On looking back at four years as President, it is clear the best two decisions we made were the First and the Last.

The First was in February 2020 when we appointed Russell Clark as our CEO. He has since driven a rebuild of our back-office into one of the most professional in WAFL Football – a key factor in that we grew our Club and delivered \$533,000 in net profits over that period, despite the fact that Covid-19 arrived exactly one month after Russell started and has hamstrung all Clubs over the past three seasons.

To quote Russell, "we've made those profits, now it's time to start spending some of it on football success." I could not agree more, and players, members and sponsors will notice a refreshed look in all areas of the Club when they call into PFC.

There is a new, youthful energy at the Club – and a major factor in that is the full-time appointment of a proven Premiership coach in Peter German, well-known for never accepting less than 100% from his players as well as the Club administrators. Members and Sponsors will find him just as demanding.

We have recovered our traditional junior zones around Armadale-Kelmscott just this year, and added a new family growth area of Byford, with 20,000 residents and 750 boys and girls playing football. In essence, PFC has been playing with one hand tied behind its back in that these zones were taken from us in 1998, and it has taken 25 years of hard lobbying to win them back.

On 1st November 2022, the Town of Victoria Park confirmed that they would cover off on the \$4 million construction gap over and above the committed \$14.1 million funding, which means we can expect the new PFC headquarters to start construction by September 2023 - with a projected two-year build. Colin Lofts and Russell Clark have been persistently dogged in getting the project to this point. As I write in mid-November, they have achieved a major step towards the PFC future needs with this building. Three years ago, the Council saw PFC as being a part of a multi-story Community building-we have always sought a stand-alone building identity for the PFC, so that we can run our own management model, as we have for some 63 years. Your Board unanimously has accepted a Council counterproposal which provides that identity. In effect our existing building runs from the oval midpoint south to the half-forward flank - it will now run north from the oval midpoint to the half-forward flank. As well when and if the Council builds its Community Centre, there are extra major benefits for the Club in the 4th changeroom and extensive alfresco entertaining areas. We are also seeking to expand the viewing area seating in the south zone.

The growth in our out-reach into our community has been generously funded by key sponsor Hungry Jacks, and others such as Macmahon Holdings Limited and Fugro – this is the great, unknown benefit that WAFL clubs perform within the wider community – it is why Governments and Councils support the clubs – they know it is about much more than Football.

Another promised initiative achieved this year is the debut of our PFCW team in the form of them playing in the WAFC's women's school holidays competition. After starting just in 2021, this group of exciting talents has rocketed into a Rogers Cup debut in 2023. Directors Kelly Townson, Carolyn Hall and Travis Burrows have driven this project, with Michele Burton as Football Manager and former Swan Districts premiership player Gavin Outridge doing a great job as coach of the PFC Women's Academy which we started in May this year. My thanks to all for this wonderful outcome.

The steering of all this has been handled by a remarkable set of Club Directors all of whom deserve our thanks, but I must mention our two long-serving Vice Presidents in Mark Treasure and John Dorazio. I have taken great pleasure in nominating them both for PFC Life Membership, and I hope you will endorse this with your vote.

Our Players and Coaches have battled manfully under two seasons of ravaged injury lists, and I remain grateful that they always played "like Demons." The two senior coaches in Garry Moss and Andrew Panetta, Football Manager Trevor Williams, Talent Manager Brodie Riach and the assistant coaches and support staff from League right down to the Futures deserve our thanks, with the promise of better times, given some of the exciting young players coming into League contention. It is now up to the Club to surround them with mid-career, strong-bodied players. This is where our recruiting efforts are concentrated.

The Support staff who patch up players to get them back on the field have likewise been outstanding and deserve our thanks.

The background support that match-day supporters never see such as the Maintenance Volunteers led by Lance Rigby are an integral part of PFC, as are the Past Players & Officials Association, who carry out many functions in supporting the players, and keeping the Perth Spirit well and truly alive.

Our Patrons and Vice Patrons, led by Patron Peter Gilkison, who is also the Chair of the Centurions Club, contribute support in meaningful ways, not the least of which is the fact that the Club now has a financial safety net in excess of \$600,000 within the Centurions accounts.

