PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On a state-wide level, there continues to be some uncertainty around the structures of football heading into the future as negotiations around the new Perth Stadium look set to come to a pointy end in 2015. It is critical that the West Australian Football Commission continues to negotiate in the best interests of football as revenue they currently generate from managing Patersons Stadium is used to support the WACFL and regional development staff and structures.

The WACFL is affiliated with the WAFC and we continue to support the WAFC and Chief Executive Gary Walton as they work through these complicated negotiations with the State Government.

Country Football as a whole has certainly been surrounded by uncertainty, as in the country so much is dependent on areas often out of our control such as the impacts of the mining and agricultural industries. The WACFL's strategy around dealing with uncertainty is to ensure we have our own house in the best possible order to be in a position to cope with future uncertainties.

Football (as with a number of industries) is currently going through an evaluation phase whereby we analyse exactly what we deliver and how it is delivered. Across the state football has experienced tremendous growth in participation over the past decade whilst, unfortunately, the economic factors behind football have been somewhat diminished. The executive continues to evaluate our financial model and the programs we deliver as we strive to become more efficient.

I'm pleased to report that in 2014 we released our three year strategic plan which has already produced vast improvements in how our executive functions by giving us and our stakeholders a shared vision, "To enhance regional communities through having professionally run football competitions where participants are able to develop within a team in a safe, well governed and successfully administered environment".

One of the major challenges facing the WACFL will be to ensure our stakeholders continue to have a voice and are represented as the WAFC negotiates through the challenging times with key stakeholders such as the State Government and the AFL. For Country Football to remain strong we need to ensure we have positive relationships with these bodies for the betterment of our stakeholders.

The future of representative football continues to be a contentious issue on a national level with WA one of the few states still supportive of carnival football. Unfortunately, with changing structures of how football in other states is being managed, representative football for senior competitions is something that has fallen by the wayside, which I feel is extremely disappointing. We continue to develop our relationship with the SACFL and look forward to hosting their state side in WA in 2015.

In 2014 country football saw the passing of Colin Philpott, an individual who was critical to the establishment of the Country Week Championships, for which we will be forever grateful.

The executive continues to be very proud of our small but dedicated team of staff and welcomed the addition of Shaun Jasper in 2014. Having a steady foundation to manage our operations is certainly advantageous to our executive and stakeholders and we hope that continues in 2015.

In 2014 we saw two long serving members depart our executive in Catherine VanderWeide and Michael Kain. This year we will also say goodbye to Graeme 'Charlie' Young and Peter Sheridan who have both decided to retire from the executive. We thank the above four for their services to country football and certainly hope they continue to support country football, as I'm sure they will

With executive members leaving it opens up opportunities for new board members with some new ideas and Colin Cox and Ken Rowe have both been solid contributors to the executive's activities in the previous 12 months.

I'd like to thank the 25 Leagues within the WACFL network for their continued support of the WACFL and hope we can continue to carry out our vision in 2015.

Landmark 40 Year Anniversary

WA Country Week 50 Year All Stars

At the commencement of 2014, WACFL set about trying to select a team that composed the 'best players' that had ever played at Country Week, not an easy task.

Four selectors were chosen to put the side together and included WACFL President Terry House, John Ditchburn (Peel Thunder President), Darrell Panizza (Claremont Legend) and Cameron Knapton (WAFL Manager). All selectors have a thorough background and involvement in country football over a number of years.

The major criterion for selection in the side was specifically an individual's performance at Country Week. A number of fantastic players have used the Carnival as a stepping stone to bigger and better things, but that did not necessarily hold them in good stead for selection in this particular side.

This team is composed of players who repeatedly supported Country Week and represented their region with outstanding individual performance.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

2014 was another busy and productive year for the WACFL as we celebrated 50 years of Country Week Championships whilst continuing to strengthen our systems and support provided to our leagues and clubs.

WACFL's number one focus continues to be regional club football and the majority of our energy is channeled into helping deliver professionally run competitions across the state. Through having well run leagues and clubs with a focus on sustainability we are confident that football will continue to prosper.

Across all aspects of regional football there was a 10.67% growth figure recorded. Club football will continue to be our number one focus and, importantly, whilst many clubs operate in challenging circumstances, no clubs have shut the doors in the previous 12 months. Being able to recognise clubs in trouble and implement some strategies prior to the doors closing is an important element of our role.

In February and March, I was fortunate enough to travel to many of our leagues and carry out an information roadshow. Communicating directly to those volunteers who run leagues and clubs is one of the major challenges in the role (due to distance), so it was great to get some feedback on the challenges of managing competitions and clubs. It was also great to spend some time with those people who continue to run competitions in the country.

