2021 is a special year for our league as we celebrate 100 years of amateur football. Our league has never been as big as in 2021 and we recently topped the 12,500 player milestone which makes us a comparable size to the WACFL and their 25 Country Leagues state-wide.

Tonight, we welcome members of the 1991 Amateur State Team which remains the only WA team to win the National Amateur Carnival. The memories and connections formed by these players is a special bond which demonstrates the benefit and value of continuing our representative football programs.

LAST TIME THEY MET

A BRIEF HISTORY

For the Perth Football League, state football is the pinnacle of an amateur player's career, or the start of an elite one. State footy stories are long and filled with inspiring victories, embarrassing defeats and bittersweet rivalries.

Founded in 1973, the WACFL today comprises of 25 Senior Leagues, 150 Country Clubs and around 12,500 players, not to mention the 5,000 plus volunteers who help facilitate football each weekend.

The PFL last faced the WACFL in 2019 in what was a rare win for the amateurs in a tight contest. Over the last decade, the WACFL have claimed bragging rights in a period of dominance, winning nine out of the last eleven representative matches.

However, prior to this in the late 1980's up until 2000, it was the amateurs who reigned supreme, winning eight out of ten encounters during this period. The two team's compete annually for the Kevin Duffy Shield which is named after long serving Life Member and Official of the WACFL.

You may notice a reversed swan logo on tonight's jumpers worn by the PFL which was designed to replicate the style of the 1936 amateur state team jumper, who were the first WA amateur representative side in history (pictured below).

In an inspiring victory, it was the PFL who claimed the win over the WACFL by 9 points at Charles Riley Reserve under lights on Friday 31 May 2019.

It took just a minute and a half for the PFL to kick their first goal off the boot of Ryan Ekert. A dislocated knee to WACFL's Toby Gianatti just minutes later left his side down a rotation for the remainder of the match. With accurate goal kicking on their side, the fast-starting PFL kicked four goals straight, all while restricting Country to an erroneous 1.2.

Faced with a 16 point deficit at quarter time, Country were roused into action by the coaching group, including senior coach Craig Walker, which inspired them to boot three majors to one and head into the main break only a 7 point deficit. With a dominant goal-kicking display from Bassendean spearhead Dino Ross (3), the amateurs were able to regain a handy lead of 21 points ahead of the final quarter.

A galvanizing fourth quarter comeback from WACFL was led by Narrogin forward Mason Hill (3) applying scoreboard pressure while keeping the PFL goalless in the final term. The amateurs were able to hold off country's late charge to claim just their second Kevin Duffy Shield in over a decade.

Gosnell's Josh Hall claimed the best on ground honours for the victorious PFL side while Rob Falkstrom from Halls Head was the standout for the WACFL in a valiant defeat.

WOMEN'S TEAM PROFILES

BEAU WOTERS PFL COACH

Former West Coast Eagles premiership player and vice-captain Beau Waters will be at the helm of the PFL Women's side. Renowned for his courage and physical style of play, Waters will be hoping to instill some of his



trade mark toughness into his players in order to claim victory in the inaugural Women's State Match.

Waters played a total of 120 games for the Eagles and was named in the All-Australian team on a half-back flank in 2012. He was also awarded the Chris Mainwaring Award for Best Clubman in 2009 for his work for the club while out injured. As the youngest member of the premiership side, he was a key contributor in the Grand Final win over Sydney gathering 26 possessions and taking ten marks.

Waters has been involved at amateur level as part of the coaching staff at University Football Club for the Women's A Grade side and will be very familiar with the talent running around in his team.



CLARE DICKSON DEL CODTOIN

Clare is an experienced on baller with excellent leadership skills which will be on display tonight as she leads the inaugural State Women's team out onto Fremantle Community Bank Oval.

She transferred to the Perth Football League after playing for Waratah's League side in the Northern Territory Football League and was a part of the inaugural Kingsley side in 2018 before moving across to North Beach in 2021.



WACFL COACH

Michelle Harris was appointed as this year's State Women's Coach because of her extensive credentials over 12 years of coaching experience. This includes being a Coach and Assistant Coach of the WA under-18 Women's side,



four years as Assistant Coach at the Eaton Boomers and the title of WA's Australian Football Coaches Association 2011 Female Coach of the Year.

Harris has been paving the way for women in football after becoming the first female Head Coach in South West Football League history. She then became the inaugural South West Football League Women's Premiership Coach from the Nutrien Ag Championships in 2019.

She is currently coaching South Bunbury Football Club Women's team, making her very familiar with the ability that her squad possesses.



BETHANY BOND Wacfl Co-Captain

Bethany made history when she kicked over 100 goals in the South West Women's Football League. She was the League's inaugural player and has played 47 games for South

Bunbury, 18 games for Peel Thunder, and is currently the Captain and Assistant Coach of Bubury's Women's team. She is also a two time South Bunbury premiership player and a member of the 2019 South West Nutrien Ag Country Championship winning team.



RENNIE MEADMORE WACFL CO-CAPTAIN

Rennie begun her football career when she joined the Busselton Magpies in 2018 after moving across from netball. She has played 48 games for Busselton and has been the team's

Captain since 2019 which was the year she was the side's leading goal kicker. Rennie was a member of the 2019 South West Nutrien Ag Country Championship winning team and then co-captained the team in 2021.

