PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Season 2019 is over, and our great football club, the oldest WAFL club in WA was able to maintain a strong presence and make a real impact in all grades of the WAFL competition and the Women's competitions.

Our Reserves team won a fantastic grand final (the first since 2014) and congratulations goes to Blake Arnold and all our Reserves playing and support group. Our league team under the leadership of first year coach Geoff Valentine did extremely well. Achieving finals, our boys were not disgraced and the memorable final at Joondalup against the WCE WAFL side was a game not to be forgotten, going down to the wire in what was to be veteran and club life member Andrew Strijk's final game.

Our Colts also did well and with the Futures Squads with great leadership from Ryan Lasscock and Casey Haw, our club has a very bright future. Young Koopah Todd won the Jack Clark Medal for the F&B in the Colts competition and two young guns (Jaxon Prior and Ben Johnson were drafted).

The Women's reserves team saw a few changes in 2019 with new coaching staff and game plan from Rebecca Boladeras and Edward Beck. They were unfortunate to miss out on finals; however, the season saw three players drafted into AFLW, including past Captain and F&B winner Ashton Hill (WCE) Ann McMahon (FFC) and Biancca Webb (FFC).

Our female Rogers Cup Team (Colts) had a great season finishing it off with some strong wins though no finals. Amy Franklin won the Rookie of the Year Award for the WAWFL competition and Emily Bennett and Biannca Webb played in the WA U18's State Team in both QLD and WA.

The club has in our senior coach Geoff Valentine, an outstanding and respected senior coach and leader. At the close of the season the board agreed to extend his contract as a sign of faith in him and his direction for the club. Along with Football Manager Steve Trewhella and the football department staff we have the core for a group of people that will forge success for the Falcons into the coming years.

The efforts by the board this season have been herculean. Halfway through the year we also managed the resignation of our then CEO Linda Hammersley, who we thank for her efforts managing thought the voluntary administration phase. Director Jimmy Caffieri stepped up to the plate and took on the interim CEO role pro bono. For this the board was very grateful. Along with assistance from finance director Sam Modica we have aimed for a balanced budget. However as reported we will make a loss in 2019, though this was not unexpected.

During the year the board formed a Football Committee under the chair of director Peter Cutler. Peter's connections to the past players from many eras and his work in oversight of the football affairs has been outstanding. We thank Peter and other co-opted committee members John Dimmer, Daniel Shadbolt, Geoff Valentine, Steve Trewhella, and Casey Haw.

The board divided its responsibilities with Paul Murray passionately taking on communications (and matchday MC) with great work provided by former player Cameron Branch in social media. Two business forums with the Hillarys and Joondalup business coteries were held with speakers Basil Zempilas and Dennis Cometti. Brett Raponi took on the Corporate Classic and membership areas and directed a concerted membership drive, kindly assisted by the Cardies Coffee Club. Ross Kelly ably fulfilled many liaison roles with the WAFC as well as sitting on the finance committee (thanks also goes to independent members Mark and Andrew Anderton). During the season Phil O'Donnell president of Whitfords Junior FC was co-opted to the board and he has made a strong contribution already.


As it is well known in 2017 and 2018 the Club went through its most difficult period financially resulting in the Voluntary Administration issue, due to decrease in major sponsorship's and poor financial management. The Board reiterates that it is a three to four-year journey to get the club back on its feet financially. 2019 was the first year.

The Falcons Gala Dinner at the Italian Club hosted by Dennis Cometti where we celebrated the 70th, 50th and 20th anniversaries of the 1949, 1969 and 1999 Premierships was a brilliant night of nostalgia and fun. Premiership medallions were retrospectively presented and many great stories were told.

Our club took the challenge 25 years ago to move from its home at Leederville and grow the game in the northern suburbs. It has not been easy. The club still believes in the vision to be the powerhouse of growing AFL through community involvement and engagement in Joondalup and its surrounds. We have over 5,000 children and youth playing in our junior competitions and we have a huge population and commercial base to work with. In addition, we have been working hard to improve the situation with our landlord VenuesWest and though the relationship is much improved there is still much to be done on both sides to have a win-win situation.

I do wish to thank our very hard-working staff including Tracy Venner, Lis Fullbrook, Steve Trewhella, Casey Haw, Anthony Donetta, Sam Pantellis and Paola Zito. They have all made huge contributions. I trust you will continue to support us as our Great Club moves positively into the future.



MEN'S FOOTBALL



Season 2019 has seen significant change at the West Perth Football Club as well as the WAFL. The competition was expanded to include a tenth team with West Coast Eagles granted a license to join the WAFL, thus ending their alignment with East Perth FC.

