### CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

Members of the South Fremantle Football Club, on behalf of the Board of Directors, I have much pleasure in presenting for your adoption the club's 110th Annual Report.

The disappointment of last years on field performance was completely erased this year when the players responded magnificently on grand final day to win in both the league and reserves grand finals a feat that was last performed in the 1954 football season.

The season started in earnest on a very positive note with the recruitment of Peter Bell, Jeff Farmer, Jaymie Graham, Theo Adams and Nathan Street and then the mid year inclusion of former Perth fairest and best player Chris Bossong, thanks to club supporter Joe Rotondella who paid his transfer fee.

Directors Peter Christie, Anthony Van Der Wielen and Santo Merenda played a leading hand in convincing the above players to sign with the club and must be congratulated on their astute judgement and negotiation skills.

The coaches and support staff were then able to mould our squad into two most competitive teams that finished minor premiers and along the way won the Pat Rodriguez Shield for the best performed club over three grades.

The colts were most unlucky not to play finals this year even though they won 13 games. Many of our colts players had an outstanding season and should make the transition to senior football in 2010 rather comfortably if they have good preseasons.

Off the field major renovations occurred in the home change rooms which are now the best in the league.

The board is now looking at enlarging and refurbishing the club kitchen in preparation for a busy 2010. Our official club caterer Guido Micalizzi recognised throughout the football industry as the best in the business is looking to sign a long term lease agreement with the club which should benefit both parties and give members additional opportunities to visit the club and taste his gourmet meals.

The Strzelecki Group Indigenous Rising Star Award was won by outstanding junior Brendan Ah Chee.



### WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Roy and Pam, Ruby, Ron and Sheila ..... build a Bulldog tradition



At the last 'home' derby I attended the pre-match luncheon proudly wearing my 'SFFC- The Premier Family Club' T-shirt. I love being at South. The atmosphere at pre-dinner drinks, as usual, was terrific, the people warm and friendly and there was a feeling of confidence that our players would perform against a vastly improved and unbeaten East Fremantle, our traditional rival.

My wife, Caroline, and I were randomly allocated seating at the luncheon between truly legendry South people, Ron and Sheila Greer and Pam McGuinness. Both had recently lost loved ones, great South people who had dedicated a lifetime to South Fremantle. Pam was on her first trip back to the club after the passing of husband Roy and Sheila and Ron were battling the loss of a great mate and long time South helper, the extremely popular Ruby Wilson.

My immediate thoughts went out to the wonderful work done by Ruby and Roy over some 50 odd years. Then how could one leave out the Greers' with more than a 100 years of combined service, particularly as Sheila and Ruby worked identical paths. This is why we have such a wonderful club... the volunteers who dedicate their life for the betterment of South. We need to recognise and appreciate the work done by all of these marvellous South people. This story is a tribute to all who have volunteered to assist our wonderful club.

Probably we should amend the "Where Are They Now" banner for this our fifteenth issue...we all know that Ron and Sheila are never away from our club and that Ruby and Roy are probably overseeing the 'Bulldogs in the Heaven' matches starring greats like Bernie, 'Scrano', 'Big Dave', 'Loafer', 'Bones' 'Big Boots' and crew...

Their contribution to South represents something like 200 voluntary years of service in a club that's slightly more than 100 years old. Fantastic effort and wonderful dedication!

#### **Roy McGuinness**

The McGuinness association with South is sensational, dating back to 1905 when



Roy's great uncle, Otto Kelly, was Captain of our club playing 30 games (Cap No. 136). Between 1927-31 Roy's father, Jack 'Trotter' McGuinness, played 79 matches (Cap 422) and also captained the side. Undoubtedly the most outstanding statistic at South involves Roy's wife, Pam... who represents three generations of South Fremantle Life Members. Pam won Life Membership in 1998 after many, many years of hard work on the ladies committee; her father, Claude Law, was rewarded in 1943 after some 32 years as club Secretary, Committee member, vice president fund-raiser and delegate; Son, Lorne was honoured in 2005 for his dedication and reliability as Trainers' Assistant. Lorne is now in his nineteenth year as club helper.

And still there's more. Pam's mother, Thelma Law, donated 20 valuable years to South's Ladies committee and son Brad spent 15 years in a variety of roles from Colt's statistician and runner to League runner, Team Manager and Chairman of Selectors.

