
The colts' season ended with a two-point loss with Mitch Dzelebdzic kicking three goals and Jake Florenca finishing with 28 possessions and two goals.

And it was the Bulldogs who dominated from the outset kicking the only six goals of the first quarter and then they were never really challenged the rest of the afternoon cruising to the 14.17 (101) to 7.12 (54) victory.

The biggest concern ahead of the game for coach Tony Walters was how to fit 30-plus available players into his final 23, and those unlucky to miss out on selection included Bailey Matera, Brad McPhail, Kaiden Matera, Matthew Gundry, Noah Strom, Steve Mills, Jakeb Tartaglia and Dom Warrell.

John Sgherza was a dominant presence in the forward-line for South Fremantle and all 12 of his kicks for the game turned out to be scores. Six of them ended up as goals, the other six were behind as Subiaco had no answers for him.

KATANNING SIXCOUNTRY TOWN WELL REPRESENTED AT BULLDOGS

he Shire of Katanning might only have a population of 4000 people but the town almost 300km south-east of Perth continues to have a massive impact on South Fremantle.

That was highlighted in Round 23 when the Bulldogs' league team featured six players who have hailed from Katanning – Ashton Hams, Kyle Hams, Tim Stewart, Kade Stewart, James Laurino and Haiden Schloithe. It was a remarkable occasion against Peel Thunder in Mandurah.

Ashton and Kyle Hams had been playing together all season, and are two of the finest footballers to ever come from the area.

Ashton has now played 153 WAFL matches to go with 39 for West Coast in the AFL as well as winning two Simpson Medals and a Hughes Medal. Kyle has played 186 WAFL games with the pair having played in the 2005 and 2009 premierships.

Tim and Kade Stewart are two more brothers from the area who have bright futures ahead of them. They played together late in the season in the reserves and then ultimately in the premiership. Tim made his league debut in Round 23 to be alongside his brother and fellow Katanning representatives.

Laurino was another to earn his league opportunity late in the 2015 season to be there for the Round 23 game. The hard-running midfielder worked hard to get back from a knee reconstruction in 2014 and then to find his best form in 2015, culminating in the reserves premiership.

Schloithe is another proud Katanning product. Having played in a colts premiership with the Bulldogs, he was picked up by Fremantle and continues to be a key player for South Fremantle.

He won the Hughes Medal in 2014 and then was the Bulldogs' most dangerous forward for much of the second half of 2015 after returning from an ankle injury.

Schloithe reflected back on his younger days looking up to Kyle and Ashton Hams, and how much of a dream it is to play alongside them.

"We're all from Katanning and they used to babysit me, so I have some good memories there with them," Schloithe said.

"Obviously when I was a young fella and not playing footy up in Perth, I used to come up with my old boy and watch them play on a Friday night or the weekend for South Fremantle.

"I've always had that dream to come up and play for South Fremantle as well. When Kyle went away for a few years, I hoped that the three of us could still come together and play in the same team and we're lucky enough this year to be able to do that and it's been a good experience."

I thought for the majority of the season it was probably our young players who were our better players. They got a bit tired towards the end, but certainly our young blokes are something for us to be excited about. We also have a few blokes who will come back from injury and another key forward would be pretty nice, but we are pretty excited about the young group we have going forward.

With some strong leaders showing the way for these young guys, I believe it is the recipe for success. Our fairest and best winner Ashton Hams, captain Ryan Cook and Adam Guglielmana who celebrated his 100th game this season are among those leaders who had strong seasons in 2015 that we will again be looking to lead the way in 2016.

We then had the next batch of leaders take the next step in their careers in 2015. Marlion Pickett settled into a new role



off half-back and ended up playing state football and having a tremendous season. Adam McIntosh became one of our most consistent players, Brock Higgins did a power of work holding down the ruck, Josh Pullman gave us a target in the forward-line and Tim Kelly again improved as a midfielder.

It was really a season that was exciting for the chances we gave to the young players as well which will only help us have success going forward. We also farewelled some great servants of the club at the end of 2015 most notably Craig White and Paul Mugambwa who are both premiership players who decided to retire. Whitey had a pretty tough year in terms of starting OK, then having a bit of a flat patch and then fighting back well to play some really good footy in the second half of the year. He leads really well and

will be missed obviously. He's a 190-game player and is really popular around the club, so he'll definitely be missed as will Gumby who is one of the most popular players at the club and it was great to see him get to captain the reserves to the premiership to end his career.

We are working really hard to keep the majority of the group together and we have a few young guys who've been waiting for opportunities who we'd like to give more chances to next year. On top of Whitey and Gumby, Kyle Hams won't play next year and Jimmy Sellar is going to move home but we think we can keep the majority together.

I can't speak highly enough of the support I received from the South Fremantle Football Club in my first season as coach. Right from the Board, to CEO Stuart Kemp, footy manager Dave Depane and my coaching team and support staff including Geoff Lewis, Brett Duffield, Arthur Maskos, Shaun Tinsley, Les Olivieri, Michelle Cowan, Paul Litherland, Mike Vegar, Michael Swan and Rachel Harris. You, and a host of others I apologise to have not named, have been outstanding helpers throughout 2015.

Overall I have enjoyed my first year here at South Fremantle, but I can't help be left with the feeling that a lot was left unreached in 2015. We are aiming for nothing short of playing finals in 2016 and the work to make that happen is already well and truly underway by us all.

HAMS CAPS OFF YEAR WITH HUGHES MEDAL

shton Hams claimed his first WJ Hughes Medal as the South Fremantle Football Club fairest and best award winner after a 2015 that included him representing Western Australia and earning life membership at the Bulldogs.

