## FINANCE REPORT

In 2024 we have achieved a better-than-expected financial outcome for the Club, realising a full year cash profit of \$180,828 with a net profit result of \$167,464, our best result since 2021.

The year revealed many firsts, including record income which pushed us through the \$3.5m ceiling for the first time (turnover \$3.7m).

From an operational perspective, highlights included significant revenue from commercial partnership arrangements, investment returns and club record match-day gate incomes.

The club also recorded bar sales in excess of \$900,000 for the first time, which is testament to

our exceptional relationship with food and beverage partner, Benny's Bar & Café.

Further revenue opportunities were not realised due to both the WAFL and WAFLW programs not making finals this year, which reinforces the performance of our operational core activities in delivering a strong financial result.

This profit continues to support the Board's strategic intent to further strengthen our balance sheet to support future activities.

# HEAD OF FOOTBALL

## Charlie Burke

Season 2024 fell just short of expectations and is on my mind every day as we plan for 2025. The challenge to 'fight back' this season was at the forefront of every player, coach and support staff's minds and falling half a game short in the league and bowing out in the second week of finals in the reserves only makes us hungrier.

After reviewing 2023, we looked at some key areas of our male program which included strategic list management, skill development, leadership, connection and medical.

### LIST MANAGEMENT

The football department met at the back end of 2023 and worked through a depth chart of our current list and worked through a process to target certain players that fit our profile. Three of the top four WJ Hughes Medallists were recruits, well one of them was the return of a club favourite Haiden Schloithe.

Lewis Rayson (fourth) made the move across the Nullarbor from the SANFL, where he spent the last few years at Glenelg and captained the South Australian U18s in 2021. Lewis was one of only four players (Chad Pearson, Jordan Boullineau and Isiah Winder) to play every single league match this season and was recognised for his consistency by winning the Best First Year Player award.

Isiah Winder took out the WJ Hughes Medal after a stellar first season at The Kennel. Isiah added some spark as a goal kicking midfielder and thoroughly deserved the recognition after a consistent season.

The addition of Luke Polson, Cooper Osborne, Jason Carter, Connor McDonald, and the return of Josh Branchi and rapid development of Jacob Whan has put our list in a very healthy position for seasons to come.

### SKILL DEVELOPMENT

We identified that our skill execution was an area that needed attention and were fortunate to secure the services of Chris Mayne. Chris's football experience and the work ethic he had as a player was evident in the way he went about delivering the skills program with energy and passion.

It's clear this paid off, with all key stats showing our efficiency by hand and foot improved as well as the ability to back ourselves in pressure situations knowing we had done the work to execute.

### LEADERSHIP

One of the best recruits of the season was securing the services of our leadership consultant who is a returning Bulldog. Glenn Stewart is a well-known figure in WA football circles after 20 years at the West Coast Eagles in High Performance roles and prior to that Glenn held various roles including as a runner under Mal Brown at the Bulldogs.

The work Glenn put into our leaders and leadership program was clear and we saw a changing of the guard as Chad Pearson took on the captaincy from premiership captain Dylan Main. Having Dylan remain in the leadership group shows the type of person he is and the fact he has always been a club and team character.

### CONNECTION

Football clubs are all about people, so it's vital to ensure we provide opportunities for our people to connect with one another away from the footy field. A couple of examples are the camp in Pingelly this season, which provided an opportunity for our recruits and new staff to connect prior to the season commencing as well as celebrating special events such as NAIDOC Round where we heard from some of our Indigenous players.

Connection is also about our community and our fans which is something we pride ourselves on. Community week this year saw over 60 of our male and female players go out and have a kick with our future Bulldogs, as well as having Todd Curley and Chris Mayne present to our RDC Coach Academy Coaches.

### MEDICAL

Bringing in an additional physiotherapist this season allowed for more time dedicated to treatment and diagnosis. Courtney Kranz came onboard as head physiotherapist and did an outstanding job alongside Macy Sumich for pre-season and then Jacob Millar for in-season.

Our Doctor Ashton May, head trainer Steph Cammarano and all our wonderful trainers have well and truly looked after the squad this year and we look forward to having them all back in 2025.

### COACHING

Brad Maney joined our coaching group this season as our Reserves Coach and did a fantastic job in his first season at WAFL level. His natural ability to connect and build lasting relationships was evident from the first training session along with allowing the reserves group to play with some freedom and flair.

We were fortunate to add Brendon Logan (League Assistant), Chris Mayne (Skills & Development), Brad Karafil (Reserves Assistant) and Chris O'Connor (Opposition) into the program and all had massive contributions.

We do farewell Nick Suban (premiership player and league assistant), Geoff Lewis (Chairman of Selectors) and reserves assistants Mike Hays, Geoff Barry and Brad Karafil who have all decided to move on from their roles.

I want to take this opportunity to thank outgoing senior coach Todd Curley for his remarkable tenure at the club and the incredible impact he has made. Thanks must also go to Todd's wife Paula and his two kids AJ and Tahlia for supporting Todd to do the role at the club for so long.

### PLAYERS

We had 10 players make their WAFL and/or club debut with Jaren Carr, Jason Carter, Jacob Whan, Lachlan Mitchell, Lewis Rayson, Isiah Winder, Luke Polson, Lachlan Turley, Connor McDonald and Cooper Osborne, three of which have come through our talent pathway.

There were 41 players pulled on the red and white at league level which was the second highest (for non-aligned clubs) number of players used at league level this season, while the reserves had 58 players which was the most of any club in 2024.

