



Beginning in 1922, the WAAFL has grown from what started as a small six team competition to the largest single organised football league in WA.

In its 95th year with 69 clubs, 240 teams and 10,000 registered players, the WAAFL caters for players as young as 16 years to provide a quality high standard competition whilst accommodating considerable volunteer personnel and social supporters.

For many players the WAAFL provides a superior football competition for those not wishing to endure the commitment to WAFL training due to study commitments, career commitments or simply a lifestyle that considers football as a recreational pursuit.

The WAAFL is also the beginning point for many well-known WAFL and AFL personnel, starting their careers in amateur football and becoming the football champions of tomorrow.

High profile players and our Colts League namesakes include Phil Scott, Drew Banfield, Laurie Keene, Brett Jones and two-time Sandover Medallist Ian Dargie all who played for the West Coast Eagles.

Other household names, and current AFL players, include Tendai Mzungu (Fremantle) and Nick Kommer (Essendon).

Coaches, staff and players should be pleased with their performances; to represent your State in a national competition is something to be very proud of.

INTEGRATED FOOTBALL

In 2016 Integrated Football continued on its way delivering on two key fronts, Participation and Competition. Seven Teams, Coolbinia West Perth, High Wycombe, Kingsway, Wembley, Warnbro, and Fremantle CBC Gold and Green participated in regular fixtures with all teams playing a minimum of twelve home and away games.

This season Integrated matches were played for the first time on Friday nights in addition to regular Saturday afternoons following senior football with occasional games on Sundays. Player registrations have now reached 190 with strong growth across all teams.

For a number of seasons, the West Coast Eagles Football Club extend a Curtain Raiser to the program providing just over fifty Integrated players the opportunity to play before a West Coast Eagles home game at Domain Stadium. In 2016 this was held on June 11 prior to the Eagles vs Adelaide game, enhanced by the appearance of Eagles Star Mitch Brown who has become a most welcome member of the Integrated Football Family providing support and coaching knowledge.

At the completion of the 2015 National Inclusion Carnival WA had two players from the State Team, David Hallows and Lyndsy Ashworth from the Coolbinia West Perth AFC selected in the 2015 All Australian All Abilities AFL Team.

On Friday 29 July, our two All Australian nominees together with Program Coordinator Greg Gilbee flew to Canberra to play in the first ever All Australian All Abilities exhibition game

at Manuka Oval. This was another first for Footballers with Intellectual Disabilities, it was a fantastic reward and opportunity for our WA Players who enjoyed and excelled in the match, David receiving the Coaches Award.

WA did not send a team to the 2016 AFL National Inclusion Carnival, however it was imperative that the skill development of upper echelon players continued to occur.

The High Performance Academy was set up in 2016 for aspiring players to build on their skills and abilities. Coached by 2015 State Integrated Coach Jamie Wynne with Dave Wright as his assistant.

The Academy is not just about improving playing skills, it is also providing whole of football education incorporating other aspects of the game, umpiring, coaching, volunteering, peer mentoring and respect.

From May to August the High-Performance academy trained at Robinson Reserve in Tuart Hill each Monday fortnight. Jamie and Dave were supported by Mitch Brown at many of the sessions, setting a challenging program for the participants who eagerly accepted and rapidly improved their skills, fitness and most importantly respect for the game.

A highlight of the program was a session by WAFC Umpire Manager Darryl Sinclair and WA AFL Field

Umpire Luke Farmer. The session touched on respect, behavior and laws, with Mitch Brown also in attendance.

On Saturday 6 August, Integrated Football was welcomed to the WAFL, where the High-Performance Academy played an exhibition game at Kingsway following the Subiaco v West Perth league match.

The 2016 season culminated with the Grand Final between Coolbinia West Perth and Kingsway on Sunday 4 September. A very competitive match between two highly skilled and determined teams ensured a tight finish. Coolbinia West Perth claimed the win by just three points to make it back to back premierships for the club. Coolbinia West Perth's Lyndsy Ashworth was voted Best on Ground.

