League Coach's Report

Development Coach's Report



Michael Saunders, Development Coach

The senior coaching group had concerns with our player depth going into the 2013 season due to a high turnover of experienced players from the club in the off-season. These concerns were confirmed with some lack lustre performances by our development group in the pre-season and in our first round loss to Peel Thunder. The new AFL alignment structure presented

itself for all to see with some very experienced league footballers playing in the Peel reserves, the tables would be turned later in the season for Peel however.

The second round bye could not have come at better time for our development group. As the coach I realised that in order for this team to be competitive and in-turn create the best environment for every player to develop to their full potential, we needed to focus on the following key areas:

- Game style it must mirror the league side
- Game day tactics mirror the league side to expose the opposition
- Two way running focus on being a strong defensive team that runs both ways
- Redleg Indicators reward individuals performing well in this critical area
- Team first mentality play the game the right way

From this point on we turned our season around starting with a win in round three against South Fremantle. The same group from two weeks earlier played with a higher level of intensity and carried out the game plan allowing us to control the game. This win started a six game winning streak that gave us all confidence and setup our season.

The development group this year consisted of a mix of players:

- 7 players were 1st year out of colts
- 5 players were 2nd and 3rd year out of colts
- 8 players returning from the 2012 development squad
- 12 players were new recruits to the club

One key objective as the coach of our development group was to run a program that closely mirrored the league side, from the Monday night reviews and weekly feedback, to the pre-game meetings and Sunday recovery sessions. This provided continuity in training, education and development, ensuring when players were promoted into the league side their focus was on playing at their best in a program that was familiar to them. We feel this approach paid dividends again this year, some highlights from the season were:

- We played finals football
- We were the minor premiers with 13 wins and 7 losses
- Four players who started with the development group made their league debut
- There was continual improvement through open and honest feedback

We saw a transformation in many individuals throughout the season, none more than our youngest players stepping up from the colts, Kieran Hug, Joel Kalajzic, Aaron Dow, Daniel Arangio and Chad Sandilands, all of which played an integral role in our finals campaign.

There were some new players to the club who made their mark, Kristian Egan, David Johnston, Ryan Gray and Jason Currie embraced the club values on and off the field and became part of the core group that carried us throughout the 2013 season. Taking part in our 3rd successive finals campaign was a great result for our group, our philosophy on selection was the same as the regular season, our mandate was on player development and backing-in the players who got us there.

Second Semi Final v South Fremantle

Going into our first finals game after finishing top of the ladder was a challenge for our young group, I could feel the nerves at training. Our round 24 performance again South Fremantle didn't help our cause, our injury depleted squad lost by our biggest margin for the season, 91 points.

We started slowly and looked tentative in the first quarter, South Fremantle were harder in the contest and spread quickly to counter attack from our turn overs. Our second quarter was much better, we seemed to settle into the game and got more aggressive around the contest allowing us to claw our way back into the game trailing by just 11 points at half time.

The third quarter was like our first, south were stronger in the contest and opened up a handy 26 point lead by three quarter time. In the last quarter we threw caution to the wind and played on at all costs, we showed great spirit to almost win the game, we eventually lost by five points.

Preliminary Final v West Perth

In the lead up we trained really well, we were sharp with our skills and the voice and enthusiasm on the track was at a season high. Senior players Jarrad Irons and Kane Ransted took it upon themselves to lead the way, the rest of the group lifted and followed suit, making it the best week on the track we had all year. We started the game well, kicking the first two goals for the game. We were strong in the contest and attacked the ball and the opposition with ferocity. However our skills let us down and we didn't capitalise on the score board, we came in at quarter time with just a two point lead.

At half time we found ourselves 21 points down and with only four fit players left on the interchange. Tyler Chrimes had suffered a broken nose in the first contest of the game and later strained his calf when bravely going back onto the field. Hats off to Tyler for his courage.

