PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On a state-wide level, there continues to be some uncertainty around the structures of football as the State Government negotiations around the new Perth Stadium and the future financial model for football look set to come to a pointy end early in 2016

Once the WACFL is fully aware of how the WAFC's future economic model looks, we will need to ensure that country football and our leagues are represented at the table and our importance to the football model around the state is suitably recognised.

The WACFL's strategic plan was in the second of its three years, and has been an extremely useful tool in providing the Executive and our stakeholders a shared vision, "To enhance regional communities through having professionally run football competitions where participants are able to develop within a team in a safe, well governed and successfully administered environment".

It has also been a positive watching each Executive member work within the Executive and with the staff on their designated portfolio. This has given each member more ownership of their position and tasks.

Towards the end of the 2015 season, the WAFC announced that, in 2016, the WACFL will no longer fall under the 'Competitions and Pathways' structure of the WAFC and will be moved into a newly named 'Community Football' structure under the

leadership of Warren Nel. We are hopeful that this move will give our network better access to WAFC resources to further assist the running of country football competitions. The Executive will continue to seek feedback from our leagues and work with the WAFC to ensure the best possible outcomes are being achieved through the investment that is currently being made into football in country areas.

A highlight of the 2015 year was the appointment of Peter Sheridan and Graham "Charlie" Young to WACFL Life Member status. Both men achieved their awards after long representative careers on the WACFL Executive, as well as a variety of roles at a local level. Prior to being awarded this honour, both men announced their retirement from the WACFL Executive.

After a number of stable years with the same Executive members, in recent years there has been a significant turnover of Executive members, which gives opportunities for new volunteers to influence country football's state-wide administration. Throughout the 2015 season, we also said goodbye to Alan Bishop and Barry Butterworth from the Executive. Both Alan and Barry were significant contributors to the Executive over long periods of time. Barry Tate (South West) and Michael Harding (Esperance) were appointed as their respective replacements.

In 2015, country football mourned the passing of two previous WACFL Executive

members in Harry Reeves and inaugural WACFL Chairman Bud Byfield. Both men achieved a significant amount for country football for which they will be remembered. With such a large network as country football, there will always be some extremely sad passings at local levels. Towards the end of 2015 we witnessed what courage was all about with Gibson Football Club Life Member Kym Curnow losing his life trying to help others in the Esperance fires.

The Country team of Joe, Shaun, Robyn and Kellie continued to work hard to develop country football and are a fantastic asset for our Executive and leagues. We are also excited about some of the upcoming projects we have worked on throughout 2015 that will enhance country football in 2016.

I'd like to thank my fellow Executive members for their contribution to country football in 2015 and our affiliated leagues and clubs for their continued support of the WACFL. I am confident that, provided we continue to work hard on trying to develop the code, we will have a prosperous future and successful 2016 season.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

WACFL's number one focus in 2015 continued to be regional club football and the majority of our energy was directed towards helping to deliver professionally run competitions throughout the state.

Across all aspects of regional football there was a 9% growth figure recorded which encompassed club, female, school, Auskick and social football. Club football will continue to be the number one focus of the WACFL and ensuring football can continue be played across all corners of the state must be a priority.

Technology will play an increasing role in how we administer football across the state and there were a number of enhancements introduced in 2015, including the National Online Registration System, the WACFL App and the WACFL website.

The Online Registration System has been beneficial in giving us a more accurate picture of our network of players and in 2015 we had over 12,000 players register to play with a WACFL club. Whilst there were some teething problems with the introduction of this system, we expect the system to significantly enhance our operations moving forward and we thank all leagues and clubs for their cooperation.

The upgraded WACFL website was also launched early in 2015 and has proven a useful tool for the storing of our information and promotion of all things country football.

Our long association with Landmark continued into its 41st year and the Landmark Country Football Championships were again filled with drama with the South West just scraping through the qualifying rounds. The South West proved too strong in the grand final defeating Upper Great Southern to claim their fifth straight division 1 title. In the Colts division composite sides Regional Districts and Northern Suns qualified for the grand final with the Northern Suns running out winners. Football played across the carnival was of the highest standard with

a number of players putting their hands up for Country Colts, State Country and even WAFL selection.

It was a pleasing end to 2015 to re-sign Landmark for an addition four years which will extend our partnership to a 45th season.

Our senior state side hosted South Australia at Mandurah in July. The side was coached by Craig Walker and captained by Cunderdin's Troy Skilton. South Australia again got the jump on our boys and proved too strong, running out 82 point winners. Best players for WA included Alex James (EDFL), Mark Deaves (UGSFL), Jayden Brooks (OFA) and Liam Ryan (GNFL).

The Executive and I continue to investigate opportunities into how we can build and deliver programs that enhance both the country football clubs and the greater community – in line with our Strategic Plan. There appears an obvious opportunity and need for football to be used as a motivating factor to improve community behaviours around drugs, alcohol, violence, health, etc. This was evidenced through a handful of incidents that occurred across finals matches and throughout the season. These incidences not only disappoint those involved with the game regionally, but have the potential to damage the code nationally.

I'm pleased to say that the Executive has been proactive in trying to address some of these challenges and we'll roll out enhancements in the 2016 season and continue to explore opportunities to add to our resourcing to support leagues and clubs.

The player payment issue has also attracted attention nationally with some of the more traditional states introducing tighter legislation around player payments in a bid to reduce money being used to pay players and equalise competitions. Whilst we recognise that paid players are an important part of football in certain areas, The WACFL has committed to closely monitor the impact that these systems have in other

states and, if required, introduce policy for the 2017 season.

