## Results at Last

**S**upporters finally have something to crow about with the Men's League team pulling off a Houdini to inflict ladder leaders Claremont with their first loss of the season and then take out 2021 Premiers South Fremantle two weeks later. Should have been 3 from with a narrow loss to Subiaco in Kalgoorlie in between.

#### Women's Football

Rounds 12 to 14 were not productive for the League side with them dropping games to Claremont, Subiaco and Peel. The losses to Subiaco and Peel were the first to these teams for the season. The Round 15 clash against South Fremantle was a must win to stay in contention for finals. The girls bounced back to win the crucial match. They now sit fourth after round 15 with a 6/7 win loss ratio and must beat Peel in the last game of the regular season to guarantee a finals berth. The Reserves won 2 from 3 in Rounds 12 to 14 and sit comfortably in third spot with a 6/5 win loss ratio. The Colt's girls have had three narrow losses and one win for Rounds 12 to 15. After round 15 they sit sixth with a 3/10 win loss ratio.

#### Men's Football

After narrow losses to East Perth and East Fremantle in Rounds 1 and 2 respectively the Men's League side finally got a win on the board over Perth at Lathlain in Round 3. The Round 4 clash against undefeated Claremont at home was going to be an uphill battle. The cocky Tigers didn't expect the battle that was to prevail. In a tight fought match Swan's went into the last break 2 points up. Claremont kicked the first 2 goals for the last term and were expecting Swan's to lay down, but that wasn't the case. Swan's kicked the last 3 majors of the game to get the points in a remarkable effort. The Round 4 match against Subiaco in Kalgoorlie saw Swan's leading by 20 points at the last break but an injury to stalwart Tony Notte and the effects of Covid saw Subiaco keep Swan's scoreless in the last while kicking 5.4 to win by 14 points. With 5 players out with Covid the Round 5 clash with South Fremantle at home was going to be tough but to Swan's they came out firing and led at half time by 14 points. South Fremantle came out hard in the third term but the undermanned Swan's took it up to them and went into the last break 15 points up. As with the Claremont game South kicked the first two goals of the last quarter to get within a couple of points but the Black Ducks kicked the last goal of the match to get another remarkable win.

After losses to Claremont in Round 4 and Subiaco in Round 5 the Reserves got back on the winners list with a hard fought win over South Fremantle in Round 6. In what is a tight competition they currently sit in eighth position and are only one game behind second spot.

Round 4 saw the Colt's take on Claremont in the Grand Final re-match. It was a bottom of the ladder clash with the young Swan's yet to get a win and Claremont with only 1 win. The result was the same with Swan's coming out on top but the margin was far greater. Unfortunately they couldn't carry that form into Rounds 5 and 6 with losses to Subiaco and South Fremantle respectively and sit last on the ladder.

#### **Integrated Football**

After a bye in Round 3 the Integrated team nearly pulled off their first win of the season in Round 4. Trailing by a solitary point when the final siren went, Swan's had an opportunity to win with a kick for goal after the siren but the kick went through for a behind to salvage a draw. Their first win came the week after in Round 5 and then followed up with another in Round 6. They have jumped up to eighth spot on the ladder with a 2/2 record and take on undefeated High Wycombe at Steel Blue on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> June.

# Scott Cummings

Swan Districts and West Coast Eagles Legend

Scott played at Swans between 1991 and 1993, winning the Colts

goal kicking with 78 goals, then winning our League goal kicking in 1993 with 85 goals, he was then drafted by Essendon at pick 20 in 1994, kicking 8 goals on debut against Sydney. After 40 games with Essendon he was traded to be part of the Port Adelaide inaugural list, playing 37 games (102 goals) and then to West Coast where his best season in 1999 saw him win the distinguished Coleman Medal with 95 goals. He kicked 14 goals in one match against Adelaide at the WACA.

After one season at Collingwood his total AFL games were 128 with 349 goals. Winning the leading goal kicking award at 3 AFL clubs, the Coleman Medal, Graham Moss Medal and an AFL Rising Star nominee in 1994. Scott then returned to Swans for one more year in 2001 taking his Swans goals to 104 in only 34 matches.

Scott was then prepared to put his hand up and was a Director of the Club for 4 years between 2009 and 2012. Post football, Scott has had a successful career in the media for SEN, Fox Footy and 3AW in Melbourne and is a well sought after guest speaker.

He went back and played amateurs with Swan Valley for 4 years before deciding to give it one more crack at WAFL level. He has now had four strong years back at Swans. He said his hardest opponent was Keegan Knott at

West Perth. He is a Phys Ed teacher at Kiara College. Glen Jakovich asked him what it meant for him to be at Swannies, and he said it keeps him feeling young and connected. He really enjoyed the win over Claremont recently and said he greatly admired the careers of Glen Jakovich, Scott Pendlebury and Tony Notte.

- The Guest Speaker for the night was Glen Jakovich. With many a tail to tell Glen recalled a few from his illustrious past. He spoke about his experiences with Swannies over time and an infamous visit to Kalgoorlie as a 16-year-old when they played Subiaco. He recalled being on the train home after Stephen Michael's 200<sup>th</sup> game at Basso, which they lost and about spending valuable time with Toddy at book signings when both he and Toddy had published books at the same time and about Toddy and Mick Malthouse being similar coaches who were in it to win at all costs, and both were not in it to make friends. He talked about the Eagles golden years of the early nineties and noted that Brett Heady was the toughest player he played with and that he loved the State of Origin games.
