PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to say that all in all it has been a positive year for country football despite what was shaping up as a disastrous agricultural year for many of our farmers (who are the backbone of football in our agricultural leagues). It has been pleasing to see that most of these regions will experience good years with their crops, which hopefully can ensure prosperity for football in this important demographic of country WA.

2013 was a challenging year for the WACFL from a staffing perspective with funding cuts by the WAFC reducing the staff numbers of our team. The reason for this was due to some budgeting issues, which is an indication of how tight the football financial model is moving forward. This was an unfortunate occurrence that has impacted the level of service and time dedicated to servicing leagues and clubs.

The WA Football Commission, led by Chairman Frank Cooper and CEO Gary Walton, has an important role to play in trying to secure the long term futures of grass roots football through the negotiations around the new stadium complex. I would like to thank the WAFC for the funding support they provide, which enables us to staff our offices and work towards providing important programs and resources to our participants.

In light of these reductions to staffing and our distributions, the WACFL Executive has evaluated many of the services delivered and, in many ways, looked at how we can better manage our network. We look forward to sharing our new strategic plan with our members early in 2014.

The WACFL Executive will continue to work towards assisting and improving our leagues where we can and there were some positive developments and increases in the energy and services provided to our league volunteers in 2013. We look forward to continuing to work with this group on improving their leagues as well as drilling down to a club level to ensure strong clubs exist.

The future of State football continues to be a topic of discussion both at our board level and at a national level with the Australian Country Football Council. Country football in the eastern states has experienced dramatic changes in its structure and administration. This has impacted Queensland, New South Wales, and Victoria's ability to field a representative country side to participate in the bi-annual national country carnival. Unfortunately it appears these carnivals will no longer be played

and therefore will no longer be a pathway for our State's best country players, which is disappointing considering the efforts many of our previous Executive members have put into the formation of this concept.

The WACFL is still committed to providing our best country players the opportunity to participate in representative football and will continue to explore opportunities to ensure that representative football continues beyond 2014. We have formed strong relationships with the South Australian Community Football League and the WA Amateur Football League so we are confident of delivering future opportunities to our best players.

The WACFL has had another sound year financially and we continue to strive to become more financially secure in light of the uncertainty of the future. I would like to thank all our members who have played their part in helping us to achieve this pleasing result.

This year the WACFL welcomed two new Life Members into the fold with Tambellup legend Jim Hull being acknowledge for his services to football in the Great Southern region. Benjamin Ralph was also honoured for his many years of service to not only the Miling Football Club, but also for his involvement as a volunteer for the State country sides for well over a decade. Both gentlemen's nominations were very fondly received by our members and each is a welcome addition to the WACFL Life Members family.

The WACFL staff continued to work professionally, so I'd like to acknowledge Joe, Robyn and Kellie, Ben Ralph and Executive Member Milton Milloy who helped out at various times throughout 2013.

To my Executive, thanks very much for your support and the work you have put in to date. I look forward to the challenges we face moving forward. We certainly have a critical role to play in helping keep football alive in the country.

Finally to all those volunteers at league and club level, I'd like to extend the Executive's sincere thanks to you all, as we are all well aware that without your tireless efforts football would be unable to continue in regional WA.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

On the back of a challenging 2012 financial year for the West Australian Football Commission, 2013 saw a more conservative approach adopted throughout the whole football industry with a reduction in financial commitments across several key areas.

The WA Country Football League was not insulated from this and experienced a reduction in resources, as well as reduced sponsorship income that forced us as an organisation to reevaluate all of the programs we deliver.

Whilst, as General Manager of the WACFL, I will ensure we support leagues as best we can financially (and otherwise) and provide as robust a funding model as possible, we will need to keep a close eye on how things progress, particularly with negotiations around the new stadium at Burswood.

Approximately 80 per cent of the WA football industry's income is underpinned by the current lease and management arrangements at Patersons Stadium. With this in mind, the WAFC is working closely with the State Government and has formed a joint football working group to ensure the needs of WA football are met at the new stadium.

The WAFC, on behalf of football, will also submit a proposal to manage the new stadium so that it can continue generating the funds needed to help grow, promote and develop the game throughout regional Western Australia.

In light of the reduction in resources and challenging financial climate, I am proud of what the executive and our small team at WACFL achieved in 2013. Below are some of the highlights:-

Colts Program

The WACFL put an increased emphasis on its colts program in 2013 with a colts camp and two matches. These events helped identify some of the vast talent that exists with our young country players. Hopefully some of this year's colts group can challenge themselves and try out in the WAFL system in years to come.

