PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Well 2021 was another outstanding season for the West Perth Football Club. We celebrated the 130th anniversary of our club's name, although as we all know, we started playing in 1885 in the first WA competition. Our brand as an historic and progressive football club continues to endure over decades, and we remain one of the powerhouses of the WAFL competition.

SEASON 2021

This season there have been many highs, and thankfully not many lows. One of the great successes this year was the premiership by our girls' team in the WA Rogers Cup. They were undefeated all season and congratulations go to the coaches, players and all people associated with our girls' success. This culminated in the latter part of the season with the announcement by the WAFC that we would be gaining a WAFL Womens licence for 2022. We are now fully embracing girl's and women's football programs that will see them continue as an integral part of the future of the club.

Our men's teams had good success this year with all grades reaching the finals. Unfortunately, our Colts and Reserves sides were bundled out in the first round, but the growth in the depth of our lists is promising. The League side went on, but with a depleted defence went down in the Elimination Final. Our thanks go to our senior coach Geoff Valentine, reserves coach Blake Arnold and Colts coach Ryan Lasscock for leading great groups of men who have represented our club with distinction.

In Aaron Black, Blake Wilhelm and Tyler Keitel we have an outstanding group of leaders. Combined with the House group leaders and some younger emerging players we are confident that the leadership of the club is safe.

We congratulate Geoff Valentine who was appointed the WA State Coach this year, playing against SA in Adelaide, and to Noah Pegoraro, Connor West and Tyler Keitel for being selected. Connor West was rewarded by being taken in the AFL mid-season draft and went on to make his debut for the WCE in fine form. Tyler capped off another great year as the Bernie Naylor Medallist and Keegan Knott again with the best goal of the year. During the year we had a number of retirements and our thanks goes to Steve Potente a former premiership player and to Kris Shannon for their many years of service. They along with a number of other long serving reserves players hopefully will stay part of the future of the club.

STAFF

With the appointment of our new CEO only in late 2019, then becoming full time midway through 2020, we have seen the club operations grow in leaps and bounds.

Joe McCarthy has made a big impact in the WAFL and we look forward to his continued growth and leadership. Assisted by Tracy Venner who looks after all of our administration, events and reception duties we punch way above our weight compared to the staffing resources of many other clubs. Tracy really is the heartbeat of our club and aided by Paolo Zito who looks after board support and events, with support from Cardinal Lawyers we are well covered. A lot of work falls to our football manager Steve Trehwella who marshalls a small team (many part-time), but who all present a highly successful football program.

SPONSORS and PARTNERS

Following a difficult and shortened season in 2020 our sponsors remained on board for 2021 and their support of the club is greatly appreciated. Our Corporate Classic this year saw a record number enrolled and we look forward to increasing that next year. FACILITIES

This year we have continued to deepen our relationship with VenuesWest. They have been incredibly supportive of all that we wanted to do. The kitchen has been upgraded with a cold storage room and in 2022 we will see the construction of a can bar on the far bank and upgrade of the sponsors' boxes in the main grandstand. The Club is very appreciative of the opportunity to ensure our venue which outside of Optus Stadium is the best football venue in the state, is utilised more often. Improved lighting is a high priority to ensure we get the most efficient use of the ground all-year-round. Upstairs the memorabilia and ambience of the function and bar areas is gradually being improved and we thank many people who are committed to the ensuring the heritage of the club for their work.

FINANCES

The Club will record a net profit of around \$230,000 this year and will have a healthy cash balance on the balance sheet. Considering where we have come from since 2019, it is something that the board and all members should be extremely proud of. We are consolidating the club's financial position and we are confident that into the future we will be even more financially strong. In 2022 we will be unveiling a number of new partnerships which will be extremely exciting for the club. Our special thanks go to Adam Myers (Finance Director) and volunteers (especially Andrew Anderton) and all members of the Finance Committee for their hard work throughout the year.

EVENTS

The celebration of our 130th anniversary with a gala event at the Tuscany Club in Balcatta was the highlight of the year. Nearly 300 people attended where we presented premiership medallions to the 1960 and 1971 premiership players (many who had passed on). We saw for the first-time colour footage and commentary of the 1960 premiership. Special thanks go to all those involved in putting this event together and to Dennis Cometti, Andrew Henyon, Basil Zempilas and Peter Cutler for their assistance with this special video.

Throughout the year the players through their house groups also conducted a number of events which were a lot of fun and continue to build a great culture at the club.

LEADERSHIP

In the week of the Breckler Medal we were faced with some sad and glad news with Geoff Valentine accepting an appointment as an assistant coach at the Fremantle Dockers. Of course, we did not stand in Geoff's way as he is an outstanding individual and deserves the opportunity, but we have lost a key person who has led a renewal of the club culture over the past three years.