My final thanks must go to the Office Team led by Russell Clark which includes Jared Bell, Jill Green, Cath Parker and John Matthews, as well as community officer Oscar Bird. They create a harmonious and welcoming atmosphere in supporting members and sponsors.

Time to go - content that the Business of the Perth Football Club is in good shape, I am keen to return to the ranks of your former players. Like them, I will watch with great interest as your success emerges from the above platform over the next 2 - 3 years.



The one thing that stays constant in the world of football is that the parts of a football club are always moving. Joining the Club in January, 2022 was Brodie Riach, taking over from Trevor Screaigh as the Talent Manager at the club following Trevor's decision to take a change of direction in employment. Also moving on in February after many years of service to the club was our Functions and Facility Manager Ryan Keatley, who accepted a position with Perth Racing. Our thanks to Trevor and Ryan.

History was made in 2022 with the establishment of our first female academy. Led by Directors Kelly Townson and Carolyn Hall, the women's football committee blazed a new trail and key partnerships quickly formed. Coached by Mr Gavin Outridge with help from assistants Paul Burton, Jared Bell, Oscar Bird and ably assisted by our first Women's Football Operations Manager in Michele Burton, the program grew very rapidly. The enthusiasim of the girls grew along with their confidence each session culminating in 3 academy games in October. The girls were very competitive as a new outfit amongst established club teams, with a very strong win in their last game against East Perth. The club will continue to grow women's football in our region , with the club granted a licence in the WAFLW Rogers Cup competition in 2023.

Thanks to the continued support of Hungry Jacks we were again able to have the services of a Community Engagement Manager, with Oscar Bird in the role. Oscar has done an outstanding job in this portfolio with the delivery of the Penrhos College football program, the Free Kick Project in York, Junior Club visits, Metro & Country Schools programs as well as the growing partnership with the Bachar Houli foundation. In 2022 Perth Football Club became only the fourth WAFL Club to enter a team in the West Australian Wheelchair Football League. The Hungry Jacks partnership continues to increase our footprint in the community and is growing our community engagement strategy.

Whilst the audited financial report was not available at the time of writing this report another strong profit is forecast for 2022. This is due to the ongoing support of our sponsors, members, fundraising activities as well as the day to day business operations of the club.

The 2022 season was yet another difficult year for the senior squad. A reserves premiership in 2021 had us looking forward to growth in our senior ranks. The untimely and unforeseen departures of Brady Grey to Hawthorn and Dalton Langlands returning to Albury prior to the start of the season certainly hit our inside mid stocks before the first bounce of 2022.

Compounding this was the loss of Jaiden Hunter for the season in the pre-season fixtures, as well as season-ending injuries to young up and coming players Deklyn Grocott and Oscar Morcombe before round one, and the feeling of déjà vu was starting to become real.

My thanks to Garry Moss who worked extremely hard in his two-year term as Senior Coach. The growing injury list during the season, and Covid-enforced selection changes and coaching availability challenges, often at the last minute, made selection on the run a real factor in 2022. Forty-five (45) players played league football in 2022 whilst the reserves fielded sixty-four (64) players over 16 games.

To Michael Pratt, Colts Coach and Brodie Riach, Talent Manager, thank you for the enormous time and effort you have both put in this year. There was improvement in 2022 in the colts and development programs on the back of some very hard yards from Michael and his assistant coaches in 2021. I am strong in my belief that there will be further improvement in the colts in 2023 on the back of the seven years of service from Michael to the club.

Well season 2022 started like most others, an arduous Preseason under the guidance of a new S&C team led by 'Hoggy', followed by some pre- season scratch matches to have us all in readiness for an improved showing in 2022. Our final 2 pre -season games gave us great hope as we performed strongly against Subiaco and South Fremantle; perennial finalists.

With the introduction of new recruits in Brayden Ainsworth, Ajang Ajang, Kieran Hug, Jordan Busher, Chris Mayne, Chapman Jones, Denzel More and Kane Johnston the scene was set for Round 1 clash with our 'new derby' rivals in WCE.