As a youngster Roy would always get to Freo oval early to meet his idol, Clive Lewington, as he got off the tram in South Terrace. He would assist Clive off the tram and carry his bag into the ground with pride and get into the ground free. All boys were rewarded with free entry for lumping a league player's bag on match days.

Roy played just two league matches (Cap 718) in 1949 during the 'Golden Years' of South and played 79 Reserves games. He proved his outstanding talent by being runner-up for the 1950 Prendergast medal for the best player in the competition. However it was tough for any little fella to crack a league game in that era with the likes of Steve Marsh, Harry Carbon and Barry White to compete with.

Roy continued his connection with Fremantle Ex Scholars FC which awarded him with Life Membership in 1954 the same year he won Life Membership of the Fremantle Ex-Scholars Association. He also helped in the formation of North Fremantle Amateur FC and was captain in 1956.



In 1957/8 he was inaugural Secretary/ Manager of South's Thirds (Colts); 1959 joined SFFC committee; league selector 1960. Then after many years assisting SF Junior Council was appointed Life Member of South in 1969. During the next 35 years he held a variety of positions, including Chairman of Colts (four years) and interchange steward 1994-2003. Roy has recently been honoured with his name on the interchange bench. Roy sadly passed away in February just a few days short of his 80th...a lifetime of wonderful service to our great club.

**Ron & Sheila Greer and Ruby Wilson** Ron, Sheila and Ruby's association began with South in 1957 where they assisted with Hilton Park under 16's in our junior comp. Each had a son, Gary, playing and Ron was President and both ladies assisted in the canteen, at players' teas and selling raffle tickets. The coach was a very young John Todd but after injuring a knee he was replaced with South former player Kyffin Miller.

A couple of years later the boys moved onto South playing Fourths (under 19's), Colts and Reserves before both playing their first league matches in 1963. Gary Wilson (Cap 859) played eight league games and Gary Greer (Cap 851), 169 matches with South, including the 1970 Premiership... he was rewarded with Life Membership in 1981.

In the meantime the mothers were now helping at South. Among their many duties, Ruby and Sheila were preparing afternoon tea for sponsors', guests' and directors' on match days, sandwiches for the reserves and league teams, arranging players teas and selling raffle tickets in between. Sheila was quick to respond to the excellent help from Myrtle Williams, Jess Leslie and Anna Riddell. Sheila was honoured with Life Membership in 1983.

"Today Marion Reid and her team of helpers are arranging afternoon teas and food for special occasions", Sheila said. "They do a fantastic job. However, Vida Dunstan and I supply sandwiches for the Past Players half-time get together."



Sheila spoke with great emotion when describing her great mate, Ruby. "She loved South Fremantle. She was very popular with players, supporters and trainers. We worked together as good teams do until Ruby decided at 90 that was enough. She was 96 when she passed on."

Born in Fremantle, Ruby was rewarded with Life Membership of both South Fremantle (1982) and the Fremantle branch of the Labor party. She has been quoted as saying: "The people of South have been my saviour. I've done my part for the things I love."

Ron Greer has served just about every position at South from Premiership President (1980), Director, Trustee to raffle ticket seller and dishwasher.

He joined South in 1947, was appointed to the committee in 1963 and was President for the 1980 Premiership, after Norrie McDonald resigned through ill health. In 1971 he was awarded Life Membership. For five years he was a Trustee of our club and was President of the Social Club for some time. Ron played a major role in running the 'Car Club' for 42 years... a terrific fund raiser for South with an annual car-raffle.

Ron has been honoured with Life Membership of the WAFL for his services to football, particularly South Fremantle.

You can still catch Ron and Sheila any Friday selling raffle tickets to members at the entrance to our club. Make sure you enter through Greer's Gate a tribute to their wonderful service to South. There's only one thing missing...their great mate Ruby's not with us to fold the raffle tickets as she has so diligently done for many, many years.

When asked for their favourite ever South player Ron said 'Toddy' but Sheila interrupted and corrected him, "We don't have any favourites. We love them all".

"South Fremantle has been our life", Ron said.

Then Sheila added, "Yes we've had a wonderful life and if we had our time all over again we wouldn't change a thing. Particularly our time at South, we've got friends for life." The message from Pam McGuinness was strikingly similar. "Dad took me to South when I was very young. He was assistant secretary to Frank Harrison and I can remember helping dad by cutting all South stories from the newspapers and pasting them into a club scrapbook.

"Roy also had an early start at South, carrying Clive's bag and helping his father as property man between 1938-41.

