Count Me In Round

Saturday 29th May was the annual 'Count Me In' round, a highlight on the WAFL calendar. The Swansmen once again sponsored a table at the Legends Lunch, which allows those a bit less fortunate than us and their carer's, to enjoy a day out at the footy. Lunch goers were treated to some fancy dance moves by the Sparkle and Shine Dance Group and interviews with Stephanie Pearson, Brett from St Judes, and Kingsley Bugarin. Stephanie is a young woman who has Down Syndrome, Brett loves to talk and is on a lot of St Judes advertisements. He has an acquired brain injury and his recovery from his initial prognosis has been remarkable. Kingsley is a Guildford boy who is vision impaired. He is a Paralympian and has an OAM. The Coaches from the two All Ability teams Willetton and Kingsway, who played prior to the Women's League match were also interviewed. Refer to page 3 for photo's.

On the Women's football front, the League are still undefeated after round 13, although they did have a couple of scares in rounds 11 and 12, just falling over the line by a point against Peel and Subiaco, both been away games. Round 13 saw them back at Steel Blue Oval for the Count Me In round, up against fourth placed East Fremantle. They were back to their best kicking four goals to one in the opening term in wet conditions. East Freo only managed two more goals for the game, both coming in the third quarter, while the Swans piled on another seven to run out comfortable winners and retain top spot on the ladder. After a couple of big wins against West Perth and South Fremantle in rounds 9 and 10, the Reserves lost a close one to East Fremantle by two points in round 11. They bounced back in style in round 12 thumping Subiaco by 97 points. They sit on top of the ladder by percentage from Peel. The Colts girls have managed another win to take their tally to four games and still sit in sixth position.

On the Men's front, after two narrow loses to West Perth and Subiaco in rounds 6 and 7 the League team came up against East Fremantle at Steel Blue Oval in round 8, the Count Me In round. It was a seasoning defining match, win and stay in touch with the top three teams, lose and fall back with the pack. The first quarter was a battle of two teams wanting to hang on to their top five position with Swans taking a five point lead into the first break. Not too sure what Pickers said to the boys at quarter time but whatever it was worked. Swans came out and kicked eight goals to two to break the game open and go into half time 39 points up. The Sharks came out after half time with some renewed vigour and piled on three quick goals and another fadeout from the Swans was looking imminent. However, the Black and Whites steadied and managed three goals themselves before East Freo kicked one more for the quarter to bring the margin back to 33 points. Swans took control in the fourth kicking three goals to one to come away with a 44 point win and push them into fourth spot on the ladder. Jesse Palmer booted three goals for the day, with Frank Anderson, Jesse Turner and Josh Cipro outstanding in the mid field, with Tony Notte, Nelson Waite and Jackson Beck solid in defence. Earlier in the day the Reserves made better of the wet conditions, keeping East Fremantle scoreless in the first term while kicking five themselves, and then goalless in the last, to set up the 42 point win. They sit second on the ladder behind Claremont, who have a game in hand. Jack Cox had a day out kicking 5 goals. Mitchell Bain, 22 disposals, Callum Garcia and Dylan Ralph, 21 each, were among best a field. The Colts played on the Sunday and a four goal to two first quarter setup a the seven point win. They now sit on top of the ladder by one game, with only one loss for the season. Joshua Middleton kicked three goals and Max Chipper 2. Lawson Humphries, Bryce Watson and Max Chipper were judged best a field.