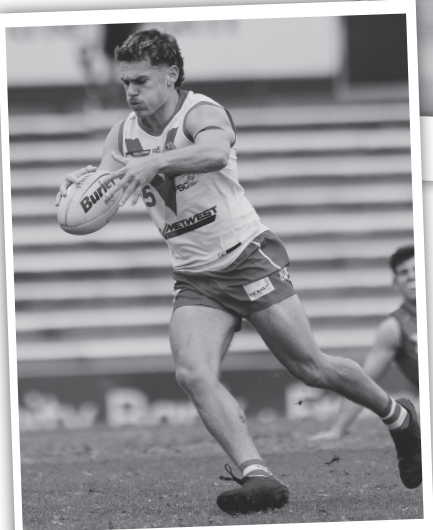

There were plenty of underage representatives from South Fremantle playing for WA throughout 2024 as well and none did it better than Jaxon Artemis.

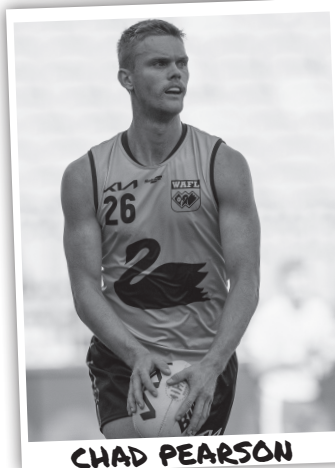
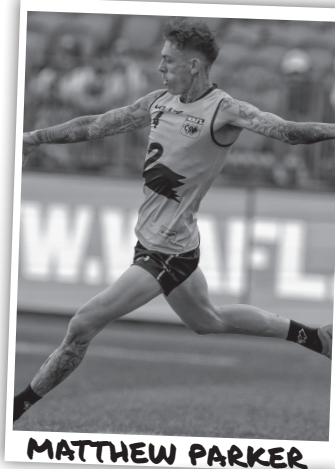

**S**outh Fremantle celebrated another product becoming an AFL premiership player in 2024 with Callum Ah Chee playing a starring role in the Brisbane Lions stunning victory at the MCG.

Ah Chee was just one of a host of South Fremantle products to shine on the national stage in both the AFL and AFLW competitions in 2024.

Callum Ah Chee not only became a premiership player at Brisbane in 2024 after playing in the losing grand final of 2023, but he starred in the entire finals series for the Lions.

That included kicking four goals in the grand final win against Sydney on the back of three in the thrilling preliminary final win against Geelong.

On the back of playing in Collingwood's premiership of 2023, Billy Frampton played another 18 games in 2024 to take his career total to 58 across three clubs.

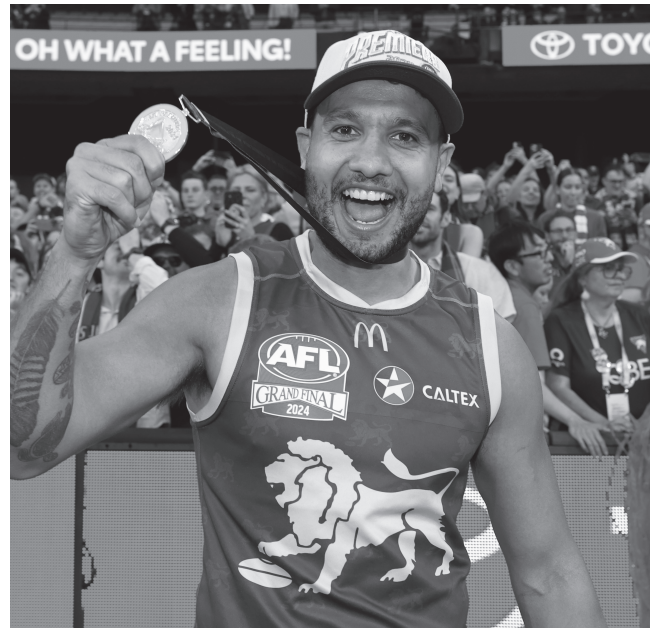
Tim English continued to be one of the AFL's premier ruckman playing another 23 games with the Western Bulldogs to now have played a total of 131.

Shai Bolton has played 135 games at Richmond up to the end of 2024 but now will be making a fresh start in 2025 having been traded to Fremantle.

On the back of winning the John Worsfold Medal in 2023, Tim Kelly played another 20 matches in West Coast's midfield to have now played a total of 144 AFL games coming out of South Fremantle.

The remarkable story of Marlion Pickett's late AFL chance to become a premiership star saw him retire at the end of the 2024 season following 91 matches at Richmond.

More chances opened up in Geelong's forward-line

Jesse Motlop had an injury-interrupted 2024 but still played another seven games with Carlton to take his career total to 40 over the past three years.

Steely Green made his AFL debut with Richmond in 2024 and went on to play six games and plenty more opportunities should present in 2025.

Following her stunning WAFLW season at South Fremantle where she won the Allomes Medal in 2023, Ariana Hetherington got her first taste of AFLW at Fremantle later that year.

She added another eight appearances with the Dockers in 2024 largely in the forward-line.

Zoe Wakfer got her first taste of the AFLW at the Eagles in 2023 with six matches, and she played all 10 of 2024 largely in the back-line.

Like her sister, Lauren Wakfer also became a key player at West Coast in 2024 playing all 10 matches to take her career tally to 21 over the past two seasons.

Makaela Tuhakaraina added to her tally of games with another appearance in 2024 to have now played a total of 17 AFLW matches dating back to 2022.