The 29-year-old dual premiership player spending the majority of the season in the midfield, averaging 29.9 possessions a game being tremendously consistent not having a game with less than 17 touches.

Along the way, he had 10 matches with 30 or more disposals and in the last 10 games of the 2015 season he was particularly outstanding averaging 33 possessions.

Hams also represented WA for a second time in the State match victory over South Australia at Lathlain Park while reaching his 150-game milestone to earn life membership of the Bulldogs.

Now he is a WJ Hughes Medal winner to go along with two Simpson Medals, two premierships and two appearances for WA along with 39 AFL matches with the West Coast Eagles.

Hams claimed the Hughes Medal for the first time with 124 votes to win ahead of captain Ryan Cook (90 votes), Marlion Pickett (88), Kyle Hams (75), Adam Guglielmana (65), Adam McIntosh (61), Tim Kelly (56), Blayne Wilson (56), Brock Higgins (53) and last year's winner Haiden Schloithe (51).

Cook finished as runner-up to continue his outstanding time with South Fremantle since arriving ahead of the 2011 season during which time he has now won two Hughes Medals, and finished runner-up on two other occasions while having now served as captain for a fourth season.

Pickett finished in third position as reward for his first full season of league football. Not only did he represent WA but became





one of the most exciting, damaging and attacking players off half-back in the competition who could now very well have an AFL future.

Kyle Hams came fourth in the Hughes Medal voting to cap a strong return to the WAFL after a year away, and his first season with South Fremantle since 2010 following a stint with Swan Districts.

Guglielmana cemented himself as one of the best small defenders in the WAFL and came fifth in fairest and best voting while McIntosh had the best season of his career as well in the back-line and finished sixth while also receiving the Culver Family Award for courage and perseverance.

Jacob Dragovich received the Shearer Family Award as the Best First Year Player while Cory Dell'Olio took out the John Gerovich Trophy as leading goalkicker after kicking 33 goals in his first season back with South Fremantle upon return from Essendon in the AFL.

Shaun Bewick was presented with the Warren Medal as the Best Clubman for 2015 having spent his season both in the league and reserves teams, and playing in his second reserves premiership in three years.

The career of Paul Mugambwa was also celebrated during the Hughes Medal night at Fremantle Oval after he captained the reserves premiership winning team to bring an end to his 143-game WAFL career at South Fremantle.

Craig White was also paid tribute to on the night after retiring following a 192-game career with the Bulldogs that included the 2005 and 2009 premiership.

COLTS REPORT NEW GROUP EMERGES AFTER SUCCESSFUL ERA

he colts season was always destined to be a rebuilding one with new coach Jason Ireland who was appointed for 2015.

His job was to build a young colts group that would see the players reach their peaks in 2016 and 2017, and that's what was achieved. Jason did a great job achieving this.

After doing an apprenticeship with 16 matches in 2014, Donaldson took on a more senior role in the colts team of 2015 and delivered accordingly with the 18-year-old not only kicking 26 goals but averaging 15 possessions a game.

Florenca finished runner-up in fairest and best voting while Jesse Mudge was named Most Consistent Player, Daniel Burke the Best First Year Player and Jamie Foster the Best Team Man.

Josh Collard received the Collard Family Encouragement Award after an impressive season by the 18-year-old which saw him play 16 games after just two as a 16-year-old in 2014.

Not only did South Fremantle's colts provide Ah Chee, Stewart, Florenca and Mirco to the WA State 18s squad during 2015, but Donaldson and Florenca were also recognised while being named to the WAFL Colts Team of the Year.

South Fremantle will take on a restructure of its colts and development programs in 2015 with Mark Foster appointed to the newly created position as Academy Head Coach.

That sees him take over not only as colts coach in 2016 but also being in charge of all the coaches in the South Fremantle development programs. We look forward to seeing what Foster and his high-calibre team can produce in coming years.

ot only did the South Fremantle Football Club play for the Garlic Munchers Cup at HBF Arena on Saturday in Round 13 and celebrate the Hall of Fame induction dinner that evening, but Sunday proved a successful day for the Bulldogs strengthening ties with the club's country zone.

It turned out to be an eventful weekend for South Fremantle beginning with the clash on Saturday at Joondalup's HBF Arena which was for the annual Garlic Munchers Cup for a third successive year.

The result might not have gone South Fremantle's way, but it didn't dampen the mood

back at Fremantle Oval on Saturday night as the club hosted its second Hall of Fame induction dinner.

Almost 400 people packed out the Griff John Function Centre as eight greats of the South Fremantle Football Club were elevated to Legend status, and another 25 players were inducted into the Hall of Fame and 10 officials were inducted as well.



That was a night to remember in recognition of the South Fremantle Football Club and then on Sunday, the playing group made a successful trip to the Bulldogs' country zones.

Just looking at the Bulldogs' current senior playing group and the likes of Haiden Schloithe, Kyle and Ashton Hams, Craig White, Adam Guglielmana, Toby Bairstow, Zac Strom and Simon Panizza are all tremendous examples of the pathway from that country zone to play league football at South Fremantle.

The senior playing group of South Fremantle plus the club's directors visited four matches in the country zone on Sunday afternoon in Boddington, Narrogin, Wickepin and Katanning.

The players not only were in attendance in matches in each of those four towns, but also participated in activities with Auskick participants at half-time of those games, and presented the best player awards to the participating teams at the post-game functions.