MEN'S FOOTBALL

- Tyler Kietel, Noah Pegoraro & Connor West selected to represent Western Australia in the State Game versus South Australia and Geoff Valentine selected as the Senior Coach of the Team.
- Connor West being drafted to the West Coast Eagles with Pick 23 in the AFL Mid-Season Draft.
- Winning the Polly Farmer Shield against our old archrivals East Perth for the fifth consecutive year on NAIDOC Round.
- Winning 8 out of 9 games between Rounds 6 to Round 16 that secured our qualification for our 7th consecutive finals campaign.
- A gutsy Elimination Final victory against Swan Districts at home in front of a big crowd.

The COVID-19 global pandemic continued to have an impact on the WAFL competition with the State experiencing three separate lockdowns during the course of 2021. Two of these lockdowns occurred during the regular season which required changes to fixtures. Again, the competition, the Clubs and all the players showed their agility and ability to adapt to the lockdowns and restrictions and ensure the season was completed.

Five players earned their league debuts in Season 2021. Congratulations to Jack Burke, Kellen Johnson, Nathan Murray, Koopah Todd and Michael Mallard who all did themselves and the Club proud.

I would like to make special mention to Nathan Murray who won this year's Rising Star Award after playing ten senior games in his debut season and showing that he has a bright future.

Captain Aaron Black won his 3rd Breckler Medal as the Club's Fairest & Best player. Aaron had a fantastic season showing why he is still one of the premier midfielders in the competition. Tyler Keitel finished Runner-up to Aaron and also won his second Bernie Naylor Medal as the WAFL's leading goalkicker finishing the season with a career high 70 goals.

Noah Pegoraro rounded out the top 3 after producing some brilliant and consistent football at Centre Half Back. Noah's emergence in his third season of league football has seen him recognised as the best Centre Half Back in the WAFL. Dean Munns was awarded his second Wayne Dayman Medal as the Most Courageous Player and Conal Lynch was named Best Clubman.

Nathan Murray won the Ennis Medal as the Fairest & Best player in the Reserves. An extraordinary effort given he played ten League games during the course of the year. Such was Nathan's influence and form in the Reserves that he polled votes in every game (except one) to win the award in a landslide. Sam Rotham finished Runner-up after a very consistent second half of the season that resulted in Sam regaining his spot in the league side and having a significant impact in finals. Tom Medhat finished in 3rd place with the key forward continuing to improve and grow his game.

Our Club is privileged to have an army of volunteers to help in all areas of operations. I extend my personal thanks for the professionalism and dedication to you all, especially the time you give to help our Club be the best it can be. It is truly inspiring, and I say thank-you. I wanted to make special mention to David Prout who this year was awarded our Volunteer of the Year Award for his outstanding service and efforts to the Club. Congratulations David and we look forward to more years to come.

Senior Coach, Geoff Valentine who after completing his third season with the Club has accepted a role in the AFL with the Fremantle Dockers Coaching Team. Since arriving as Senior Coach in the 2019 season, Geoff's contribution in his three years as Senior Coach has been significant. His leadership and ability to empower people has changed the Club's culture for the better and truly created a place of belonging for everyone connected with the Club. I speak on behalf of everyone that we congratulate Geoff on his appointment and we wish him, his wife Vinny and their family all the very best for their future.

2022 will deliver significant change to the West Perth Football Club. We have been handed back control of our Talent program from the West Australian Football Commission and we have been granted a WAFLW licence which will see us have a Women's league team in the WAFLW competition for the first time.

The 3 core objectives of the Development program were;

1. Transitioning the players to our senior program
2. Development of skill and game plan knowledge
3. Preparing the players for the requirements & rigors of League football

Our goal over the past 3-4 years has consistently been to assist and prepare these talented young men and give them the best opportunity to develop both on and off the field as players and people.

In 2021, with the assistance of Corey Green and his team we were able to take the players through a number of different education sessions including diet & nutrition, recovery, mindset and others across the season, these short sessions were well received and again provided our young group with additional content to best manage themselves across the season.

We had 51 players represent the club at Reserves level in 2021. In addition to this we had 5 League debutants. Well done to Kellen Johnson, Koopah Todd, Jack Burke, Michael Mallard and Nathan Murray. It was great to watch these young players be rewarded for their effort and consistency

It was also really pleasing to see continued emergence and development of last year's debutants including Tristan Hobley, Sascha Kernutt, and Tom Boyes.

With such a young group each week we struggled to find a consistent level of concentration for long periods of games and would find ourselves behind the game, regularly trying to fight our way back in to it.

No doubt there were some challenges and frustrating times for our young group through the middle part of the season as we fell away sharply in terms of our match day performances. 14s & 15s Development Squads

This program underwent so much change in 2021 with the 15's program taking place mid-season, while the 14's program remained in the traditional post-season time-slot.

Again, we were able to engage with all Junior Community Clubs and Schools to ensure we selected the very best talent in our zone. There was some outstanding talent on display across both programs and we are all excited to welcome these new young players to the West Perth FC family.