2015 was a challenging year financially for the WACFL as state-wide funding cuts were absorbed prior to the season commencing. With future uncertainty around the economic model of football, the WACFL board continues to try to strengthen its financial position and in 2015 recorded an operating profit of \$27,071. Our economic model and reinvestment back into our leagues and programs would not have been possible without the support we receive from our partners including WAFC, ICWA, Landmark, The CBH Group, Toyota, The Regional Men's Health Initiative, New Holland, West Coast Poly, GWN and Media 365.

WACFL staff members Shaun Jasper, Robyn Payne, Kellie McBean and volunteer Ben Ralph continue to work tirelessly for country football and are great assets for our stakeholders due to their commitment to country football.

I'd like to take the time to acknowledge all those who are exiting the administration of country football and thank them for their services to their communities. Volunteering is a thankless job at times, but without our volunteers the game would not be possible at a grass roots level.

Finally, I'd like to thank the members of the Executive for their support in the previous 12 months. I believe the WACFL is becoming stronger each season and we need to ensure we are well positioned in the coming years to continue to assist our leagues to handle the challenges of managing football in regional WA.

UMPIRING MANAGER'S REPORT

Umpiring Programs to assist WACFL affiliates and identify umpires for the WAFL talent pathway commenced with the Umpire Coach PD program in March 2015.

This program was attended by around 35 umpire coaches from across regional and metropolitan WA (three regional), with representation from market sectors including AFL to juniors. The format

included laws and interpretations through to a consistent umpire coaching philosophy across WA.

The 2015 Landmark Country Football Championships, being the centrepiece to identifying talented umpires that may transition to WAFL, was another successfully conducted event. Full credit is extended to the team of 70 umpires and umpire coaches alike.

The 53 umpires (23 field, 14 boundary and 16 goal umpires) from WACFL affiliate leagues were very motivated to learn from evening and match day coaching they received.

Mindful of the importance of the carnival to players, they all umpired to the best of their abilities which was terrific to see.

Further thanks to Landmark coach John Beaton who, in April, availed himself to North Pilbara Football League umpires in Karratha. John passed on his knowledge in a two hour interactive session. John followed this up by match day coaching multiple local matches that same day, providing a unique opportunity for umpires to receive a taste of the coaching John normally provides to WAFL umpires on a game day.

The AFL national uniform program was introduced in 2015, with ordering online via www.afl.com.au/umpires/uniforms. This has provided the benefit of a user friendly and consistent umpire uniform across the nation and WA market sectors both metropolitan and regional.

The AFL is to be acknowledged for maintaining useful weekly 'what's your decision' umpire coaching tools readily available via the www.aflcommunity.com.au

website, along with online courses.

WAFC Umpire Development Managers Tim Priest and Dean Margetts were in Geraldton in March as part of the AFL Umpire Road Show program. They were fortunate to be accompanied by AFL umpires Nathan Doig (WA based four time AFL Grand Final boundary umpire) and Brett Dalgleish (WA based AFL finals boundary umpire). The visit included sessions with Clontarf, the local GNFL umpires and some coaches, along with an interview with ABC regional radio.

WAFC GENERAL MANAGER PATHWAYS & COMPETITIONS' REPORT

The WACFL continues to maintain its reputation and high standing within the WA Football system and this is primarily due to the leadership and dedication of key volunteers, particularly WACFL President Terry House and all WACFL Executive members. I take this opportunity to acknowledge and thank each of them for their outstanding contribution throughout season 2015.

There was a significant number of achievements throughout the year that reflect the professional management and administration of the central WACFL team. Therefore I also acknowledge Joe Georgiades, Robyn Payne, Kellie McBean and Shaun Jasper on their efforts and commitment throughout the season.

I'm sure everyone will agree that 2015 was a great year overall for football in WA. Our AFL teams finished first and second on the ladder, there were four sell-out AFL finals played at Domain Stadium, Fremantle claimed the minor premiership and West Coast played in the AFL Grand Final.

Country boys starred on the big stage, with Nat Fyfe from Lake Grace winning the Brownlow Medal playing for Fremantle and Northampton's Josh Kennedy claiming the Coleman Medal with West Coast.

Country Football has a proud tradition of producing top talent, which in addition to Fyfe and Kennedy, included 2015 Sandover

Medallist Aidan Tropiano from Geraldton, Subiaco premiership captain Kyal Horsley from Kalgoorlie and AFL Rising Star finalists Patrick Cripps (Northampton) and Dom Sheed (Kalgoorlie).

As well as producing such tremendous talent, football is also crucial to the social fabric of our communities, particularly in regional areas. The WAFC recognises how important the game is to WA communities and is committed to ensuring it continues to grow and prosper. We also acknowledge and thank all of the volunteers throughout country WA who are so important to ensuring this occurs.

One such volunteer was Rod Atherton, footy legend from Donnybrook, who was chosen as the 2015 Sunday Times Volunteer of the Year. Congratulations to Rod.

Regional participation accounted for almost a third of WA's total participation in 2015, with almost 62,000 involved in competitions from Auskick to Masters. Around 35% of players in the West Australian Football League also hailed from regional areas and 20 country players represented WA at the National 16s and 18s Championships.

The WAFL competition was extremely close in 2015 with a high quality brand of football broadcast on commercial television by the Seven Network, which I'm sure will only continue to grow in 2016. Community

competitions also grew in both in numbers and quality in 2015 and overall participation broke 200.000.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2015

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1987. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Dividend revenue

Dividends are recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depends on whether the outcome of the services can be measured reliably. If this is the case then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period. If the outcome cannot be reliably measured then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.