HALL OF FAME RECOGNITION PETER BELL JOINS AUSTRALIA'S GREATS

ither side of a storied AFL career at North Melbourne and Fremantle, Peter Bell began and finished playing with South Fremantle and will always be one of the Bulldogs finest ever products.

Bell's remarkable career saw him play 335 matches in total made up 49 with South Fremantle, 123 with North Melbourne and 163 with Fremantle. He kicked 58 goals for the Bulldogs, 120 goals for the Kangaroos and 130 for the Dockers.

Along the way, he played in AFL premierships in 1996 and 1999, and a WAFL flag back with South Fremantle in 2009. He was North Melbourne best and fairest in 2000, and Fremantle's club champion three times and captain from 2002-06. He was named All-Australian in

1999 and 2003 while representing WA three times.

Bell began his WAFL career with South Fremantle in 1994 and impressed so much as a small rover that he became the first player signed by the Fremantle Dockers.

Things didn't quite work out in his first stint, but it did at North Melbourne and upon return to Fremantle, and following his remarkable AFL career, Bell finished up playing with a season in the WAFL with the Bulldogs in 2009.

Bell represented WA for a third time and captained a drought breaking victory over South Australia before then going out in style by playing a starring role in South Fremantle's grand final win over Subiaco to claim the 2009 WAFL premiership.

And now Bell joins Stephen Michael, John Todd, Steve Marsh, Peter Matera and Glen Jakovich as South Fremantle greats in the Australian Football Hall of Fame.

Bell was the adopted son of a veterinarian family in Kojonup, arriving from Korea.



Not until he moved to Perth to attend Aquinas College did football become a focus, but he was short for a footballer.

He suffered two broken legs and if his mother hadn't intervened, his injuries would never have healed properly.

But through sheer determination he made it through school football and to South Fremantle. It was only natural that he would join the Fremantle Dockers and he was the first player signed in 1994.

He played two games in 1995 and looked destined for the scrapheap until Bob Maumill convinced North Melbourne coach Denis Pagan to give Bell an opportunity.

Bell flew to Melbourne at his own expense to play an intra-club practice match. Such

was Pagan's paranoia that Bell was instructed to introduce himself as Pagan's "little cousin Ricky from Wangaratta".

But he demonstrated he could play and forged an outstanding career with North, playing in the 1996 and 1999 premierships. He had 31 disposals and four goals in 1999 grand final.

In 2001 he returned to the Dockers, as captain, and was part of that club's first finals team in 2003. He retired in 2008, by which time he was president of the AFL Players' Association.

Meanwhile, Bell's former Fremantle teammate Paul Hasleby was also inducted into the West Australian Football Hall of Fame.

Hasleby is the most recent of the inductees following a 208-game AFL career with Fremantle that included an All-Australian in 2003 and four Ross Glendinning Medals.

He won East Fremantle's fairest and best in 1999 prior to being drafted and played one season with South Fremantle in 2011 before three years as coach of the Bulldogs up until the end of 2014



CRAIG WHITE TRIBUTEDUAL PREMIERSHIP LEADER CALLS TIME

raig White has retired after an outstanding WAFL career with South Fremantle that included two premierships and him earning life membership of the Bulldogs during his 192-game career.

White committed to the Bulldogs in 2003 having moved to Perth from Williams and completing his schooling at Aquinas, and had a remarkable first three years playing in a colts premiership in 2003, reserves premiership in 2004 and then the league triumph in 2005.

There was another premiership to come in 2009 and now White has retired following a career that included two flags, life membership, being a long-time part of the leadership group and vice-captain as well as captain on occasion, and one of the most consistent and versatile players in the competition.

The 30-year-old began and finished his career as a forward, but in between was a key part of South Fremantle's outstanding defensive unit where he became one of the best players in the WAFL at setting up play out of the back-line.

White has been at South Fremantle since 2003, aside from one year away playing and coaching in Sydney in 2012, and finished with 192 games, kicked 113 goals and felt the time is right to retire at the end of 2015.

"I'm content with the decision but to take that final step was the toughest part over those last couple of weeks," White said.

"It's played on my mind for 12 months and I'm fully content in my decision. To actually tell everyone I was retiring was really tough to step away after 12 years isn't easy but I'm happy with my decision."

White did consider retiring at the end of 2014, but with the Bulldogs finishing off winning the last five games of the season, welcoming a new coach in Todd Curley while premiership teammates Kyle Hams and Cory Dell'Olio returned along with the arrival of Blayne Wilson, he was excited to play on.

Things didn't go smoothly with White spending a rare month in the reserves, but he was a strong contributor in the second half of the year in the forward-line leading hard up the ground and delivering the ball precisely inside the 50.

He was more than happy to have played on for a final season.

"We had a great summer and start to the year. It was a bit tough during the middle part of the year when my form wasn't the best but Todd was really good about it and so was the club, and I was able to work through and get back into the side," White said.



"I've enjoyed the season and the boys can only move forward from here."

White has become one of the best clubmen in the history of the Bulldogs and he's hoping that's something his younger teammates follow.

"For the last 12 or 13 years, it's been a big part of my life and it's shaped the person that I am at the moment," White said.

"I've matured from a young smart arse, into an older open-minded senior player who can put the club first and try to let the younger guys know the club comes first before yourself. If you can be a clubman, that's a major part and it's something the younger guys can really take on board."

While White's 2012 spent in Sydney as playing-coach at the Balmain

Dockers cost him 200 games for South Fremantle, it gave him tremendous personal and professional development it gave him.