Several quality players from our 2018 squad either retired or decided to continue their football careers elsewhere. Jay Van Berlo, Chris Keunen, Matt Guadagnin, Steve Potente and Max Alexandre all retired. Kody Manning transferred to East Fremantle and Luke Meadows decided to continue his football career in Victoria in his pursuit to find his way onto an AFL list. All up over 950 league games of experience and significant leadership had departed the senior list.

We welcomed in a new Senior Coach in Geoff Valentine who returned to the club he played for in the mid-nineties, including the 1995 Premiership. A key element of the success of the Men's Football Program in 2019 that resulted in our League, Reserves and Colts making finals has been the determination, dedication and unwavering diligence of Geoff who has been ably assisted by Jason Salecic (Assistant Coach), Matt Guadagnin (Assistant Coach), Ron Skender (Specialist Ruck Coach), Dylan Eiffler (Bench Coach), Corey Green (S&C Coach) as well as Blake Arnold (Head of Development), Phil Johnson (Development Coach) and Todd Steward (Development Coach).

Recruiting rucks and key position players to our club was a critical focus in preparation for the 2019 season and the club was pleased to be able to able to welcome Ben Delaporte from Wembley FC, Troy Yukich from Swan Districts FC, Noah Pegoraro from Kingsley FC and Sam Rotham returned after spending a season at Goomalling FC. Tom O'Donnell and Tom Medhat graduated to the Senior list from our Colts program further bolstering our key position stocks. It was pleasing that all these young men played league football during the 2019 season.

The club was also pleased to secure the signature of 2013 Premiership player Laine Rasmussen who returned after a two-year break from the WAFL. Laine's brand of football and his leadership proved to be significant as the season progressed. It was fitting that Laine was awarded the Wayne Dayman Medal as this season's most courageous player.





Throughout season 2019, West Perth fielded a relatively young and inexperienced team and managed to maintain a competitive edge. The league side finished the season in fifth place on the ladder with nine wins and nine losses. Several of our losses were by narrow margins including the 3-point Round 1 loss to Peel, The 16-point Round 3 loss to South Fremantle, the 10-point Round 8 loss to East Perth and the 4-point Round 20 loss to South Fremantle.

The last third of the season presented significant challenges, especially for our defence as regular league players Dean Munns, Laine Rasmussen, Noah Pegoraro, Ben King, Zac Guadagnin and Bailey James all suffered injury that prevented any continuity during this stage of the season. This did however provide opportunity for two emerging players for the future in Jaxon Prior and Ben Johnson to make their league debut's late in the season. Both were impressive stepping up from Colts into League football. Unfortunately, for Jaxon he suffered a broken hand in just his second league game and although he played out the game under duress displaying tremendous courage, his season was ultimately over.

Eight players earned their league debut's and all played their role and performed admirably. Most notably Noah Pegoraro who was recruited from Kingsley FC. Although Noah finished the season with 6 games due to injury he showed he will be a player for the future winning this year's Rising Star Award. Additionally, second year players including Connor West, Zac Guadagnin, Baylee James and Liam Tedesco where all able to add to their League games following their 2018 senior debuts.

Amid the disappointment of the League side being dispatched from the finals' series in the first week in September against West Coast Eagles by 3 points, our members should have great optimism for what the future holds. For anyone who witnessed our Reserves team winning the 2019 Premiership, this was an insight into our future. The average age of the team that bought home the Flag was just twenty years. The spirit and determination the team displayed over 4 quarters of football against an experienced and quality Claremont team and the internal belief that was installed into the young group was truly inspiring, especially when you consider we had been badly beaten by Claremont in the 2nd semi-final by 77points.

To Blake Arnold and his assistants Phil Johnson and Todd Steward, Captain Tom Boyes and the players that secured the 2019 Reserves Premiership it was a great reward for all the hard work over the season. Congratulations also to Conal Lynch who was awarded the Merv McIntosh Medal for the best player on Grand Final day. If ever one player deserves singling out for recognition it would be Drew Blurton for his selfless act, withdrawing himself from the Grand Final team prior to the game commencing due to calf soreness. It was a tough call by Drew who had been instrumental in the finals series in which he had displayed outstanding form throughout September. It was great to see Drew being presented with a premiership medal back in the rooms after the game in front of his teammates. Hopefully we all get to see Drew fulfill his goal and playing senior football in 2020 and beyond.

