PRESIDENT'S REPORT

ongratulations and thank you to everyone who contributed towards ensuring our great Club continued its improvement during 2018. I specially thank all Members for their continued support of our Club, of myself and the Board in so many ways.

I believe 2018 saw us achieve a higher level of credibility and respect in the WAFL, both on and off the field. Evidenced by comments from our competitors and the WAFC. Nothing ever just happens. This is the result of the commitment of so many.

An exciting 2019 lies ahead as we enter our 120th year. What an achievement this is and during 2019 much will be covered regarding our 120 years and its significance. I believe understanding our history helps us make successful decision for the future.

Before proceeding on to specific acknowledgments I have listed some of our more notable achievements during 2018.

- The development and completion of The Club's 5 year strategic plan under the four pillars of: Football, Facilities, Community Engagement and Sustainability. Each Pillar has its own objectives and operational plan. The strategic plan is available on our website.
- Our new constitution was approved by members and registered with the Department of Commerce, making us the first WAFL Club to be compliant. I thank our consultant Barry Butterworth, Director Cathy VanderWeide, Executive Officer John Matthews and Life Member Richard Camm for their work in getting the constitution completed and approved.
- We have implemented many of the recommendations of the Cumberland review held in 2017 into our operations, football and culture.
- After much lobbying, Steve Irons our local Federal member for Swan, was successful in obtaining \$4 million of funding for a new PFC/ Community facility at Lathlain. At the time of writing both the Town of Victoria Park and our Local State Member, Ben Wyatt are supportive of a new facility. Much work lies ahead of us but we thank Steve for his efforts in obtaining funds for this essential community project.
- Our League team improved considerably during 2018 and played some
 of the most exciting football seen at Lathlain for many years, just missing
 out on the finals as the result of an East Perth goal after the siren. The
 improvement in player enthusiasm and culture was noticed by many. They
 and the coaching group are to be congratulated.
- The Club continued its many Community Engagement Programs:
 - Coaching Academy headed by Trevor Williams
 - Aboriginal Engaging Program and Regional Accommodation House
 - Banksia Hill Football Program
 - Outside the Locker room Mental Health and Self-development program
- The Club has achieved a small profit during 2018 in a difficult economic year and the club has seen our Centurion Reserve Fund increase to approximately \$440m. I thank my fellow Trustees of the fund: Fund Chair and Club Patron Peter Gilkison, Past President Damian Matthews, Vice Patron Phil Castle and CEO Marty Atkins for their efforts in managing the fund.

ooking back on my conclusion from last year's Annual Report, I'm happy that my expectation for Season 2018 occurred - more happier faces at Lathlain. LEAGUE COACH'S **REPORT**





EARL SPALDING LEAGUE COACH

am confident the true value of our much improved 2018 season will become apparent in the next year or two, because despite the frustrating last three weeks, where we blew the chance to play finals for the first time in over twenty years, our progress as a developing young group is undeniable. We managed to beat five teams and lost to a sixth after the siren, which left just the undefeated Subiaco & fellow grand finalists, West Perth (a team that we tend to struggle against for some reason) as the only sides we couldn't master. Even then we had our moments in games against both these sides, but couldn't take our chances against West Perth or sustain our effort for long enough against Subiaco. This showed me we could compete with anyone when we brought our A game, which revolved around pressure in the contest and on the ball carrier when they won the ball. Also in our ability to lock the ball in our forward line and get repeat entries, thus giving us more opportunities to score. Our average inside 50's were up by 5 on last year and saw us ranked 3rd for the season. This saw the greatest drop off in all our stats over the last 3 weeks, due mostly to our lack of forward pressure.

There were quite a few reasons for our improved performances. Firstly some low key, but targeted recruiting that saw Corey Yeo, Mitch Lague & Ben Giobbi join the club as well as Michael Bennell, who "knocked on the door" asking for an another opportunity at WAFL level after a promising colts career at Swans. Whilst Mitch & to a lesser extent Ben had injury interrupted seasons, they certainly showed they can be very good players at this level and Corey & Michael had outstanding first seasons at the club, with both having scope for improvement. Also Matt Taylor returned to the club after a year at North Melbourne on their rookie list and he has certainly benefitted from his time at AFL level. Even though it ultimately proved to be a disappointingly short stay, he is still young and talented enough to get back if he continues to work hard. Secondly, welcoming Cody Leggett, Lachie Dennis, Jared Bell & Kristian Cary back from long term injury. They all showed what we missed out on last year with the impact they had and in Jared's case, he will be much better for the 5 games he managed at the back end of the season after 2 full years out. Overall we had a much better run with injury this year, with key play makers Brant Colledge & Michael Sinclair showing the benefit of playing relatively pain free for the first time for a while. The main exception being Sam Garstone, who hurt his ankle in round 1. Unfortunately he didn't recover well enough to make it back into the senior line up. We look forward to seeing him contribute to our continued improvement in 2019.

Thirdly the continued development of our young second and third year players in Corey Byrne, Cody Ninyette, Anton Scotney, Blake Johnson, Kasey Nicholas, Mitch Henderson, John Levien & Marshall Jones. They all showed at different stages of the season that they can already have an impact on a game, so it should fill us all with hope and optimism how good they can be when they get another year or two's experience under their belt.





Along with our 2019 debutants (especially young Zac Hill, who managed to play 15 games in his debut season as a key defender) and very promising graduating colts, it's not hard to see why I'm so bullish about our short and more importantly long term future. Fourthly and most importantly in terms of taking the next big step forward, was the role our leadership group played this year. We took a different approach in forming this group, allowing the whole playing group to vote for their leaders after a short, but extremely gruelling and mentally challenging overnight camp at the back of Byford. The five leaders empowered by their peers were Clint Jones, Brent Edmonds, Christian Eyres, Lachie Dennis & Cody Leggett. They all contributed well in their role as a conduit between the coaches and players, but have also acknowledged that we have a long way to go to catch up to Subiaco in how we go about challenging our team mates and holding each other accountable. We will continue to tweak this group and encourage them to have a bigger say in how we go about the next exciting phase of our development.

Another big challenge we faced in the off season was filling the shoes of departing assistants Michael Pratt & Garry Moss, who both landed Colts coaching jobs at Perth & East Perth respectively. It was a big assignment, given how high a regard I hold these 2 men in and it took quite a while to fill the positions, but in the end we were very fortunate to secure the services of Pat Litherland & Darren Kowal. Pat took over the defence and Darren the forwards, which allowed Chance to move into the mids. It was guite a diverse group which worked fantastically well together and despite having differing opinions from time to time, we were all on the same page once a decision had been made. We were also lucky to gain the services of Rhys Thurston during the season. Rhys would sit in the box on match day and observe all the coach's behaviours and interactions with each other and the players. He does this professionally with teachers and we certainly reaped the benefits of his insights. Whilst this could be confronting at times, all the coaches found it extremely beneficial to our development as communicators and educators. Our Development coaches were also a part of this process and we continue to be so lucky to have such an experienced group enthusiastically led by Andrew Panetta.

His able assistants in Daine Burnett, Kim Vanderweide and Bruce Fraser were more than comfortable working with our entire list and I had every confidence that a consistent message was being relayed to both playing groups. Add in Neil Allen (Chairman of Selectors), Trevor Williams (Skills Coach & Mentor) & Craig Fewster (Bench Coach) and you'd be hard pressed to find a more experienced or harmonious coaching group in the WAFL.



Losing our Head S & C coach to WAIS and Physio to the Western Force, wasn't an ideal way to start the new year and left little time to find experienced replacements, so we were so fortunate to have Ben Teune step up from his assistant S&C role and Brett Fletcher step up from his role as Colts Physio and seamlessly fill these positions. Along with Ben's assistants, Sara, Matt, Pat & Michael, our club doctor Joe Henry & our wonderful head trainers, Charlotte & Hayley they formed a fantastic working relationship that enabled our fitness levels to reach new heights (we won 10 out of 18 last quarters and had a positive for and against in this stanza for the first time in ages) and our games missed through injury to improve markedly.

I'd also like to acknowledge and thank all of our other match day support staff. From our ever growing dynamic stats team of Boo, Spud and DB, to our Team Manager Dacky, board man Lidds and runners Jenks & Scotty (Jenks also doubles up as boxing coach at the club and at a mate's gym on Sundays). One thing we are not short of at our club is passionate people willing to give their time to enable us to continue to improve. I hope we are able to reward their faith & loyalty in the not too distant future.

He has been able to implement real change that has certainly contributed to our change in fortunes lately and he continues to demand we all stay focussed and ensure our path continues in an upward direction.

We have certainly had some challenging times over the last 4 years and I'm sure there are still a few bumps in the road ahead, but we've been able to stay the course in terms of developing our young group of predominantly local talent and this is paramount in achieving the ultimate success we all crave.

3 players played Reserves football this year over the season. It is always very challenging at Reserves level to balance the desire to win and the need to educate. I believe we have a very good balance in achieving the goals we are aiming for. All these things can only fast track and prepare the boys better for careers at Perth. As a coaching group in the Reserves we are very satisfied that we have given the boys a good grounding for moving forward into the next seasons.

Thank you to our Football Manager (Dale Ballantyne) and our Team Manager (Peter Boyd.) Their help in keeping everything running smoothly took great pressure off us and we appreciate this.

COLTS COACH'S **REPORT**



MICHAEL PRATT COLTS COACH

would like to start by thanking the Perth Footy Club and the WAFC for the opportunity to coach the Colts team during the 2018 season. The season was my 3rd at the club – after spending 2 years as an assistant with the seniors. Since joining the club back at the start of the 2016 preseason, I have been continually overwhelmed by the welcoming nature and professional approach of everyone at the PFC.

Our season – the first conducted under the new WAFC Talent Model – really was a season in two halves. After a close first up loss at home to Swan Districts, the team went on a bit of a roll – winning 6 of our next 7 games including a win over eventual premiers Subiaco and big victories over finalists East Fremantle and Peel Thunder. The last 12 weeks of the season though were extremely disappointing. We won only one game from the start of June until the conclusion of the season on Sunday August 26th – which is 13 weeks (and 39 training sessions!) without success...far too long for any group of players. The question I have repeatedly (and quite fairly) been asked since the end of the season is 'What went wrong?'.

We could find a lot of excuses for what happened this year – but ultimately the players were unable to deliver success on game-day because I was unable to provide them with the method and motivation for them to do so. Our group of players this season was exceedingly talented (more on this later) and to be unable to 'get it together' in the final 3 months of the season was certainly my most disappointing period in 15 years of coaching. The results were certainly not a reflection of the outstanding efforts of my coaching staff – Glenn Davies, Dean Mann and Peter Donaldson together with S&C Coaches Luke Everett, Aaron Dean and Tapiwa Shekede – nor the off-field support team led by Physio Alex Murdock, and trainers Hayley Patterson and Charlotte Elliot (together with their awesome teams!). Everyone in the Colts structure worked long and hard to turn things around during the back half of the year but for whatever reason as a group we were unable to find the right button to press.

Back to our players – who I am quite certain everyone wants to hear about – and the incredible talent the club has coming through the ranks at the moment. Some numbers to consider:

- **58:** Players who donned the Red and Black during the 2018 Colts season.
- 11: 2018 Colts players who progressed through to senior footy during the
- 6: Members of the WA U18 side including FIVE (5) who participated in the crucial final game vs Vic Country at Marvel Stadium. (5 out of 22 players from the Perth Footy club! - Not bad!)
- 5: 2018 U16's who progressed through to play Colts Football in 2018.
- Members of the undefeated Aquinas team who played Colts Football at Perth in 2018.
- 3: Invitees to the National Draft Camp (10 from WA, 3 from Perth! How good?!).
- All-Australian U18's Congratulations to Luke English and Sydney Stack.
- 2: All-Australian U16's Congratulations to Logan McDonald and Nathan O'Driscoll
- Colts Team of the Year members Congratulations (again) to Luke English and Sydney Stack.
- 2: Participants in the 'Future Stars' game conducted as a curtain raiser to this year's AFL Grand Final congratulations to Elijah Taylor and Dev Robertson.

Keep in mind when reviewing all of these achievements – and the list is significant – that Colts Footy is not JUST about winning and losing...and the playing field is not necessarily level between teams. Of course, when the players cross the line it is 18-vs-18, but whilst some clubs miss a large number of players due to PSA football commitments – or representative commitments – others are barely impacted. And whilst teams such as ours actively encourage our developing colts to 'push up' and get a taste of senior footy, other teams hold players back. As an example of this, for our Round 21 fixture versus Subiaco, the opposition ran out 13 players born in 1999 (effectively 19 year olds) whereas our side featured just 3. Which approach is correct? This is hard to say – in the short term, Subiaco won the game of colts footy (and ultimately the colts premiership with that same playing group) but what we are trying to do is provide our players with the best possible grounding to push ahead into senior ranks.

I think it is inarguable that we are providing great benefits to our young players by enabling them to train (and potentially play) with the senior group during the year they turn 18. The process we have put in place to push our young players up through the senior group for a 'block' of 3-4 games during the second half of the season is one I am very pleased with - and most thankful for the support of the senior coaching group (in particular Earl Spalding and Andrew Panetta) for making the boys so welcome. How could an 18 year old player not benefit from training with Clint Jones? From being coached by Earl Spalding? Not only do they have the opportunity to actively LEARN from their senior team-mates and coaches - they also move into the next pre-season with a CLEAR and very personal understanding of what will be required to make a success of senior footy in the following season. Too often players exit Colts footy and fall by the way-side during their first senior pre-season simply because the training load coupled with the competitiveness of the senior players is too much for them. The success our club has had over the past two seasons in turning graduating colts into senior players has been absolutely outstanding and really does speak to the benefits of the approach we are taking.

What else? Well, there are of course more thank you's. To Trevor Williams, Team Manager Steve Ransted, Boardman David Van Raalte, runners Chris Maskiell and Kurt Bufton – you have all been outstanding contributors and I look forward to working with each of you again in 2019. Also a special thanks and a sad farewell to our Talent Manager Peter Brear. I first worked with Peter when he was the Talent Manager and I was the colts coach down at Peel Thunder in 2008. In the subsequent 11 years Peter has had a tremendous influence on the lives of literally hundreds of young footballers – many of them from the Perth District. I know everyone at Perth will wish Peter all the best as he returns to Victoria and lives a life closely connected to his family who he has been separated from for far too long.

Finally, thanks to all of the players and their families – the 2018 season was a long and frustrating one for all of us associated with the colts program.





Growing the great game at junior level can at times seem very complex, but it is extremely rewarding. Participation in junior football whether at a club or at a school gives children the opportunity to become better people through developing both physical and life skills.

It also gives participants an opportunity to develop across a range of pathways. - The Auskick Gala day at Curtin University that was well supported by players from the PFC.
- The Year 2 Auskick Gala Showcase where over 100 teams across the Perth, East Perth and Swans junior districts came together at the WACA for a day of sensational fun. This was again an overwhelming success.
- The Nicky Winmar Carnival continues to grow in significance in developing our indigenous players.
- Junior players, from a range of clubs, playing for our district development and academy teams and successfully competing against other district sides.
- PFC continuing to support the District Parade Day at Lathlain Park which resulted in record numbers of junior players attending.
- Junior female football continuing to expand at a rate of knots and this will continue in the coming seasons.
- Expansion of junior coaching development with the appointment of Allana Dickie as a Coach Coordinator, the continuation of the coaching road shows and the ongoing success of the Demons Coaching Academy that was developed with the PFC under the guidance of Trevor Williams.
- Umpiring continued to thrive and develop through the Perth District Junior Football Umpires Association and full credit to those participants who both juggle playing and umpiring junior football.
- For the first time, the District gala night occurred under the Central Conference banner where the Perth, East Perth and Swan Districts junior districts all came together at the Hyatt Regency and this was an outstanding success. - The recognition of the importance of volunteers continued with the Sunday Times Volunteer of the Year Ceremony at the Convention Centre with our District winner Kristy Drew from the Huntingdale Junior Football Club.
- The emergence of the Naitanui Academy to drive multicultural and indigenous participation. In attending several of the clinics, it showed how much fun training and development can be for junior players and this drove home the importance of coaching. Drew Petrie and his team do an outstanding job in running this extremely important program.
- School based competitions continued such as the Eagles (male) and Dockers (female) Cups. The importance of these programs cannot be underestimated as for many children this is their first experience in playing our great game. I was fortunate this season to coach a local primary school in the Eagles Cup and of the 18 players, 13 had not played football before.
- The District successfully hosting a number of Central Conference grand finals at Mills Park, Beckenham with the assistance of the Kenwick Junior Football Club. The District also recognises the significant achievements of a number of local clubs making junior grand finals this season such as Victoria Park (3 teams), South Perth, Belmont and Lynwood-Ferndale.