"I learned how to respect the fact that coaches have hard decisions to make, and how clubs and coaches work on the decisions," he said.

"The main reason I went around this year was that I was content that if I ended up in the reserves that I would see it out and do everything to get back into the ones side.

"But if I didn't have that year as a coach, I might have played a couple of reserves games and then stepped away. It's a little disappointing not to get to 200 but I'm really content to finish on 192. I think that's still a pretty good effort."

White can't help but reflect who had a significant influence including former football manager and games record holder Marty Atkins, and premiership coach John Dimmer.

"The person who had the biggest influence on me early on was Marty Atkins. Marty took the time out to come down and see me to make sure I stayed at Souths, and I forged a great relationship with him," White said.



"The coaches I've had, obviously John Dimmer is the standout and he's been a massive part of my career. He's obviously my best coach, and I learned all my footy craft from him and all the coaching stuff that I will take on will be things that I learned from John.

"Two guys who have been unheralded are Tony Walters and Glen Davies who I have forged great relationships with over the years. Glen, especially early on, moulded me in my first couple of years and helped me become a little bit tougher than I was."

Over 11 years and 192 matches, White has had some remarkable teammates who will always go down as South Fremantle greats, and he formed some lifetime friendships with a lot of them

firstly as a youngster looking up to some veterans, and then as the older head showing the way.

"I've had some amazing teammates. Toby McGrath, David Gault, Evan Hewitt and Ryan Webb early doors were standouts, and then more recently Josh Head, Hayden North, the Hams boys, Toby Bairstow, Adam Googs, Cory Dell and all those guys I've built great relationships with, become great mates with and played in premierships with most of them," White said.

"Kris Miller is another one and I think he's the one I have played the most of my games with. Googsy, Millsy, Red and the Hams boys I'd have played around 100 games with all of them so when you play that much footy with guys, it helps you build some great relationships."

White certainly does see a future in coaching for himself down the track, but his more immediate thoughts are on enjoying his first break from football in 2016 that he's ever had, and to enjoy married life after his wedding later this year to Lucy.





STATE REPRESENTATIVES 2015BULLDOGS SHINE IN WA JUMPER

or the second straight year South Fremantle players were instrumental in Western Australia prevailing in a State match, this time five Bulldogs were part of the WAFL's 45-point win over South Australia at Lathlain Park.

Following the efforts of Ben Saunders, Haiden Schloithe, Ryan Cook and Ashton Hams helping the WAFL beat the NEAFL by 85 points in Sydney last year, South Fremantle players were instrumental in the 18.13 (121) to 11.10 (76) win.

Saunders and Schloithe were both unavailable due to injury, but Cook and Hams were back again and joined by Cory Dell'Olio playing for the Black Swans for the second time, and Marlion Pickett and Blayne Wilson making their debuts.

Dell'Olio played perhaps his best game of the season as well finishing the afternoon with 20 possessions, seven marks and three goals in an impressive performance.

Hams was again terrific in the midfield and ended up with 26 touches, five marks and a goal with Cook enjoying his fourth match for WA both on the ball and at half-forward, compiling 18 disposals to go with nine marks and a goal.

Wilson played his usual role controlling play across half-back that he was doing with the Bulldogs and finished with 23 possessions and eight marks, while Pickett did some encouraging things running out of the back-line as well.

WA got off to a flying start kicking the first three goals, but then South Australia hit back with the next five either side of quarter-time to threaten to blow the game open.

However, by half-time the Black Swans led by 14 points and that got out to a game-high 45 by the final siren.

The victory sees WA move ahead 47-46 in the overall standings in State matches between the two proud footballing states.

South Australia's only two State defeats since 2002 have both come at the hands of Western Australia firstly with WA winning by a point at Medibank Stadium in 2009, and by 45 points at Lathlain Park.

The WAFL has won three straight State matches having beaten the VFL in 2013 by 17 points, the NEAFL last year by 85 in Sydney and now over the SANFL following a 14-point loss in Adelaide to South Australia in 2012.

Ryan Davis was awarded the Simpson Medal for a stunning game off half-forward for WA with the Swan Districts premiership player finishing the afternoon with five goals to go with 25 possessions, 10 inside 50s and eight marks.

Meanwhile, Alex Cabassi and Kyle Donaldson both represented the WA State 16s from South Fremantle at the National Championships on the Gold Coast.

Callum Ah Chee, Kade Stewart, Jake Florenca and Jesse Mirco all played the WA State 18s in the National Championships as well.

outh Fremantle celebrated two significant milestones for loyal servants in 2015 with Ashton Hams earning life membership by reaching 150 games and Adam Guglielmana booking his name on the No. 2 locker with his 100th.

Hams played his 150th match in Round 19 against Subiaco earning life membership while in Round 13 at HBF Arena against West Perth, Guglielmana reached his century as he put together the most consistent season of his career.

While neither milestone was celebrated with a victory, both players deserve to be celebrated for the milestones and for their dedicated service to South Fremantle that is showing no sign of ending soon for either individual.


Tim Kelly, Jacob Martinez and Adam McIntosh all reached 50 WAFL matches during the 2015 season while Shaun Bewick (previously 30 games at West Perth) and Ben Saunders (five with Claremont) both recorded 50 appearances at South Fremantle.

Hams earned life membership by playing his 150th game as part of a career that has seen him play in the 2005 and 2009 premierships, win a grand final and State game Simpson Medal on top of his 39 AFL matches with West Coast.

Having already had one of the great careers and being one of the most decorated players in the competition, that didn't stop the 29-year-old taking his game to another level in 2015.