I extend my congratulations to Aaron Black and Shane Nelson for their selection in the 2019 WAFL State Team that played against South Australia. Incredibly it was the 6th time that both Aaron and Shane have represented Western Australia with distinction. Aaron for the second consecutive year was named as State Vice-Captain.

This season also bought the end of Andrew Strijk's career when he announced he would be hanging up his boots. Andrew has given outstanding service to the Club as well as football over 14 wonderful seasons. Andrew retires a Premiership Player, a Breckler Medalist, a three time Ray Scott Medalist (Club Leading Goal Kicker), a Bernie Naylor Medalist (as the WAFL leading goalkicker in 2018), a seven time State Representative for Western Australia and a West Coast Eagle, having played 13 senior games in the AFL. Andrew comfortably sits in the top echelon of champions in the history of the Club, having represented West Perth on 245 occasions. I wish Andrew and his wife Nicole and their family all the very best for their future together.

Congratulations to all the Award winners this year but it is worth singling out the outstanding individual seasons by Tyler Keitel (Breckler Medal), Alec Johnson (Ennis Medal) and Koopah Todd (Dominish Medal). Tyler strengthens a family bond within the Club's history following in the steps of his Uncle, Ron Skender who won a Breckler Medal in 2002. Alec Johnson backed up his stellar 2018 season when he won the Colts Fairest & Best Award to add the Reserves Fairest & Best to his football resume. We look forward to seeing Alec continue his growth into season 2020 and push for league selection. Koopah Todd also had an outstanding year. He was voted in as the Colts Captain and his stellar season resulted in Koopah also winning both the Jack Clarke Medal for the WAFL Colts competitions Fairest & Best Player. Koopah also made his senior debut in the Reserves Grand Final after Drew Blurton was a late withdrawal and contributed to the fantastic victory finishing his season with a Premiership.

Life Membership is one of the highest honors that can be bestowed on an individual at any Club and this season Shane Nelson joined the exclusive list when he played his 150th WAFL game in Round 15. Shane has been an outstanding footballer who has shown tremendous dedication and excellence in his craft over eight seasons in Senior football. 

SENIORS COACH REPORT



For me, football is less about the technical aspects of the game and more about who you are; what you represent; how you go about it. I posed these questions to the playing/coaching group pre-season in a couple of facilitated culture/leadership sessions in the pre-season. By the end of these session, we had a trademark - We are the W.P.F.C

W - for West Perth

P - for Premierships.

F - for Family.

C - for Culture.

W is for West Perth. A club that has its origins from 1885 and has celebrated 19 premierships at League level. A club that is such a special thing for so many people. A club that has continually found a way to rise up and compete for Premierships when others have bottomed out and languished there.

P for Premierships: It's what we do – we win flags. Sunday 22 September 2019, what a Grand Final win that was!! The Claremont reserves team had been beaten just the one time throughout the season and beaten us by 98 & 77 points in our last 2 clashes. To the 23 lads who delivered the Club that flag and the joy and pride that those in attendance and those following the scores on-line felt, we tip our hats and thank you. It was a truly remarkable win. The coaching performances of Blake Arnold, Todd Martin & Phil Johnson were as good as any you'll get, at any level. Going into that game, we all knew that we were a big chance to cause the upset – your capacity to set up the finals campaign, to develop the plan, to sell belief and then to execute on the big stage was elite. The input of Jason Salecic, Matt Guadagnin, Prouty & Corey Green should also be acknowledged and applauded.

Great victories like that are invariably built on the strength of the leaders on the ground. We were blessed to have some great leadership from the boys who had played League football this season, but none stood taller, none cracked in harder than Tom Boyes. It was full of families sharing a special day with their sons, their brothers and his mates. There was a genuine feeling of belonging in the room and I felt so very proud to be a part of it. But we don't need a premiership celebration to host your family and friends. Invite them into the West Perth family. Let us put our arms around them too.

I would like to congratulate those players and their partners that have started their own family unit this season – to Laine Rasmussen & Laara who welcomed Sully in May; to Blake Wilhelm and Meghan who welcomed Ruby; to Andrew Strijk and Nicole who welcomed Isabella; to Drew Blurton and Shania who welcomed Laearni.

I'd like to thank the families of the coaching staff who sacrifice so much during the footy season. To Alanna Arnold, Katie Salecic, Natalie Trewhella and Karly Guadagnin – your support and understanding has been greatly appreciated. And I would certainly like to thank my own wife, Vinny and daughters Talietha, Rhani & Lemarna for their love and support.