Mim Strom continued her emergence in 2024 as well to become perhaps the best ruck in the competition having earned selection in the All-Australian squad.

She played a key role in helping the Dockers reach the finals and by the time Fremantle had beaten Essendon in the elimination final, she was up to 61 AFLW matches.

# HEAD OF FEMALE FOOTBALL

**T**hey say a year is a long time in football, and from a personal perspective, I wholeheartedly agree. This time in 2023 I was living with my family in Melbourne, working for the Footscray variety of Bulldog and possessing a limited knowledge of the 'Premier Family Club' apart from a vague memory of a speccy statue on Parry Street.

Flash forward to October 2024 and I feel firmly entrenched in the culture and history of this great club, having been welcomed with open arms by the staff, players and supporters from day one.

Especially impressive has been the absolute commitment to the progression of female football here at South Fremantle. As we invest in and champion upcoming and established female talent, I see absolutely no barrier to achieving high-level development and sustained on and off-field success for both our

Rogers Cup and WAFLW programs. From boardroom to office, changerooms to the field – we are all in.

A fine example of this investment was our Round 1 derby against East Fremantle. Played in front of nearly 1000 people at Fremantle Oval, several new traditions were formed around the female program, including a 'Derby Cup' for the winner, the forging of a best on ground medal named after our active captain Lauren Vecchio (won on the day by Poppy Stockwell) as well as a 'Celebrating Female Football' function at the club.

While we unfortunately missed finals in both grades, there were some clear highlights for our players and staff throughout the season.

After a slow start, the Rogers Cup program really hit their straps with a mid-season run that included five straight wins between Rounds 6 and 11. Nicole

Taylor-Thorpe continued her stellar form by taking out the league goalkicking award (in a tie with West Perth's Shantae Anderson), with captain Poppy James finishing runner-up in the league fairest and best.

Marie Polimeno and Shaya Yarran should also be congratulated for their selection in the State 16s program. This honour saw them competing in both Melbourne and South Australia and representing South Fremantle to a high standard.

All of them offered plenty to suggest that they have big futures with South Fremantle and it all started in Round 1 against East Perth at Fremantle Community Bank Oval.

Connor McDonald, Luke Polson, Lewis Rayson, Lachlan Turley and Isiah Winder all made their league debuts for the Bulldogs in that home season-opener against the Royals.

McDonald joined South Fremantle from Perth in 2024 where he had come through the colts system and broke through into the senior program for five reserves appearances in 2023.

He is the younger brother of Sydney Swans forward, Logan, and had earned a spot in the South Fremantle team for that Round 1 game against East Perth.

He was impressive on that afternoon too with 17 possessions, three tackles and a goal.

While he was only able to manage two more league games for the rest of the 2024 season, he played some impressive reserves football and aged just 20, he has a bright future as part of the forward-line with the Bulldogs.

Polson was another new face to South Fremantle in 2024 having come from previously playing at Peel Thunder and then a year out of the WAFL system in 2023.

He had played 23 colts matches with the Thunder before earning his league debut in 2021 and then adding another three matches in 2022 along with seven reserves appearances.

Then he returned to the WAFL system albeit with the Bulldogs in 2024 and would go on to make five appearances in the league side.

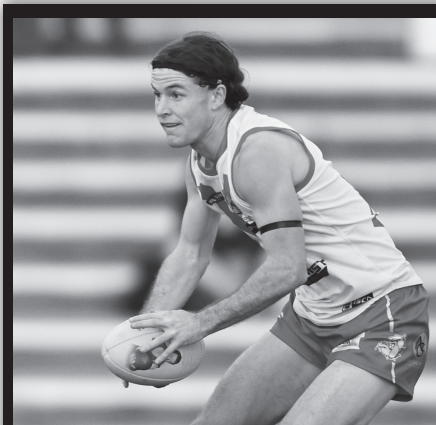

against Claremont.

At just 21 years of age and with good size at 196cm tall, he is someone that could be a key target in attack now for South Fremantle for a long time to come.

Rayson moved interstate to join South Fremantle for the 2024 season having previously played in the SANFL at Glenelg.

He took no time settling into the defensive set up with the Bulldogs and went on to have a tremendous first season in the WAFL.

Rayson would go on to play all 18 matches through-

out the season for the Bulldogs and ended up averaging 16.9 possessions and 4.9 marks a game.

He showed the ability to both do some strong defensive jobs but to also be an effective creative player out of the back-line.

Rayson is another who at just 21 years of age has an enormously bright future based on what he showed in his first season in the WAFL.

Another Round 1 debutant was Turley who has graduated from the colts program at South Fremantle to come into the senior program in 2024.

With good size behind him standing at 190cm and a solid build, he has all the makings of a key position player of the future and showed encouraging signs throughout 2024.

Turley ended up playing eight league matches throughout 2024, another three in the reserves and he is a local product the Bulldogs will look to continue developing moving forward.

Winder joined South Fremantle in 2024 on the back of his time with the West Coast Eagles where he was able to play seven AFL matches.

He was initially drafted back in 2020 from Peel Thunder and the best of his AFL seasons was in 2022 when he was able to play six of those seven games.

However, he found himself delisted at the end of 2023 and was quick to jump on board at the Bulldogs to continue his WAFL career.

Clearly motivated to show what he was still capable of, the 22-year-old went on to have a brilliant season at South Fremantle, playing all 18 matches and kicking 16 goals while averaging 25.4 disposals a game.