MEN'S TERM PROFIL

DARREN YOUNG **PFL COACH**

Darren Young has appointed as the Coach of the Men's PFL State side as a result of his affiliation with the League for over 15 years as a player and coach. Young tasted premiership success, winning back to back flags with Bassendean in 2018 and 2019.



He has also been involved in a Laurie Keene Colts premiership in 2012 and coached the club's B Grade team to a preliminary final in 2020.

Young will be hoping that his side can repeat their 2019 performance over the WACFL which will be a massive task for him reproduce given the accomplished talent running around in the Country Leagues today.



Ben is a prolific ball winner who is able find the footy on both the inside and outside. He played for East Fremantle from 2016 to 2018 and was awarded with the Prendergast Medal in 2017 as

the fairest & best player in the WAFL Reserves competition. Ben made the move to Peel Thunder in 2019 and then decided to join the amateurs through University Football Club in 2020. He was recently awarded with the best on ground medal for his performance against Fremantle CBC at the Centenary Match.



WACFL COACH

For the sixth year in a row, the Men's WACFL State team will be coached by Craig Walker, whose experience is sought after in the country League. impressive football resume consisting of Senior Coach roles at Northhampton,



Chapman Valley, Lakes and Borden to go along with four premierships makes him the perfect candidate to lead the the WACFL State team to victory.

Walker will be looking to atone for his side's narrow loss against the PFL when the sides last met in 2019. Fortunately for the WACFL side, Walker's pedigree also includes overseeing the WA State team that defeated South Australia at Optus Stadium in 2019 which will certainly be advantageous to him.

With the depth of talent currently found in the country League, his team will be every chance to knock off the PFL in what is set to be a cracking game under Friday night lights.



JESSE CRICHTON

Jesse played 18 games for the Fremantle Dockers after being drafted in 2009 at pick 48 and is now playing for Harvey Brunswick Leschenault in the South West Football League.

He was awarded with the Hayward Medal in 2019 as the fairest & best player in the South West Football League and has led the WACFL State side to victory previously as Captain in 2019. Jesse has also played 39 games for East Fremantle and 50 games for Peel Thunder where he finished third in their fairest and best in 2010.

ACCEPTING DEFEAT

Kerry Coates was the state senior coach in 2003. On his side was Trent Cooper, who is now the Fremantle Dockers AFL Women's Team Coach.

First up in the state season was a match against WA Country Football League, who would take home the bragging rights for the night.

Up next was SA — the WA team played well in the first half, but a second half capitulation saw the opponent walking off the pitch victors.

The formidable Victoria side was the third and final match for the 2003 state season, however the only positive to come out of the game was that the WA players were able to play on Subiaco Oval before an AFL match.

The team was thrashed by the fit, skilful and more experienced east coast team, with Victoria finishing the game on 176 points and WA failing to score a goal, only managing three behinds.

Cooper remembers playing fullback, marking former Hawthorn player Brett O'Farrell. He wasn't the only ex-AFL player on the Victorian team however.


"They had John Stevens who played for Sydney, Paul Corrigan, Stewey Lowe was in the squad and didn't get selected," he said. "Their side was really stacked."

Despite playing well over the three state games and being awarded the Laurie Tetley Medal for the best WA state player that year, it wasn't the best game of footy he had been a part of. "I remember it was a reasonably warm day, and watching the ball go over my head an awful lot that day," Cooper said. "I remember on the half-time siren, one of the guys from Victoria had a free kick on the boundary and he was literally, man on the mark was 65m out, and he went back after the siren and kicked a torpedo and it went through. I was on the line and it just went over my hand.

"I can still remember the grand announcer saying, 'and that just about sums it up'. It was 13 or 14 goals to zero at that stage — we couldn't do anything right.

"The last five or six minutes I got a message to go forward and try to kick a goal. So I went forward and O'Farrell had come with me. I said to him, 'what are you doing? You are up by 27 goals'. He said, 'there is no way I'm going to have the only goal kicked by my opponent'.

"So he followed me around. I had a shot on goal and I missed it."



A TASTE OF VICTORY

Footy is always filled with highs and lows, and while 2003 might have been disappointing, at the Australian Amateur Football Council (AAFC) Carnival in 1991 it was anything but.

Winning for the first time on home ground since hosting the carnival in 1982, Bill Armstrong became the only victorious WA captain at the AAFC Carnival.

Armstrong has a long and storied career in amateur football at nearly all levels of the game, from 200 games with Mount Lawley to representing his state and being selected to play with the All Australian Amateur team on two occasions, and he remembers his time playing for the state well.

"Like all footballers know, they love the mateship and the comradeship, and that was one good thing about playing state footy — you got to meet a lot of other guys from other clubs," he said. "Strike up those sort of friendships, which made it a bit more interesting when you're playing each other. There was always a handshake after, but it was competition during the game."

Reminiscing on the AAFC Carnival, the first match against a strong SA side saw WA come out on top — 124 to 97. The next game against Tasmania saw WA cruise through 189 to 45. After the two games at Subiaco, the match against the Victorians was moved to Claremont Oval.

"It poured with rain," Armstrong recalls. "So we just kept moving it forward. I remember after that

game, we had won and we could hardly believe it, we were just that excited."