"So we can sincerely say with pride South has been our life. The Premierships have been great but we truly treasure the lifetime of friends we have made among players, members and supporters of our fabulous club."

This story of wonderful dedication to our club is no 'lone ranger'. There are dozens of similar stories of hard work and sacrifice for the mighty 'red and whites'. Through this column we thank you all...please take a bow...you deserve it.





Our property men Jonesy and Sandy even though you get a bit grumpy you do a great job and the colts would not be the same without you guys. Thanks!



### 200 RESERVES REPORT

The senior squad enjoyed incredible success in 2009, and the achievement of dual premierships made all of the hard work more than worth it. 



# 200 PLAYER DEVELOPMENT OFFICER REPORT

#### SFFC "Warriors development Program 2009:

The newly created position of Player Development Officer was implemented by the SFFC with board approval, in conjunction with recommendations from the WAFL high performance academy. The PDO role responsibilities are mainly centred on talent and the delivery of talent programs, and the administration functions of all the talent programs.

The SFFC Warriors development program covers our 14/15/16s junior player ranks, and these programs run from December through to mid October. The SF Warriors program includes a WAFL carnival involving all WAFL clubs. Players are selected from our metropolitan, district and regional areas (UGS and Gascoyne regions).

#### 16s Carnival/WAFL Program:

Our SF 16's Warriors development squad played five games starting in March, and completed in late April. The team was coached by head coach Arthur Maskos and a team of assistants including Jason Ireland, Mark Pashby, Paul McGrath, Sam Maskos, and team manager Peter Robinson. The players were rotated into many unfamiliar positions and acquitted themselves very well in all games.

Our Chairman Mr. Peter O'Neill provided the program with a staff of volunteers that were organized and very professional

in all areas. The Players were exposed to quality coaching and education programs along with the opportunity to play and develop their skills and knowledge to a higher level than they are able to attain at community levels. The SFFC supported by the development committee led by Mr. Peter O'Neill worked very hard to provide the funds that are required to run a quality program. To our major Sponsors Woolworths the fresh food people, Tony Ale, Seacorp, Hamilton Engineering, we must say a huge thank you and we look forward to your continued support of junior development.

Following the WAFL 16s carnival program four players were selected to represent WA at State level: Shane Kersten, Steve Verrier, Brendon Ah Chee ("Jim Hurst" Medal Best player award for the 16s carnival), and Myles Bolger.

The SF Warriors 16s development group completed a tour of Melbourne in July, which included a group of 38 players and eight adults made up of SFFC delegated staff: PDO, Development chairman, and coaching staff. The tour gives the best young players in our district and regions a chance to observe and be exposed to the rigors and life of an elite football player playing in the AFL. Our Development squad played two games against quality opposition, providing the coaches and PDO the opportunity to identify which players have the potential and what

areas require work for the individuals and the group of players to improve and develop. Our squad performed very well winning convincingly against St Monica's College and, narrowly going down to Xavier College senior squad. The players also attended three quality AFL games and watched a couple of the AFL clubs go through a training session. Brad Hardie, a past SFFC Bulldog champion player spoke to the boys about opportunity and life at a prearranged dinner to enlighten the players and provide them with information and ideas, along with many humorous stories on past Bulldogs and AFL champions.

#### 14/15s WAFL Carnival:

Our 14/15s carnival consisted of four teams of thirty players selected and invited from all our districts and regional centres to represent SFFC at this level. The teams all played some great football and we again expose our developing young players to field positions that they may have never before have played in. Our coaches were: Daniel Vidovich, Jason Ireland, Sam Saffioti, and Darrin Bryden, each team consisted of three assistants and a team manager who all work tirelessly to provide a safe and professional environment for the players to develop their football skills and knowledge. Special mention to the players selected into the WA State schoolboy's squad: Sean Lynch, Sam Rundle, Michael Marriot and Adam Carter. Jayden D'Vauz was also selected by the AFL and Kick start tour of South Africa as part of a leadership development program provided to rising young players with indigenous heritage.

#### **Country / Regional Servicing:**

The SFFC and the DFDC worked hard to provide the UGS and the Gascoyne regions with coaching courses and development sessions to all talent squads as selected in their own regions. Training sessions were conducted at Williams and in Narrogin; our 14/15s development squad played a match at Williams in June. During the season we travelled to the Exmouth and the Carnarvon region twice to identify any potential players and hold school clinics to promote the SFFC and the WAFL pathway.