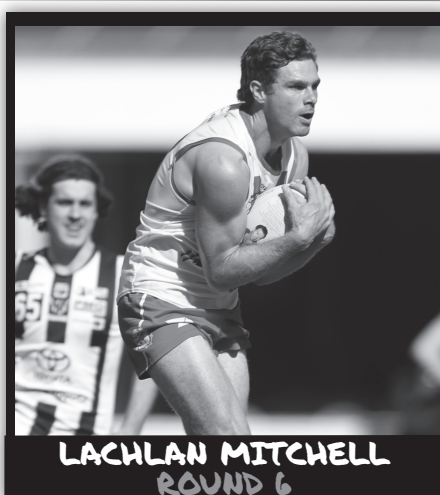

The next debutant came in Round 5 and it was the son of a former Fremantle Dockers star.

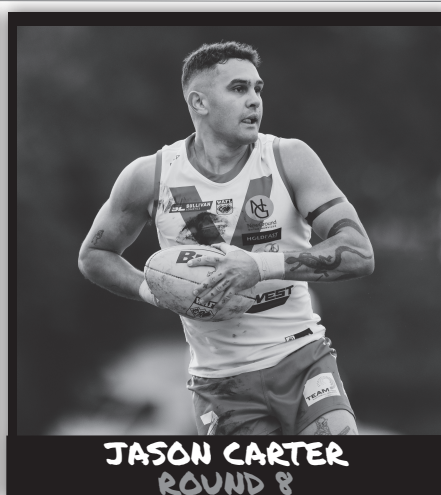

Not only do they have the similarity in looks, but Jaren is a smooth mover like his dad was and has that unique ability to be deceptively impressive marking above his head for his size.

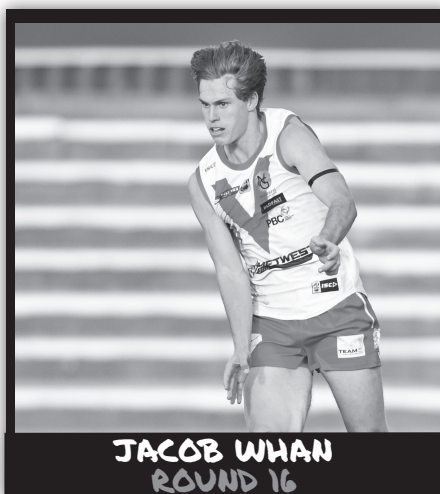
Jaren would go on to make nine appearances in the league team throughout the season showing great versatility showing he has a bright future that might not only be in the WAFL, but potentially also the AFL.



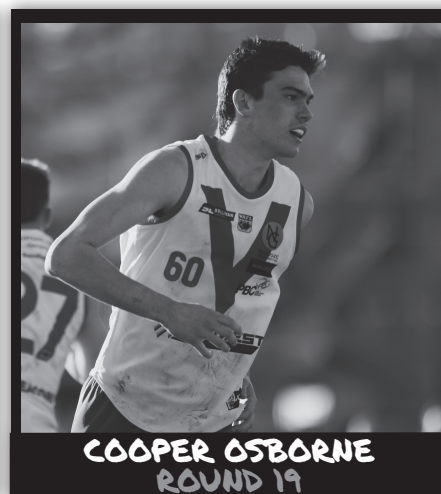

The 25-year-old was a mature-aged recruit and would go on to play seven league matches in his debut season showing a good ability to win the ball and provide some run and carry.

Jason Carter was a prized recruit for South Fremantle coming into 2024 having previously played with Fremantle in the AFL, and then playing at Claremont in recent years.

Jacob Whan came through the development pathways with South Fremantle and after 25 colts matches over the past two years, moved into the senior program in 2024 and earned his league debut in Round 16 against Subiaco.

Ended up playing five games the rest of the season and as such a strong ball winner, will look to build on that further in 2025.

Cooper Osborne was the final debut of 2024 for South Fremantle coming in for the Round 19 match up with Peel Thunder.

He had previously played his colts football with Peel before joining South Fremantle and will now look to have a more significant impact again using his impressive size in 2025.



## WJ HUGHES MEDAL

### *Winder caps stunning first season at Bulldogs*

Isiah Winder was a prized signing for South Fremantle coming into the 2024 WAFL season and he slotted right into the midfield for the Bulldogs to deliver a brilliant season that was recognised with winning the WJ Hughes Medal as fairest and best winner.

Winder was initially drafted from Peel Thunder back in 2020 and he would end up spending three years at the West Coast Eagles, playing seven AFL matches.

That included six in 2022, but after just one AFL appearance in 2023, he found himself off the list and was quick to sign at the Bulldogs for the 2024 WAFL season.

The smooth moving and dynamic 22-year-old took

no time slotting in at South Fremantle and while he had somewhat been earmarked as a high half-forward, he moved into the midfield with the Bulldogs for brilliant results.

Especially when he was up and going alongside Matthew Parker and Haiden Schloithe, it was virtually an unstoppable combination at times throughout the season.

Winder would end up playing all 18 matches for the season, kicking 16 goals and averaging 25.4 possessions and that included some brilliant games including 30 touches and three goals in Round 6 against Perth, and 32 and two against Peel in Round 8.

As a result, Winder topped the WJ Hughes Medal count to win the fairest and best with 102 votes.

He won ahead of captain Chad Pearson who ended up with 90 votes to be runner-up to continue his remarkably consistent 131-game career with a fourth consecutive top three finish.

