At the Telethon Kids Institute **Andrew** leads a large team that use a wide range of methodologies to investigate the early identification and intervention of children with Autism Spectrum Conditions, including molecular genetics, neuroscience, endocrinology, behavioural experiments and clinical trials.

Andrew has published over 150 peer-reviewed journal articles and attracted over \$35 million in competitive research grants. He currently presents an internationally syndicated video series called '60 Second Science", which has been viewed by over 1 million people. He is an advisor to State and Commonwealth Governments on policies relating to children with Autism Spectrum Conditions. and he chaired the committee that generated Australia's first national guideline for autism diagnosis.

Andrew is married and has two kids – 2 and 4 years old to keep him grounded – as well as being a SWANS Supporter.
