Here we go AGAIN

Just when we thought life was getting back to some sort of normality good old Covid Delta strikes. The ensuing lockdown and restrictions meant the cancellation of activities in the last week of June, Round 13 of the WAFL and the WAWFL Grand Final. Hopefully things will get back to business as usual quickly.

On field, both the Women's League and Reserves sides made it to the first week of the finals, with the Reserves playing in the First Semi against Claremont and the League in the Second Semi versus Peel. It was mixed results for the Black and Whites with the Reserves winning through to the Preliminary Final against Peel and the League losing, going into the cut throat Preliminary against Subiaco. Unfortunately the Reserves couldn't keep their winning form going losing by 16 points. In the League match it was an even first half with the Swannies going into half time 5 points up. The second half was a different story with the Black and Whites finding some form after the half time break and kicking 5.4 to 1 point to come out comfortable winners and book their place in the Grand Final against last year's Premiers Peel. On the Men's front, the Colts are still travelling well with only one loss and sit on top of the ladder one game clear of East Perth. The Reserves had a shock four point loss to Subiaco in Round 12, only their second for the season, but still sit second, one game behind ladder leaders Claremont. The Leagues mixed season continued, falling over the line against an inaccurate Peel at Mandurah in Round 9 then losing to West Perth at home in a shocker. Round 12 saw them travel to Leederville to take on ladder leaders Subiaco, a daunting task under the circumstances, but as they say 'A week is a long time in football'. This was a different side that ran out onto the park to the one from the week before and Swans had the better of Subiaco for three quarters going into the last break 13 points up. This should have been more if not for inaccurate kicking. As you would expect, Subiaco are on top of the ladder for a reason and they came home with the wind behind their sails but the young Swannies managed to hold on to take a thriller by one point, a great result. Again, due to the Covid lockdown the next rounds of the WAFL are TBC, so keep an eye on the Swans webpage for information

From Trinity he moved to London to take up a PE position at St. Pauls. After six years he returned to his homeland of New Zealand where he headed the PE Department at St. Peters in Auckland. After two years there he took up a position as Director of Sport at Christ's College in Christchurch. 2003 saw him move to NSW as High Performance Manager of NSW Cricket, and then to General Manager of the Randwick Rugby Club in 2010 and then to Tasman Rugby in NZ in 2013, where he saw the Club go from cellar dwellers to Premiers. He moved back to Perth in 2021 to fill the position of CEO of the Western Force.