A strong come from behind win got the season off to the start we needed, only to falter against EP and SD in coming weeks and then bounce back with a good win over Peel Thunder in Round 4. Following the State game between WA and SA we entered a block of tough games, made even more challenging as COVID impacted the playing and coaching group badly. Coupled with significant injuries, our playing depth was eroded. Consequently, we lost 11 straight games which was very disappointing. We won't make excuses for our poor performances, however the nature of some of the injuries made it very difficult to field competitive teams, albeit it did give some younger players an opportunity to get some League experience which we believe will be beneficial in the long run. Congratulations to Damian Sinclair, Daniel Hill and Baxter Philip on making their League debuts after commencing the season in Colts. Regan Hill overcame injuries to make his senior debut along with Liam Dellamarta and Harry Quartermaine. All of the above named made their debuts during this difficult period.

Our remaining win for 2022 came in the game against WCE in Rd 19. A solid 47pt win was great reward for the playing group's persistence. Finishing the season with a 3-15 win/loss record certainly went against the goals we set at the commencement of the year. Interestingly our only 3 wins came against WCE and Peel, both having AFL content in their list.

Well done to all the Coaching Staff for your dedicated work and support of each other in challenging times. Unfortunately, Mossy was unable to see out the season and we thank Garry for his commitment to coaching Perth FC. We thank Steven Armstrong for his role as caretaker coach in the final 2 rounds. Andrew Panetta ably supported Steven as did all the assistants led by Daine Burnett, Kim Vanderweide, Pat Litherland, Stephen Martin and Clint Rudd.

Thank you to Jeremy Hogg and Jason in leading the strength and conditioning team in such a professional manner, assisting the players prepare and recover in readiness for training sessions and games. Our medical and training staff again proved to be an awesome team. Brett and Clare as our physios and Tahnee and Nikki as club doctors, working

The Reserves started the season with 2 wins from the first 4 games but found the going tough after that with only 2 more wins for the season. 64 players suited up over the 16 games with 13 colts making their seniors debut.

Damian Sinclair, Daniel Hill and Baxter Philip all moved on playing some League football before the end of the season. These 3 boys with the addition of Conor McDonald, Ben Fairbank and Tyresse Warrell will one day form the nucleus of a very good team.

Finding continuity in selections was always a challenge. On multiple occasions the team played short of the 23 maximum players allowed. For many weeks the team was put together on who was available to make up a team rather than picking players based around Development and Performance. While this did not allow for a winning structure the players never once dropped their heads and not play with intensity and pride in the jumper. Overall though they just could not play a full 4 quarters at times after being in many of those games at halftime. I am extremely proud of the effort shown to continually turn up, have a great attitude and do their best.

Round 17 was the first opportunity to pick from a solid base of players and in defeating the second placed Claremont on a wet day showed that when available, we have the depth and talent to compete with any of the clubs in the competition. The challenge moving forward is to keep players healthy and up for selection week in and week out.

Every year it requires a dedicated group of support staff to assist in getting the players ready and on the park to play. This year was no different. Starting with Jeremy Hogg and Jason Castelanelli who oversaw and ran a very professional S &C program. Ella McMillan and Isaac Reid as Co head trainers with their team provided the boys with the care and support they require during the year.

Our physios Brett Fletcher and Clare Thomson-Boston are probably the most important members of the team. Their knowledge and professionalism around the management of injuries and the general health of the players is second to none. Thank you to Brian Oliver our Team Manager for keeping everything running smoothly on match day and keeping us all on time. You can get lost sometimes with what you are doing and Brian was always there with a quiet reminder to move along.

Kim Vanderweide, Pat Litherland and Stephen Martin made up the coaching team in the Reserves. You could not have a more dedicated group of men who gave up a lot of their time and provided the players with constant feedback and support. Their commitment to the players and to the club goes very much above and beyond what is expected from coaches at this level. There is a great deal of respect and trust among this group and it was a pleasure to work with them.



Thank you to Garry Moss, Daine Burnett, Steve Armstrong and Clinton Rudd for their continued support throughout the year. Their guidance and friendship helped to create a very good atmosphere within all the coaching groups including the Colts' coaches. This allowed all coaches to feel included and valued.

Trevor Williams continues to be a sounding board, yet someone who will challenge you when required. Thanks, Trevor, for allowing us to Coach in a learning and supportive environment.