He averaged almost 30 possessions a game mostly as a midfielder and ended up narrowly finishing runner-up in the





Sandover Medal behind Perth's Aidan Tropiano and then winning his first WJ Hughes Medal as the Bulldogs' fairest and best winner.

Hams has now re-signed for another two years with the Bulldogs as he looks to add a third premiership to his career before riding off into the sunset.

Guglielmana had a standout 2015 season as well, which included him becoming one of the elite small defenders of the WAFL, but what he remains desperately craving is his first taste of finals football.

Guglielmana originally joined South Fremantle to play colts from Carnarvon in 2007 and after a lengthy apprenticeship behind a successful league team, and some injuries along the way, it was a long journey to the 100 games.

And it's only been in the last two seasons where he's settled into a role as a small defender after spending the majority of his career as a hard running midfielder and wingman, and half-forward.

However, as a defender he has turned himself into an elite player in the competition and did an outstanding job in 2015 both stopping some of the WAFL's best forwards.

After his journey, he was proud to reach the 100-game mark.

"It's a pretty big deal to get to 100 games. I came down from Carnarvon when I was 17 to play colts and I'm 26 now so it's taken a fair time but I'm proud to get there," Guglielmana said.

"My name will be on that locker forever so it doesn't matter what you do from here, they won't scratch it off. I'm proud of that and young people coming into the club will now see my name there.

"When I signed my first contract there was a bonus if you got to 50 games. I thought I would get there after two and-a-half years but eight years later, I'm getting to 100 so it doesn't happen easily. I had to work through some hard times but I'm pretty proud of finally getting the rewards for that now."

While Guglielmana is glad to be playing good football individually at the moment, it pales into insignificance in contrast to his desire to play finals football for the first time in his career.

He became a regular member of the team from Round 14 to 23 in 2009 but was dropped for the finals to make way for a bevy of returning experienced stars that went on to win the premiership, and then in 2011 when South Fremantle last played finals he was out with a knee injury.

The last four years has seen the Bulldogs fall short of the mark but he hopes that changes in 2016.

"I'm really desperate for some success. I've never even played in a senior final because the last time we were in the finals was 2011 and I did my knee that year, so I missed out," he said.

"In 2009, I got to play in a ressies grand final and you see blokes like Timmy Malseed, Kris Miller and Andrew Siegert in '09 play in their first grand final and you see how much they wanted it.

"You appreciate that when you see it at the time, but a few years on you get a real understanding of how they would have felt. I'm really desperate to experience something similar."

The journey to 100 games hasn't been an easy or quick one for Guglielmana and it began when he was made to earn a regular league spot by playing just 12 games in his first two seasons.

However, that taught him what it took to become a league footballer and despite the 2009 knee injury and then a hamstring injury late in 2014, he has had a reasonable run at it in recent seasons despite the variety of roles he has played.

"I started playing senior footy in 2008 and it was pretty tough to get a spot," Guglielmana said.

"John Dimmer was pretty keen on making everyone earn their spot so I didn't play in many games that year, and then in 2009 it was an unbelievable team with Peter Bell and Jeff Farmer coming back, and everyone in that team was unbelievable.

"I was lucky enough to play the back half of that year, but didn't stay in for finals. I can't complain about missing out in that unreal team though."





RETIREMENTS, DEPARTURESMUGAMBWA BIDS FAREWELL IN STYLE

aul Mugambwa's remarkable career with South Fremantle came to an end in style with the excitement machine captaining the Bulldogs' reserves premiership.

Mugambwa made his debut with the Bulldogs in 2005 and after a career full of highlights including high marks and spectacular chase down and tackles, the 2009 premiership player decided that the 2015 season would be his last.

While he didn't break back into the league side after Round 13 ending on 143 matches, he was named captain of the reserves team for the finals and led the team to the premiership giving him a farewell to remember.

Mugambwa first arrived at South Fremantle from the Bull Creek-Leeming Junior Football Club and it wasn't until he was 24 that he broke into the league side late in the premiership season of 2005.

He played from Rounds 17-20 before being forced out of the outstanding team that went on to beat Claremont in the grand final, but he was becoming a favourite of coach John Dimmer.

It was still a hard team for Mugambwa to break into the next two seasons with 18 games, but he was displaying a unique ability to tackle hard, apply enormous pressure and compete in the air for marks and ruck knocks.

It was in 2008 when he became a permanent part of the South Fremantle league side playing 16 games and then played 20 in 2009 for 27 goals as he became a crucial member of the forward-line in the premiership team.

Mugambwa became one of the best stories of the premiership winning side and that gave him the confidence that he was now fully entrenched as a league footballer.



As he moved into his 30s, Mugambwa continued to play like he was 10 years younger losing no signs of his leap, pace and pressure ability. His best season might have been in 2013 when he kicked 32 goals after bringing up his 100-game milestone in 2012.

Injury curtailed his career both in 2014 and 2015, but he continued to fulfil his role when called upon and lit up the South Fremantle faithful with his leaping ability, big marks and stunning chase downs of opposition players.

He might have been limited to five league appearances in 2015 due to knee problems and ending in the reserves, but it wasn't without memorable moments none better than kicking the winning goal in the WA Day Foundation Derby.

Mugambwa didn't take the fact that he was in the reserves personally, instead fulfilled his role to aplomb as a leader in

the dominant team and was honoured to be named captain for the finals.

His reward was captaining the reserves premiership to cap off an outstanding, memorable and exciting 143-game, 148-goal WAFL career from one of South Fremantle's most popular ever players.