Haiden Schloithe's remarkably return after a year off saw him finish third already as a five-time fairest and best winner in his 216-game career.

Schloithe claimed 88 votes and he was third ahead of Lewis Rayson (61 votes), Matthew Parker (61), Glenn Byron (49) and Zac Strom (45).

Zac Strom is now closing on being a 200-game player with 190 appearances behind him and he was leading goalkicker in 2024 with 25 majors.

Lewis Rayson was rewarded for his tremendous first season winning the Shearer Family Trophy as Best First Year Player.

Robbie Turnbull received the Best Clubman Award for his contributions that include being part of the women's coaching staff to see him claim the Warren Medal.

Other awards presented on the evening included Ashton Williamson winning the Culver Family Award for courage and perseverance.

Young star Jaxon Artemis was also presented with his MVP award from the National 18s Championships this season where he was judged to be Western Australia's best player.

### STEVE MARSH

On March 5, club Legend Steve Marsh sadly passed away aged 99. It is known to all that Marsh's Football career was one of the best, both at the Bulldogs, and in the State.

He was recognised for his achievements when inducted into our first Hall of Fame night in 2011. Further to this in 2015, Steve was elevated to Legend status along with seven other SFFC Greats.

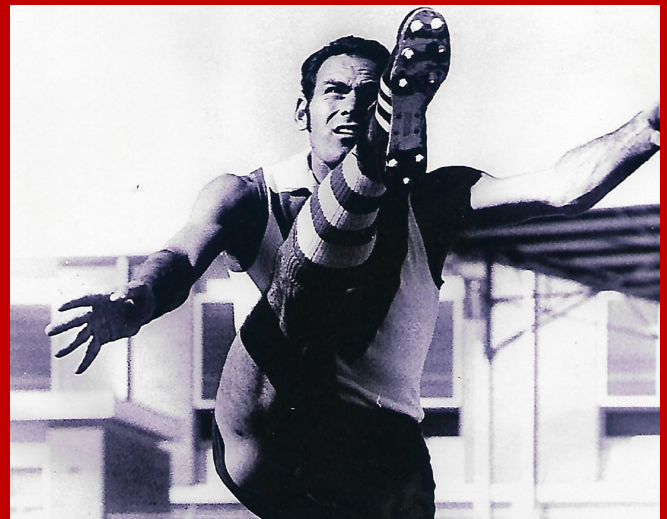
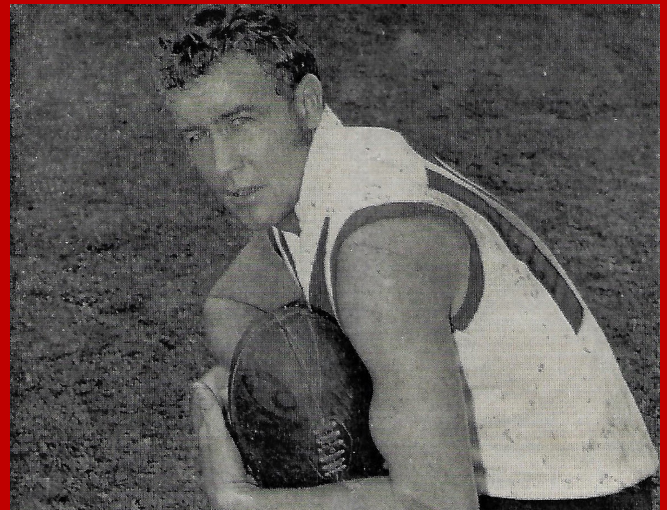
Marsh was widely known as one of the greatest rovers, but not limiting him to just this, his speed and skills in general were outstanding. His confidence radiated making him a great leader.

In Steve's 12 Seasons (1945-56) on the field for the Bulldogs he curated a football resume like no other. Throughout his career, he totaled 226 games.

Our Premier Family Club offers its deepest sympathy to Steve's family, Terry and Len, and their respective families.

### GRAHAM SCOTT

Sadly our club has lost another former great South Fremantle player in Graham (Matey) Scott who passed away on the April 30 at the age of 77.

Graham (Cap 896) played 117 games, plus five State games, between 1966-71 and had a significant influence in our 1970 premiership side when he kicked four goals in the Grand Final.

He then went on to top our goal kicking list in the 1971 season with 97 goals. In 1972 Graham moved to St Kilda and played 18 VFL games, and then in 1974 transferred to Melbourne and played a further eight games. Graham was awarded Life Time Membership in 2105.

The Scott family have had a major influence on South Fremantle from Mandurah, with brother Dixie playing at reserves level and brother Gary (Cap 788), playing 255 games plus 11 State games, winning the Walker Medal in 1964, and was an Inaugural South Fremantle Hall of Fame Inductee in 2011.

### JOHN TODD

South Fremantle Football Club is deeply saddened by the passing of club Legend, John Todd.

A giant of WA Football, Todd was a young footballing phenomenon for the Bulldogs, winning the 1955 Sandover Medal at just 17.

Playing 132 games before succumbing to persistent injury, Todd won the fairest and best in 1955, 1958 and 1961 - in one of the strongest ever periods.

He would represent WA 13 times and was All-Australian in 1961.

Todd would transition to coaching, and in doing so, became legendary in WA Football, starting as captain-coach in 1959 and coached outright in 1966-68 and 1996-98.

In between, he coached East Fremantle to the 1974 premiership and Swan Districts to premierships in 1982, 83, 84 and 90, with a two-year stint at the West Coast Eagles 1988-89.

