Joe's departure provided the Executive with an opportunity to review the current staffing structure that supports Country Football and work closely with the WAFC to implement a new model that will help to provide more support to our volunteer stakeholders at every level. After a long and extensive process, we welcomed Tom Bottrell into the role of Executive Manager, Country Football and Facilities. The new title and increased portfolio will mean that all levels of Country Football report through to Tom, including the WACFL, which will no doubt lead to improved communication and engagement across all levels of Country Football. Excitingly, it also provides Country Football with a voice at Executive level within the WAFC. Myself and my fellow Executives are excited about what the future holds in this regard.

In 2019 we also entered the first year of what will hopefully be a long and fruitful partnership with Healthway and the 'Think Mental Health' message. The health and wellbeing of our members and our regional communities continues to be at the forefront of everything we do and we are in a privileged position to be able to play some small role in helping to drive positive outcomes in this space.

In July, a new era in Country Football was ushered in with the inaugural Women's Country Football Championships being held. It was exciting to see five sides converge on Perth for the weekend. Innovation continues to drive the sustainability of our leagues and clubs, and it was great to see a number of leagues come on board with the adoption of a Points System for 2019. We have invested considerable time in developing a model that

Working with leagues in regard to implementation of Points Systems, application of the Salary Cap and competition innovations has been, and will continue to be, a focus into the 2020 season.

I'd like to thank my fellow Executive members for their contribution to Country Football in 2019. Whilst it was sad to see long time Executive Member and past President Terry House no longer part of the Executive team, it has been exciting to have Geoff Davis from the Central Kimberley join the board and provide us with a greater understanding of the Kimberley region and the challenges that football faces in that part of our great state. It was also great to see former WACFL Life Member and former President Terry House recognised for his service to Country Football with membership of the WA Football Commission. Congratulations Terry!

Finally, I'd like to thank the small team of WACFL Staff. Whilst understaffed for a large part of the 2019 season, Brent, Kellie, Robyn and our new additions to the team, Zoe and Tom, continued to provide fantastic support to all our leagues and clubs. 2020 will see even more change with our long serving administration officer Robyn Payne retiring after 20.5 years of service to WA Football and country football. Whilst it will be sad see her go we wish Robyn and Bill all the best for the next chapter.

We are privileged as a collective, both Executive and Staff, to work closely with the great volunteers week to week to help facilitate more than 3,000 senior matches that take place around country WA each year and look ahead with excitement as to what 2020 may bring.



EXECUTIVE MANAGER COUNTRY FOOTBALL & FACILITIES

2019 saw a significant positive change to the WACFL's partnership with the WAFC. Following extensive discussions with the WACFL Executive on how to best service football in our regions, the WAFC created the Executive Manager position, fundamentally, to provide the WACFL more operational and administrative support day-to-day. My role, Executive Manager — Country Football & Facilities,

commenced in August and we set about planning and embedding a team structure that can better service the length and breadth of Western Australia, delivering programs and support from Auskick, umpiring and club development through to senior country football. Below is an overview of the structure which will be fully embedded by February 2020.

COUNTRY FOOTBALL AND FACILITIES STRUCTURE



The key aim of this new structure is to ensure there is frequent and clear communications with our key stakeholders in each region. Each league will receive a communication plan which breaks down the structure flowchart and outlines who to speak to as their first contact. Our overall aim is to ensure the new structure has made a positive difference to Country football when we reflect at the end of 2020.

2019 also saw the launch of the WAFC's Social Return on Investment report which clearly demonstrates the value football plays in the community. The final report by ACIL Allen consultants, highlights that for every \$1 spent by a community football club,

\$2.16 is returned in Health, Social and Economic benefits back to community. Overall, WA football provides \$225m in social and health benefits and around \$220m in economic benefits to our community. We have always known that football is a great connector of communities and we now have the research to back that up and will use this information when talking to funding and community partners into the future.

Another significant piece of work being done comes on the back of the AFL's pledge to Country football in Victoria valued at \$18m over 3 years. The figures are all relevant to the size of league's costs and we intend on presenting our case to the AFL after



significant planning and consultation. This process commenced in December in the Kimberley with the intended outcome being a Football Development plan launching in July this year. As part of that process, we will be talking with football and non-football stakeholders in each region to ensure we fully understand their requirements and the template can then be replicated in all regions to put together a comprehensive request to the AFL. The request needs to be based on detailed rather than anecdotal feedback so we can demonstrate a genuine need for assistance. Throughout 2020 our team will be working with all leagues on this process.

The WACFL is blessed to partner such loyal and high quality organisations. We are grateful to Healthway, Insurance Commission of WA, Landmark, CBH Group, New Holland, Regional Men's Health Initiative and West Coast Poly, for their continued support and one major partner, in particular, has undergone a recent name and branding change but continues with the same wonderful and long-term partnership. Nutrien Ag Solutions, formerly Landmark, may have taken on new ownership structures, however the support received from Steve Wright and newly appointed Region Manager — West, Andrew Duperouzel means that the Country Championships partnership will enter its 46th year in 2020.

After just 5 months in the role, I'm pleased to say that we have a wonderful team of staff and WACFL Board members who all want to ensure we have made a positive difference to Country football in 2020. I'm looking forward to the season ahead including successful colts, female and male Country Championships, along with our State side making it 2-in-a-row when we tackle the Croweaters in Adelaide on 25th July.

I look forward to meeting you throughout the season and good luck for a successful 2020 on and off the field.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2019

1. BASIS OF PREPARATION

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Dividend revenue

Dividends are recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2019

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably. If the outcome can be estimated reliably then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period. If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

Revenue from training services is generally recognised once the training has been delivered.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.