With over 20 coaching and support staff who were committed to the development and welfare of the players, each player was better equipped to make improvements to their football through training, education S&C and other important life skills. It was fantastic to see how far the players came along in just a short period of time.

148 young talented players from our regional and metro zone were selected to the program that included 6-8 weeks of training then carnival matches to finish vs Swan Districts, Peel Thunder and Perth Football Clubs.

An enthusiastic coaching group headed by Ash McKown in his third season as Coach welcomed new assistant coaches Steve Chapman & Josh Wooden alongside Midfield Coach Paul Downer saw our Futures win 3 from 6 matches, while remaining competitive in our 3 losses finishing 5th overall. Whilst the wins were fantastic it was great to see these young players get a real taste for what WAFL football is like. The West Perth Football Club Colts programme focuses on developing our talented young footballers both on and off the field. Our programme works to develop on field skills and strategy, the leadership qualities of our players, resilience through feedback and accountability, and to build a culture of support and care for all members of our community.

After a shortened season in 2020, we managed to get a full season in 2021. While we had some interruptions, and the season extended, we got there in the end.

In what was another challenging year for everyone, our 2021 season proved to be a successful year for the Colts Programme, both on and off the field. This is largely due to the planning and persistence, through hard work by many over the past 4 years to develop our standards and maintain consistent behaviours to a point where it translated to on field success.

ON FIELD

The Colts finished the regular season with Eight (8) wins and Eight (8) losses, finishing the regular season 5th (5th) on the ladder. We were in almost every game we played, with 6 of our eight losses by under 20 points.

This result meant the Colts Squad qualified for our third finals series in a row. This is the first time in the clubs history that has occurred. We are finally establishing an environment where finals are expected, not a surprise.

Lochlan Paton and Zac Fleiner performed at an extremely high level, and both played their roles in helping Western Australia get the clean sweep over the South Australian side.

A big thank you must go to Ash McKeown, our Futures Coach. Ash stepped in and covered for me while I was on State duties. The way Ash went about the role, and giving the program a fresh perspective, was greatly appreciated by everyone. The fact Ash got 3 wins from 3 games was an outstanding result. We are very lucky to have the quality of people like Ash at our club. Thanks again Ash.

The State 17's side played 2 games against South Australia, splitting the games with 1 win each. Kane Bevan, Griff Julian, Luke Michael, Jasper Scaife and Noah Farrow all pulled on the jumper for Western Australia, and they should all be looking to play in a revamped National Carnival in 2022.

Every year the WAFL selects a Colts Team of the year. Well done to Zarne Robis and Luke Michael and on their selection in this team. A great reward for their efforts at Colts level in 2022.

The relationship between the Colts program and the Senior Program is an important one at any WAFL Club. We are very lucky at West Perth to have the support of Senior Coach Geoff Valentine, General Manager of Football Operations Steve Trehwella, Reserves Coach Blake Arnold and all of the Senior playing list. Dennis Cometti played 38 matches for West Perth. His best year in the West Australian Football League was 1968, when he kicked 63 goals playing for West Perth under Graham Farmer. In 1971, Cometti made the senior list at Footscray but, due to injuries and media commitments, was unable to make a mark and did not play a Victorian Football League senior match.

On his return to Perth, he played with some success in the Sunday Football League. He initially played for Wanneroo before moving to Maddington as captain-coach, leading the club to four successive grand finals and winning premierships in 1974, 1975 and 1976. After hanging up his boots, he later coached Osborne Park and Kelmscott, winning a premiership in 1979.

In 1982, Cometti was appointed coach of West Perth. The club finished third in his first year, but his tenure at West Perth was otherwise uneventful, and the team finished sixth in both 1983 and 1984.

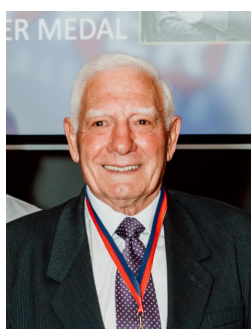

During 2021 we mourned the passing of two of our life members and West Perth's great legends. Fred Buttsworth passed away in May, age 94, and Wally Price in June, age 95. As the closeness of their passing indicates, they also shared many triumphs on the football field. They were team-mates in the 1942, 1949 and 1951 premierships, both debuted for West Perth in 1942, both were representatives of the State, both won club Fairest and Best, both named in West Perth's Team of the Century, and both were inducted into the WA Football Hall of Fame.

Wally was considered by many to be the greatest of the back pocket specialists and played 256 games, kicked 4 goals over 13 seasons, and represented the State 12 times.

Fred commenced his career in the back line, then moved to the forward line where he kicked 246 goals. He played 182 games over 11 seasons and won the Sandover Medal in 1951, then the Simpson Medal in a game against Victoria in the same year.

Both players will always hold legendary status at West Perth, and on behalf of their compatriot life members we offer our condolences to the Price and Buttsworth families.