The UGS Rams development squads were guest of the SFFC during country week in July and performed very well in all matches with some standout performers who we invited back to be a part of our 14/15s carnival later in the year. The SFFC

District Manager Bradd Gardiner and YDO Louise McKenry accommodated the group and worked hard all season to keep the development program heading in the right direction at all times.

#### Future trends and possible directions:


In partnership with the WAFL and the high performance academy programs SFFC players selected into the state academy programs will be fully supported, in the form of mentoring/leadership/ strength and conditioning programs, and to further develop the players more video analysis will be conducted at our club by senior players and coaches to enhance the game sense of individuals and the groups. The players will be required to access a website and complete daily templates to monitor workloads and type of strength, and conditioning training undertaken. Coaching will be heavily invested in and many Clubs and coaches under our umbrella will have to lift to achieve the required minimum standards set for all groups on and off the field of play. With our district and zones providing more and more players the development program will have to expand its network to maintain the quality and training ethos towards development of all players selected into our squads.

#### In Conclusion:

The SFFC and DFDC have worked very hard to provide all our stakeholders with the necessary training and quality programs to ensure the development of our junior football players and that coaching staff are meeting the required levels to build on the SF Warriors development programs provided. We continue to provide a pathway and opportunity for players and coaches to enhance their skills, and to make our club the "Premier Family Club" a model for others to follow. The work that all our volunteers and elected delegates put in over a season is amazing, without the assistance, and help of all these people our program would not be as professional and well organized as it is. The SFFC and the DFDC, and I personally would like to say thank you to all concerned, and I look forward to the season ahead and the continued improvement of this fantastic program.

#### DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT REPORT

The South Fremantle District Football Development Council in 2010 has achieved some encouraging results. We have consolidated our participation numbers to be the healthiest District in the state. Our focus this year has been on ensuring all players have a quality club and environment to play and enjoy their football in. We have also ensured that our clubs have the capacity to handle the intake of the large influx of junior players coming through.

Club, Facility and Volunteer Development were 3 key areas which we aimed to achieve some quality outcomes this year and I think we have. We had 158 key senior and junior stakeholders attend our club development night which is a key component of our Quality Club rollout in 2010 which will see all clubs on a bronze, silver, gold program. This will assist all clubs to ensure that their clubs are using best practice strategies and ensuring they remain sustainable.

We have been working very hard with each of the 6 Local Government Councils which encompasses the District to develop a facility plan which will see the best result for football over the next 10 years. We have secured a number of new facilities and upgrades to existing ones moving forward, which will be integral in capturing the new populations that we have moving into our District. Our relationships with local and state governments have never been better and we will continue to build on the success of these relationships.

Our Volunteer Development Program received a shot in the arm at the start of 2009 when we were successful in receiving a volunteer grant from the federal government. The \$55K enabled us to provide BBQ's, Gazebo's, Line Markers, Patio Heaters and \$33K worth of Caltex fuel cards to our clubs. All clubs used the fuel cards to reward and recognise the key volunteers within their organisation, which we all know is a key component in retaining and recruiting quality people to fill these volunteer roles. We also held a function for our key stakeholders at the WAFL GF to thank our key clubs and volunteers for their efforts in 2009 and watch the mighty bulldogs rack up two flags.

In general it was a great year for development and I will now detail some of the main achievements:

#### 1. Continuous Improvement in Environment and People in the District

• Conducted Club Development Night with 158 volunteers in attendance. The night involved a 3 course meal and sessions with topics such as Volunteer Development, Best Practice Strategies, Multicultural participation and Child Protection.

- Introduced a "Safe Clubs for Kids" pilot for all clubs, where each club has a reporting officer and procedure manual for any cases of child abuse. This will predominantly be a preventative measure which we hope no club needs to use but is part of a quality risk management program which the District is rolling out
- Have formed a partnership with the South Metropolitan Public Health Unit in Fremantle to form a program which will provide a healthy environment for all families involved with the SF District as well as assisting clubs to engage local, state and federal funding which is available when clubs provide these healthy environments
- Sent out 4500 District Dirt newsletters at start of year to promote registration day and inform participants and families of new and emerging programs
- This year saw over 70 coaches become accredited in Auskick, Youth or Senior coaching, with a further 13 expanding their coaching skills by gaining a Level 2 accreditation. Of those, 5 have gone on to coach at the next level with the South Fremantle Development Program. With the addition of our coaching co ordinator in Jason Ireland, and Player Development Officer Michael Athanasiou to the SFFC, the district was able to assist coaches and clubs as needed in the field. The addition of Jason to the DFDC has been fantastic, as his hard work within the district means coaches, old and new, are getting more support and opportunities as they require.
- Next year sees the introduction of our 'Coaches Program'. A new initiative, it sees more resources, seminars and support available for those coaching in the South Fremantle District. Our aim is to ensure our coaches get the best possible opportunities to further their skills and learn new techniques to raise the bar within the district.