Integrated Football has much to look forward to, it has evolved into a vibrant and sustainable program. The program recognises the tremendous work done by volunteers at WAAFL Club level who provide the environment and supportive surrounds. The program would also not have been possible without the financial contribution by The Department of Sport and Recreation towards the High-Performance Academy as well as all the help from the West Coast Eagles and Mitch Brown, Disability Services Commission, National Disability Insurance Scheme and Inclusion WA.

HALL OF CHAMPIONS

On Wednesday 31 August, the WAAFL hosted the seventh annual Hall of Champions function. The Hall of Champions honours those individuals who have made long, significant and commendable contributions to the WAAFL, to help make it the strong and respected sporting body that it is today. This year the WAAFL inducted three new members into the Hall of Champions.

Bill Duckworth first began his involvement with the WAAFL in 1977 as a Colts' player for WAIT (now Curtin Uni Wesley).

He was picked up by the Essendon Football Club where he played 126 games and kicked 64 goals. He was a premiership player in 1984 and 1985 including a Norm Smith Medallist in the 1984 Grand Final. In 1993 Bill joined the North Beach Amateur Football Club where he played 33 games and kicked 16 goals. He won a premiership with the club in 1993. He coached at North Beach from 1996 to 2012. In this time, he coached teams to ten premierships including seven consecutively from 2004 to 2010. He then coached the D1 side from 2014- 2015 making the Grand Final on both occasions. All teams coached by Bill have participated in finals.

Bill Duckworth was awarded Life Membership of the North Beach Amateur Football Club in 2005. He is inducted into the Hall of Champions as a Champion.

Michael Salmon played 154 games for the University Football Club. He played in his first premiership in 1974 in the A Colts competition.

In 1975 Michael played in University's A Grade premiership and was selected

in the state amateur representative team. In the same year he won the A Grade leading goal kicking award with 103 goals for the season. He went on to play in University's A Grade premierships in 1975 and 1977 before being picked up by WAFL club Claremont in 1979.

Between 1979 and 1980 Michael played in Claremont's league and reserves side including the Claremont Reserves premiership in 1980. He returned to the University Football Club in 1981 where he played and coached the A Grade side to another premiership while being selected as Vice-Captain in the state amateur representative team and winning the inaugural B.J Giles Medal as the best player in the A Grade Grand Final.

He again coached the University team in 1982 and was selected as Captain of the All Australian Amateur Team following the carnival held in Perth. He was also selected as vice-captain of the all Australian team that played Vic Country in 1983.

In 1985 Michael was selected as Vice-Captain in University's Best 25 Year Team. In 1986 he played in University's F Grade Premiership as well as their I Grade premiership in 1988.

Michael Salmon finished with six premiership medals with three of those in A Grade. He was a four-time State Amateur Representative as well as being selected twice in the All Australian Amateur Team, once as Captain and once as Vice-Captain.

He was the inaugural chairman of the metropolitan football league council serving from 1996 to 2002. Michael is

inducted into the Hall of Champions as a Champion.

Shane Beres began his football with the WAAFL in 1996 with the West Coast Amateur Football Club. He spent two seasons with West Coast, representing the state in both years before being recruited to the Swan Districts Football Club in 1998. He made his debut for Swan Districts playing 18 games and kicking 11 goals.

He finished his WAFL career in 2008 with 193 games to his name and kicked 112 goals. He won the 2003 Sandover Medal and finished as a runner up in 2004. He won two Swan Medals as Swan Districts Best and Fairest in 2003 and 2005. Shane was also Captain of the Swan Districts Football Club from 2003-2006.

In 2009 Shane joined the Mount Lawley Amateur Football Club where his brother Damon was playing. He assisted Mount Lawley in winning the B Grade Grand Final which allowed them to be elevated into A Grade the following year. He won the WAAFL B Grade Best and Fairest and was judged as the Best on Ground in the Grand Final.

In 2010 he coached the Mount Lawley A Grade side finishing just one game out of the finals. He returned to coach the side again in 2011 finishing on top of the ladder before losing the Grand Final to University. This Grand Final appearance is the best A Grade effort for Mount Lawley since their run of premierships in the late 80's and early 90's.

Shane is inducted into the Hall of Champions as a High Achiever.