In 1997, Todd led his beloved Bulldogs to the famous premiership over East Fremantle.

He is one of WA's most decorated individuals, with Australian Football Hall of Fame, WA Hall of Fame (Legend), and South Fremantle Hall of Fame (Legend).

Today is a sad day for the Bulldog family, and WA Football at large. Today we celebrate the life of a

legend. South Fremantle offers condolences to all members of the Todd family at this sad time.

### TOM GRLJUSICH

South Fremantle Football Club is mourning the loss of Hall of Famer and Life Member, Tom Grljusich.

Taking up football only at 18 years of age in 1958 for Cockburn ex-Scholars, he won the fairest in that first year and joined South Fremantle in late 1959.

Made his league debut in Round 1 of 1960 alongside his brother George. In 1965 he joined South Australian team Central District where he won the fairest and best award in 1966.

He rejoined South Fremantle in 1968, playing until 1976. His 258 games for South Fremantle stood as the club's games played record for 27 years until it was exceeded by Marty Atkins in 2003 (266 games).

He would play in the 1970 premiership, win two Walker Medals, was leading goal kicker and represent WA on three occasions.

Highly-decorated, he received South Fremantle Life Membership, Hall of Fame induction, Fremantle Legends Team honours, and enjoyed involvement with his beloved Bulldogs for a remarkable 65 years.

The Grljusich name is synonymous with South Fremantle, and like his brother George, he will forever be remembered for his passion, love and dedication for the Red V.

### CAM MCCARTHY

The South Fremantle Football Club is deeply saddened by the passing of Cam McCarthy.

A South zoned junior from the South Coogee JFC, McCarthy was drafted pick 14 in 2013 to the GWS Giants direct from the colts, before returning to WA in 2017 to play with the Fremantle Dockers.

In 2021, Cam rejoined South Fremantle and played WAFL footy in both 2021 and 2022.

Cam is remembered not just as a prodigious football talent, but as a popular, compassionate and caring person who had time for everyone at our Club. He will be dearly missed.

### NICK CAMPO

We are a club in deep shock and mourning following the tragic passing of Nick Campo in a car accident.

Nick was a bright young man with true talent and a love for football.

He came through our talent pathway and played colts at South Fremantle for the past two years.

His loss has been felt heavily across the football, cricket, and wider WA communities.

# COLTS COACH REPORT

# TALENT REPORT

## 14S AND 15S ACADEMY

Our 14s and 15s development squad programs were bolstered by the inclusion of Robbie Turnbull as development coordinator. In this role, Robbie took over the operations of our development squads and worked closely with coach Anthony Pivac to implement a program that prepared our boys to move through the talent pathway.

The 15s had a highly successful program, playing and winning all four games in July against West Perth and East Fremantle. These boys will now transition into the Futures program leading into 2025 in which they'll complete a full preseason before playing seven games.

The 14s had their first taste of development level football and probably had a bit of a wakeup call against strong opposition. After looking very strong through an eight-session program, we came up against West Perth and East Fremantle and struggled to fire a shot. From our point of view this was a positive, as it showed the group the level required to succeed if they want to progress at SFFC. The attitude the boys showed was fantastic and it's clear they are hungry to improve next year.

The development squad programs are vital to prepare talented players in our zone for colts football and beyond, so regardless of wins or losses, it's im-

portant we prepare the group physically and mentally to move through the talent pathway. Thanks to Robbie and Anthony for organising two great programs and getting the boys ready to go for 2025.

## COUNTRY PROGRAMS

Our country programs are extremely important to ensure we have opportunities for talented players in the Gascoyne and Upper Great Southern regions to come and play at SFFC.

We work closely with the Stephen Michael Foundation, who implement our programs in the regions, to identify and provide opportunities to players.

The UGS Rams program has again been successful in identifying talented players who have played for South Fremantle from 14s all the way through to senior football. Thanks to Toby Prunty, Tony Micale and the rest of the SMF team for their work in the UGS region. Also thanks to Paul Reid for his support from the WAFC. Without Reidy we would have a very tough time getting anything done in the region.

We are continuing to work to provide development for our players in the Gascoyne region. The distances from Perth provide challenges, but we are working closely with the SMF to organise carnivals and opportunities for players to attend trainings in Perth if their football is at the required level.

## FUTURES PROGRAM

Our 2024 Futures group began their pre-season in November 2023, and quickly showed they were a determined group who were keen for success. The Futures season was increased to nine games, so it was vital we prepared our boys for a more challenging program.

In his second year in charge, coach Scott Faulkner lead the group to five wins and two draws. While we aren't too focussed on wins and losses at this level, it's a good gauge of where the group is at when they come up against all other WAFL clubs in competitive games.

We also had three State 16 representatives in Heath Wilson, Lucas Robinson and Sam Hookham. Of our Futures group we had Sam Hookham, Elijah Nathan and Lucas Robinson debut in the Colts side which is a great achievement from those boys. Heath Wilson and Lucas Robinson have also been selected in the State 18s Academy Summer program as under-agers.

These individual achievements are worth celebrating, but also put SFFC in a good position going forward with talented players coming through the pathway.

Great work to Scotty and his team for another great Futures program, and I'm looking forward to seeing these boys play Colts and senior footy in the years to come.

A huge thanks to Rod Linton for his leadership throughout immediate aftermath, as well as Sam and Sarah from the Roleystone JFC for coming down and cooking for our group and staff on the first training session after the accident. Special mention should also be made to Matt Rogers who took on a heap in this time period whilst also working through his first season as coach.

