Season Over

Score were level going into the halftime break. The third term saw Swans battle hard to keep in touch with West Perth kicking one goal to two and going into the last change eight points down. With their season on the line something clicked and the Mighty Black Ducks dominated the last quarter kicking four goals to one and keep their finals chance alive. The Round 20 clash against Peel in Mandurah was do or die, win and play finals, lose and no chocolates. With Peel fielding a strong Dockers contingent it was always going to be an uphill battle and unfortunately that was the case with Peel winning the game in commanding style. The Reserves finished on a high winning two of their last three games to consolidate fifth spot and will player Subjaco in an Elimination Final in week one of the Finals Round. We wish them all the best. The Colt's couldn't end their dismal season with a win with a day to forget against Peel.