That saw Mugambwa join 2009 premiership teammate Craig

White in retirement at the end of the 2015 season leaving a youthful team heading into 2016 looking to return to finals for the first time since 2011.

Mugambwa and White weren't the only two outstanding servants to bid farewell at the end of 2015, with dual premiership star Kyle Hams, 110-game midfielder Toby Bairstow and former AFL big man James Sellar among those to also move on.





Hams returned to South Fremantle to play in 2015 for the first time since leaving at the end of 2010, and the 29-year-old dual premiership player had an outstanding season.

He averaged over 21 possessions a game, but ultimately living in Busselton with his young family and trying to play WAFL football has led to him deciding to not continue in 2016.


Hams originally joined South Fremantle along with twin brother Ashton to play in the reserves premiership team of 2004 and then became a key part of the team in 2005 that won the league flag.

That initially was as a small forward and he kicked 36 goals in his first 30 league games, but after that he settled into a role in the back-line and that's where he remained the majority of the rest of his career as one of the WAFL's elite small defenders.

Hams was again outstanding in the 2009 premiership winning team and after a solid year in 2010, he was after a fresh start and ended up joining Swan Districts for a successful three-year run.

He moved to Busselton and sat out of the WAFL in 2014, but returned in 2015 to play with the Bulldogs and alongside Ashton for the first time in 2010. He enjoyed the return and played well, and will always be remembered fondly for his 126-game career with the Bulldogs.

Bairstow is another popular South Fremantle player whose name will forever be on the No. 4 locker who moved on during 2015.





Bairstow arrived at South Fremantle as the son of 1986 Sandover Medallist Mark and after doing a significant apprenticeship and making his debut in 2008, the midfielder cemented his place in 2009 before missing the winning grand final with Peter Bell and Jeff Farmer needing to return.

However, Bairstow then became one of the best midfielders in the WAFL over the next two and-a-half seasons before a hand injury ended his 2012 prematurely. He was back for strong 2013 and 2014 seasons, but was limited to three league appearances in 2015.

The 27-year-old was racking up plenty of the ball in the reserves but after Round 13 decided to leave to play out the season with Wesley Curtin under former teammate Kris Miller. His Bulldogs career ended with 110 matches.

Sellar, meanwhile, will now be returning home to Adelaide in 2016 after two years in the WAFL with South Fremantle.

The versatile big man previously played 44 AFL matches at both the Adelaide Crows and Melbourne Demons and arrived as a prized recruit in 2014 for the Bulldogs. He played some solid football in his 32 games at South Fremantle splitting his time between the ruck, forward-line and back-line.

Alistair Gillespie and Lewis Harvey also departed Fremantle Oval during 2015 after making good contributions after joining the Bulldogs from Claremont and West Perth.



DEBUTANTS 2015YOUNGSTERS AGAIN GRAB THEIR CHANCE

erhaps the most exciting aspect of the 2015 WAFL season for South Fremantle was the number of young players not only given an opportunity, but who grabbed their chance with both hands.

Eight players made their league debut in 2015 with the Bulldogs while two other experienced defenders lined up for South Fremantle for the first time having signed from rival clubs.

While premiership stars Craig White and Paul Mugambwa saw their glittering careers come to an end at the end of 2015, the beginning of what appears to be outstanding WAFL careers began including Traye Bennell, Jacob Dragovich and Tim Stewart.

Meanwhile, Callum Ah Chee and Kade Stewart both received their first tastes of senior football late in 2015 and excelled ahead of what could be AFL futures.

Bailey Matera, Josh Branchi and Matthew Ah Siu were other South Fremantle players to debut during 2015 while defenders Blayne Wilson and Chris Luff played with the Bulldogs for the first time.


Round 1 saw South Fremantle begin the season in style with a win under lights over West Perth at Fremantle Oval and the occasion saw 20-year-old Bennell make

his league debut.

Bennell impressed with 14 possessions and a goal on debut as well and was a regular feature of the Bulldogs' team in the first half of the season. He went on to play in the reserves premiership and will look to take his game to another level again.

Matera came in for his debut in the Round 2 victory over Perth at Lathlain Park and showed some good signs.

The 19-year-old who is the brother of Brandon and son of Wally continued to impress in the reserves for the rest of 2015 and was a key player in the premiership as one of the best afield in the grand final with 25 possessions.



Dragovich stepped up to senior football with a strong reputation having been colts captain and fairest and best winner, but the way he acclimatised to league football was a pleasant surprise.

The 19-year-old's competitiveness and natural attack on the ball became a feature of his game and he made an instant impact when he made his debut in the Anzac Derby against East Fremantle.

He had 23 possessions and a goal that day and continued to play some outstanding football in 13 league matches. He kicked seven goals in his first six matches but as the year went on he spent more time in the midfield and had a career-best 27 possessions

against West Perth in Round 22.

Branchi committed to South Fremantle at the start of the 2014 season with the former basketball player being looked at as a long-term project by the Bulldogs. He showed encouraging signs in 2014 and then in 2015, emerged as an exciting ruckman with plenty of athletic tools.

The 21-year-old made his league debut in the stunning WA Day Foundation Derby win where he held down the ruck for much of the game. That was largely his role in his eight league matches

which allowed Brock Higgins to spend more time as a target.

He only missed the reserves premiership due to a broken hand suffered in the second semi-final but had impressed so much in 2015 that AFL clubs have taken a genuine interest. The 202cm big man could become a star ruckman with South Fremantle if he doesn't go to the AFL.

