PRESIDENT'S REPORT



On behalf of the Board of Directors, I have great pleasure in presenting my 8th report as President to the members of this great Club.

How do you follow up the greatest season in WAFL history? You win premierships back to back and continue the great work developing the next cohort of players, thats how!

And how does the peak body of WA Football congratulate us – "Something has to be done " Gavin Taylor said. "Recruiting restrictions at the top end and

looking at ways to help teams like Peel have to be considered". Unbelievable, disrespectful and unforgivable on the night of our great premiership success. This leadership drove the social media commentary that has been so damaging to this Club and our people and, of course, deeply damaging to the reputation of the WAFL competition.

And then the WAFC decided to make the WAFL a laughing stock by penalising or victimising the best team. It was affecting my health and I emailed Gavin Taylor: "So when I have a nervous breakdown will the WAFC come up with some compensation!!".

Not all commentary was hysterical about equalization and our money. The West Australian football writer John Townsend wrote the following insights into the real reasons for our success, "No great team can exist without a great Club behind it and Subiaco have no peers when it comes to operating in the constrained environment of a State league. This is a Club that rarely if ever makes an organisational mistake, that pays meticulous attention to the smallest detail while being conscious of the big picture and, above all, is driven to win games of football."

"Subiaco are a great football Club and their six consecutive grand final appearances would not have happened without exceptional culture of their players, their extraordinary work rate and commitment beyond any other semi-pro football Club in the country and a level of ruthlessness unmatched in the land. Subiaco get more things right at every level and make fewer mistakes on and off the field than any other Club".

Its notable that John understands WAFL Clubs because he takes the trouble to attend training and thus has a deeper knowledge that many others.

Chasing back-to-back league premierships, three in a row for the reserves and back-to-back for the Colts was a great challenge.

We had a new league coach, new football manager, new S&C, new Club Captain, new Colts coach and new Talent Manager just to name a few.

That made the results even more satisfying - Minor premier, the 5th year in a row for the league team and 6th grand final in a row.

And then to convert that to a crushing win over the 2nd best team in the grand final was magnificent. The Reserves finished 3rd and played finals but could not quite get it together, whereas the Colts had a slow start but a great back half of the season

Every year we have planned to improve our Club, bringing in coaches, developing players and making sure all our people love being here and that makes Subi better. And that is a great reflection on everyone here.

We have only won 15 premierships in our 123 years of existence, think about that! And to win four in the last six years, six grand finals in a row must surely now be our most successful era.

Beau WARDMAN has been appointed as our league coach for the next two years and his development as a coach is very impressive. I have no doubt that Beau is the right man to continue to drive results at the Lions. Well done Beau!

ONGOING SUSTAINABILITY OF THE CLUB

This year will be our third financial loss in succession as we transition from our old business model at Subiaco Oval. We have held a number of Subi Summits over the last few years to hopefully have all members understand the huge \$400,000 gap we need to fill, what we are doing to close that gap and our other plans for the future which are detailed elsewhere in this report.

What is really important to understand is that we need you all to help us, please. Be ambassadors for the Club, get to understand our situation and what your Club is doing, when you have the chance to involve others please get the message to your business contacts, get people to join as members and grow the Subiaco family. And suggest or help generate ideas that will provide leads that we can then follow up to generate new income opportunities.

CONGRATULATIONS

Kellie PROPERJOHN has been with the Club for three years and has done a mountain of work with our emerging leaders program along with Kyle Horsley. Kellie also works with our coaching groups to become more consistent in the approach to coaching and a worthy recipient of this year's PRESIDENT'S TROPHY sponsored by the STRACK FAMILY.

Well done to Captain Leigh KITCHIN and his leadership group for driving our standards all year and leading us into another grand final. Congratulations to the 2019 Sandover Medallist Lachlan DELAHUNTY on his excellent form this year and to Kyal HORSLEY for his third runner-up at the Sandover Medal. I suppose he must console himself with five league premierships, one reserves premiership and four Outridge Medals!

Never in the history of the WAFL has a Club won the premiership, the Sandover Medal, the Bernie Naylor Medal, the JJ Leonard Trophy and also the Simpson Medal in both the state game and the grand final for a clean sweep of major awards.

Congratulations to everyone involved this year. Be very proud to be part of the Subiaco Football Club - we all are.