The resilience of this group was astounding, not only playing less than a week after the tragedy, but also committing to training and looking after each other in what would be a completely foreign situation for many of them. A highlight of my year was our second Fremantle Derby at Fremantle Oval for the year. We had attended the funeral of Nick on the Friday, and the way the boys grouped together and played for their mate on Saturday morning was as proud as I've ever felt.

Although team results weren't at the level we wanted to be when we set out at the beginning of 2024, there were many individual achievements that deserve celebrating. Jaxon Artemis, Hudson Pivac, Tom Bell, Fred Rodriguez and Toby Whan were all selected in the WA State 18s Academy, with Jaxon being selected as MVP for WA in the National Championships.

We also had Heath Wilson, Lucas Robinson and Sam Hookham selected in the WA 16s Academy, with Robinson selected as MVP in the National 16s Championships. Fred Rodriguez and Toby Whan were also selected to play on the MCG in the National Futures game on AFL Grand Final Day. To finish the year, we

have had Tom Bell attending the AFL State Combine in Perth, and Jaxon Artemis attending the National Draft Combine in Melbourne. Not only is this exciting for all the boys mentioned and a credit to the work they have put in through 2024, but it's also good signs for the future at SFFC.

Huge thanks to Lachie McDonald in his first year as Physio leading the medical team with the assistance of Michael Lee and our trainers in Jacob, Luke, Jess, Camryn, Josh and Sam. Thanks to Anthony Pivac for not only keeping everything organised as team manager, but also for organising our monthly pasta dinners for the boys amongst about 100 other jobs he's done for us outside of his job description this year. Also to Rod Linton not only in his work directly relating to the tragedy we experienced, but also his leadership of our welfare team throughout the entire year. Special thanks to PTT and Pops for all the behind the scenes work that they have done in making sure our programs run smoothly. Without you guys we would be in serious trouble.

To Matt Rogers - unbelievable effort in your first year as coach. The leadership shown through some serious challenges all season, as well as developing a group to be ready for success at senior or potentially AFL level was outstanding. We set out to develop these boys not only as footballers but as people, and your work from the outset made sure this was possible.

Finally, to the players, I couldn't be prouder of you as a group. The way you have all banded together after the loss of a close friend and serious injuries to two other mates was something to behold. You boys stepping up to support one another meant we were also able to process the tragedy we were going through and I can't speak highly enough of how you went about it. We'll always remember Nicko and will continue to honour him each time we take the field in a Bulldogs jumper, and to JJ and Rowey, I can't wait to have you boys back around the club in 2025 however that looks.

I'm already excited for season 2025 and think we can really give it a good crack next year.

## REMEMBER WITH PRIDE - OBITUARIES

**It is with sincere and deep regret that since our last Annual General Meeting we record that the following former Players, Life Members, Life Time Members and Supporters are known to have passed away.**

**ASHLEY GORDON AUGUST (Cap 808)** - Died December 18, 2023. Played 74 games between 1959-64 and was cleared by Claremont (along with the late Bob Bolton) upon the appointment of Ray (Lizard) Richards, as Claremont's playing coach in 1959.

**WADE NORMAN DENNIS (Cap 819)** - Died December 28, 2023. Dad John (Cap 819) played 25 games and Uncle Norm (Cap 862) played 47 games, and was an instrumental player in great 1970 premierships side.

**MRS DOROTHY DIXON** - Died in Mandurah on the January 7, 2024, and her late husband was South Fremantle Hall of Famer, 2015 inductee Don Snr (Cap 708). He was a premierships player in 1950, 1952 and 1953, who played 134 games and was awarded Life Membership in 1998. Late son, Don Jnr (Cap 968) played 15 games between 1974-75, and Don Snr's Father, Norm (Cap 399) played 98 games between 1924 and 1931. Both Don and Dorothy were regular attendees at the club and three generations of Dixons have represented the Bulldogs on a total of 247 occasions.

**VALERIE EVELYN TIMEWELL** - Died February 22, 2024. Val was a lovely lady, who dedicated her life to South Fremantle and who was also a passionate Fremantle Dockers supporter.

**STEPHEN WILLIAM (STEVE) MARSH (Cap 666)** - Died March 5, 2024, just 6 months shy of 100th birthday. Our Legend and six-time premierships player was a wonderful personality, whose footy records throughout Australia are unrivalled. He was more than a champion player, was also a champion team man where his on-field leadership and direction had a profound influence on South Fremantle's amazing success during our Golden Years. VALE STEVE - ONE OF OUR VERY BEST.

**COLIN BERT HICKS (Cap 727)** - Died in Tasmania on March 8, 2024, aged 94. Was a staunch South Fremantle man who rarely missed a home game, having previously represented the red-and-whites in 1950, playing five league games. An Inaugural Life Time Member (2003).

**PATRICIA FLANDERS** - Died mid-March 2024. Pat was a lovely South person, a regular attendee at all games and functions, always supporting the Bulldogs and her late husband Laurie (Life Member 2002).

**FRANK FREDERICK FORD** - Died March 18, 2024, aged 92. Frank was a dedicated South Member who was rewarded with Life Time Membership in 2013.

**MRS LOUISE MILDRED CAMPBELL** - Sadly passed away in Katherine, Northern Territory on March 20, 2024, aged 90. Son Basil, (Cap 1008) played 102 games 1975-1981, a premierships player in 1980 Hall of Famer and Life Member 2015. Grandson Warren, (Cap 1196) played 44 games between 1992-1993 and 1997 and was premierships player in 1997.