Ah Chee has long been looked at as an AFL player of the future having been involved with the AIS-AFL Academy, but until Round 16 of this year he had yet to play against men.

He was outstanding in his lone reserves appearance with 23 possessions and two goals leading to

his league debut in Round 17 where he made a statement about what his future holds kicking three goals, including two in the last quarter, to help the Bulldogs beat East Fremantle.

He went on to play the last six games with the league side and showed some exciting form further up the ground in the last three weeks before he now embarks on that AFL career.

Ah Siu was another to graduate from the successful colts program to senior football in 2015. He was forced to earn his league debut with it taking a run of three dominant matches from Rounds 16-18 for him to earn that opportunity.

He joined the Bulldogs this year and had a strong first three quarters of the year as a defender, including playing in WA's state game win over South Fremantle, before succumbing to a shoulder injury.

Wilson's former Peel teammate Luff also joined South Fremantle in 2015 and did some good jobs in his eight league games while also playing in the reserves premiership.

outh Fremantle premiership player Paul Duffield retired from the AFL following a terrific career with the Fremantle Dockers at the end of 2015 while a host of other Bulldogs products had seasons to remember.

Duffield had to work hard to earn his AFL chance and then cement his place at the Dockers, but he certainly did so putting together an outstanding career that ended after 171 matches.

Brandon Matera, Shane Kersten, Brendon Ah Chee and Cameron McCarthy all saw their AFL careers flourish during 2015 while Jarrod Garlett was another South Fremantle player to make his debut at the top level.

Duffield grew up in Mt Arthur before moving to Perth to attend Aquinas College and arriving at South Fremantle along with good friend Craig White. The pair enjoyed colts, reserves and league success together with the Bulldogs and now have retired from the AFL and WAFL respectively at the same time.


Duffield cemented himself in the back-line with South Fremantle and was a key part in the 2005 premiership but it took him dominating more as a midfielder in 2007 and 2008 before he became an AFL regular with Fremantle.

And once he was settled at the Dockers, that's where he remained earning life membership at the club and being one of the first players picked until falling out of favour midway through 2015.

Duffield finished the season playing mostly at Peel Thunder and he announced his retirement from the AFL after 171 matches, to go with the 86 WAFL games he's played.

The 30-year-old is proud and thankful to everything he achieved in the AFL at Fremantle, which included the 2013 grand final.

"To be a Fremantle Dockers life member is something I'll hold very dear because it did take a great test of my character to keep knocking down the door," Duffield said.

"My form this year fell away a bit and that was disappointing. It's a sad time to retire because the Fremantle club has been part of my life for 12 years. I've really grown up here but I'm excited to step into the next phase of my life."

As for South Fremantle's other products in the AFL, McCarthy emerged as one of the most exciting young forwards in the game. He kicked 35 goals in 20 games and despite requesting a trade to Fremantle, remained a required player at the GWS Giants and that's where he will stav.

Matera had another strong season at the Gold Coast Suns playing 19 matches and kicking 18 goals to now see the 23-year-old take his career tally to 74 games and 78 goals as he's now entering his prime.

Kersten received more opportunities at Geelong in 2015. Having played nine games for 10 goals in 2014, the 22-year-old

played 11 matches this year and kicked another nine goals.

Ah Chee's younger brother Callum appears set to burst on to the AFL scene in 2016, and that's exactly what Brendon did late in 2015 at Port Adelaide.

The 21-year-old was yet to make his AFL debut in his time with the Power, but he received his chance in Round 3. After three quiet games it wasn't a given he'd get another opportunity.

However, he did get that chance in Round 12 and had a tremendous last four games of the year averaging over 22 possessions a game which included him taking one of the marks of the year and earning a new contract to remain with Port Adelaide.

Garlett was the only draftee from 2014 to play AFL football this year playing nine matches for the Suns showing enough to suggest he can be a long-term player.

While Garlett got to play for the Suns, fellow draftees from 2014 Jarrod Pickett (GWS Giants) and Billy Frampton (Port Adelaide),




along with the rookie-listed Jermaine Miller-Lewis (Hawthorn) didn't get that opportunity.

However, all four have retained their spots with their respective AFL clubs for 2015.

Blaine Johnson did play two AFL matches for Carlton in 2015 to take his career tally to seven, but he was delisted upon the arrival of new coach Brendon Bolton.



SOUTH FREMANTLE DEVELOPMENT ACADEMYFOSTER NAMED COACH IN NEW ROLE

South Fremantle has appointed former dual reserves premiership player Mark Foster to the newly created role as Development Academy head coach.

The new role sees Foster become colts coach in 2016 as well as being in charge of all the coaches involved in the Warriors' program.

Foster returns to South Fremantle after a career that saw him play four league matches and in the 2004 and 2009 reserves premiership teams to fill the newly created position.

In conjunction with the WA Football Commission, the South Fremantle Football Club interviewed a number of quality candidates for the role who were put through a

rigorous process to find the right person for the newly created position.

South Fremantle CEO Stuart Kemp commented how important the development pillar of the club was for the future.

"We have identified that to be competitive with the power clubs of the WAFL in years to come, we need to shift a greater percentage of our financial resources to our development program for future sustained success," he said.

"This important position will focus on the players across the whole Academy along with an emphasis put on teaching and providing best practice for all of our development coaches.

"We feel this position has the capacity and opportunity to deliver a centre of excellence structure for coaches in our district as well."

After being a colts premiership player and fairest and best winner at East Fremantle in 2001, Foster joined South Fremantle in 2003 and made an immediate impact at reserves level playing in the premiership of 2004, winning the fairest and best that year and being runner-up in 2005.

