NOTICES OF INVESTIGATION

Perth Football League clubs looking to submit a Notice of Investigation will notice a new option when clicking on the www.perthfootball.com.au website under Integrity.

Through an evolving Match Review process clubs will be able to submit an NOI with two options:

- (1) NOI with video footage on the Hudl platform no bond required
- (2) NOI with no video footage \$500 bond required as per the existing process

The first option is both simpler and streamlined with the intent to provide an easier submission and match review process.

With the challenge around club upload of video footage and opportunities for clubs to review this around incidents of concern, all clubs will have the opportunity to submit a video footage NOI by Wednesday 9am following the match. This is not intended to delay the club upload of footage to the Hudl platform.

The timelines for the Match Review process are as follows:

^{*}Clubs that are awaiting video footage upload from opposition should contact a Football Operations team member prior to 9am Monday to indicate their intent to submit.

HUDL CAMERA ANGLES

Clubs with Hudl cameras are strongly encouraged to ensure the "Left Half" and "Right Half" camera angles are selected before starting recording. Clubs can deselect the "Extra Wide Tactical" view to reduce file size and upload times.

Enabling the left half and right half camera angles significantly enhances the quality of footage and reduces the risk of incidents being missed or hard to assess with moving camera lens.