The players deserve recognition. They battled all year in trying circumstances to overcome a great number of hurdles continually placed in front of them. They always turned up regardless of the situation and in a lot of cases badly outnumbered. They played as a team and gave great effort every week and showed pride in the jumper. I am very thankful for the trust and belief they always displayed in the Coaches.

Finally, thank you to the Football Club, Board, Admin and all its Supporters for their interest in the Reserves program. It has been a challenging yet enjoyable experience once again and hopefully after reading this a bit of understanding in the results around the circumstances of the year.





It is with a lot of pride that I submit my report to the 2022 year book.

After a winless season in 2021, and lots of talk about 'doom and destruction' for the future of the Perth Footy Club, during season 2022 the Colts were able to win 5 games - 3 of those against eventual finalists, and were more than competitive from week to week. Between rounds 7 and 15 (7 games) we only managed to win one game - however every week we were 'IN' the contest, not being defeated by more than 13 points in any of those fixtures. Whilst it was incredibly frustrating for the players to be in so many close games without getting the four points, at the same time it was very encouraging. We dropped games to the two grand finalists by 3 points (West Perth) and 13 points (Peel Thunder) in consecutive weeks...our best was clearly good enough, however we simply couldn't seem to get over the line to win. Our average losing margin from Round 7 until the end of the season was just 18 points, and every week the players ran out and played with great effort and skill.

What became evident as the season went along was that the decision to play so many of our talented 2005-born players during the 2021 season - whilst challenging for everyone at the time - will eventually pay dividends. Players including Elijah Scoble, Noah Murray, Ben McFarlane, Joseph Harp, Quayden Roe, Noah Cachard, Aiden O'Driscoll, Mitch Keene and Jake Harvey - and I'm sure I've missed a couple - all played as 15/16 year olds during the winless 2021 season, and really started to make a mark on the competition during the latter half of the 2022 season. Unfortunately the perpetual lament of the Perth Colts Coach - "I wish I could have my PSA players every week" - was often heard as we so rarely were able to have our 'BEST' team on the park.

2022 was also a season of celebrating the success of our players moving up into the senior program. Graduating colt Harry Quartermaine really started to establish himself as a league player, winning selection in Round 11 and holding his position in the side until the end of the year. In addition, 2022 Colts squad members Regan Hill, Daniel Hill, Damian Sinclair and Baxter Philip all played league games during 2022 - a fantastic achievement. In addition to those playing at League level, FIFTEEN (15) members of our Colts squad progressed through to play Reserves footy during the year. Whilst I acknowledge that some of these elevations were forced due to Covid/Injury issues within the senior squad, at the same time I was incredibly proud of the way the players stepped up to play senior footy and gave it their best shot!

During the National Championships in 2022, two of our Colts squad members - Connor McDonald and Coen Livingstone - both won selection to represent Western Australia. This was a great opportunity for these two talented players to really showcase their abilities at a national level and challenge themselves to compete against the best U18 footballers throughout Australia. I know both of them loved the experience and I am sure it will help them push their football to another level in 2023 - Connor as he moves into the senior program at Perth (or hopefully for him at an AFL club) and Coen as he returns to play a full season with the Perth Colts now that his PSA commitments at Scotch have concluded.

We also had two players selected to play in the National U16 Championships, Cooper Moore and Ali Al Shuweli. Cooper proved a very effective small forward/midfielder for WA during the championships. Unfortunately for Ali, his quad injury prevented his participation in the carnival. Both of these young players - together with a host of their team-mates in the 2022 Futures program showed a lot of talent and it will be great to watch what they can do at Colts level in 2023 and beyond.

Unfortunately this report is the final piece of work I will be doing for the Perth Footy Club. After 7 years – 5 years as Colts Coach - the club informed me at the end of the season that it is time for a new voice and new ideas. I was incredibly disappointed to hear this. Whilst I have total faith in the ability of the new coach, former senior player and, more recently, Perth Futures' Coach Scott Moore, I had really wanted to 'finish the job' we commenced in 2021 with playing a whole heap of 15 and 16 years olds at Colts level and trying to teach them to play BEFORE they were ready. 2022 was promising and I truly believe 2023 will be AMAZING! But few of us get to leave on our own terms and I was never going to be a person who was allowed to do that.