CEO REPORT



In my report to members last year, I posed the question about what makes Subiaco the best Club in the WAFL and then, given the history making result of all three premierships last year why are we then on the podium for the very best in WAFL history?

Given the rubbish written and social media commentary that has been rife since this year's wonderful effort of back to back premierships I think it needs to be emphasised again.

Beau Wardman was appointed senior coach this year in part

because of his skill set around player development, his success at the Colts level and his focus on individual players. The Club's recruitment strategy has been minimal in the last two years with only five players recruited and yet 15 experienced league players have exited.

The Club's directive was to develop the talent within the Club and our players, leaders and coaches have been outstanding again.

The Club sets very high standards and expectations, employs the very best people we can find who then all commit to these high standards and cultural norms. Coaches demand high standards in preparation and training and drive each other to set a professional environment with only one aim – to get the very best from every player. Players in the Club must be of great character and part of the team, no excuses for individuals, all together and no cliques, they buy into the programs, support the leadership and more than anything else simply work harder for longer than anyone else.

Many external people continually disrespect the achievements of this Club, the WAFC have implemented penalties on the premiership winning team for being "dominant" in a competition where we have salary cap and list points totals, emphasis on playing local and WA players and we spend a very similar amount in our football budget as do the majority of our opposition.

We must all wear that constant negativity and criticism from people without a clue as a badge of honour, and be proud of our Club and its achievements.

SFC OPERATIONS

People are what really defines a Club's culture and we are very fortunate to have a great team that includes Debbie King. Deb continues to set a standard for our administrative group that includes Teigan Freeman and they provide a wonderful public face to our members, visitors and supporters.

Mack Sheppard has stepped up to replace Kevan Sparks and Mack's hospitality team includes long time staff in Paul and Suzie and they continue to welcome our members to the Club.

Zac Acott joined the Club as our Corporate Partnerships and Business Development Manager mid-season and he has already made a difference. Zac has announced new partnerships and taken our communications and social media strategy to the next level.

Well done to the Subiaco District team, particularly Matt Debarro along with Andrew Ridley who continue to have positive and engaging relationships with all the staff and continue to be the face of football participation in Subiaco football district.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- Life Members Function to induct Tanya Ferguson and Blake Broadhurst
- Leederville Oval hosted 2nd Semi Finals for both league and reserves games.
- The 2nd Grand Finals at Optus Stadium featuring Subiaco again!.

KEY CLUB STRATEGY

Our days at Subiaco Oval are now history and replacing that income will take a lot of hard work by us all and support from our current and new members, sponsors and supporters. The Club has identified a number of strategies and continues to move to a new business model but until that can be achieved we will continue to have sustainable losses such as the one this year and last.

Closing the gap between our revenue and expenses means meeting revenue targets especially in the hospitality bars and social Clubs, there was some with growth in our BD sales and sponsorship and great news that Holman Industries and Wally Edwards are now our principal partner.

In addition, we have been excited to welcome the North Perth Community Bank and Chair Nick Catania as our major community naming rights partner for 2020 and beyond.

The WAFL is facing a very tough time now and into the next few years, this Club is no different.

We must all now be aware of the significant challenge we face financially, the financial result this year again emphasises the need to address all the following key issues during next year and beyond;

- Leederville Oval Master Plan with EP and the City of Vincent
- SFC Strategic Plan incorporating a strong community engagement activation.
- A "One Club" model for the Subiaco mens and women's teams.
- Sustainable model for SFC and the WAFL what the vision for WAFL football?
- Subi Forever projects that will help us to a sustainable future.
- Greater level of support for donations via the Australian Sports Grants platform
- Ongoing support for the AFL hospitality opportunities we have developed at AFL games.



FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

Football is addressed more completely elsewhere in this report but I would like to acknowledge Beau Wardman and Michael Farmer as the team that drives our football programs. Both have been part of the succession plan to replace outgoing staff and they have both been outstanding this season.

The core of our Club is the football operations staff, coaches and players that continue to set high goals, to work together and never take things for granted. Our list management was critical given our Club direction to develop our players promoted from Colts and Reserves emerging talent. The key platform to our list for a number of years has been identifying players undervalued and not getting regular league games and that continued again this season.

TALENT & DEVELOPMENT PATHWAY

With the promotion of Beau Wardman and Michael Farmer we looked firstly within the Club and Chayce Creedy was duly appointed Colts coach. Kristian Dicton was successful through the interview process and was then appointed the Talent Manager. It was a slow start and after some soul searching and tinkering with the program these leaders showed they have a bright future after a strong back half of the season and player improvement to provide another crop of graduates at the completion of their first season.

They have been well supported by many aspiring coaches and support staff that provide the teams in the pathway with a great learning experience during their time at the Club in addition to development of their football.

SPONSORS

It was exciting to announce Holman Industries as our major partner and to also see Managing Director Wally Edwards as a regular at home games.

In addition, we welcome in 2020 and beyond the North Perth Community Bank and Chair Nick Catania as our major community naming rights partner.

Stadium naming rights continue to be unfilled for the 3rd straight season. The City of Vincent continue to seek a naming right sponsor that is shared with the Clubs based here at Leederville.

Our major support sponsors are vital to the Club, thanks to Phoenix Holden, SKG Radiology, ISC, AE Hoskins and Sons and CUB for your support.

MARKETING COMMUNICATION WITH MEMBERS, SPONSORS AND SUPPORTERS

As expected, the 2019 year was a challenging one from an economic perspective as the Club seeks to transition to a sustainable financial model following cessation of our commercial operations at Subiaco Oval. 

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT



Back to Back! Subiaco clinched WAFL Premiership number 15 in 2019 in another successful year. With so much change this year with key personnel, one constant remained the same for the Lion's and that was their unwavering approach to success.

Jarrad Schofield departed the Senior Coaching role after six years and three premierships while Football Manager Daniel Vidovich also said goodbye to the Club after bringing them three

premierships in 2018 in what was the Club's most successful campaign. Beau Wardman, who took the Subiaco Colt's to their first premiership in 29 years, was given the task of coaching the Senior side and Kyal Horsley stepped down from the captaincy with Leigh Kitchin taking over the role. While last years undefeated season can never be topped, the League lost one game in the regular season to South Fremantle in Round 6 before winning 12 straight games and bringing home the premiership cup to Leederville.

Seven players made their debut for the league side, which included two players from the 2018 Colts premiership side, eight players represented the WAFL in the State game with Kyal Horsley named captain and Josh Deluca winning the Simpson Medal for Best on Ground in their loss to South Australia. Subiaco also had three players in the 18's State squad, three in the State 16's which included Blake Morris winning the MVP for the Carnival. Lachlan Delahunty was awarded the 2019 Sandover Medal, Ben Sokol won the Bernie Naylor Medal, Beau Wardman won WAFL Coach of the Year and Subiaco were winners of the Rodriguez Shield for the third year in a row.

Kyal Horsley won back-to-back Outridge Medals and the fourth of his career and finished runner up again in the Sandover Medal. Lachlan Delahunty was runner up in the Outridge and Jordan Lockyer finished third. Liam Hickmott won the Blakemore Medal for the Fairest and Best in the reserves and added that to his collection of Taylor and Jack Clarke medals.

The Club farewelled Subiaco Legend, Chris Phelan who departed for Victoria after 168 games and two Outridge Medals. Zac Clarke was rewarded for his outstanding year in 2018 by being drafted to Essendon and Luke Foley was drafted out of the Colts to West Coast. Recruiting in 2019 wasn't as active as in previous years but the addition of former Sydney Swans player Harry Marsh provided a boost across an already strong defensive unit. Simon Moore returned back to the Club also after a two year break.



The transition program continues to yield success with 12 players representing the Club this year that were a part of the Colts program in 2018. The ability for these players to seamlessly transition into our senior program is due to the number of Colts aged players that train and are exposed to the standards of our senior squad throughout the season.

COACHING

With a major change in the Senior Coaching role, the key was to retain the quality of our coaches in 2019. Steve Wasley departed the Club as the midfield coach and was replaced by 2014 Simpson Medallist and Subiaco favourite Jason Bristow. Paul Vines returned to assist the midfield and the developing coaches, while Ryan Redfern and Nigel Hamilton rounded out the League Coaching unit.