C is for Culture: It's how we go about it. We know that the little things really are the big things. We know that this great club has been able to punch above its weight because of the cultural threads that bind us together.

For me, culture is what you see, feel and hear around the playing group. It's the customs and rituals that are passed on from one playing group to the next. It's what makes this club great. We, the players and the coaches, know that we are simply custodians of the jumper. We know that our time will pass in due course and that it is our responsibility to ensure that the jumper is in better shape when we hand it on. We know that it's a privilege to wear the Red and Blue jumper in a WAFL match. We know and appreciate that for every team that takes the field, there's an army of volunteer support staff that work tirelessly to make that opportunity happen.

If not underpinned by appropriate behaviours, the 'We Are the W.P.F.C' trademark can simply represent words on a wall. The behaviours that we link to high performance are – United, Professional, Relentless.

United: If ever there was an example of the scope for unity to influence performance it was this Reserves Grand Final. The 35 senior boys who weren't playing had a massive influence on that game without touching the ball. By turning up in full uniform, by sitting in such a tight formation, by generating such noise they made a clear statement that they were 100% there for the boys who were playing. There is no doubt that it lifted those boys to a higher level of performance while at the same, deflated the Claremont boys who were left wondering where their league boys were.

A similar example of what great Unity looks like came with Drew Blurton's decision to withdraw from the team about 45minutes before bounce-down. Drew had been one of our best players during the final series and we were really keen for him to play; but he knew that his calf injury would stop him from playing his role for the team. Selflessly, he stepped aside for Koopah Todd to come in for his first game of senior football.

That Drew and the other emergencies who missed out (Kurt Hindmarsh, Brayden Templeton and Fraser Foley) wholeheartedly supported Koopah and the team epitomises the Unity within this playing group. There is great strength and genuine care in the relationships in the group.

Professional: The professionalism of any Football Department starts at the top. And for us, that's with Director of Football, Peter Cutler, General Manager of Football Operations, Steve Trewhella and Football Operations Coordinator, Anthony Donetta. Your work ethic, professional standards and wise counsel have been a great example for all in the Football Department and I have truly appreciated your support and friendship.

Our medical team headed up by Physiotherapist Aaron Thomas, Dr Greg Smith and Dr Rhys Daniel and Head Trainer Maddie Simon sets a professional standard that is best practice in the WAFL. The work of Corey Green and all his staff at The Athletic Institute provides our entire squad with the necessary foundation for elite athletic performance. There is no more a passionate or professional approach than the way Corey goes about his work.

To the playing group, your commitment to your craft and this club has been professional & inspiring. We recorded some significant achievements things this season but the end of season reviews have highlighted a clear need and strong desire to improve the consistency of our training standards – at the end of the day, finishing 5th was an accurate reflection of our season. We weren't good enough for long enough. We bridge that gap by consistently training which a sharp focus and a strong competitive purpose. I'm looking forward to driving the standards that will underpin a deep run in September 2020.

Relentless: When you start the season at 0-4, all sorts of elaborate theories emerge as to what needs to be done to turns things around. But generally, the key is to stay connected and to simply approach things in a relentless manner. One of the great strengths of this playing group, of this club, is that we are relentless if nothing else. From that position the league team was able to secure a home final (albeit with some good fortune) and our relentless spirit was there to see for everyone who watched that game. We withstood a physical onslaught from a bigger, stronger West Coast team, held steadfast as they repeatedly banged the ball inside their forward 50 and we relentlessly went at the game. We clawed our way back into the game and with less than a minute to go we looked like we might even pinch the victory. It wasn't to be, but our relentless spirit could not be denied.

Finally, I'd like to thank the Board for the opportunity to coach this great Club and the players, coaches, office and support staff for their tireless efforts. I trust everyone has had a safe and enjoyable off-season and I look forward to charging into the 2020 season.

COACH REPORT

The West Perth Football Club Colts programme focuses on developing our talented young footballers both on and off the field. Our programme works to develop on field skills and strategy, the leadership qualities of our players, resilience through feedback and accountability, and to build a culture of support and care for all members of our community.

Our 2019 season proved to be a very successful year for the Colts Programme, both on and off the field. However, this is largely due to the planning and persistence, through hard work by many over the past two years to develop our standards and maintain consistent behaviors to a point where it translated to on field success.

On field

The Colts finished the regular season with nine (9) wins and seven (7) losses, finishing the regular season third (3rd) on the ladder. Pleasingly, we were competitive in every game, with our biggest losing margin for the season being 21 points. This result meant the Colts Squad qualified for our first finals series since 2015. This is only our second qualification since 2002.