Feedback from these sessions and from initiatives like the Football Affairs meeting in Kellerberrin in 2013 were used to formulate the WACFL's Strategic Plan 2014-16 which was presented to leagues in July. The Strategic Plan gives the executive a solid structure to manage our business and each executive member has assumed responsibility for a portfolio, which allows them to shape strategy within their dedicated area. This Strategic Plan has already seen improvements in the way our business is conducted and I think the following two years will enable us to see the full benefit of these changes.

The highlight of the year was the Landmark Country Football Championships where we celebrated the 50th year of the championships being held in Perth. Over the 50 years of country week, an astounding list of champions has played at the carnival with many of these greats recognised over the carnival week. This year's championship was also the 40th year that Landmark (formerly Wesfarmers) has sponsored this event, a partnership we are very proud of and look forward to continuing.

Our senior State side was fortunate to travel to South Australia to continue our strong relationship with the SACFL by playing in a curtain raiser match prior to the Adelaide v Port Adelaide SANFL match in July. The side was coached by Tom Floyd and co-captained by Donnybrook's Jeff Smith and Cunderdin's Troy Skilton.

A slow start and accuracy in front of goals was again the downfall of our boys who put up a much better showing than the scoreboard suggests. In 2015 we host South Australia in WA and

will be looking for a better result. State football again received fantastic support from the players who tried out and travelled away and we thank their clubs for allowing them to participate in the program.

Country football always has a strong group of colts players, as was evidenced in a strong victory against the WAAFL colts prior to the West Coast v Gold Coast Suns match at Patersons Stadium in June. The side was coached by Craig Walker and we hope to continue to provide opportunities for these young men to show their wares to develop the next generation of leaders for country football.

The financial position of the WACFL continues to strengthen with an operating profit of \$34,330 in 2014. Accumulating funds and diversifying income continues to be a strategy of the WACFL executive as we continue to build for the uncertainty ahead.

These positive results would not have been possible without the fantastic support we receive from our sponsors year after year. I'd like to give a big thank you on behalf of the country football fraternity to ICWA, Landmark, CBH Group, New Holland, West Coast Poly, SportsPower, Horizon Power, The Regional Men's Health Initiative, GWN, Media 365 and Burley and hope they receive fantastic patronage from the football community in exchange for their support.

WACFL staff members Robyn Payne, Kellie McBean and volunteer Ben Ralph continue to work tirelessly for country football and continue to be great assets for our stakeholders. In 2014 the WACFL employed Shaun Jasper as a Country Operations Coordinator to provide assistance to myself and our team. Shaun's role has been predominantly operational and he has acquitted himself extremely well in 2014 and has a bright future in sports administration.

I'd like to take the time to acknowledge all those who are exiting the administration of country football and thank them for their services to their community. Volunteering is a thankless job at times, but without our volunteers the game would not be possible at a grass roots level.

Finally, I'd like to thank the members of the executive for their support over the last 12 months. All these members give up numerous hours volunteering for these positions for the betterment of football and I believe in the previous 12 months they have all helped steer country football into a better position to handle the challenges of the years ahead.

UMPIRING MANAGER'S REPORT

Umpire Development Programs commenced with the UMPIRE COACH PD program in February 2014.

This program over three days was attended by some 50 umpire coaches from across regional and metropolitan WA (14 regional), including all market sectors from AFL to juniors.

The format included new laws and interpretations, discussion around how to best use on line resources and a consistent umpire coaching philosophy as far as possible across WA.

The two highlights of the WAFC financially subsidised program for many was, firstly, the opportunity to match day assess WAFL umpires in a scratch match in an interactive format and, secondly, South Fremantle assistant and women's representative coach Michelle Cowan as a guest speaker.

The 14 regional WA umpire coaches that participated found the program well worthwhile and their support will ensure the program continues again in February/March 2015.

The attendance of AFL National Umpire Development Manager Adam Davis and AFL Umpire Coach Michael Vozzo was simply terrific and provided the opportunity for direct grass roots access to those setting umpire development and umpire coaching practice at the national level.

The 2014 Landmark Country Football Championships was another successful event with the umpires adding to the professionalism. It was satisfying to manage close to 60 WACFL field, boundary and goal umpires from all parts of WA who wanted to service the carnival to the best of their ability.

Regular Landmark Carnival and South West Umpire Jason Crowe was acknowledged with a special service to umpiring award in the presence of his peers.

