PRESIDENTS REPORT

2020 was not the year we all expected. It started well and just when it looked like the season was going to kick-off the Covid-19 Pandemic struck. After 3 months of isolation restrictions eased and The Swansmen set about salvaging what was left of the football season and trying to provide opportunities for our members to enjoy good fellowship and raise some very valuable money for the Club at the same time.

Although it was another tough year on the field, we congratulate the whole football department and the men's and women's teams on their seasons and the continuing effort to develop home grown players for the future. We congratulate VFL recruit Sam Fisher on winning the prestigious Sandover Medal in his debut year. The Swansmen appreciate the support received from Phil Smart and the coaching staff, both male and female, and to the players for making themselves available to speak at our dinner meetings. We look forward to the 2021 season.

Dinner Meetings

The year commenced as normal with the Annual Planning Seminar in February followed by the Lounge Busy Bee. The first of the Swansmen monthly dinners in March was on track until Covid-19 struck and everything ground to a halt. After a 3-month hiatus, June saw things start to get back to some sort of normality and come July the monthly dinner meetings recommenced and fundraising was back on the agenda, along with the long awaited 2020 season. We heard from coaches, players and a diverse range of entertaining guest speakers including Adam Pickering, Ted Polglaze (Club Sport Scientist), John McGuire (Sporting and Cultural Ambassador) and representatives from the Bus Preservation Society of WA (based at Whiteman Park), averaging about 30 each dinner.

Fundraising

Although the net figure raised in 2020 was not as high as previous years due to the 4-month lockdown, the fundraising that was achieved was very successful. Over \$55,000 was raised in just 3 months through:

- the Thursday Members Night, Chase the Ace, raffle and wheel \$11,000.
- Cash Bonanza Raffle \$12,000 (thanks to Peter Snow for coordinating).
- Auction \$32,000 (thanks to the Committee, Ross Leipold and the Club staff and all the donors).
- Swansmen Lounge Home Game Bar \$2,000 (thanks to 'bar manager' Peter Bacon).
- Plus, our membership subs, Winning Margins, Sponsor-A-Picket, dinner meetings and fines.

This amount was returned to the Club through the annual sponsorship of a Count-Me-In table; a payment towards the new memorabilia room; the Women's League Best Player Awards; the Men's League Leading Goal Kicking Award and an end of season cash donation to the Club of \$32,000 (plus \$18,000 to come).





September John McGuire (Sportsman, Indigenous Ambassador)

A proud Balladong Noongar elder, John McGuire played 23 seasons of grade cricket, mainly with the Mt Lawley District Cricket Club. He also captained the Australian Aboriginal team which toured England in 1988. John compiled 10,004 First Grade runs at 36.2 to make him the second highest all-time leading run scorer with 15 first grade centuries. He played over 100 WAFL games for East Perth and Perth.



October Pat Hallahan (Bus Preservation Society of WA)

The Bus Preservation Society provided a very entertaining night with Pat Hallahan suited out in his Kalamunda Bus #17 Inspectors uniform. Pat gave a passionate presentation from his almost 40 years of association and restoring the old buses of Perth together with the 200 members of the group based at Whiteman Park. They have over 60 buses in their collection in various states of repair, but with 20 fully restored and on display. Pat included his singing rendition of the Kalamunda history.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (WA). To comply with the new Act, a revised Constitution was lodged with the Department of Mines, Industry Regulation & Safety in June 2019.

The Committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. Under the Act, the Association is classified as Tier 1 for reporting purposes and does not require an annual review or audit unless requested.

The financial report has been prepared on a cash basis and is based on fair value costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The Association is exempt from income tax. The accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Note 2: Current Liability

The Swansmen are committed to pay out the Chase the Ace Jackpot at some time in the future. [Subsequent to End of Financial Year, the Jackpot of \$5,635 was won on 12th November.]

Note 3: Contingent Liabilities

- The Committee previously agreed to meet the costs of memorabilia displays on a progressive basis at the rate of \$2,000 per annum for three years. Contributions made in 2016, 2017 & 2018. The present exposure to that commitment after paying out \$1,350 in 2020 is \$3,175.
- The Swansmen are committed to paying \$1,000 to the Women's Fairest & Best Awards in 2020.
- The additional profit made in 2020, will see an additional \$18,000 paid to the Club in 2021.

STATEMENT BY MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE

The Committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity and that this special purpose financial report should be prepared in accordance with the accounting policies outlined in Note 1 to the financial statements.

In the opinion of the Committee the financial report as set out on pages 6 to 8:

- 1. Presents a true and fair view of the financial position of Swansmen Incorporated as at 31 October 2020 and its performance for the year ended on that date.
- 2. At the date of this statement, there are reasonable grounds to believe that Swansmen Incorporated will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.