As a squad, the feeling in the rooms after the first Semi-Final win over East Perth was an experience we won't forget in a hurry.

Unfortunately, we lost to Claremont, the eventual premiers, in the Preliminary Final. Finals experiences, knowing and feeling the highs and the lows, will definitely assist with our development, and it was a fabulous opportunity for our players to experience playing in three finals, and our coaching squad will look to leverage this experience to assist with our development moving forward.

As a coach, this role definitely has its hard moments. One of the more pleasing aspects of our role is telling a young man he is going to make his debut for the WPFC. In 2019, we had 19 players play their first game for the West Perth Football Club at this level.

This year we had five (5) players selected in the WA State 18's program. Congratulations to Jaxon Prior, Ben Johnson, Ryan Hudson, Zak Patterson, and Heath Chapman. WA played some great football over the carnival and were able to win the Championships with a thrilling win over Vic Country in the final game.

Every year the WAFL selects a Colts Team of the year. Well done to Koopah Todd, Ty Hindmarsh, Heath Chapman, Jaxon Prior and Ben Johnson on their selection in this team. A great reward for their efforts at Colts level in 2019. 5 players was the most from any side this year.

The relationship between the Colts program and the Senior Program is an important one at any WAFL Club. We are very lucky at West Perth to have the support of Senior Coach Geoff Valentine, General Manager of Football Operations Steve Trewhella, Reserves Coach Blake Arnold and all of the Senior playing list.

Additionally, during the season four (4) players from the Colts programme were selected to play senior football. Ryan Hudson played in the Reserves in Round 15 against East Perth. The Yilgarn Falcons continues to provide opportunities for young men from our country zone to be exposed to WAFL football and the West Perth Football Club. Ash McKeown (Former Colts assistant and Ocean Ridge AFC Head Coach) was appointed in the top job supported by Craig Wilson, Steve Hazell, Paul Downer, Daniel Rowe, Matt Davis and Damian Verazzi. The program was revamped in 2019 to align more with the Colts program playing more games across the season, right up to July. CONGRATULATIONS



John Loughridge entered the WA Football Hall of Fame in 2019. John played 136 games for West Perth between 1945 and 1950. He won the Fairest & Best Award on 3 occasions (1945, 1946 & 1949) and in 1946 was awarded the prestigious Sandover Medal after his stellar season. In the same year John won the Simpson Medal for his best on ground performance in the losing Grand Final against the undefeated East Fremantle team. John would eventually taste Premiership glory

when in 1949 West Perth defeated Perth to claim the Premiership Flag. In a non-professional era however, work commitments forced Loughridge to place family security before football and he retired at the age of 28 due to work commitments. Loughridge was not lost to football however, serving on the West Perth committee from 1952 to 1957 and intermittently as a broadcaster. He was awarded Life



Membership to the Club in 1955. Loughridge was also the driving force behind the Sandover Medallists' club, serving as its president until his early death from a brain tumor in 1981. He was only 58 and remembered by many as one of the game's great personalities and friends.



Former West Perth & Essendon Player and Football Administrator Ron Evans was inducted into the AFL Hall of Fame in 2019. Evans played 64 games for Essendon between 1958 – 1962 kicking 210 goals. In 1963 Evans moved to West Perth where he played 60 games between 1963 and 1965 kicking 271 goals. He topped Essendon's goalkicking in 1959 and 1960 and was West Perth's leading goal kicker in all three of his seasons at the Club. Evans also represented Victoria and Western Australia in State football playing 5 games for each state. Later in life Evans returned to the game and was an Essendon board member: from 1978-92 including a term as President from 1988-92). He then became an AFL Commissioner from 1993-2006 including Chairman of the AFL from 1998-2006.

WAFL Life Membership - Vic Carbone was awarded WAFL Life Membership at this season's WAFL Sandover Medal Count. Vic was recognized for his outstanding service to Western Australian football over nearly four decades. Vic has volunteered in numerous roles during his time at West Perth, the West Coast Eagles and the WA Trainers Association . Vic is still involved and is currently the League Team's Match Day Manager. The Award was recognition for one of the games truly great gentlemen.



Volunteer of the Year — Belinda Taylor was recognized for her outstanding service as a volunteer in the role of match day photographer. Since 2009, Belinda has braved the elements of rain, hail and sunshine to contribute to the club every week. She is diligent with her service and her work is always of the highest quality. Through her work she provides our players and fans with lasting memories throughout the season. On receiving the Award, Belinda shared her passion for photography and for her love of the Club.






