carried at cost and represent liabilities for goods and services provided during the financial year that are unpaid at year end and future payments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services is required.

Income Tax

As both a not-for-profit and statutory body, there is no obligations to pay income tax.

Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax, Except:

- (i) Where the amount of GST incurred on a purchase of goods and services is not recoverable from the taxation authority, in which the case the amount of GST is recognised as part of the cost of the acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense items as applicable; and
- (ii) Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable, or payable to, the taxation authority is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash is defined as cash on hand and cash equivalents, including highly liquid assets, which have a maturity of less than three months from Balance Date.

Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables are recognised and carried at cost. An estimate for doubtful debts is made when collection of the full amount is no longer probable.