Matt Cavedon continued on as Reserves coach in his second year and was again ably supported by Robbie Forrest, Martine Pearman and Matt Scully. A big thank you to all of our coaches for your hard work, dedication and commitment to our program. Your involvement, knowledge and experience ensures our players get the best development in the WAFL system.

A special thank you to Kellie Properjohn who was the recipient of our 2019 Presidents award for her ongoing involvement with our emerging leaders program with Kyal Horsley. You give so much time to the Club, our players and coaches and we are extremely appreciative of that.

To Beau, your first year delivered a premiership to the Club and it is a just reward for the hard work, long hours and care you put into the role. You have seamlessly slotted into the senior role after working with our Colts for the past two years and delivered a quality program that will no doubt be successful for years to come. LIFE MEMBERS' REPORT



Two-time premiership player Blake Broadhurst and long-time head trainer Tanya Ferguson were announced at the 2019 AGM on Wednesday 12 December, as the newest

additions to the exclusive life membership group.

A hard working and accurate goal kicking forward, Broadhurst played 142 games with Subiaco between 2004 and 2012, finishing his career with 319 goals, the seventh most in history of any Subiaco player.

Broadhurst notably played in four straight premierships for Subiaco, as he was part of the league premierships of 2006 and 2008 as well as the reserves premierships of 2005 and 2007

On top of his goal kicking and premiership achievements Broadhurst is one of only two Subiaco players, 2018 Game Ball Legend Brian Taylor being the other one, to win fairest and best awards with the colts, reserves and league.

Broadhurst was the Taylor Medal winner in 2003, Blakemore Medal winner in 2004 before taking out the Outridge Medal in 2010.

That 2010 season began a three season run where Broadhurst was the main focal point of the Subiaco side kicking 161 goals between 2010 and 2012.

He claimed three straight Austin Robertson Jnr club goal kicking crowns, plus in 2011 was the Bernie Naylor Medallist as the leading goal kicker for the entire WAFL competition, with Broadhurst also representing WA in 2008.

This long list of achievements is unsurpassed by any of the recent greats of the Subiaco Football Club, with Broadhurst one of the unheralded greats of Subiaco's golden era.

Ferguson meanwhile joins a select group as female members to earn Subiaco Life Membership.

She has been a mainstay of the Subiaco Football Club training team, with 13 years of head training experience at the club.

Ferguson was head trainer of the colts between 2006 and 2007 before becoming the head trainer of the senior squad in 2008, a role that she has held through to 2018.

Her strong work ethic, ability to build strong relationships with both the playing group and training staff, has meant that Ferguson has been an important and instrumental figure over a decade of success for the club.

Consistently going beyond her role, Ferguson has been a regular feature at Subiaco training sessions and games for the past 15 years, playing a key role in keeping Subiaco players fit and able to play to their best abilities.

The Subiaco Football Club congratulates both Blake and Tanya on this very deserving honour.



EQUALISATION AND THE WAFC ATTACK ON SUBIACO FOOTBALL CLUB

In an historic ruling that was in direct response to our back to back premierships, the WA Football Commission announced "equalization measures will now be implemented with the clear intent of closing the gap" and "this includes some rules specific to Subiaco Football Club in response to their dominance over the last decade."

This decision is without precedent and Mark Lawrence said it was an "unbelievable, disrespectful and unforgivable" response to our great premiership success. The WAFC leadership "drove the social media commentary that has been so damaging to this club and our people and of course deeply damaging to the reputation of the WAFL competition"

Given the nature of the WAFC decision to impose restrictions on the best team in the WAFL for no other reason than we are dominating the WAFL, its important this is documented in our history as part of this annual report. This following was posted on our website on 16th October 2019.

SFC RESPONSE TO THE WAFC WAFL COMPETITIVE BALANCE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 2020.

Firstly, to penalise the premiership winning team for being "dominant" in a competition where only six years ago we finished 8th! And we have met all the rules that includes points limits and salary caps and we spend a similar amount in our football department as most of our opposition is simply a very poor reflection on the WAFL and its other teams.

We are told the industry stakeholders demanded something be done and that included nearly all the other WAFL Clubs. Extremely disappointing!

In initial discussions with the WAFC about equalizing and penalizing SFC, we suggested they look at the rest of the competition and had they requested reasons why South Fremantle, Claremont and West Perth (these finals teams in particular) did not use their available points to be more competitive? They could each have recruited at least 3 x 10 point players each and that would have made a difference and that each need to be accountable for those decisions.