#### 2. Promoting and Managing Growth

- Megan O'Mara and Adrian Ricciardello were our in school and after school clinic coordinators this year and they did an outstanding job completing our schools program
- District conducted over 255 clinics in our schools, reaching over 30,000 students.
- Started a new Auskick Centre in the fast growing suburb of Hammond Park and secured an oval and a facility plan with the City of Cockburn to accommodate the predicted large participation rate for the club
- Record number of teams in our STS Cup (years 8 and 9's) and Belt Up Cup (years 11 and 12's), 14 and 12 teams respectively.

- This year saw some record numbers for participation at many centres and events. The annual 'Bulldogs of the Future' Auskick Gala day saw over 600 enthusiastic players brave the cold and windy conditions to join some of their favourite Bulldogs players to play a round robin of games under lights at Fremantle Oval. A big thanks to NAB and Harvey Fresh, whose support ensured the future stars had a sausage sizzle and fresh juices available to recharge after showing off their skills.
- Eight after school and two All-Girl Auskick centres were run in 2010, which saw over 450 x 5-12 year olds join in, many of them first time footballers. The six week programs are designed to teach basic skills and footy rules, with each participant receiving an Auskick footy pack filled with AFL goodies. Thanks to our trusty team of after-school coaches who ran these sessions, without them it would not have been possible to give this many schools the opportunity to host these programs.
- Despite some inclement weather, our enthusiastic Auskickers turned out in force again for the second gala day of the season. Hosted for the second year by the Forrestdale JFC, it saw over 400 children participate in a fun filled day of footy. The weather couldn't dampen the spirits of the players as they slipped and slided their way through a round robin, ending with some fantastic food and drink by the Forrestdale canteen staff and parent volunteers. Thank you to the club, especially Co-ordinator Leanne Shadbolt and all the committee members for making this a wonderful day.
- Overall, our Auskick programs are thriving after several years of significant growth. This wouldn't happen without dedicated volunteers, parents and our hard working Auskick Co-ordinators of all our junior clubs, without you this wouldn't be possible.
- Increase in schools participation in all of the WAFC competitions, including Eagles Cup, Smarter than Smoking Cup, and Belt – Cup.
- It was a successful season for the district, which saw many of our schools and teachers win awards and competitions. Congratulations to Forrestdale Primary for winning the state-wide 'Design a Jumper' competition, Winthrop Baptist for their STS Girls cup win and boys grand final appearance, CBC for their SportsReady cup win and our Eagles Cup winners.
- Our School Ambassadors have once again done some fantastic work within the district, with one of them being recognised as the State Primary School Ambassador of the Year. South Coogee

Primary teacher Gary Gough was honoured for his work with both his school and the district in 2009, a well deserved award for someone who puts many hours of his own time to promote and run our great game.

#### 3. Reaching new Populations

#### Female Football:

- This year saw South Fremantle become the first District to provide a full pathway to girls aged 5 and up. The addition of a team into the Youth Girls Carnival saw the final age barrier break down, and will be used as a launching pad for the inaugural South Fremantle Youth Girls season in 2010.
- This year saw another new addition to the DFDC, with Nicole Hughes becoming the Female Football Rep for the district. She has been involved in every aspect of female football this year, especially our Auskick and junior programs. She has been integral in getting our first ever Youth Girls team off the ground, and along with Megan O'Mara has coached every age group, passing on her skills and knowledge to our next batch of superstars.
- One of the highlights of our programs this year was the opportunity to play half time at an AFL match during Women's Round. It saw 60 Auskickers and 22 junior girls from our programs play in front of a sell out crowd at Subiaco Oval. It was a fantastic opportunity to promote female football in WA and the Bulldogs Girls did us proud
- 2010 sees us continue building on the foundations we have laid in the past 3 years to have female football become a permanent part of our fixtured junior and youth season. The launch of the 'Pink Packs' enticed many girls to try football for the first time and we hope these girls continue to rise through the ranks at their chosen junior clubs.