**JACK MOORE** - Died April 13, 2024. A good South person and long-time member, and two of his brothers are former players. Bill (Cap 772) played four games in 1955 whilst Robbie (Cap 849) was our reliable defender between 1962-67 playing at full-back in 72 appearances against plenty of torrid opposition. Robbie also acted as our players representative and then team manager for a number of years, and was also a member of the committee of management between 1973-79.

**FRANK LA ROSA** - Died April 29, 2024. Was a heart and soul South Fremantle person, always at Souths training, always in the change rooms and at the end of each quarter would run down the middle of the ground to sit behind the goals to which ever end South were kicking. He lived and loved all and everything South Fremantle. A true Bulldog.

**GRAHAM (MATEY) SCOTT (Cap 896)** - Died April 30, 2024. Played 117 games and five State games between 1966-71 and also played a significant role in 1970 premierships win kicking four goals. Was awarded Life Time Membership in 2015. Scott family have had a major influence on Souths, with brother Dixie playing at Reserves level and brother Gary (Cap 788) playing 255 games plus 11 State games. He was Walker Medallist 1964, captain 1963 and 1965-1967, Life Member 1967 and an Inaugural Hall of Fame Inductee in 2011.

**CAMERON ALEX (CAM) MCCARTHY (Cap 1548)** - Sadly passed on May 9, 2024. Commenced with the South Coogee JFC and in 2013 was drafted by GWS Giants with pick 13 before returning to WA in 2017 to join the Fremantle Dockers. In 2021, returned to South Fremantle playing 10 games between 2021-22. Is remembered not just as a prodigious football talent, but as a popular, compassionate and caring person who had time for everyone at our club.

**DON (BULL) KENNINGTON (Cap 858)** - Died mid-May 2024. Was a local Hilton Park junior, who commenced with South at Thirds level and played seven league games between 1963-65. Subsequently assisted the Hilton Park Junior Football Club and coached their underage teams for a number of seasons.

**NOLA MAY SMITH** - Died mid-May 2024. Nola and her late husband Keith, each had a big influence on South Fremantle in the 60s with Keith (Cap 837) playing 88 games between 1961-68 and then on retiring, he took over the role of secretary/manager from 1970 until 1974. Keith later served the club as a director.

**JOHN TODD (Cap 769)** - Died June 4, 2024. One of our greatest ever players over his 132-game career that saw him win the 1955 Sandover. Coached the club for seven years including to the 1997 premiership and is a Life Member, inaugural Hall of Famer, inaugural South Fremantle Legend, and a giant of football throughout the whole of Australia. VALE TODDY - ONE OF OUR VERY BEST.



**JACK SUMICH, GARY SCOTT, JOHN TODD**

**VERNON JAMES (BLONDIE) CAVANAUGH** - Died June 3, 2024, and his son Greg (Cap 1036) played 43 games between 1978-80.

**DUJE TOMY (TOM) GRLJUSICH (Cap 821)** - Died June 8, 2024. Was one of South Fremantle's most decorated players over 258 games while also playing 49 with Central Districts and six for South Australia and three for WA. Was 1970 premiership player, Walker Medallist 1968 and 1972, Life Member 1974 and inaugural Hall of Famer 2011. Was one of seven members of the Grljusich families that have represented South Fremantle.

**NICK CAMPO** - Tragically killed in a motor vehicle accident on July 13, 2024. Was a great young man who came through our talent pathway and played at Colts level with South Fremantle for the past two years. His loss has been felt heavily across the football, cricket and wider WA communities. One minutes silence was observed before all games on Saturday July 20.

**JACK LOCKYER** - Died July 29, 2024. His son Jamie (Cap 1010) was our premiership wingman in 1980, playing 61 games between 1975-80.

**DRAGI DINKO PADOVAN** - Died July 29, 2024. Dragi was a dedicated South man and a sponsor/donor to South Fremantle.

**JEANNETTE (JAN) DYMOCK** - Died August 11, 2024. Jan and her late husband Bill were great South Fremantle people and both were Life Time Members of our club.

**GORDON SYDNEY SCOTT (Cap 724)** - Sadly passed away in August or early September 2024. Played 16 games between 1950-52 and was a member of our star studded teams of the Golden Years era.

**NORMAN JOHN (JOCK) BEATTIE OAM** - Died September 18, 2024, just three days short of 92nd birthday. Was a legend of country footy, and a Life Member of Country Football WA, a terrific supporter of country zoning and a great South Fremantle man. Son Doug (Cap 1046) played two games in 1979 whilst son Alan represented South at Colts and Reserves level and won Colts fairest and best in 1983.

**KYE DAVID HART** - Died September 21, 2024, in Queensland. Played in the QAFL for the Noosa Tigers and all our South diehards will recall the scintillating performance and influence his dad, David (Cap 1092) had in our winning Grand Final in 1997. David played 81 games for South and had a glittering career with West Coast playing 184 games and was selected in the All-Australian side in 1994.

**DON SMITH** - Well-known former journalist and former editor of both The West Australian and the Sunday Times sadly passed away on November 4, 2024. Was awarded the Order of Australia Medal in 2001. Was a wonderful South Fremantle supporter and one of his greatest loves was watching South Fremantle's performances through the Golden Years, followed by the magic and brilliance of Toddy and Gero.

Each of the abovementioned will be remembered and we extend to their bereaved relatives our deepest sympathy. Your Board also wishes to express its sincere condolences to all members who were unfortunate to lose loved ones during the past year.