Was it to do with TPP salary cap pressure concerns about overspending stopping them recruiting or alternatively pressure from their Clubs to spend less and save money in this area or simply an inability to attract recruits? Or some other reason? We think this is still an important unanswered issue.

THE SFC Football Operations group have the following club feedback but emphasize that any penalty on the premier club is strongly opposed.



PROPOSAL TO REDUCE CLUBS TO A BASE OF 100 POINTS

- Takes higher value players out of the WAFL competition and will weaken the WAFL.
- Will make AFL /aligned clubs stronger in comparison.
- Competing clubs that agree to a SFC penalty must be held to account about their points use and salary cap spend – maybe that's the problem!

MORE EMPHASIS ON "LOCAL DISTRICT PLAYERS

- Zones are clearly very unequal and a focus on that cannot be introduced before that is sorted out and bedded in.
- Non-district players are still WA footballers and that needs to be recognized. Players move for all sorts of reasons opportunity, recognition, not valued, looking for a new start etc.
- Having a list of nearly all WA produced players should be positively recognized as should the voluntary ongoing points reductions and interstate recruitment by clubs.
- WAFL Clubs do not control the talent pathway and have little say in its effectiveness or focus on future WAFL players and will strongly impact the quality of "local district players".
- WAFL Clubs can only negotiate their district priorities with the WAFC – a strong focus on youth football has not always been shared!

PENALTY ON SFC FOR WINNING 2019 GRAND FINAL

- Pathetic for a competition to be even discussing reflection on all involved
- 100 points will just cover the current list of players at the end of 2019
- We expect 10 to 15 players to leave the senior program before 2020 and must be replaced. The ability to recruit 1 point players to at least fill these gaps is essential to fill the list and field a reserves team. This is not about the quality of the list.
- Like for Like this is very important if a Ben Sokol or other quality regular league player does not play next year.
- We clearly think that if the competition minimum points total is 100, we should be able to fill that number of points as necessary.
- Our current list strategy is to develop our players and only fill when players exit the club and a need is obvious - see comments about List Maintenance below.
- What clubs support a penalty on Subiaco we would request an understanding of which of our peers supported that – open and accountable.



NO RECRUITING AND FUTURE IMPACT

- If this is even considered it will severely impact our club for years to come. Think what happens to clubs who do not or cannot at least maintain somewhere near the quality of their list WHEN everyone else is improving theirs.
- Finalists South Fremantle, Claremont, West Perth have all got points to recruit quality players even if the base 100 points is introduced. Their lists will improve, and so they should be aiming to do that.
- If SFC cannot at least recruit one-point players and like for like then a list disaster is in the making.
- Our local zone very clearly has the lowest number of players of all clubs and this was very clearly emphasized in the 2019 Boundary Review.

LIST MAINTENANCE

- SFC's recruitment of league quality non— district players in the last two years particularly has been minimal (five players) compared to key losses of regular league players (15) in fact we know recruitment has been in decline as we chose to develop our own players—a club directive and key reason for the appointment of Beau Wardman.
- Season 2019 IN (1) Harry Marsh OUT (9) Zac Clarke, Chris Phelan, Josh Deluca, Jack Mayo, Adam Cockie, Brad Stevenson, Ethan Burnett, Daniel Perkins, Chris Bryan (all league players)
- Season 2018- IN (4) Ben Newton, Zac Clarke, Drew Rhode, Kaiden Fullgrabe OUT (6) Wayde Twomey, Liam Ryan, Corey Adamson, Scott Hancock, Declan Jackson, Liam Baker,
- Based on this other clubs can hardly complain about SFC recruitment!!

COMPETITION INTEGRITY

- The very unfortunate quote from your CEO followed by a poor effort by the WAFC hierarchy to defend the integrity of the competition that encouraged and fostered ill-informed comment to continue and further damage the WAFL.
- The immediate focus on dragging SFC down has been damaging!
- Defending the integrity of the WAFL and ensuring the industry/stakeholders understands the measures that the ruling body has in place to ensure all that is vital to a highly valued competition. Too many WAFC and stakeholders have ill-informed views and that has been allowed to continue in the media / social media.
- The negative damaging comments played out in the media/ social media do little to promote the WAFL – in fact the opposite.