Following three years with Harvey Brunswick Leschenault in the South West Football League where he won a premiership



and was captain, Foster returned to South Fremantle in 2009 playing in another flag before two more years at Harvey Brunswick Leschenault.

He was again successful with another flag in 2010 and winning the Shine Medal in both 2010 and 2011, before finishing his playing career with a B Grade premiership at Wesley Curtin.

Foster's coaching career began with Harvey Brunswick Leschenault's under-15 side while still playing in 2007 before being reserves midfield coach at South Fremantle in 2010 and 2011.

He returned to the Bulldogs as colts midfield coach in 2012 as well before then spending the past three seasons as colts coach at East Fremantle where he's overseen 17 players

represent WA in the State 18s, four players drafted into the AFL and eight players make their WAFL league debut.

The 32-year-old comes with a South Fremantle history and now a burgeoning resume making him a standout candidate for the newly created role, and he commented how honoured he was to have been appointed.

"I feel privileged to have the opportunity to work in a club with such a rich history like the Bulldogs," Foster said.

"The role is exciting and very different to what a lot of the WAFL clubs are doing in their development areas and I can't wait to get my teeth into working with the talented group coming through, as well as working closely with all of the Academy coaches."

Foster will commence in November for the pre-season and one of his first duties will be to sit down with South Fremantle Player Development Manager Jason Pedulla to review the talent pathway and identification processes for players and coaches alike.

Foster won't be alone in taking on the new role with his group of assistant coaches including his brother and dual WAFL premiership player Andrew, Brisbane Lions AFL premiership midfielder Richard Hadley, Sam Buhagiar and the well-respected and highly successful Glen Davies.

Let's look forward to a successful 2016 on and off the field.



This event was our major fundraising event in 2015, with monies raised going towards our development programs and allowing us to provide some of the best training facilities in the WAFL.

With stellar entertainment, great prizes and delicious food, the South Fremantle Football Club Gala Auction was a night enjoyed by all. The night included a three-course meal as well as an appearance from Perth's best oyster shucker Andy Grljusich. There was also entertainment from Johnny Cash tribute act Monty Cotton from The Voice Australia.

We would not be have been able to hold this event without the generosity and support of many people. To everyone that has contributed by way of sponsorship, donations, personal assistance or by buying a ticket and coming along to this evening, we extend the sincere thanks of the South Fremantle Football Club.

The funds raised from the Auction Night will be distributed into five important areas below and as we stressed on the evening, the fundraising from the auction is imperative for the viability of these projects.

FOOTBALL - Providing the best development environment possible so the boys from our 14's, 15's, 16's and colts programmes can reach their potential.

MEMBERSHIP - Aid in the funding of a new database for past players and members, this is one of the most important projects we have for the future of the club.

FACILITIES - With a 50 year old building, we are continually spending money on our club rooms.

FACILITIES - Griff John Room, looking at a renovation of the entire function room for the comfort of our members.

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES - Helping with the establishment of an Indigenous Foundation that is currently in its planning stage.





TREASURER'S REPORT



his year's result shows an operating profit of \$20,893 compared to last year's operating loss of \$91,129, an improvement of approximately \$112,000. Depreciation expense for the year was \$78,256 this giving rising to cash operating profit of \$99,149.

Whilst the areas of Administration and Football did not show improvement, our remaining five cost centre did.

Administration is basically an area that has very little revenue to its name other than bank interest and sundry revenue in the form of insurance claim money received, as was the case in 2014 when \$16,700 came in.

Some increases in expenses such as computer support (\$7,800) and payroll tax (\$4,700) were the main contributors in the movement.

Bar revenue from sales was a significant mover this year and increased to \$445,723 (up by approximately \$180,000) with The Workers Club and such functions as The Hall of Fame and Auction nights contributing accordingly.

With this improvement in sales and proper management the resulting net profit was \$143,000, an overall improvement of \$85,000.

The overall increase in marketing was mainly attributed to such things as the club auction, special functions, donations and advertising screen income. This group accounts for approximately 35 per cent of the marketing revenue.

Our Sponsorship and Advertising within marketing representing approximately 50 per cent of the revenue within marketing fell by some \$56,000. Despite this there was an overall increase of approximately \$50,000.

Football revenue decreased by approximately \$8,000 which related to a decrease in the transfer fees received falling from \$144,000 to \$122,000. This was partially offset by player sponsor money received of \$10,250 and uniform recoupment of \$2,900.

Within the expenses of the football department, player match payments increased by some \$91,000. There was a decrease in the cost of coaching fees and medical cost to the extent of \$31,000. We were \$45,000 worse off than last year.

Football development is another area that is one we do not expect to make profits from but mainly to ensure our costs are kept in control and this year colts uniform reimbursements of \$9,500 was the main contributing factor to the \$9,000 improvement over the prior year.

Membership income improved \$9,000 from last year because membership fee revenue increased from \$90,000 to \$96,000 (types of membership movement) and our membership overall expenses decreased. Social activity expenses were down \$1,500 and promotion and advertising down \$900.


Our Facilities revenue increased with gate receipts of \$55,500 (up \$14,000) and ground management parking of \$58,700 (up \$9,500) as well as these general expenses were down approximately \$9000. In total there was a \$29,500 improvement in this area.

In summary the improvement in profitability is a welcomed one, however, there still needs to be more revenue achieved from our marketing and advertising for our club to be more financially stable.

Thank you once again to all those members and supporters who help out in kind and/or money.