Our third quarter was outstanding, we kicked five goals straight to be eight points down at three quarter time. This effort appeared to empty the tank, as we unfortunately ran out of steam in the last quarter, eventually losing the game by 42 points.

In the aftermath of going out in straight sets, we discussed the game in front of family and friends. I felt it was important to dissect the game and talk about why we lost the game before we discussed the season in retrospect. I explained that fundamental skill and decision making errors cost us in the end.

In summary, we have a lot to be proud of, our development group exceeded expectations this year but as a club our next pre-season is our most important. Let's give it everything and look to improve in Season 2014.

In conclusion I thank my assistant coaches, the medical staff and other volunteers who supported the team throughout the year. Also the players and I appreciated the many members and supporters who attended games, particularly during the finals. Thank you also to the Perth Football Club for the opportunity to coach this group of outstanding young men.





Wayne Langborne, Colts Coach

Having come off a very strong 2012 Season which included playing finals the major benefit of the 2013 Season would be the numbers of young men we exposed to colts football.

With around 30 odd boys having been in the 2012 squad and already having at least 12 months in

the system we had a huge advantage in comparison to previous years.

The preseason was extremely solid under new Strength & Conditioning Manager Sam Mainwaring with the emphasis on short and long distance running, cross fitness training, core strength and flexibility during the structured four sessions per week program.

This coupled with a focus on competitive drills where the coaches could fast track the quality player identification process enabled us to select a final squad of 47 players from an original training number in excess of 100.

Contrary to the previous couple of seasons we won our first game of the year but then proceeded to lose 4 out of our next 5 games.

Similar to 2012 we were confident that the boys that were playing just needed time to gel together and get used to the very high colts standard and thankfully this is what happened with them winning the next eleven games in a row to firmly entrench themselves in the top four.

We finished the season off with two very narrow losses against the eventual grand finalists even though we played exceptional football.

Unfortunately we were very disappointing in our first semi final loss but the boys can certainly walk away from the 2013 Season in the knowledge that they were very competitive and have continued developing in their football journey.

Along with achieving our goal of playing finals there were numerous positives to the 2013 Season which included:

- A total of 45 boys represented the PFC Colts in 2013
- 18 of these boys are eligible to play in 2014
- 1 state representative in Clem Smith who went on to be awarded the WA Player of the Series.
- Brent Edmonds winning the Colts Coaches Award and along with Clem Smith and Alex Moreno being named in the Colts Team of the Year.

Assistant Coaches Barry Stanton, Glenn Davies and Chris Bolton along with Rucks Coach Terry Gabriel were all outstanding in their commitment to the boys and the knowledge they were passing on.

Team Manager Steve Ransted was a tireless worker and his guidance was particularly appreciated as was property guru Uncle Arthur's timely Saturday morning cups of tea which I couldn't have done without. Strength & Conditioning Coach Sam Mainwaring brought a new level of professionalism to the role and I know the boys certainly appreciated his expertise.

Physio Nick Kane along with all the other trainers were outstanding in their care for the boys and it was great to have experienced football heads in Scott Stanton and Kevin McArthur as our primary runners throughout the season.

Board men in Andy Roberts and Andy Myers rounded of a very professional off field outfit.

League Coach Damien McMahon was always available to bounce ideas off and was a constant source of support and Colts Football Manager Peter Brear was fantastic in his Pathway Development Management role.

I'd also like to thank Christina's Restaurant for the Thursday night player's teas along with all the other sponsors for their support. On top of this Gavin Caudle from Provident Capital Partners and the PP&OA made cash donations to enable the squad to enjoy team building opportunities throughout the season.

A huge thanks to the parents who have supported the boys not only this year but throughout their football journey. I'm truly astounded at the distances the country based boys and their parents have to travel each week and I'd like to thank all the parents who gave tremendous support to myself and the program we were running.

Finally I'd like to thank my wife Dawn who along with Connie Anile made the players after game meals at every home fixture.

In closing I'd like to very much thank the Perth Football Club for supporting me after a very tough 2011 season. At the end of last season I said we'd reap the benefits of blooding so many talented players and I'm proud to say that given the results in 2013 this is exactly what happened.

Once again the future of our Colts program is very positive and with the success this current batch of boys have experienced this season I'm confident the winning culture will flow on as they progress through the ranks to senior football at the Perth Football Club.

The 2013 season saw the Demons District and our country region, the Midlands provide over 88 per cent of the playing group to the Perth Football Club. This is only the tip of the iceberg with large numbers of players, umpires and coaches developing their skills in Auskick through to Women's and Masters Football in our

District.

The Demons District Football Development Council (DDFDC) dynamically develops football across the Demons region.

The West Coast Eagles relocation to Lathlain with the Perth Football Club will further enhance the opportunities for the players in our District as the joint work of these clubs evolves.

In 2013 the Demons DFDC in conjunction with the Demons Junior Competition Council, Perth Football Club, the WAAFL, Demons Umpires Association, District schools and the Western Australian Football Commission continue to support game development at all levels.

The number of playing participants in 2013 was 12,125, an increase of 9.8 per cent on 2012.

Auskick, modified rules and youth player participation remained stable however, growing the game in modified and youth is a challenge. Significant involvement in school based programs saw 4,675 students participate in football through the support of the Demons District. This area too can grow and is a key target for the District staff.

Our thanks go to the District Manager Scott Faulkner for the strategic leadership of these programs and to District Trainee Ash Fitzgerald and the team of clinic coordinators who deliver quality programs and competitions to our District schools. Scott is managing the District by developing innovative programs like the acclaimed Evolve Friday night football program. The District team has a new District Officer, Bruce Fraser of whom we are expecting a great deal of input through his professional and football experience.

Volunteers are the heart and soul of a successful District. The Presidents at junior and community and WAFL level, their committees, coaches and support teams from each club deserve thanks and admiration for the efforts they put into leading their clubs and supporting players to enjoy our great game. Thank you to all Presidents and congratulations to the volunteers in the Demons DFDC.

The District has focussed on coach development and the expansion of the School Ambassadors program in the District. The number of coaches with level 1 and 2 coaching qualifications has grown. Junior clubs have been supported by the District coaching coordinator Bruce Fraser and his team to provide well planned training programs, skill development and coaching tactics. The AFL School Ambassadors program has had mixed success in 2013 and I look forward to renewed outcomes from this program. Successful



Country Football Reports

Ian Thomas, North Midlands Football League President

As in 2012, this year saw all six Clubs competing at League level and Nippers but with only four Clubs (Mingenew; Morawa; Dongara and Carnamah/Perenjori) fielding Reserves teams. Coorow/Latham with the help of four or five young players residing in Perth was able to keep a competitive League side playing. Three Springs fielded a League side of very young players who were realistically out of their depth. Carnamah/Perenjori has for several years struggled to field a Reserves side. Morawa is always capable of fielding two senior sides due to having an Agricultural College within the town. Mingenew has been able to field two senior sides due to smart canvassing of disgruntled players from Geraldton, which make their numbers strong. Dongara, which has a population equalling the remainder of the League combined, generally fields two senior teams easily.

The Mingenew Football Club became the first Club in the NMFL to win Premierships in all grades. The Captain of the Mingenew Football Club, James Dempster became the 3rd Player within the Leagues History to take out the "clean sweep" in 2013 by becoming the Hal Hunt Medallist (NMFL Best & Fairest), the Len Angel Medallist (Best & Fairest Grand Final) and Michael Kerr Medallist (Club Best & Fairest) plus Premiership Captain. The 2013 Grand Final was held at the Goomalling Football Oval with approx 1200 adults plus children. The 4 finals shared between Wongan Hills and Goomalling attracted over 3400 adults.