CLANCY WHEELER

Clancy Wheeler played his 150th game against the Perth Demons at Leederville Oval on Saturday 8 June at 2:10pm. The game will mark a special achievement for the versatile Esperance product known affectionally as Clanger as he will receive Life Membership from the Subiaco Football Club.

Wheeler, a product of the Newtown Condingup Football Club, initially moved to Perth from Esperance to play cricket with Gosnells at the end of 2010 while training once a week in pre-season due to his cricket commitments. After playing the first seven games in the Reserves he would make his League debut for the Lions in round 11 and is fitting that it is against the opponents for this week in Perth. His four goals on debut were not enough to get his side over the line that day but proved to be a great indication of the career that would follow.

Wheeler describes the Life Membership as "an absolute honour to receive from the Subiaco Football Club. It will hold a special place in my heart and something that I will cherish forever". The three-time Premiership Lion is proud of all three Premiership victories but holds the 2014 Grand Final victory over a strong East Perth as his most cherished. "2014 would be my career highlight. We came into the game as strong underdogs in really wet conditions and prevailed against a quality opponent".

On an individual level, a game in 2011 sticks out in Wheeler's mind. It was Round 11 vs South Fremantle in a regional game in Esperance. With the game close in the last quarter, Wheeler calmly kicked a goal to seal victory in front of his home crowd of family and friends. It was there in that moment that the self-proclaimed Mayor of Esperance was born.

Subiaco would like to thank Clancy Wheeler for his services at Subiaco since debuting Round 11 against Perth in 2011. Wheeler has decided to hang up the boots after winning his fourth WAFL Premiership this year.

Throughout Wheeler's career he has played a total of 154 WAFL league games, averaging 14 disposals, four marks and two tackles while kicking a total of 109 goals in his career.

200 OF THE BEST - KYAL HORSLEY

Subiaco's Kyal Horsley celebrated his 200th game against East Perth in the last home-and-away game of the 2019 Optus WAFL Premiership Season. Kyal is the 15th Subiaco league player to hit the 200thWAFL game milestone in the Club's history. Horsley was an outstanding sportsman in his youth in cricket, hockey and football. Horsley made his senior debut for the Kalgoorlie City Football Club when he was 16.

Horsley first debuted for Subiaco in round 16 of the 2007 season against East Fremantle. In his first game for the Club he was able to hit the scoreboard with two goals and finished with 21 disposals.

In 2008, Kyal played 21 league games including the WAFL Grand Final, represented Western Australia against Queensland, and was awarded the Football Budget: Best First Year Player.

The 31-year old who came across from Kalgoorlie City Football Club has had an outstanding career with Subiaco FC, winning three Outridge Medal's for Subiaco's fairest & best in 2011,2014,2018. Horsley also finished second in the Sandover Medal for WAFL Fairest and Best in 2011, 2018 and 2019 and third in 2017.

Kyal Horsley was drafted to the Gold Coast Suns #2 (Rookie Draft) in 2012 and was elevated from the Gold Coast Rookie List the same year. Kyal was awarded "Most Professional" and "Iron Man" Award at the Suns best and fairest in his first year at the club where he played 13 games.

In Kyal's second season he only managed to play one AFL game due to rupturing his ACL which saw him return to Perth at the end of the 2013 season. Kyal then returned to Subiaco in 2014 and named captain, playing 19 league games including the WAFL Grand Final.

Horsley has had an influential impact on the Club across the past 12 years, bringing a new standard of professionalism and team culture; setting the benchmark for future years. In these years, he was able to show both his strong leadership styles and passion for football which lead him being a part of winning five WAFL grand finals.



COLTS COACH REPORT



Season 2019 was always going to be an interesting one after having won the Colts premiership in 2018. As happens at Colts level most of the premiership team moved on to senior football both at Subiaco and amateur level. Along with those players a big part of the squad that had provided much needed depth and pressure also transitioned away, then add into the mix a new head coach, a new talent manager and a couple of new line coaches as well and we had a job in front of us.