I have loved every minute of my involvement at Perth. Since I walked through the doors in 2016 to work with Earl and his senior program, everyone at the footy club has made me feel part of the place. I have been surrounded throughout by a terrific bunch of support people - assistant coaches, Strength and Conditioning staff, Physios, trainers and an amazing admin team, all of whom have worked tirelessly to make my job as coach easier, and to help the footy club return to the top of the league ladder. I'm not going to name everyone who has helped me - I will forget someone and don't want anyone to think I didn't appreciate them - but a very special thanks goes to this year's coaching team - Mark Piani, David Keys, Kurt Bufton and Jye Welch. It's been a challenging season that's for sure but we gave it EVERYTHING we had.

That's it from me - onward and upward - and Go the Dees.

2022 can certainly be reflected upon as a big step forward for the Perth Talent Programs, as Covid continued to cause immense unpredictability throughout the WAFL landscape. Despite these challenges, many great outcomes were achieved this year across our four metro programs, which in combination with our three regional academies proved the future is bright at the Demons.

WAFL COLTS

In preparation for what looked to be an interrupted early part of the season due to Covid, an extended squad for this year was decided upon to combat the lack of player availability we may have faced. We played an enormous 54 players throughout the season, including 27 debutants, 4 players being from our Central and North Midlands regions whilst 3 originated from our Avon zone. These figures promote what can be classed as a squad mentality within the group, where regardless of who is wearing the jumper there is a role to be executed. We finished the home and away season in 8th place with a record of 5 wins and 11 losses.

Starting the season with 2 wins in a row gave the group a muchneeded confidence boost after a winless 2021 season. The first of these victories came on the eve of Anzac Day as the Demons took a 38-point win over the Royals in the first home game of the season for the colts after a round 1 bye. Back-to-back home games proved the trick against Swans in round 3 as Perth kept things interesting in a low-scoring affair resulting in a 38 – 34 win. Our next win didn't come until round 9, where a Michael Hall match-winning left foot snap from the boundary sealed the deal against South Fremantle, placing the Dees at 3 wins and 5 losses for the season so far. Round 12 against the 2021 reigning premiers at Bassendean gave Perth another inspiring win defeating the Swans by 17 but unfortunately, our 5th win of the season had to wait until the final round of the year, where the Demons proved victors over South Fremantle in what was a positive end to a much-improved 2022 campaign.

As with every year, we had some standout individual performers throughout the season, with a full list of individual award winners and state representatives featured later in this report. A few special mentions must be made though, starting with Coen Livingstone and Connor McDonald who realized their goal of representing Western Australia at the Under 18 National Championships. Also worth mentioning is Baxter Philip who was named in the 2022 WAFL Colts Team of the Year. Finally, congratulations again to Baxter Philip who was crowned the winner of the Jack Ensor Medal in our Fairest & Best and again to Oliver Zolnier-Owens who finished Runner Up.

As always, we have a great representation of the PSA school football programs in our colts program and this year Scotch College was crowned winners of the Alcock Cup with Demons Coen Livingstone and Kalib Dempster-Park contributing greatly to the school's success. Congratulations boys.

The Colts Program does not run without the amazing work of many people. Thank you to Coach Michael Pratt and his Assistant Coaches David Keys, Kurt Bufton, Mark Piani, Damian McCague and Mark Longton. We owe plenty to our support staff, made up of Team Manager Steve Ransted, Head Physiotherapist Daniel Anderson, Head Trainers Angela Lefante and Seth Campbell and their team and finally Head S&C Coach Jye Welch and his Assistant S&C Coach Mitch Tiernan.

These people put in significant hours for the benefit of the program and the players and their efforts do not go unnoticed.

WAFL FUTURES

Our Futures group endured a challenging campaign, winning just one game out of six, but showing some positive signs for years to come regardless. At the end of the Futures Competition we had Ali Al Shuweli and Cooper Moore selected for the state 16s academy which was a fantastic result after both players had an outstanding futures campaign. Ali, unfortunately, sustained an injury that prevented him from playing, however Cooper featured in all 3 games for WA at the most recent NAB AFL Development Championships, winning two games overall.