North West Academy

The WACFL managed the 2013 North West Academy Program which saw 25 of the best 15-17 year olds from the State's North West attend the National 16s carnival in Sydney. Organising flights and logistics for such a diverse group of players was certainly a challenge, but we were able to get all the players there and back successfully. Once in Sydney, many of the players showed enormous talent and appear to have bright futures ahead of them. The team went on to finish second in division 3.

State Match

Tom Floyd took on the roll as State Coach this year with the program including a match against the WA Amateur Football League under lights in May and a match against a powerful South Australian team at Brownes Stadium in July. The squad for the SA match was selected from players who attended the Landmark Carnival. A quick, highly skilled side was chosen, but unfortunately neither of those attributes helped the side as the match was played in wet and windy conditions. The South Australians certainly played the conditions better than we did.

Landmark Country Football Championships

The Landmark Carnival ran like clockwork this year which is a credit to the work put into the event beforehand by the WACFL staff and the attending leagues. There were some big changes this year, and all in all the changes were dealt with well by the leagues and I think the best teams won in all four divisions. I'm confident next year's carnival will be bigger and better than this year and it should be a great event with it being the 50th country carnival and the 40th year of Landmark's support of country football.

• League Professional Development Day

In February this year we invited all our league secretaries to Perth for an information and development day. Hopefully this day helped each of these critical volunteers run their leagues more professionally throughout the year. Feedback indicated the day was beneficial and there are plans afoot to continue to develop this concept in 2014.

WACFL Rounds

Belt up – the WACFL continued its 15-year partnership with the Insurance Commission of WA. Highlights of this campaign were the annual Belt up round of fixtures.

One Life – in our second year with One Life we continued to spread mental health and suicide prevention messages to our football clubs and regional communities. Each country league participated in the One Life Suicide Prevention Day.

Pink Football Day – leagues voluntarily chose to participate in this event over the Mother's Day weekend raising funds for the National Breast Cancer Network. This was a great example of country football getting behind a worthy cause for which we were able to raise over \$100,000.

Footy Affairs Meeting at Kellerberrin

Country Football hosted a meeting in Kellerberrin in June with the WAFC's Football Affairs Committee in attendance. This committee consists of WAFC Commissioners and staff who meet monthly to discuss relevant football competition issues. It was fantastic to give them an insight into some of the challenges currently being experience by our leagues and clubs.

The meeting was attended by WACFL executive, WAFC staff, WAFC Football Affairs Committee members, regional development staff and committee members, football volunteers from leagues and clubs, Department of Sport and Recreation staff and local shire staff.

A consensus was reached at the meeting and a commitment made to improve the flow of information between the WAFC and country football volunteers. Making this improvement will be a key challenge over the next 12 months, but I believe all who attended were confident that if this can be achieved country football can take a significant step forward.

As well as the above highlights, it was pleasing to see the total number of football participants in regional Western Australia grow by 10.4% in 2013 to a total of 51,579, seeing country football make up 32% of WA's total participation of 161,429.

This is a credit to the regional development staff, volunteers and WACFL senior leagues for the work they do in their communities and schools to promote football and put teams on the park each week.

Country football continues to rely strongly on league and club volunteers to run football in their region. Providing ongoing professional development for these key football participants will be one of the strategic focus areas of 2014 as they are very much the ones driving the health of country football.

2014 promises to be another busy and challenging year for the WACFL and our leagues. Whilst there are many challenges on the horizon, country football remains in a strong position in the community so we will continue to develop this standing to ensure our sustainability for years to come.

It is an honour to work with the many League and Club volunteers around the State who are tied up in football. Assisting them with their duties continues to be the major driving force of this role and I look forward to visiting all leagues in 2014.

Finally, I'd like to thank Terry House and the WACFL executive for their support over the previous 12 months and our WACFL team of Robyn Payne, Kellie McBean and Ben Ralph who have all gone over and above the call of duty to help us manage our programs successfully in 2013.

UMPIRE MANAGER'S REPORT

Umpire Development Programs for 2013 commenced with the Umpire Coach PD program in late February. This consisted of a two day intensive workshop attended by around 40 umpire coaches from across regional and metropolitan WA, including all market sectors from AFL to juniors.

The format included clarifying new laws and interpretations, explanation of the now on line accreditation system, plus quality interaction to establish a consistent coaching philosophy to cater to individual circumstances.

The highlight of the financially subsidised program was the opportunity to match day assess WAFL umpires in a scratch match, followed by an interactive follow up session that evening.

It was regrettable that this excellent opportunity had representation from only around 20% of senior affiliate leagues. Nonetheless, those that did attend found the program well worthwhile and their support will ensure the program continues again in February/March 2014.

With WAFC Umpiring resources in high demand in 2013, coupled with tighter budgets across all regional and metropolitan market sectors, high level support remained, with strategies reprioritised accordingly.

The 2013 Landmark Country Football Championship was another successful event with the umpires demonstrating one of the most professional performances in many years to ensure this event remained a high class spectacle.

It was my pleasure to manage around 60 WACFL field, boundary and goal umpires from all parts of WA who freely gave of their time for this prime umpire development opportunity. Thank you to Grant Dorrington as keynote guest speaker.

Well done to each of the dozen or so metro and regional coaches for providing quality match day feedback plus coaching sessions each evening. Special thanks to WAFL Coach Darryl Sinclair along with the Landmark Umpire Coach leadership team of Ray Zoch (Head Field Coach), Great Southern Coach Terry Eaton (Boundary Selector) and South West based Damian Cifelli (Head Goal Coach).

The coaching sessions being conducted at Ernest Johnson Oval were complimented with, importantly, some social interaction with WAFL and WA based AFL umpires. Thank you to the WANFLUA for their continued support of regional umpires, not only in this event, but also in availing themselves for coaching sessions when umpiring regional WAFL matches.

My gratitude is extended to AFL staff Andrew Hughes and Adam Davis for their work on the development of Umpire Accreditation, now being introduced on line in 2013. This enhancement is obviously of particular benefit to the more isolated regional umpires. This was well supported by the continued growth of an array of umpire coaching tools readily available via the www.aflcommunity.com.au website.

Whilst competing demands and resource availability meant less regional PD visits, I am indebted to AFL umpires Dean Margetts and Alan Zanich who accompanied me in March 2013 to Carnarvon as part of the AFL Umpire Road Show program. Their professional contributions were simply outstanding. Equally favourable, WAFC Umpire Manager (metro and regional) Juniors Glenn Omodei was full of praise for the presentations by AFL umpires Matt Laycock and Callum Brown in Manjimup and Peel.

The full time WAFC staff based throughout regional WA are critical to the development of umpires, both in terms of quantity (recruitment) and quality (education). Strategies to meet the needs of the varying football landscapes include: recruitment of umpires, umpire training, umpire development, material distribution and general support to umpire coaches and leagues on umpire development matters.

My acknowledgement to all volunteers for a job well done in 2013, and best wishes as you plan for 2014 including and beyond your local umpiring.

In closing, may I impress upon all WACFL affiliate leagues to ensure their local umpire coach/coordinator or other representative attends the February 2014 Umpire Coach PD Program in Perth as a matter of priority.

The West Australian football family continued to grow in 2013, with participation numbers climbing by more than 13% to over 160,000 across the State. We are now targeting 200,000 participants by the time the new stadium is scheduled for completion at the end of 2017.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2013

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the West Australian Country Football League (WACFL) constitutional requirements to prepare financial statements.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of this financial report, are in the opinion of the members of the Executive, appropriate to meet the requirements of the WACFL.

The requirements of Australian Accounting Standards do not have mandatory applicability to the WACFL because it is not a reporting entity. The members of the Executive have determined that relating to recognition, classification and measurement of assets, liabilities, revenues and expenses have been complied with. This includes the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements and AASB 107 Cash Flow Statements.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on the historical costs.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Statement of Compliance

The financial report complies with the recognition, measurement and classification requirements of Australian Accounting Standards, which includes Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS) and the disclosure requirements of accounting standards AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements and AASB 107 Cash Flow Statements.

Going Concern

This financial report has been prepared on the going concern basis. The going concern basis has been implemented, as the Executive Members believe that the cash flow projections are sustainable and the WACFL has a large surplus of cash on hand.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the WACFL and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade payables and other payables are carried at cost and represent liabilities for goods and services provided during the financial year that are unpaid at year end and future payments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services is required.

Income Tax

As both a not-for-profit and statutory body, there is no obligations to pay income tax.

Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax,

Except:

- (i) Where the amount of GST incurred on a purchase of goods and services is not recoverable from the taxation authority, in which the case the amount of GST is recognised as part of the cost of the acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense items as applicable; and
- (ii) Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable, or payable to, the taxation authority is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash is defined as cash on hand and cash equivalents, including highly liquid assets, which have a maturity of less than three months from Balance Date.


Trade and Other Receivables