The focus for 2019 that this was now the story for the current players to write and that past deeds although nice didn't mean much for us moving forward. We didn't quite get that right early in the season and the pillars of Subiaco and their successful culture and competitiveness all of the time took a little while to shine through, this wasn't to say they were never there but we struggled as a group to find the consistency needed to be successful

We started training in November with nearly 100 players trying out for a place in the main squad which was a challenge but eventually we were able to whittle down the numbers to what we thought was going to be the best squad to move us forward. We had a good pre-season based on skill fundamentals and getting the basic right. Our first practice match against East Perth showed that we had a way to go and by round 5 when we were last on the ladder and having suffered some reasonable losses, we still had a way to go. It was after a big loss against Swan Districts and a bye that we were able to take stock and see where we were at. Through the guidance of my coaching mentor Tony Micale we were able to strip back our program and look at the core things we believed in and focus on them and what we wanted to stand for. I would like to thank Tony for his guidance and counsel over the season it certainly is a privilege to be able to have the ear of a seasoned professional such as him.

With a renewed focus and the boys seemingly buying in we faced South Fremantle in Round 6. The first part of the season our best football was good enough, but we just couldn't sustain it long enough and teams took advantage. The game against South Fremantle was our first four-quarter effort and the result followed, and we were able to celebrate our first win which was great achievement for the whole group. From here on we were much more competitive and while it didn't always lead to wins, we certainly felt more in control of our football and what we were trying to achieve. The improvement was there, and the players were working hard. We would end the season with an 8-8 record and miss out on finals by percentage. So, from staring down the barrel at 0-5 to finish where we did gives us hope for the future and that we are on the right path.

We set ourselves a goal to beat a team above us on the ladder with three rounds to go and our first opportunity to do that was in Kalgoorlie where we travelled to showcase our talent pathway in one of our regional zones. We invited five local players to play for the first time for Subiaco and in front of a great crowd and with these new faces in the team we were able to have a great win against Swan Districts. This was our moment of the season and to see each of the local Kalgoorlie players not only play but have a solid impact throughout and

then be backed up and embraced by the rest of the playing squad was a real thrill and very satisfying. We were able to replicate that winning feeling with last gasp wins against West and East Perth in the final two games of the season. So, having beaten three teams who would go on to play finals was a satisfying end to the season but did probe the "what if" question had we made it? But our early season lapses cost us, and it wasn't to be.

Across 2019, 52 players represented Subiaco in the colt's competition of which 35 were new players and 14 debuted having originated from our regional zones, a great achievement. As always, we had players involved in state programs so well done to 16's - Richard Farmer, Jayden Crane, Campbell Henderson, Matthew Johnson and Blake Morris who went on to win the MVP for the carnival. In the State 18's we had - Tristan Hobley, Mitch Georgiades and Nicholas Martin who were all a part of the squad that went on to win the Championship. We were represented in the WAFL Colts team of the year through Ben Golding and Abraham Clinch. It was a particularly good year for Ben Golding who as well as team of the year honours was also runner up in the Jack Clarke Medal, Winning the WAFL Past Players Coaches Award and capped off by winning the Taylor Medal for 2019. A great year and a great achievement by a terrific young man. Well done and congratulations must also go to all our other award winners across season 2019 both weekly and those awarded at the end of the year.







With over 7000 community club participants and many more engaged through school and community programs, the hard work put in by our clubs, volunteers, WAFL club and District in a collaborative effort, overcame the challenges faced to ensure the Subiaco District remained leaders in football administration and development across the state.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE:

- Sorrento Duncraig JFC President John Sobolewski named WA Optus Volunteer of the Year.
- Carine JFC winning the Most Improved Club award at the WA Industry awards; also receiving a special mention in the Marketing award category.
- 100% of district coaches accredited in 2019
- Delivery of the new Auskick model across 100% of junior clubs
- Record number of participants at the NAB AFL Auskick Gala Day hosted by Sorrento Duncraig JFC.
- A Completed Female Football pathway, starting with strong growth in Auskick, along with exponential growth in the Junior and Youth age competitions with strong representation across Subiaco District clubs. The Subiaco FC Women's Rogers Cup side played finals football for the first time and the league side were crowned minor premiers finishing top in the Inaugural season of WAFLW.
- Successful delivery of the Female Development Squad Program with strong representation from Subiaco District players, who were also selected for the State Academy Program.