Congratulations to our 2022 Futures Award Winners: Coaches Award – Kai Millington, Troy Cook Courage Award – Ali Al Shuweli, Ross Young Leadership Award – Jacob Roberts, Waldock Player of the Year Award – Cooper Moore. Thank you to Coach Scott Moore and his Assistant Coaches Damian McCague, Cal Walley and Ross Clark. A thank you also goes to Runners Mark Millington and Aaron Russell, along with Development staff Karen Turnbull and Ryan Smith. Finally a big thank you to head S&C Coach Andrew Cox along with Angela Lefante who was our Head Trainer.

DEVELOPMENT SQUADS

Our 14s and 15s Development Squad Programs took a giant leap in 2022. A big emphasis on development, professionalism and passion saw both programs go from strength to strength across the carnivals with special note to our 14s squads who won 4 games out of a possible 6. It was also the 14s program that saw the Demons claim new areas within the Perth metropolitan area as part of the WAFL boundary review. Our updated metro zone now includes the suburbs of Southern River (part), Champion Lakes (part), Seville Grove (part), Haynes, Hilbert and Brookdale (part), Darling Downs, Cardup, Oakford (part), and Byford (part). It was very clear in the early stages of this program that the inclusion of these areas will certainly complement the existing talent already coming through and make us stronger for the years to come.

This year saw the Perth Football Club continue their commitment to the Women's Football strategy with the commencement of an Academy, continuance of the Penrhos College partnership, and our first participation in the WAFLW's Metropolitan Development carnival.

The female football pathway at PFC was the vision of our current Board - "From Zero to Halo" - aimed at providing a framework towards the establishment of a PFC Rogers Cup team, a WAFLW league team, and a women's football legacy within the PFC district. We are excited to be on track with our proposal to the WAFC to enter a Rogers Cup team in 2023 after meeting the other milestones for the first year.

The 15-week Academy development program enabled 42 girls from the Perth District to participate in a pathway program, providing them with similar development opportunities currently offered to our District's boys, and a clear pathway to reach their dreams of playing at the highest level. The program consisted of 18 training sessions, a scratch match and 2 fixtured games. The games provided the best girls in our district an opportunity to play together, display their skills against other WAFLW development teams, and be the first females to wear the PFC jumper!

We were fortunate to have an experienced coaching group lead by Gavin Outridge (previous WAFL/community coach and premiership WAFL player), Jared Bell (ex-PFC player), Oscar Bird (current PFC player & ex-Sydney Swans Academy), and Paul Burton (ex WAFL/community coach and WAFL player). Thank you to this amazing team for sharing their knowledge and expertise, and leading the improvements that we saw as the program progressed. The coaching staff were well supported by Angela Le Fante (Trainer), Sarah Hampson (S & C) and Daniel Hill (Runner).

Several special quests gave up their time to assist with the program. Highlights included a visit and talk at our jumper presentation by Emma O'Driscoll, specialist coaching from Scott Moore, and goal kicking pointers and a Tik Tok share from Sam Stubbs. Grace Hirte's social media posts were also extremely popular with the girls, and it was great to have Board Members and PFC staff dropping into training showing their support.

In addition to their 'on-field' training the girls were provided with an opportunity to commence a Strength and Conditioning program through our partnership with Diamond Fitness, Perth's leading fitness provider. Other generous sponsors who helped to make the program what it was were Hungry Jacks, Fugro, MACMAHON's and ID Fleet Hire - thank you all for your support.

Recognition must also go to our inaugural group of amazing girls for making it so much fun - an amazing group who we enjoyed working with. They took on everything we threw at them and showed they were prepared to commit and work hard. We look forward to supporting them as they take the next step in their football careers.

Finally, thank you to the women's committee led by Kelly Townson, who have enthusiastically supported our progress this year, Russ Clark and the PFC staff who have been right behind our program, the Board for their ongoing support, and Trevor Williams for his advice over this past vear.

Our proposal has been submitted to enter the Rogers Cup competition next year - hopefully the WAFC will see fit to support our application and ensure that all WAFL clubs are represented in 2023 - providing more girls the opportunity to play football at the highest levels in WA.