All leagues are encouraged next year to ensure that their umpires attend the carnival to avoid missing out on this fantastic development opportunity.

A big thank you to all the umpire coaches at the Landmark Carnival that included AFL umpire coaches through to regional umpire coaches who wanted to upskill. Special mention to Greg Gilbee (Senior Field Coach), WKFL Coach Mike Kaufman (Boundary) and South West based Damian Cifelli (Goal Coach) who were charged with umpire selections, along with umpire Jak Wulff who was awarded the JJ Lussick umpire medal and went on to represent WA when the WACFL team travelled to South Australia a few weeks later.

The WAFL umpires in 2014 continued to support local regional umpires when umpiring regional WAFL matches, via PD and interaction. This is best summed up from a GNFL coach following the WAFL match in Geraldton who stated: "Can you please pass on to WAFL goal umpires Sally and Kendall a huge thankyou for their encouraging words and advice to our young goal umpires Jess Bradley and Stew Whiteaker after watching the WAFL curtain raiser on Saturday".

The AFL is to be acknowledged for maintaining useful umpire coaching tools readily available via the www.aflcommunity. com.au website, along with supporting umpires via various web based courses and on line accreditation.

We are indebted to AFL umpires Dean Margetts (field) and Dale Edwick (goals) who accompanied me in March 2014 to Bunbury and Busselton as part of the AFL Umpire Road Show program. Their contribution to local leagues was outstanding.

WAFC Umpire Manager Juniors (metro and regional) Glenn

Omodei travelled with AFL umpires Jeff Dalgleish (field) and Nathan Doig (boundary) for the other AFL Roadshow being in Albany and Ongerup. They were well received and passed on invaluable experiences.

In 2014 full time WAFC staff based throughout regional WA remained important in growing the game, including umpiring, be it umpire quantity (recruitment) and quality (education via resources), in partnership with local leagues.

A recommended priority for each league moving forward is to have your local umpire coach or other representative attend the next umpire coach PD workshop in Perth.

The accommodation, meals and other associated costs of the February Umpire Coach PD are subsidised via a WACFL and WAFC partnership, with only travel costs not included. I would ask all affiliated leagues to consider a provision in your local league budgets to assist your umpire coach meet any travel costs to attend the February 2015 Umpire Coach workshop.

WACFL ANNUAL REPORT



GENERAL MANAGER PATHWAYS & COMPETITIONS' REPORT

Whilst the 2014 season produced a number of key challenges across the WA Football landscape, it also delivered some very positive and satisfying results. Importantly, a number of these related to the WACFL. In saying this, I take the opportunity to acknowledge the efforts of our regional volunteers and stakeholder networks for their passion and dedication that sets the benchmark for quality game environments across the collective 25 Leagues.

The WAFC recognises how important the game is to the social fabric of communities in country WA and remains steadfast in working alongside the WA Country Football League to continue growing the game in regional areas and delivering programs and resources to ensure that every country town can participate in football.

The upward growth in participation continued in 2014, with participation numbers increasing by another 10.7% to over 178,000 across the State. Around a third of these participants, or just over 51,000, are in country WA, illustrating why the WACFL is such an important part of the football family.

Our sights are now set on reaching 200,000 participants across WA by the time the new stadium is scheduled for completion at the beginning of the 2018 AFL season. This will ensure football helps build a solid foundation for the new stadium and its increased capacity, and in turn is supported by better financial outcomes from the new Perth Stadium.

With the future economic model of football in WA reliant on outcomes from the new Perth Stadium, we will continue to experience ongoing challenges within the WA Football industry until greater certainty is achieved. An unintended consequence of moving to a new stadium is the inability to secure any further long-term sponsorships and supply arrangements at Patersons Stadium and the additional financial benefits that come from longer-term agreements.

A cost savings program has been implemented to ensure that the WAFC adapts in a timely way to both the changing economic environment and the impact of the development of the new Perth Stadium. The majority of the cost savings have been internal to the WAFC, but stakeholders, including the WAFL, Districts, Amateurs and Country, have also been asked to contribute. None of this has been easy and we appreciate the level of understanding from our stakeholders.

Pleasingly, the WAFCL appears very well placed to ensure that key development and competition outcomes can continue to be achieved. Strategically, the WAFCL is in a very sound position.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2014

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1987. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Dividend revenue

Dividends are recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depends on whether the outcome of the services can be measured reliably. If this is the case then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period. If the outcome cannot be reliably measured then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST). $% \label{eq:control_good}$

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.