#### **Multicultural Program**

Russell Higgins has done a fantastic job in his first 12 months of his position.

At the end of 2008 the District Development Department applied to Department of Sport and Recreation for funding which would further enhance our already successful Multicultural Program.

In May last year we were successful in our application for funds to the tune of \$70,000, which would help fund a full time Community Multicultural Officer for a period of up to 18 months.

Russell Higgins is the result and was appointed in August of last year and is based out of the South Fremantle District Development Office.

Russell's main objective is to use Aussie Rules Football to integrate new and emerging cultures into the wider community. Turn "Classmates into Team Mates" is the catch cry for the program which we hope will see plenty more Paul Mugambwa's at South's in the near future.

This year we have managed to secure \$50k per annum over 3 years to have Russell based at the WA Football Commission where he will manage the Multicultural portfolio for the entire state.

We wish Russell all the best and thank him for his quality contribution as an employee and a person – well done!

#### 4. Player Retention

- Focus on youth coaches in regards to quality and accreditation proved to be successful, with strong numbers seen in a majority of youth teams.
- Conduced a number of High School Recreation Football Programs this year which we hope will keep more participants involved in 2010

#### **Country Servicing**

- Secured up to \$20k from Great Southern Fuels in Lake Grace and Flight Centre Garden City to provide flights and fuel cards for our young and talented country stars when they travel to SFFC and ply their talents
- Provided football reports for the UGS
- Conducted clinics at all 6 schools in the Gascoyne
- Conducted training sessions with the Gassy Bulldogs development squad and identified up to 7 players for Warriors
- Conducted a level one accreditation course for 6 coaches over two nights in Carnarvon

- Upper Great Southern Rams competed in the Country carnival in the July school holidays and were all richer for the experience.
- Assisted the UGS Rams with their Country Carnival weekend through training sessions at Fremantle oval and development sessions at Santich Park

A huge thank you must go to the volunteers who sit on all our Development arm bodies. To have the calibre of people such as Rob Taylor, Graeme Smith, Shane Harding, Sharon Greengrass, Robyn Elms, Sheryl Ward, Sue Ireland, Nicole Hughes, Richard Liedtke, Gary Gough, Adrian Lacquiere and Mal Hooper is an honour and we would at a loss without them.

To Mike, JB, Amelia, Kirsty and crew for all their help at the front office, we thank you for all your support and team building efforts.

Thank you to all Junior Clubs for all their support for the year. It is essential to our core business in development that we have a strong and sustainable partnership with our junior colleagues and we do appreciate the outcomes achieved by the committees and volunteers out there in club land.

South Fremantle District Football Development has achieved some amazing results this year and we must commend Louise McKenry's efforts in her second year as Development Officer and Jamie Eggers our Development Trainee on the mountain of work they have competed this year – well done!

# STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views). The financial statements have also been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial statements.

#### Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### **Property, Plant and Equipment**

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost or at independent or directors' valuation, less where applicable any accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows, which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal.

# **Employee Entitlements**

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those entitlements.

Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

#### Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in at call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months, net of bank overdrafts.

# 200 TREASURER'S REPORT

The audited Financial Statements for the year end 31 October 2009 reflect a profit of \$1202 which is below our budget expectations but understandable in the current economic climate.

Despite the low profit our Statement of Financial Position remains strong and cash reserves have decreased only marginally due to the capital expenditure in the changerooms.

Our bar trading is starting to show a vast improvement not only with increase sales but also in better gross profit margins as well as reductions in cost areas such as general bar expenses, repairs and maintenance and staff wages.

Marketing and sponsorship this year was mainly aided by the acquisition of several new sponsors and souvenir sales due to our premiership success.

Due to a decrease in transfer fee income and extra expenditure in player and coaching fees, the football department disclosed the largest movement from a loss of \$893 in 2008 to \$183,199 in 2009.

Our membership income increased significantly this year and was aided by a concerted effort through radio advertising and individuals concerned. The end result was an increase in member numbers with the revenue from 2008 being \$54,958 to \$85,641 this year a wonderful result in an area that is usually fairly stagnant.

The overall net cash flow of the club remains very positive and allowing for depreciation , amortization , movements between assets liabilities and provisions the net cash flow provided by operating activities amounted to \$129,956 compared to \$125,252 in 2008.

Our cash holdings at 31 October 2009 are \$614,050 of which a significant amount is interest earning.