2022 was an exciting year for the Perth Football Club in the community space. This included the creation of many new programs and the strengthening of existing ones. The Perth Football Club has a metropolitan and regional zone that is rich in diversity and multiculturalism and we are truly privileged to work with such a variety of individuals, communities and organisations.

Our work in the community would not be possible without the generous ongoing support of our major community partner, Hungry Jack's. We also thank Fugro, Macmahon and other club sponsors for their support of our important community programs.

Penrhos College Partnership:

The Perth Football Club has an ongoing partnership with Penrhos College with the aim of growing women's football in our metro zone. In term one 2022, three Penrhos teams participated in the very first IGSSA Football Competition – assisted by the coaching of six senior Perth Football Club players. The IGSSA season involved one training session and game each week of the term. The growth in skills and football ability that we saw in the 60+ girls who participated in the program was outstanding. We were fortunate to showcase Penrhos' football development with the year 7/8 team taking part in a curtain-raiser prior to the WAFL round 1 fixture against West Coast. We have continued to run football coaching through the Sporting Schools Program in term three and four and look forward to the resumption of the IGSSA competition in 2023.

Free Kick Program:

The Free Kick Program is a new program for 2022, designed to help engage young people in our regional zones. The aim of the project is to provide participants a physical outlet through sport as well as the opportunity to sit down, eat a meal and interact with guests and leaders from a variety of community and professional backgrounds. Our pilot program commenced in York during the month of August and ran for four weeks. We had over twenty participants taking part in a variety of skills development, leadership and career workshops. We were lucky to secure in-depth presentations from Chris Mayne, Jacob Peletier and Steve Nikola throughout the program. A big thank you to Ben White for helping to design the program, as well as Robyn Garratt and Rebecca Atkinson from the York Community Resource Centre for helping the program run smoothly. We are excited to be expanding the program into more regional towns in 2023.

Macmahon Schools Program:

Growing football at grassroots level is crucial in allowing young people to live active lifestyles, develop new skills and ensure the longevity of our great game. This is something that the Perth Football Club takes great pride in and we thoroughly enjoyed delivering successful Macmahon School Clinics to more than 500 students throughout 2022. A highlight of the schools' programs this year was delivering a day of football clinics for Bannister Creek Primary School during their NAIDOC week celebrations – who shared with us a barbeque of Kangaroo, Crocodile and Emu.



Junior Clubs:

Senior Perth Football Club players always look forward to visiting and giving back to our junior clubs - and this year was no exception. We had over twenty players visiting our Junior Club training sessions during the season, which is always well received by players and coaches. We were also pleased to visit and assist the Belmont Bombers and Redcliffe Eagles as they delivered their Summer Football Academies earlier this year. Our Junior Clubs were celebrated this year in round 18 of the WAFL season as Parade Day saw over 200 players, parents and coaches marching across Mineral Resources Park representing all of our Junior Clubs in our Metro Zone.

Multicultural Programs:

The Perth Football Club has been fortunate to develop a strong relationship with the Bachar Houli Foundation throughout 2022. We joined Bachar Houli himself and many other key staff in May, as the Foundation promoted football and faith to hundreds of students at the Australian Islamic College in Kewdale. We were also fortunate to host and contribute to a two-day leadership camp for young male and female Muslims in our metro zone. The two separate programs saw over thirty participants being joined by Muslim leaders in the community from both Melbourne and Perth. Thank you and congratulations to Pinar Komur at the Bachar Houli Foundation/ WAFC for arranging a terrific program. We look forward to continuing to build on our relationship with the Bachar Houli Foundation and expand our Multicultural Programs for 2023.

Wheelchair Football:

As a club that strives to be inclusive and promote diversity, we became the newest team to participate in the WA Wheelchair Football League. Our 5-a-side team saw us join our rivals East Perth, Subiaco and Swan Districts for season two of the competition. The competition involves teams of mixed genders and a blend of players with and without a disability. The competition is held on indoor courts at HBF Stadium and runs throughout the months of October, November and December. We will certainly be excited to return to the competition next year.


Walk for Him Challenge – Prostate Cancer Foundation of Australia:


